1 RACHEL: Well, you said that he needs to
2 lead his people through to the end. Well, they're
3 God's people so --

4 HENRY: I'm sorry?

5 RACHEL: I said you said that he needs to
6 lead his people through to the end and they're God's
7 people.

8 HENRY: That's right, but -- is depending on
9 him and it's not just the people that are within the
10 compound. Okay? I want to be given an opportunity to
11 help him. I sincerely, truly want to help him, but I
12 can't help him if, if I can't speak to him. I can't
13 help him if he doesn't permit me to help him, and I
14 sincerely, truly want to help him.

15 RACHEL: What do you mean that there are
16 people out there need him? What have you heard?

17 HENRY: What has happened is a lot of people
18 placed a lot of importance on his message. What has
19 happened is everybody listened in its entirety to the
20 messages that were broadcast, both on, on the
21 Christian Network and on KRLD.

22 RACHEL: Um-hum.

23 HENRY: Now, everybody is still thinking
24 that he is going to lead his people out just like
25 Moses did and just like David slew the giant. They

1 feel that he needs to slay fear, that he is just
2 afraid. That's what the thinking is.

3 RACHEL: They think that --

4 HENRY: We need for him to take on the
5 giant. He needs to lead the people out of the
6 compound. He needs to -- the people need to know that
7 he is not hiding. If he is going to die, so be it,
8 but he need not die isolated because it's important.
9 He gave his word. He needs to come out.

10 RACHEL: Well, like you said, if you -- if
11 you're comparing him to Moses leading the children of
12 Israel out and God directed Moses, right? Well, then
13 we relay the message to you that God told him to wait,
14 the same God that revealed to him the seven seals, so
15 that was our message to you. So you're trying to tell
16 me something different than what God is leading him to
17 do.

18 HENRY: I am not telling you anything
19 different. What I am telling you is that a lot, a lot
20 of Christian people who listened to that message
21 sincerely, truly believed his word. He needs to make
22 an effort to continue in that vein. A lot of people
23 went on the line for him. A lot of people are
24 believing. He needs to go all the way. People
25 believe that he is scared. He needs to know that and

1 he needs to deal with that.

2 (Pause. Rachel having conversation with
3 unidentified persons, not discernible.)

4 HENRY: Rachel?

5 RACHEL: Yes.

6 HENRY: Could you please give him the phone?
7 He doesn't need to talk. I just want him to listen.

8 RACHEL: Well, when I told him that a minute
9 ago, he gave me the message to give to you and you
10 didn't respond either, so what more can I do?

11 HENRY: Could you please let him listen to,
12 to what I need to say to him, please? I can't imagine
13 that he can be afraid to listen to me or that you can
14 be afraid to have him listen to what I need to say to
15 him. Rachel? We started something. We need to
16 finish it. We can't stop in midstream. We need to
17 complete this mission. There are a lot of people, not
18 simply the people that are within the compound, that
19 are waiting for the outcome of this. If he is going
20 to die, then he is going to die, but he should not die
21 within the compound so that his word is not completed.

22 He gave his word. It's imperative that he not die
23 within the compound. There are a lot of people that
24 are looking to see what is going to happen. The news
25 media is, is looking at this simply as a cult. He

1 doesn't want to be seen as a cult leader. He needs to
2 make the sacrifice.

3 RACHEL: And that's why we're waiting
4 because that's what God told him to do is to wait, and
5 right now he's sleeping and all I can say to you is
6 you're going to have to wait a little longer and maybe
7 you could talk to him a little bit later. That's all
8 I can do right now. We're all sitting here waiting
9 just like you are.

10 HENRY: Can you at least put the phone to
11 him so that he can listen to me? Is that possible?

12 RACHEL: Henry?

13 HENRY: Yes.

14 RACHEL: You're trying to keep you and the
15 people out there off of us and he's trying to keep God
16 and his army off of you. God is very powerful, you
17 know, and when he gets angry -- if you read Nahum,
18 you'll understand very clearly --

19 HENRY: I understand.

20 RACHEL: -- and Psalms 18.

21 HENRY: I understand and I don't want him to
22 feel that he is causing us any problems. What I want
23 him to think about is not simply the people within the
24 compound. He needs to think in terms of the effect
25 that he had because he went over national radio and

1 television. There are a lot of people that are
2 depending and waiting watchfully to see whether this
3 is a man of his word. He has a very powerful message
4 and he has an excellent way of presenting things, but,
5 but we need -- if other people are going to be
6 influenced, if the message of the seven seals is going
7 to be taken seriously, we need for him to come out of
8 there. It's imperative that he come out of there
9 today. Even if he didn't live up to coming out
10 immediately, he needs to think in terms of coming out
today.

