1                   HENRY:  And that's fine and I have no  
2 problems with that.

3                   MR. KORESH:  Okay.

4                   HENRY:  But I have a problem with you  
5 staying there all day.

6                   MR. KORESH:  Well --

7                   HENRY:  And when I say I have a problem, I  
8 would like --

9                   MR. KORESH:  This is why, this is why you  
10 agreed to play this tape, right?  Because you really  
11 have no intention of playing it, right?

12                   HENRY:  No, no, no, no, no.  That has  
13 nothing to do with anything.  If I told you that I was  
14 going to do something, that's exactly what I'm going  
15 to do.  You know, I, I have no problems doing, you  
16 know, this and whatever, you know --

17                   MR. KORESH:  I told these people to trust  
18 you all.

19                   HENRY:  And, you know, and likewise I've  
20 been trusting you, okay?

21                   MR. KORESH:  Okay.  Now, here's the deal,  
22 though.  You know, you do understand the importance to  
23 us for this -- what I have to say to be gotten out.  
24 Now, we're not terrorists.  I mean, you're not -- And  
25 we don't have no hostages here.

1 HENRY: I understand.

2 MR. KORESH: I mean, the children, that's  
3 kind of like a hostage 'cause, like I say, they're too  
4 young to make their decisions.

5 HENRY: Um-hum.

6 MR. KORESH: And I don't, I don't agree with  
7 that, even if they're my own, see. So the thing of it  
8 is is that, like I say, I've been faithfully sending  
9 them out. Not just because I'm trying to, to, to buy  
10 time, but because I just don't want them involved in  
11 this.

12 HENRY: Um-hum.

13 MR. KORESH: You know? And trying to, to  
14 walk the middle of the road to make it as fair for us,  
15 you know, and as fair for you. But, actually, on my  
16 side, I'm going to make it fair for me first. Just  
17 like your, your side, you're going to make it fair for  
18 you first. So, you see, we both know where we're  
19 coming from on that area. You've got me, okay? Like  
20 you say, you know, we're sitting here listening to the  
21 radio and everyone on the radio keeps continually  
22 saying you all are going to storm us, you all sent,  
23 you sent -- You know, this is what they're saying now.  
24 I'm not saying that that's true.

25 HENRY: Okay.

1           MR. KORESH: See? So you're being -- If  
2 you're honest and you're being dirty dealt with, just  
3 like I have been dirty dealt with, you see? And it's  
4 a different situation, but still it's the same thing.

5           HENRY: Well --

6           MR. KORESH: They're saying that you're  
7 going to do something and it's going on national  
8 radio, state radio at least, and people are out there  
9 listening and you're not correcting it, you know. And  
10 they're saying well, the fog is a good cover and this  
11 is going to happen and, and we've seen these many  
12 vehicles and they're moving up and, and, you know --  
13 Well, you're not, you're not getting on those boys  
14 saying now, wait a minute, you know, we're not doing  
15 that. No, they're, they're incessantly tormenting us,  
16 you know, and they're telling us what you guys are  
17 doing.

18           HENRY: Exactly. But one of the things that  
19 we've been doing is we've been ignoring the press  
20 because we don't want the press to know what we are or  
21 are not doing, you know, and that's why we haven't  
22 said anything one way or the other.

23           MR. KORESH: All right.

24           HENRY: That's why the press doesn't have  
25 the correct story, because we're just --

1 MR. KORESH: But the press --

2 HENRY: -- not talking to them.

3 MR. KORESH: The press, you know, you all  
4 pulled them back because, you know, they feel that  
5 when you all come in here and, and bang us all up and  
6 everything that you don't want them to get it on  
7 footage.

8 HENRY: But the press was saying last night  
9 that we were storming the place at eight o'clock, and  
10 I told you we weren't, and we haven't. And even when  
11 you thought that somebody was on the roof, I told you  
12 that we were not.

