General

The Dormitory Annex and N.Y.A. House are operated on an economical basis on reasonable rental. Hines Hall, Cliffside Hall, Lowman Hall, Pickard Street House, and Russell Street House are co-operative homes, accommodating 190 students. The Director, on a low monthly salary with the assistance of the girls or boys in the home, takes care of the rooms and provides meals. Duff House on Austin Street, Oakwood Hall, Annex Apartment, and Pickard Street Apartment have twenty-four separate apartments for couples desiring to attend College, for student use at a cost not exceeding \$15.00 per month.

In the first five years of degree granting, the College conferred eighty-eight Bachelor's Degrees; in the first three years of graduate work, the College has conferred ninety-three Master's Degrees. In the thirteenth year of conferring Bachelor's Degrees, the College enrolled four hundred sixty-seven seniors; in the third year of graduate instruction, the College enrolled four hundred forty-two graduate students.

Faculty members are working rapidly in improvement of scholarship. Note the large and growing per cent of Doctor's Degrees. Our scheme of scholarship rating gives the Bachelor's Degree a rating of 4, the Master's Degree a rating of 5, and the Doctor's Degree a rating of 7+, indicating the total number of years work required for the completion of the respective degree.

Divisions Versus Departments

The Annual Catalog, a copy of which is forwarded you under separate cover, places the faculty in alphabetic order of Divisions. The College, following the highest administrative thought of today, organizes under the larger units of Divisions rather than the smaller units of Departments. College history abundantly shows that the multiplication of Departments multiplies small classes, overhead jealousies, and general administrative troubles. Reports of the State Board of Education give this College a splendid record of per capita cost and elimination of small classes.

Campus Enlargements

The College, at considerable sacrifice and heavy cost, has made its greatest addition to the College campus. With an additional frontage of 236 feet on Austin Street, running North and South, 438 feet along Roanoke Street at right angle to Austin Street, 362 feet along Guadalupe Street, North and South, almost at right angles to Roanoke Street, and 263 feet along Pickard Street running East and West, at right angle to Guadalupe Street, and an irregular boundary of 253 feet and 105 feet connecting with Austin Street, in all more than three acres, the College has made the most significant campus improvement in the history of the College. In this area, the College will complete by October 1 the Auditorium-Laboratory School, is now building a parkway leading from Austin Street to Guadalupe Street, and has made a beginning on the building of the playground for the Laboratory School. When these improvements are completed, under a special W.P.A. program, this area will be beautiful and attractive.

The College has acquired along North Austin Street two lots, 158 x 97, from the G. B. Ezell Estate, the Gosdin area of one and two-thirds acres, and the **Gosdin-Oates** lots, 158 x 83, extending College property along Austin Street to the Ravine and bridge, a full block North of the College campus line. Into this area the College is moving the houses from the Sevey Property, making possible a playground, and will later move the houses from the Morris property, which touches the Laboratory School Building. This so-called Gosdin Addition heretofore a dense thicket, is becoming attractive under College improvement.

The College hereby expresses its appreciation for the counsel and assistance of Regent John E. Hill in making possible the extension of College campus and the purchase of essential property.

Building Program

We confidently expect the Auditorium-Laboratory School to be ready for College use the last week of September. This building contains an auditorium with a seating capacity of approximately 1600 people, twenty-three class rooms, a Library reading room, and eleven offices. In the San Marcos Record of June 24, 1938, the cooperative program was mentioned and the capacity of the auditorium was listed at 1400 people. The San Marcos Committee has approved the location of the Student Union Building across the street from the Education Building in line with the Science-Education Buildings. The buildings in this line under the College Ten-Year Program will be the old Library Building, Science Building, Education Building, Student Union Building, and Fine Arts Building. This line of buildings is the result of the consistent work of the Hon. Ed. J. L. Green of San Marcos, six years President of the Local Board of Normal School.