11 (Pause. Henry having off the record
12 conversation with unidentified person.)

13 HENRY: Can he hear me, Rachel?

14 RACHEL: He heard some of what you said.

15 HENRY: Okay. People, because of his name,
16 David, are looking at him in a very symbolic fashion.
17 They see him as the little guy that's going to tell
18 the giant. They see fear as the giant. He needs to
19 come out. He needs to come out and slay the giant.
20 We don't want him to die within the compound. He made
21 a promise. A lot of people are waiting to see if he's
22 going to live up to his word. He has always in my
23 dealings with him lived up to his word. He has not
24 told one single lie. He has not said anything that he
25

1 did not live up to. We need to encourage him. We
2 need to encourage him to not die within the compound.
3 We need to encourage him especially with --

4 RACHEL: Henry?

5 HENRY: Yes.

6 RACHEL: He said he'll talk to you. Do you
7 have your Bible?

8 HENRY: Yes.

9 RACHEL: Okay. But he didn't hear all of
10 what you just told me.

11 HENRY: Okay.

12 RACHEL: Okay. Here he is.

13 HENRY: David? David?

14 DAVID KORESH: Hello, Henry.

15 HENRY: Hi, David. How are you?

16 DAVID KORESH: I'm doing fine. I'm doing
17 all I can right now.

18 HENRY: David?

19 DAVID KORESH: Sir?

20 HENRY: I want to help you.

21 DAVID KORESH: I know and I want to help you
22 and I want to help everyone that's around this place.

23 HENRY: Okay.

24 DAVID KORESH: But you've got to help me
25 help you.

1 HENRY: And you need to help me help you.

2 DAVID KORESH: And this is --

3 HENRY: There are a lot of people, there are
4 a lot of people --

5 DAVID KORESH: Um-hum.

6 HENRY: -- that listened to your message.

7 DAVID KORESH: I know.

8 HENRY: There are a lot of people that
9 watched it on television. Everybody is, is waiting to
10 see because of your name and because they see you as
11 David who is going to slay the giant and they see the
12 giant as being fear.

13 DAVID KORESH: Revelation -- no.
14 Revelation:13 says --

15 HENRY: Listen to me for a second. I
16 listened to you for, for a lot of time yesterday. I
17 put myself --

18 DAVID KORESH: But now why --

19 HENRY: Please, please, please give me the
20 opportunity. I put myself in your hands yesterday. I
21 listened to everything and we were able to reach a
22 very good working relationship. Please listen to what
23 I am hearing from this end. There are a lot of people
24 within the Christian community that believe in you,
25 believe in what you said and believe in what you're

1 doing. There is a tremendous responsibility now on
2 your shoulders, not just for the people that are
3 within the compound. That is a very minor number of
4 the people that we're talking about. There are a lot
5 of people that are waiting anxiously to see if you're
6 going to live up to your word. I know that you will.

7 I've never doubted that. Okay? But the, but the
8 thing is you need to come out. I know that you're
9 fading because you're sick, because you're injured,
10 because your blood pressure is going down. We can't
11 let you die within the compound. If you're going to
12 die, that's fine. That's God will. But you need to
13 come out so that people can believe.

14 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Is that it?

15 HENRY: There are many, many people,
16 millions of people, that heard you. You promised that
17 you would come out immediately. Okay, you didn't come
18 out immediately because you had to, to listen to God.

19 He needed to talk to you. That's fine. Do not let
20 this date go by because some of the people will fall
21 by the wayside. You started something very big. We
22 need to see this through.

23 DAVID KORESH: Do you have your Bible with
24 you now, Henry?

25 HENRY: Yes.

1 DAVID KORESH: Can you turn to Psalms 18?

2 HENRY: Hold on a second. Okay.

3 DAVID KORESH: David of old was inspired as
4 a God who gave him a prophecy or a vision to where he
5 could see in the future of a greater battle. In the
6 earlier times of nations when they were more nomadic
7 and they were more of the primitive origins of kings
8 and cultic rulers --

8 HENRY: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: -- God blessed nations
10 pertaining to the direction that their kings chose to
11 go.