13 MR. KORESH: Yeah, that's true.

14 HENRY: And we didn't.

15 MR. KORESH: And that's in your favor, I  
16 agree.

17 HENRY: Okay. So, you know, I would like  
18 for you, you know, in order for me to, to, to be able  
19 to, to sell all of this to my bosses, I need a little  
20 bit of help from you. Now, what I can do, or what I'd  
21 like to do is let me talk to them in terms of selling  
22 this to KRLD and maybe we can have KRLD then go  
23 national during prime time. And if we do that, will  
24 you agree to come out at that time?

25 MR. KORESH: When you've done the national.

1 HENRY: Okay.

2 MR. KORESH: You can do KRLD and I'll still  
3 send the children.

4 HENRY: Okay.

5 MR. KORESH: You know.

6 HENRY: All of them?

7 MR. KORESH: Not all of them yet. Like I  
8 say, when you go national, then they'll all come, all  
9 of us come.

10 HENRY: Okay. Let's do this.

11 MR. KORESH: That, that's the agreement we  
12 originally made.

13 HENRY: Okay. And that's fine, but, but  
14 let's consider doing one, one thing. Supposing we do  
15 this. When the -- you send out the two kids to --  
16 with the tape, give me two kids and two women. How  
17 about that?

18 MR. KORESH: See, there we're --

19 HENRY: Well, I'm just saying I've got to  
20 sell this because --

21 MR. KORESH: Look, look, there's one thing  
22 that binds us all here together.

23 HENRY: Um-hum.

24 MR. KORESH: It's the truth I'm sending in  
25 that tape. Now, these women, if they were to come out

1 to you right now, you know, knowing how so far we've  
2 been dealt with -- We've been dealt with straight  
3 across the table, but there is some shadow there. You  
4 know, they're not going to trust you until you have  
5 ultimately shown beyond a shadow of a doubt, you know,  
6 that you have kept your full end of the bargain.

7           So, you know, it's, it's like, it's like --  
8 What you're asking me to do is you're asking me to use  
9 my influence --

10           HENRY: Um-hum.

11           MR. KORESH: -- to barter someone else's  
12 decision to deal with the effects of what we have  
13 believed in, because you all fail to understand what  
14 we're believing in. The Constitution -- Watch the  
15 baby, please -- in, in written form, though there's  
16 many interpretations, constitutional law says that we  
17 are to have religious -- freedom for religion. But,  
18 of course, it has quotas to where we've got to define  
19 what religion is and is not acceptable.

20           HENRY: Um-hum.

21           MR. KORESH: Okay? Now, we do condone a  
22 Bible religion, but then there comes in the aspect of  
23 interpretation. So someone's interpretation could be  
24 wrong and therefore making their religion wrong. And  
25 if that religion hurts others, if it confines others

1 or binds others, then definitely we have to take a  
2 stand and present it to the public so that the public,  
3 which is our judicial system, realistically, can  
4 decide that well, no, this is incorrect, and we have  
5 to, in means, deal with the person that's going  
6 contrary to, to what the person is saying the  
7 scripture says.

8           You know, people can screw things up. And  
9 that religion is a false religion, for sure.

10           HENRY: Um-hum.

11           MR. KORESH: Okay. Now, I agree with you on  
12 all of these things, you know, and I love America, you  
13 know. And you'll find in my past record that, you  
14 know, I'm not a bad person. In 1988, if you research  
15 that so-called gun battle, you'll find out I went  
16 plenty of times to the Sheriff's Department and asked  
17 them to come out here and deal with George Roden on  
18 that corpse abuse thing. You know, if you research  
19 that, you'll find that out.

20           And when I was told point-blank that I had  
21 to get these pictures, and, as we were walking out  
22 Sheriff Dixon says now, boys, be careful, you know,  
23 there are some dangerous customers out there.

24           HENRY: Um-hum.

25           MR. KORESH: Now, that's when I had to stop



1 and think now, what does he know that I don't know? I  
2 didn't know Donny Joe Harvey or Orville Wells yet. I  
3 didn't know that George was involved in coke and also  
4 in methamphetamine. I didn't know those things then.

5 HENRY: Um-hum.

6 MR. KORESH: So, you know, why the system  
7 did not -- Well, like I say, this is a lot of water  
8 under a bridge.

9 HENRY: Right.

10 MR. KORESH: But it did make me look bad.  
11 And the thing of it was was that the weapons that we  
12 purchased, which you can look on all the yellow  
13 sheets, at that time everything we had was with a  
14 yellow sheet.

