To the Board of Normal Regents,
Huntsville, Texas.

Gentlemen:

It is impossible at this time to forecast legislative action regarding salaries, and is, therefore, not practicable to ask final action upon all recommendations for faculty members and other employes for the session of 1929-30. Attached hereto is the complete list of faculty members and other employes, with the present salary. It is understood that the present list is submitted for tentative approval. In accordance with a long-standing policy of the Regents, it is customary for the President of the Teachers College, during the current school year, to submit nominations to the President of the Board of Regents for approval. I recommend that the President of the Teachers College be authorized to continue the employment of teachers of Music, Voice, Piano, and Violin, as in 1928-29, so far as the same may prove advisable. It is understood that for instruction in Voice, Piano, or Violin that no regular funds, State or Local, be used, these instructors being paid entirely from the fees collected. In case conditions warrant, I recommend that an amount approximating \$500 be set aside for the Star and an equal amount for the Pedagog, regular student publications which are very valuable to the College as a whole.

Contract was let early in the Fall of 1928 for enlargement of the Boys Gymnasium. This makes the building much more serviceable, and enables the Department of Physical Education to expand its work to meet the growing needs of students. Needed repairs have also been made on the Education Building. At Riverside, plans call for the construction of a concrete retaining wall and for the building of a cottage in which the caretaker may live, thereby assuring proper protection to the property. A splendid track has been constructed, and was available for the interscholastic meet which was held in San Marcos April 13.

We are investigating very thoroughly the problem involved in the construction of a Woman's Building through the issuance of bonds. Final report of plans for this work will be ready for the July meeting of the Regents.

So far, J. E. Wilson and Ashley Wilson, owners of the property on the bank of the San Marcos River opposite Riverside decline to consider the sale of this property to the State. They agree, however, to lease for a reasonable rental, as agreed upon later. There is also an outstanding agreement to sell Riverside Island to the College as soon as the State has made an appropriation for its purchase, the price to be subject to arbitration. I submit this matter to the further consideration of the Board of Regents.

I recommend that the President be authorized to purchase the property known as the Avey lots, at a price not to exceed \$150.

I am submitting also for the consideration of the Board of Regents a proposed contract with the Texas Power and Light Company for power and light.