12 HENRY: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: And David, being a shepherd's
14 boy and having love for sheep and his flock, was
15 chosen of God by God and his other brethren, but yet
16 seven others were not chosen. There's two types of
17 nature. There's the nature of David as a king and
18 there's the nature of Saul.

18 HENRY: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: There's the proud, the
20 arrogant and the self-sufficient which God cannot
21 accept and then there are those who are humble and
22 non-self-reliable and they have to look to a stronger
23 power. Now, like I said, who has the key of David?

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1 In the book of Revelation to the Church of
2 Philadelphia, you know, these things they get holy.
3 He had had the key of David. He had opened that no
4 one can shut. And when I shut, no one can open. Now,
5 that's Christ talking and that's why in the latter
6 days in Psalms 18 when the key begins to open all the
7 Psalms you can hear Christ talk, not just out of his
8 mouth in the flesh, but out of a book declaring the
9 end from the beginning and from ancient times things
10 not yet done saying, "My council which shall stand and
11 I'll perform all my pleasure, calling a ravenous
12 person the east, the -- in far country." You know,
13 prophecy, what is this stuff, the testimony of Jesus
14 Christ? What is this spirit that forewarns us of soon
15 coming events? The testimony of Jesus Christ is the
16 spirit, a prophecy. Well, didn't Christ say, "Let
17 there be light," and wasn't there light in creation?
18 Didn't Christ say, "Let us make men in our image after
19 our likeness?" The world was made flesh and whatever
20 the word said came to pass, didn't it?

18 HENRY: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: Now, here we say in Psalms
20 18, "I will love thee, O Lord, my strength."

21 "The Lord is my rock and my fortress. He is
22 my deliverer, my God, my strength, in whom I will
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1 trust; my buckler, and the horn is my salvation." In
2 Hebrew or in the ancient concept when man referred to
3 a horn, referred to his father's ability to procreate,
4 the strength of a man's loins. So you could say if
5 man was the horn of, of your salvation, you can say
6 that the person was your father. And my high tower,
7 being able to see far off in the distance is what a
8 tower is for, isn't it?

8 HENRY: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: Just like I knew you all were
10 coming before you all even was coming, you know?

11 HENRY: Right.

12 DAVID KORESH: That's what I was trying to
13 tell, you know, Robert.

13 HENRY: Um-hum.

14 DAVID KORESH: "I will call upon the Lord
15 who is worthy to be praised; so shall I be saved from
16 mine enemies."

17 "The sorrows of death compassed me, and the
18 floods of ungodly men made me afraid. The sorrows of
19 hell compassed me and about; and the snares of death
20 prevented me." Prevented me from what?

21 "In my distress I called upon the Lord, and
22 cried unto my God; and he heard my voice out of his
23 temple," just like in Psalms 2. You know he sits on a
24

1 throne in Heaven, right?

2 HENRY: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: "My cry came unto him, before
4 him, even into his ears," and with the sixth seal now
5 and suddenly the stars are darkened and the earth
6 shakes and the mountains shake, right?

6 HENRY: Um-hum.

7 DAVID KORESH: This is the sixth seal now.
8 "Then the earth shook and trembled; the foundations
9 also of the hills moved and were shaken, because he
10 was wroth."

11 "There went up a smoke out of his nostrils,
12 and fire out of his mouth devoured: coals were kindled
13 by it."

14 "He bowed the heavens also, and came down:
15 and darkness was under his feet."

16 He rode upon a cherub. See, where I come
17 from there's two kinds of angels, the -- a set of them
18 are masculine angles and a set of them are feminine
19 angels. The masculine angels like Ezekiel talks about
20 on the judgment throne, they -- they're like soldiers.
21 He did fly.

22 "He did fly upon the wings of the wind. He
23 made darkness his secret place and his pavilion round
24 about him were dark waters and thick clouds of the
25

1 | skies." It's like lightning, stones and voices.

2 | That's where the throne is, you see?

3 | HENRY: Um-hum.

4 | DAVID KORESH: "At the brightness that was
5 | before him his thick clouds passed, hail stones and
6 | coals of fire."