15 HENRY: Um-hum.

16 MR. KORESH: Everything we bought was with a  
17 yellow sheet. Everything. You'll find that those  
18 things were bought locally and also in from Palestine.  
19 There were basic Rugers, you know, and stuff, which  
20 at that time was considered, you know, a rodent gun,  
21 you know.

22 HENRY: Um-hum.

23 MR. KORESH: Of course, we know that the  
24 5.56 is also a military, too.

25 HENRY: Right.

1                   MR. KORESH: But, anyway, the thing of it is  
2 is that it gets blown out of proportion.

3                   HENRY: Right. And I think one of the  
4 things that we're talking about and what we're trying  
5 to resolve here is, is that everybody's either fears  
6 or concerns about what might or might not happen. I,  
7 I think that what your concern is, your main concern  
8 is that we might attack you, okay? And --

8                   MR. KORESH: Well, if you attack us, it just  
9 comes down to this.

10                  HENRY: Okay, but we're not -- We have no  
11 intentions of doing that.

12                  MR. KORESH: I know, but it just comes down  
13 to this, though. You end up killing us.

14                  HENRY: Okay. And our concern is that,  
15 that --

16                  MR. KORESH: And then you'll have a story  
17 the way you had it. You'll -- There's no, there's no  
18 media around us.

19                  HENRY: Well, we don't --

20                  MR. KORESH: You'll say that we attacked you  
21 and this, that.

22                  HENRY: No. Our concern is that you're not  
23 going to come out and that you might commit suicide.

24                  MR. KORESH: Oh, look, if I wanted to commit  
25

1 suicide, I would have done it already. Now, let me  
2 explain something.

3 HENRY: Well --

4 MR. KORESH: We were accused three times  
5 this last year of going to commit suicide. Three  
6 times. The authorities were roused up by letters from  
7 MARTBRO (phonetic sp.) and all that. Here we, here  
8 we've been digging lakes in the front, fixing this  
9 place up from a rat hill, hoping that one day we might  
10 have this place finished, to be able to present it  
11 true to all those who want to come. But at the same  
12 time, knowing that as long as there were people who  
13 would not look at the truth, we could not sit with  
14 idle expectation and think that we're always going to  
15 be able to, to have this freedom that we've enjoyed.

16 We've never gone outside our boundaries.  
17 We've done things that are legal. You know, always  
18 suspicion on every hand, you know, but the thing of it  
19 is is that if there is anything in question, we need  
20 to take it to the Bible. Christians are supposed to  
21 take it to the law and the testimony of God's  
22 scripture. Now, otherwise, we are commanded by  
23 scripture to abide by the laws of the land in every  
24 degree, as long as those laws don't 100 percent  
25 conflict with the law of God.

1                   In Nebuchadnezzar's day, when Nebuchadnezzar  
2 had that dream, you know, Daniel and them were subject  
3 to the Babylonian kingdom, weren't they? They kept  
4 the laws of Chaldea, didn't they? But when it came  
5 for Nebuchadnezzar to make that image and he commanded  
6 all people to bow to it --

6                   HENRY: Um-hum.

7                   MR. KORESH: -- you know, (indiscernible) we  
8 will not be careful in answering this to you, king, we  
9 will not bow down to your law which goes against our  
10 God's law. Well, the acid test came. They threw  
11 those boys in the fire, didn't they?

11                   HENRY: Um-hum.

12                   MR. KORESH: But who protected them? God  
13 did. Now, we're in the fire now. Not a real fire.  
14 And, like I say, we believe that America is a great  
15 nation and that it, like Assyria or Nineva of old, can  
16 hear the message of Jonah and it can have a chance to  
17 say hey, you know, this, this -- what this guy's  
18 teaching out of the book is straight out of the Bible,  
19 it's in harmony, it's perfect. Maybe there's been a  
20 misunderstanding here.

20                   HENRY: Well, what -- If we can go back and  
21 clarify our agreement so that you feel comfortable --

22                   MR. KORESH: Right.

1           HENRY:  -- and everybody feels comfortable.  
2     And what it comes down to is real trust, you know,  
3     and we need to -- you need to have trust in us and we  
4     need to have trust in you.  Can you give me either all  
5     of the children or two children and two women?  And,  
6     you know, and we'll give what I said.  I will give you  
7     the KRLD and then going to national media right  
8     thereafter.

9           MR. KORESH:  Let me, let me talk about this  
10    with, with some --

11           HENRY:  You know, if we don't do what we say  
12    that we're going to do, the women will be able to give  
13    testimony against us.  Are we going to look good --

14           MR. KORESH:  No, no.  Come on.

15           HENRY:  -- in the eyes of everybody?

16           MR. KORESH:  Come on.

17           HENRY:  We will look awful.

18           MR. KORESH:  Look --

19           HENRY:  We will look awful.

20           MR. KORESH:  Oh, Henry --

21           HENRY:  Um-hum.

22           MR. KORESH:  -- how many times has the  
23    federal government --

24           HENRY:  I have not -- I have been straight  
25    with you, with -- in everything that we've talked

1 about. I've been straight with you all the way. I  
2 told you we would keep everybody away from, from the  
3 place, and we have. You know, we offered you gasoline  
4 when you didn't have gasoline.

5 MR. KORESH: I'm just thinking about all the  
6 past cases of where the -- Like I say, we both know  
7 what I'm talking about.

8 HENRY: Whatever past cases I've had --

9 MR. KORESH: But this is our case, this is  
10 our case. Me and you are talking and --

11 HENRY: Exactly. Exactly. This is you and  
12 me --

13 MR. KORESH: Okay.

14 HENRY: -- and, and --

15 MR. KORESH: So you're worried about me  
16 committing suicide. All right.

17 HENRY: We don't want anybody committing  
18 suicide.

19 MR. KORESH: Okay.

20 HENRY: And we want to get you out of there  
21 as soon as possible because, you know, your blood  
22 pressure isn't all that good. You're not, you know,  
23 with all those blankets that you have on you, you  
24 should be sweating a little bit, and you're not.

25 MR. KORESH: Well, how cold is it in this

1 room?

2 HENRY: I understand that.

3 MR. KORESH: Low forties.

4 HENRY: I understand that, but your injury -  
5 -you've had that injury for some time now. You need  
6 attention.

6 MR. KORESH: Yeah.

7 HENRY: You know, there for a while you said  
8 your mind was going blank, you know. Periodically, I  
9 feel that you have a shortness of breath. Those are  
10 not good signs. We need to get attention, medical  
11 attention for you. So I don't want this thing to drag  
12 out and, and have your death on my hands. I don't  
13 want that. Give me a chance to help you.

13 MR. KORESH: Well --

14 HENRY: Give me a chance to help everybody.

15 MR. KORESH: -- that's what we were working  
16 out. Now you're twisting up again.

17 HENRY: No, I'm not.

18 MR. KORESH: You said that we would play  
19 this thing on national.

19 HENRY: We will. And that's exact --

20 MR. KORESH: And I told you --

21 HENRY: That's exactly what we're going to  
22 do.

1           MR. KORESH: And then we would, you know,  
2 all come out. And I told you, I said well, look, I'll  
3 go ahead and I'll send a tape and I'll send you out  
4 two more children, and you said that's fine. And then  
5 you said we'll play it on KRLD and you didn't say  
6 anything about we'll play it on, play it on KRLD and  
7 then we'll send everybody out. You didn't say that.  
8 And so, you know, now you're saying something  
9 different. Now, that's honest, Henry, that's honestly  
10 what's happening. And then you're doing the same  
11 thing that, that Jim's doing.

12           You're saying your bosses, your bosses. I  
13 mean, I mean, this is not Burger King management here,  
14 you know. You're the negotiator, you're the one's  
15 that got a lot of, a lot of power, don't you?