7 | "The Lord also thundered in the heavens, and
8 | the highest gave his voice; hail stones and coals of
9 | fire." So when God speaks to you all in his wrath,
10 | you won't understand an audible voice like I'm
11 | talking. You'll understand the elements of nature
12 | fighting against you like you've never seen.

13 | "Yea, he sent out his arrows, and scattered
14 | them," and his arrows aren't really arrows like wooden
15 | with a rock tip either.

16 | HENRY: Um-hum.

17 | DAVID KORESH: "He shot out lightnings, and
18 | discomfited them."

19 | "Then the channels of the water were seen,
20 | the foundations of the world were discovered at thy
21 | rebuke, O Lord," same as Isaiah 24. It's -- this
22 | stuff is geographically incredible how these things
23 | happen. See, Waco has a, has a fault running through
24 | it --

25 | HENRY: Um-hum.

1 DAVID KORESH: -- especially through the old
2 place where God originally established His name on the
3 first Davidian movement. Now, Brother Houteff was
4 raised up to begin to, to prepare the way for this
5 truth to be know but, like I say, there's other things
6 involved, too, but anyway, it says here -- anyway, it
7 says they were discovered, "O Lord, at the blast of
8 the breath of thy nostrils."

8 "He sent from above, he took me, he drew me
9 out of many waters," which is the floods of ungodly
10 men."

11 "He delivered me from my strong enemy, and
12 from them which hated me: for they were too strong for
13 me."

13 "They prevented me in the day of my
14 calamity," and this is a calamity like Psalms 89 says,
15 right?

16 HENRY: Um-hum.

17 DAVID KORESH: "But the Lord was my stay."

18 "He brought me forth also into a large
19 place." That's where, you know, the sanctuary is in
20 Heaven, the sea of glass?

21 HENRY: Um-hum.

22 DAVID KORESH: Very big place. "He
23 delivered me because he delighted in me."
24
25

1 "The Lord rewarded me according to my
2 righteousness; according to the cleanness of my hands
3 hath he recompensed me."

4 HENRY: Um-hum.

5 DAVID KORESH: I have never taught, ever
6 taught, false doctrine.

7 "For I have kept the ways of the Lord, and
8 have not wickedly departed from my God." And in these
9 seven seals there's some strange things, and without
10 the knowledge of it -- well, like it says in verse 22,
11 "For all his judgments were before me, and I did not
12 put away his statutes from me." Now this is different
13 than what happened 2,000 years ago. Just as in Psalms
14 89 or in Psalms 2 or Psalms 40 when he gave me a new
15 Psalm, whatever the seals contain is what I am
16 responsible for doing this time, and I always obey my
17 Father.

18 "I was also upright before him, and I kept
19 myself from mine iniquity," and if I don't do what my
20 Father asks -- asked me to be a sinner as in Psalms 40
21 or Psalms 51 or Psalms 139 and that would be iniquity.

22 It says in Psalms 119, the Psalm called the word, it
23 says I've seen end of all perfection, but the
24 commandment is extremely broad.

25 "Therefore hath the Lord recompensed me

1 according to my righteousness, according to the
2 cleanness of my hands in his eyesight." Now -- so I'm
3 a sinner, but do you know some people have not used
4 that against me. Just because I might have a little
5 beer every once in awhile which some would consider a
6 sin --

6 HENRY: Um-hum.

7 DAVID KORESH: -- although Mosaic law says
8 that -- their liquors and strong drinks.

9 HENRY: Um-hum.

10 DAVID KORESH: Anyway, that -- we won't get
11 into that too much, but here's the, here's the thing.
12 I need, I need to world's mercy now. Why? Because
13 in the judgment that I come from where God wants to do
14 -- this is the deal my Father wants to do for this
15 nation. This nation has failed the -- of its iniquity
16 and this is what my Father wants to do. If everyone
17 would come up hither and acknowledge him on the
18 throne, he only has one question to justify all and he
19 has only one demonstration that all may be righteous,
20 and that is if they allow me to give them my reward,
21 if they allow me to establish equity with them, if
22 they'll acknowledge that through God's word my
23 carnality is given for their righteousness, then we
24 can understand why.
25

1 "With the merciful thou will show thyself
2 merciful. All those who show me mercy, God will show
3 them mercy.

4 "And with the upright man thou will show
5 thyself upright." Okay?