16           HENRY: Well, I don't have as much, you  
17 know, I don't have all the power. I still have  
18 bosses. Okay, now, you're in charge there and it's  
19 quite easy for you to make the decision if you choose  
20 to do so. Now, I've been real straight with you and  
21 I've pushed real hard for a lot of the things that  
22 you've wanted, and I will continue to do that. But I  
23 need a little bit of help from you.

24           MR. KORESH: Okay, let me, like I said --  
25 Finishing this tape is being dragged out now, too,



1 | so --

2 |           HENRY: Okay.

3 |           MR. KORESH: -- let me -- I'll have to, I'll  
4 | have to get with these, you know, especially some of  
5 | these girls and talk to them.

6 |           HENRY: Okay. Can I get two kids now?

7 |           MR. KORESH: Well, as soon as I get my tape  
8 | finished.

9 |           HENRY: How about now, while you're still  
10 | working on it?

11 |           MR. KORESH: Well, that's not what we agreed  
12 | on.

13 |           HENRY: I'm not, you know, I'm just asking  
14 | you if you will consider doing that.

15 |           MR. KORESH: See, you're making it  
16 | complicated 'cause, like I say, are we going to send  
17 | some mothers out with these children? Now, that's  
18 | going to take some work on my part.

19 |           HENRY: Okay.

20 |           MR. KORESH: You know? And, like I say,  
21 | these people know the seals and they know that unless  
22 | this country observes and sees, then they know point-  
23 | blank what's going to happen according to the  
24 | prophecies. That's why our main burden is holding out  
25 | here until we have an opportunity to state our cause.

1 You know, what did Nicodemus say? He says did our  
2 law judge any many before the hearing? We're talking  
3 about the Jewish law, which is law of God. Now, we  
4 know the law of man does, but, you know, that's where  
5 me and you, we kind of, kind of have a little  
6 friction, because I want to serve your laws where they  
7 coincide with God's laws.

8 And America does. Above all of the nations.  
9 It does. You know, it's the closest to God's laws,  
10 basic principles of common sense, you know. But,  
11 again, there are some laws in the scriptures of truth  
12 which are the laws of prophecy, you know, and these  
13 laws are great laws because they're additional to the  
14 Ten Commandment law, such as the law of forgive them  
15 father, they don't know what they do.

16 HENRY: Um-hum.

17 MR. KORESH: See, now, that's a law. You  
18 have to forgive people based on their ignorance.

19 HENRY: Okay.

20 MR. KORESH: Now, the next law, which let's  
21 say the Ten Commandments is Christ, right?

22 HENRY: Um-hum.

23 MR. KORESH: So the 11th commandment is  
24 forgive them, okay? So every man that, that does err,  
25 we have to forgive him 'cause they don't know what

1 they're doing.

2 HENRY: Um-hum.

3 MR. KORESH: So then the 12th law will be  
4 into they hand I commit my spirit, which means, like  
5 Isaiah 51 says, when God says hearken to me, you who  
6 seek after righteousness, you who seek the Lord, look  
7 to the rock (indiscernible) You know, God is that rock  
8 on that throne, isn't he?

8 HENRY: Um-hum.

9 MR. KORESH: And it says behold my people,  
10 give ear to me, oh, my nation, for a law shall proceed  
11 from me and I will make my judgment to rest for a  
12 light to the people. And in that judgment, that law  
13 is Christ coming, the seventh seal.

13 HENRY: Um-hum.

14 MR. KORESH: Now, that's why without you  
15 knowing where these seven seals are in the Bible, you  
16 know, you wouldn't know how to judge me.

17 HENRY: Exactly.

18 MR. KORESH: Except by your law. And I  
19 respect that. See, I'm willing to come out and be  
20 observed and judged by your --

20 HENRY: Okay.

21 MR. KORESH: -- law.

22 HENRY: Okay.

1                   MR. KORESH: But if you allow me to first  
2 speak my law.

3                   HENRY: And I have no problems with allowing  
4 you. Talk, talk to the people there, talk to the  
5 women. I'll call you back in about 15 minutes and,  
6 and you can let me know --

7                   MR. KORESH: Okay.

8                   HENRY: -- what the decision is. In the  
9 meantime, you're also going to be working on the  
10 preamble and the tape.

11                   MR. KORESH: Okay. What's the preamble?

12                   HENRY: That's, that's where you're going to  
13 explain our agreement to the --

14                   MR. KORESH: Oh, okay, right. Okay.

15                   HENRY: Okay?

16                   MR. KORESH: Right. All right.

17                   HENRY: Okay. So I'll call you back in a  
18 little bit.

19                   MR. KORESH: Okay.

20                   HENRY: Okay?

21                   MR. KORESH: Okay. I'm going to have to do  
22 some adjustment here now, so --

23                   HENRY: Okay.

24                   MR. KORESH: Okay, I'll talk to you in a  
25 little bit.

1 HENRY: Okay. I'll talk to you. Bye-bye.

2 \* \* \* \* \*

3 RITA: Hello?

4 HENRY: Hi.

5 RITA: Hi.

6 HENRY: This is Henry.

7 RITA: Okay, Henry, you want to speak to

David?

8 HENRY: Yes. Who is this?

9 RITA: It's Rita again.

10 HENRY: Thank you, Rita.

11 RITA: Okay.

12 MR. KORESH: Wait a minute. Had this ear  
plug again.

13 HENRY: What?

14 MR. KORESH: I said I had the ear plug in  
15 again.

16 HENRY: Oh, okay.

17 MR. KORESH: I keep putting the phone with  
the ear plug.

18 HENRY: Oh, okay.

19 MR. KORESH: Okay, here's the deal.

20 HENRY: Okay.

21 MR. KORESH: I'm going to make this tape.

22 Now, you know, some of these younger girls, you know,

1 they don't want to go, you know, and I, I explained to  
2 them, I said look, I says, you know, our main thing,  
3 Sarah knows anyway, and it's the truth. You know, the  
4 truth. You know?

5 HENRY: Um-hum.

6 MR. KORESH: And I explained to them again,  
7 'cause, you know, they -- the girls have the different  
8 rooms, and talked to them, but I explained to them, I  
9 said, you know, our whole purpose is our message. We  
10 have a message and the world's ignorant of what we  
11 believe in the Bible, so they're ignorant about what  
12 we're doing.

13 HENRY: Um-hum.

14 MR. KORESH: So, I says, you know, I've  
15 talked to the guy and he's concerned that we're going  
16 to, you know, same old story, we're going to all zap  
17 ourselves, you know. Why wouldn't we have zapped  
18 ourselves already, anyway, Henry? I mean, come on.

19 HENRY: You know --

20 MR. KORESH: See, that's what they --  
21 Anyway, I'm sorry, I didn't mean to get off the track.

22 HENRY: Okay.

23 MR. KORESH: Here's the deal. So some of  
24 the, some of the older -- You know, we have quite a  
25 few older ladies here, too.

1 HENRY: Okay.

2 MR. KORESH: And I told them, I said, look,  
3 I says, you know, you all, you know, you all -- 'Cause  
4 they, they've been quite shocked, you know. I told  
5 him, I said, look, you all, you all are not really  
6 involved in anything, you know, you all believe the  
7 message and believe the truth. I says, but, remember,  
8 that's the main thing, is the truth is what we all  
stand for.

9 HENRY: Okay.

10 MR. KORESH: And I says you can probably  
11 also help present to the people the truth.

12 HENRY: Um-hum.

13 MR. KORESH: And so, you know, I've, I've  
14 been talking to them. I said, look, here's the deal,  
15 you know, you can either witness for God here, and  
16 probably don't want to listen to us, or if you had a  
17 chance to, to be on the outside, you could witness to  
him there.

18 HENRY: Um-hum.

19 MR. KORESH: You know, 'cause people are  
20 going to want to know why we've done these crazy  
21 things. Now, next thing -- We didn't give them a  
22 bunch of baloney. But I said, you know, you're the  
ones that are supposed to be the victims. So, you

1 know, if you're out there, you can do a greater  
2 witness for God, you know, being out there to show  
3 them that you do want to live, 'cause, you know, a  
4 dead Christian is a dead Christian.