6 HENRY: Um-hum.

7 DAVID KORESH: All right. Dave, what is
8 this truth now? Show me the seals. All right.
9 Here's the truth and here's the seals. It says in
10 Psalms 45 grace is poured into my lips so this is it.
11 This is it, Henry. You know, the truth will set you
12 free. Not my character. Not my looks. No. It's the
13 truth.

14 "With the pure thou will show thyself pure;
15 and with the forward," those who try to deceive will
16 be deceived. Those who try to go in their own ways,
17 God will definitely deal them according to their own
18 fruits.

19 "For thou will show thyself forward."

20 "For thou will save the afflicted people,"
21 and, yes, we're afflicted right now.

22 "But will bring down high looks," the proud,
23 the arrogant, just like in Psalms 75.

24 HENRY: Um-hum.

25 DAVID KORESH: You know, I said to the

1 fools, "Deal not foolishly into the wicked. Listen
2 unto your -- on high. Speak not with a stiff neck
3 because motion comes in from the south, east or west."

4 Of course, God says I've raised that woman from the
5 north. She come from the rise in the sun.

6 HENRY: Um-hum.

7 DAVID KORESH: That's where Orion is.
8 That's where my home is. To look past -- to Pleiades
9 and look up to Orion. That's not a star up there,
10 that little middle hole. It's a hole in the universe
11 called the Horse Head Nebula Orion. See, there's
12 where your horses are found, you know.

13 HENRY: Um-hum.

14 DAVID KORESH: And, like I said, people talk
15 about the new star, constellations being developed
16 there. Why did Christ promise his disciples that he'd
17 go away? He'd prepare a place for them. You know,
18 these are serious things we have to look at.

19 HENRY: Um-hum.

20 DAVID KORESH: But I will save the afflicted
21 people who will bring down high looks.

22 "For thou wilt light my candle." How many
23 candles are there in the heavenly sanctuary? Do you
24 remember? Seven candles, right?

25 HENRY: Okay.

1 DAVID KORESH: "The Lord, my God, will
2 lighten my darkness."

3 "For by thee I have run through a troop; and
4 by my God have I leaped over a wall."

5 "As for God, his way is perfect; the word of
6 the Lord is tried: he is a buckler to all those that
7 trust in him." For who is God except the Lord and who
8 is the rock save our God? It is God that girdeth me
9 with what? Strength. What's he going to do? He
maketh my way perfect.

10 He maketh my feet like hinds' feet. He
11 setteth me upon my high places. I mean, all the
12 prophets talk about the message going out in great
13 power where finally man does not fear God and they try
14 to move in and what happens is, is that God intervenes
15 and it's a terrible outcome against those who dare be
arrogant against God's doctrine.

16 "He teacheth my hands to war, so that a bow
17 of steel is broken in my arms. Thou hast also given
18 me the shield of thy salvation; and thy right hand is
19 holding me up." You can't go against God's word.

20 "And thy gentleness has made me great."

21 "Thou hast delivered my step -- enlarge my
22 steps under me and feet do not slip."

23 " I have pursued mine enemies and overtaken
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1 | them; neither did I turn again till they were
2 | consumed."

3 | "I have wounded them that they were not able
4 | to rise; they are fallen under my feet." In Psalms
5 | 75, which says all the horns of the wicked shall be
6 | cut off, you know what that is, Henry?

6 | HENRY: Tell me.

7 | DAVID KORESH: That's their ability to
8 | procreate.

9 | HENRY: Okay.

10 | DAVID KORESH: David of old, you know.
11 | There's something about the wicked of the world. You
12 | know, God gave male and female as a blessing from his
13 | people, to progenerate his seed. And there's a big
14 | controversy now. There's people that are telling me
15 | that I don't have a right to be able to procreate my
16 | image.

16 | HENRY: Well --

17 | DAVID KORESH: But there's a lot of people
18 | that tell me that I do. Remember, I go by my God's
19 | law.

19 | HENRY Um-hum.

20 | DAVID KORESH: I don't go by the laws of the
21 | land when they conflict my Father's laws but, anyway.

22 | "For thou hast girded me with strength unto
23 |
24 |
25 |

1 the battle; thou hast subdued under me those that rose
2 up against me." That's why that tape was played, so
3 people might have a small scratch and might wonder and
4 fear.

5 "Thou hast also given me the necks of mine
6 enemies; that I might destroy them that hate me."