5 HENRY: Right.

6 MR. KORESH: A live Christian is a witness.

7 HENRY: Um-hum.

8 MR. KORESH: So, you know, and so I  
9 explained to them, you know, if, if, if you all can,  
10 you know, realize that -- See, the thing of it is we  
11 don't teach that America has to be punished. We teach  
12 that God grants unto men an opportunity to see his  
13 mistake in the light of God's word, and then repent of  
14 it.

15 HENRY: Um-hum.

16 MR. KORESH: You know? And so that's the  
17 whole thing. So this, this is where me and Jim had a  
18 good relationship on the phone, because, you know, I  
19 began to explain things to him. He, like you, is an  
20 excellent listener and he began to realize that we're  
21 not trying to be just radical idiots, you know, with  
22 ragging our head off, you know, talking about  
23 Armegeddon and stuff.

24 HENRY: Um-hum.

25 MR. KORESH: You know, Armegeddon is -- the



1 prophecies tell you is an end of time when God  
2 resurrects all the people that have ever lived and  
3 they attack the city of God. Ezekial talks about it.

4 So, you know, anyway, it's not a few handful of  
5 maniacs trying to fight. That's not Armegeddon at  
6 all.

6 HENRY: Okay.

7 MR. KORESH: But, anyway, so the thing of it  
8 is is that, you know, there's, there's, you know,  
9 there's three of them here that are, you know,  
10 deciding on, you know, whether, you know, they want to  
11 go or not.

11 HENRY: Okay.

12 MR. KORESH: And so I'm talking to them a  
13 bit more now, but -- So it appears to be, like I say,  
14 I told them what, what you promised to do for us, you  
15 know, for us, which is for God, right?

16 HENRY: Um-hum.

17 MR. KORESH: Because you're doing it for our  
18 God.

18 HENRY: Um-hum.

19 MR. KORESH: You know, for our belief in  
20 God.

21 HENRY: Um-hum.

22 MR. KORESH: And, and so, therefore, you  
23

1 know, this is the whole reason for the truth, anyway,  
2 is to, is to be able to have what we believe known.

3 HENRY: Okay.

4 MR. KORESH: These people can decide better,  
5 and then you can ask us questions if we're alive.

6 HENRY: Right.

7 MR. KORESH: And if we're gone, then, you  
8 know, no, no good. I agree with you guys, you know.  
9 Two children, that's the, that's the main thing. And  
10 two, two of the women here.

11 HENRY: Okay. That sounds real good. I  
12 really appreciate it.

13 MR. KORESH: Okay? Now, that's -- Now,  
14 remember, they're doing, they're doing this --

15 HENRY: I understand.

16 MR. KORESH: -- simply because, you know --  
17 Now, I'm telling them point-blank you all may not, you  
18 know, be 100 percent, but still their faith is in God.  
19 So, you know, if you get them on the outside and all  
20 that and don't do your end of the bargain --

21 HENRY: No, we will. But, you know, that,  
22 that'll start, that'll start the ball rolling and  
23 we'll both reach our goals. Okay?

24 MR. KORESH: Okay. Well, I'll --

25 HENRY: Now --

1 MR. KORESH: I'll tell them that.

2 HENRY: Okay. Now, what I want to do is I  
3 want to, to get your tape as soon as I can. One of  
4 the things that we're considering, because a lot in  
5 terms of radio, prime time is when the commute is on,  
6 okay?

6 MR. KORESH: The what now?

7 HENRY: When the commuters are driving to  
8 work is when prime time is on radioland, okay? So  
9 you're working on the tape and should have it for me  
10 soon. Is that correct?

11 MR. KORESH: Well, if I, if I get a chance  
12 to keep making it.

12 HENRY: Okay.

13 MR. KORESH: But prime time, I thought, was  
14 the time the people are driving home, when they get  
15 home in the evening.

16 HENRY: Well --

17 MR. KORESH: That's prime time.

18 HENRY: Radio I think is, is when everybody  
19 is going to work, don't you think? I mean, that's  
20 when everybody really listens to the radio.

21 MR. KORESH: Well, that's, that's not  
22 really -- Ask, ask the producers and they'll tell you  
23 opposite. But, anyway, like I said, you'll be playing  
24

1 the Dallas one first, right?