7 "The cried, but there was none to save
8 them." You know, Jeremiah says that they're going to
9 end up fighting against the Lord because they don't
10 know the thoughts the Lord even -- council.

11 Anyway, Matthew 24 with the carcasses,
12 eagles are gathered there, and the reason why is
13 because they wanted to be a carcass. They prevent me
14 the day of my calamities, Psalms 18. Every Psalm
15 talks about this. "Even unto the Lord, but he
16 answered them not," because God doesn't talk to you
17 all. If you can't hear his word through me, if you
18 don't want me to show you what is on his mind, well,
19 then there's no hope.

20 "Then did I beat them small as the dust
21 before the wind: I did cast them out as the dirt in
22 the streets."

23 "Thou hast delivered me from the strivings
24 of the people; thou hast made me the head of the
25 heathen," just like Psalms 2 says. "Ask of me and I

1 shall give thee the heathen for thine inheritance, and
2 the uttermost parts of the earth for thy possession."

3 "So a people whom I have not known shall
4 serve me." You see, God's going to use you all as an
5 example so that this message is going to shine as a
6 bright light to all the world.

6 HENRY: And it will, but --

7 DAVID KORESH: I know, but I don't want it
8 to be at the expense of you and your system's rear
9 end.

10 HENRY: Well, the --

11 DAVID KORESH: "As soon as they hear of me,
12 they shall obey me."

12 HENRY: -- the thing is they probably will,
13 but we have to follow through. You made a promise and
14 everybody is waiting to see if you're going to follow
15 through. One of the, one of the things that I want
16 you to --

17 DAVID KORESH: I'm following through.

18 HENRY: -- that you need to think about is
19 Jim worked real hard for you. Now, he was removed
20 from here because he was -- because he believed in you
21 and you did not follow through.

21 DAVID KORESH: Now --

22 HENRY: Listen to me for a second.

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1 DAVID KORESH: Let me, let me just say this
2 thing in Nahum.

3 HENRY: Okay.

4 DAVID KORESH: Nahum sees a vision and David
5 --

6 HENRY: That's right.

7 DAVID KORESH: Let me explain. The Nahum's
8 vision is different than any other vision of the other
9 prophets and there's a reason for this. In the book
10 of Nahum, Nahum sees a situation with chariots that
11 jostle in the streets with flaming torches. Okay?

12 HENRY: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: Torches that could make the
14 fir trees shake. Okay?

15 HENRY: Um-hum.

16 DAVID KORESH: Now, what do you know about
17 chariots that have flaming torches that jostle in the
18 broad ways? Do you know of anything that could be a
19 human transport system that has a flaming torch on it?
20 Have you ever heard of a tank?

21 HENRY: Okay.

22 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Now look, there's a
23 lot of things that you people don't understand, that
24 you're fulfilling the very word of God right as I
25 speak and it may seem odd and it may seem strange how

1 that -- you know, we're here at this time and yet, you
2 know, by nature you don't believe because you don't
3 know what to believe. But the thing of it is if you
4 could have known the word of God and what is taking
5 place in this time, if you could have believed that
6 Russia -- and, you know, Russia wouldn't lie. They
7 stated, and this should be something they should have
8 brought back into investigation, that in 1985 they saw
9 seven angels flying towards earth with the wings of
10 the size of jumbo jet. Now, if these things are true,
11 you know, we should take heed especially to the fact
12 that in the book of Revelations it's recorded that
13 there are seven angels who have a message.

14 HENRY: Um-hum.

15 DAVID KORESH: Now --

16 HENRY: Everybody believes that the message
17 that you delivered was very powerful and very strong,
18 but --

19 DAVID KORESH: But it's going to get more
20 powerful. But the problem is, is that --

21 HENRY: Well, but, but it may not because
22 what is -- what everybody's questioning is are you
23 going to live up to your promise.

24 DAVID KORESH: Right, but now the thing is
25 this. The prophesy deals with Nineveh, you know, the

1 vision of an adulterous generation -- Christ will
2 receive the sign of Jonah? Jonah tried to prophesize
3 in Nineveh didn't he? Right?

4 HENRY: Um-hum.

5 DAVID KORESH: So when Nahum says God is
6 jealous, the Lord revengeth, the Lord revengeth and is
7 furious, the Lord will take vengeance on his
8 adversaries, reserves his wrath for his enemies. The
9 Lord is slow to anger and great in power and will not
10 at all acquit the wicked. No acquittals for the
11 wicked.

12 HENRY: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: "The Lord hath his way in the
14 whirlwind and in the storm and the clouds are the dust
15 of his feet." We just read that in Psalms 18, didn't
16 we?

17 HENRY: Right.

18 DAVID KORESH: "He rebuketh the sea and
19 maketh it dry. He drieth up the rivers; Bashan, Carmel
20 languisheth the flower of Lebanon languisheth."

21 "The mountains quake at him, and the hills
22 shall melt. The earth is burned at his presence in a
23 the world, and all that dwell therein."

24 "Now, who can stand before his indignation
25 Who can abide in the fierceness of his anger? For his

1 fury is poured out like fire and the rocks shall be
2 thrown down by him."

3 Although the Lord is good and a refuge, a
4 stronghold in the day of trouble, and he knoweth them
5 that trust in him." If you don't believe in the seven
6 seals, you can't trust in him.

7 It says, "But with an overrunning flood" --
8 I'm going to show you what's happening right now with
9 you guys. Now pay attention.

10 HENRY: Okay. Okay.

11 DAVID KORESH: "With an overrunning flood he
12 will make an utter end and of the place thereof, and
13 darkness shall pursue his enemies." What do you
14 imagine against the Lord? He will make an utter end.

15 HENRY: Exactly.

16 DAVID KORESH: "Affliction shall not rise up
17 the second time."

18 HENRY: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: Now, the second time? What
20 happened the first time? "For while the wicked be
21 folden together as thorns, and while they are as
22 drunken as drunkards" -- these people are not in their
23 right mind.

24 HENRY: Um-hum.

25 DAVID KORESH: "They shall be devoured as

1 stubble fully dry."

2 "Now, there is one come out of thee, that
3 imagineth evil against the Lord, a wicked counsellor.

4 "Thus saith the Lord, though they be quiet,
5 and likewise many" -- it's happening right now -- "yet
6 thus shall they be cut, down when he shall pass
7 through."

8 Now, we -- we're being afflicted and God
9 says, "Though I have afflicted thee, I will afflict
10 thee no more."

11 "For now will I break his yoke from off
12 thee, and will burst thy bonds asunder." Now pay
13 attention.

14 "And the Lord hath given a commandment
15 concerning thee, that no more of thy name be sown."
16 Remember, it says all the horns -- be cut off out of
17 the houses?

18 HENRY: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Anyway, now, and
20 Isaiah's prophesy of old in Isaiah 52, it referred to
21 a prophesy except Nahum is totally different. In
22 Isaiah 52 it says upon the mountains bringeth good
23 tidings, that publisheth peace, right?

24 HENRY: Um-hum.

25 DAVID KORESH: This talks about Messiah in

1 53. "Who believed our report and to whom is
2 (indiscernible) the Lord revealed?" You know, he's
3 smitten. He's, you know, man of sorrows, man of
4 grief. But Nahum said it different. Nahum talks
5 about that, "I will make thy grave, for thy art vile."

6 "Behold upon the mountains the feet of him
7 that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace! O
8 Judah, keep thy solemn feasts, perform thy vows: for
9 the wicked shall no more pass through thee; for he is
10 utterly cut off." God is going to use this
11 confrontation to show his power so that he can gather
12 the 144,000. How does the land giveth 144,000?

13 HENRY: David, David, let me interrupt you
14 for a second. I want to let you know that we -- you
15 know, some of the trucks that we have in the area are
16 moving.

17 DAVID KORESH: Um-hum.

18 HENRY: Okay?

19 DAVID KORESH: Right.

20 HENRY: I don't want anybody to become upset
21 and I need --

22 DAVID KORESH: Oh, I'm not. I'm just upset
23 for you all.

24 HENRY: Okay. I need to know, are you going
25 to live up to your promise? What are you planning to

1 do?

2 DAVID KORESH: Well --

3 HENRY: Please tell me that.

4 DAVID KORESH: Let me explain. See, in
5 verse 2 --

6 HENRY: Yes, I know. Please tell me what
7 you're going to do.

8 DAVID KORESH: I am trying. Please look at
9 verse 2 of Nahum.

10 HENRY: Let's not talk in those terms,
11 please.

12 DAVID KORESH: No. Then you don't
13 understand my doctrine. You don't want to hear the
14 word of my God.

15 HENRY: I have listened to you and listened
16 to you, and I believe in what you say, as do a lot of
17 other people, but the, but the bottom line is
18 everybody now considers you David who is going to
19 either run away from the giant or is going to come out
20 and try to slay the giant. For God's sake, you know,
21 give me an answer, David. I need to have an answer.
22 Are you going to come out?