2 HENRY: We're going to play Dallas and then  
3 we hope to go to national right away.

4 MR. KORESH: Okay. Now, 'cause I'm sure,  
5 like you say, the subject matter'll be intense enough,  
6 especially if radio stations could broadcast that it's  
7 coming.

8 HENRY: Exactly.

9 MR. KORESH: You know? And then that way,  
10 you know, yeah, we could, like you said, and Arizona  
11 will be from 11 to 1 or something, right?

12 HENRY: Um-hum. But --

13 MR. KORESH: Okay, that's good.

14 HENRY: But we want to go on this right  
15 away. We're not going to wait till 11 o'clock.

16 MR. KORESH: Oh, no, with the tape, the tape  
17 needs to be given to you as early as possible.

18 HENRY: Yes. And as soon as we do that,  
19 we're going to go national. We'll go on KRLD and, and  
20 then after that, we'll go national.

21 MR. KORESH: All right. And the national  
22 will be 11 o'clock, right?

23 HENRY: It'll be as soon as, as -- right  
24 after KRLD plays it.

25 MR. KORESH: Well, how can that be then? I

1 mean, how are you going to be able to get the tape to,  
2 to Arizona?

3 HENRY: Well, we're -- Everybody, or a lot  
4 of, a lot of the national radio stations are here, you  
5 know, in this general area. So we're going to find  
6 somebody, you know, that's a national radio --

7 MR. KORESH: I see. So you're not going to  
8 be playing it around 11 or 12 then?

9 HENRY: We're going to play it at 11 and 12  
10 o'clock, too. But, you know, but, you know --

11 MR. KORESH: Well, that's, that's when we're  
12 coming out then, around 11 and 12, national time. Do  
13 we have an agreement on that?

14 HENRY: Well, you know, if that's --

15 MR. KORESH: That's what you told me before.

16 HENRY: Well, I told --

17 MR. KORESH: I asked you twice.

18 HENRY: Okay. And, and that's fine, I have  
19 no problem. I, you know, I want to get you as soon as  
20 I can to receive some medical attention.

21 MR. KORESH: Yeah, I --

22 HENRY: And that's why I've been wanting to  
23 get, you know, working from my end, pushing the bosses  
24 here to find me a way to get this into prime time or  
25 national radio station or whatever, so that I can get

1 | you some medical attention.

2 |           MR. KORESH: Okay. So, like I say, I could  
3 | more than, I could more than last, I'm sure, till 12  
4 | o'clock. It'll be our time, right?

5 |           HENRY: Okay. Okay, well --

6 |           MR. KORESH: Like I say, that's when we'll  
7 | come all out.

8 |           HENRY: Okay, well, that's fine.

9 |           MR. KORESH: We're going to, we're going  
10 | to -- Like I say, once I get this tape finished and,  
11 | like I said, I'm trying to get it done now. I mean,  
12 | I --

13 |           HENRY: Okay.

14 |           MR. KORESH: You know, I need to get it --  
15 | hurry up and get it done.

16 |           HENRY: Okay.

17 |           MR. KORESH: And, and I'm pretty sure we're  
18 | going to have two women for you and two children.

19 |           HENRY: Okay.

20 |           MR. KORESH: Okay?

21 |           HENRY: That's fine.

22 |           MR. KORESH: Are we, are we in tune?

23 |           HENRY: We're in tune.

24 |           MR. KORESH: Okay, thanks, Henry.

25 |           HENRY: Thank you.

1                   MR. KORESH:  God bless you now.  We'll talk  
2 to you later, okay?

3                   HENRY:  Okay, I'll talk to you later.

4                   MR. KORESH:  Okay.  Call me around -- Well,  
5 what time is it right now?

6                   HENRY:  It's a little after six.

7                   MR. KORESH:  Already?  Okay, give me a few  
8 minutes here and then let me let this out, okay?

9                   HENRY:  Okay.  I'll call you back in a  
10 little bit.

11                   MR. KORESH:  Okay, bye.

12                   HENRY:  Bye-bye.