23 DAVID KORESH: Right now listen.

24 HENRY: Right now you're coming --

25 DAVID KORESH: "He that dasheth in pieces is

1 | come up before thy face: keep the munition." What's
2 | the munition? "Watch the way."

3 | HENRY: One of the things, one of the things
4 | is I don't understand the scriptures like you,
5 | honestly, I just don't.

6 | DAVID KORESH: Okay, if you would listen,
7 | then I would show you. It says right here -- it says
8 | here, "The chariots shall be with flaming torches."
9 | That's what you've got out there.

10 | HENRY: Let's not talk about --

11 | DAVID KORESH: You've got large --

12 | HENRY: Let's not talk about that. Let's
13 | talk about the people that are waiting to hear --

14 | DAVID KORESH: God has already talked to
15 | them.

16 | HENRY: -- whether you are going to come
17 | out. David, please, for God's sake, a lot of people
18 | are depending on you.

19 | DAVID KORESH: It says here --

20 | HENRY: Not just the people that are there
21 | and they don't want the -- you know, you are reading
22 | to me, you know. That's you and me, one person and
23 | one person. There are --

24 | DAVID KORESH: I know.

25 | HENRY: There are hundreds of thousands of

1 people that are waiting.

2 DAVID KORESH: They're going to see this
3 happen.

4 HENRY: But, but --

5 DAVID KORESH: You could forewarn them. You
6 have a great part in --

7 HENRY: I don't have the influence. I
8 didn't go over national television, national radio
9 like you did. You need to make a statement just like
10 the statement that you made before. You can make that
11 statement quite simply by coming out and leading your
12 people out.

13 DAVID KORESH: Well --

14 HENRY: For God's sakes, don't let --

15 DAVID KORESH: -- we will be coming -- we --

16 HENRY: -- this opportunity go. Seize it
17 for God's sake, please.

18 DAVID KORESH: For 6,000 years I've waited
19 for this opportunity. Now here's what I'm trying to
20 say. It is written aforetime.

21 HENRY: Don't talk to me about the
22 scriptures. Not that I don't like to listen to you, I
23 do. Honestly I do. I like to listen to you, but I
24 have to explain to my bosses here why you're not
25 coming out. They didn't -- they -- you know, Jim had

1 to try do some explaining. He's lost a lot of his
2 credibility and they feel -- I feel that, you know --

3 DAVID KORESH: Well, my Father --

4 HENRY: -- based on what I'm hearing on --

5 DAVID KORESH: -- exonerates Jim.

6 HENRY: -- from T.V. and radio, that your
7 credibility is being questioned. We need to get you
8 out. Can you come out? Yes or no?

9 DAVID KORESH: I will be coming out.

10 HENRY: Okay. Can we --

11 DAVID KORESH: But when my --

12 HENRY: -- start coming out?

13 DAVID KORESH: No. When my father tells me
14 to come out.

15 HENRY: Can you reach down? Can you reach
16 down, you know, for some internal and intestinal
17 fortitude and let's get it done now, please?

18 DAVID KORESH: You're saying -- you think I
19 move on my own mind and my own will, don't you?

20 HENRY: No.

21 DAVID KORESH: Everything I've shown you
22 think --

23 HENRY: But all of us, all of us have to,
24 all of us have --

25 DAVID KORESH: -- is foolishness.

1 HENRY: -- to reach for that something
2 extra.

3 DAVID KORESH: You do not go against the God
4 of all heaven.

5 HENRY: That's true. That's true.

6 DAVID KORESH: Let's stop be arrogant now.
7 There is a God of truth.

8 HENRY: That is true.

9 DAVID KORESH: There's a God who overthrew
10 Pharaoh. He overthrew Nebuchadnezzar. He overthrew
11 the League of Persian Kingdoms. He overthrew the
12 Grecian kingdoms.

13 HENRY: That's true.

14 DAVID KORESH: He overthrew Rome.

15 HENRY: And God --

16 DAVID KORESH: He causes the war amongst
17 Israel.

18 HENRY: That's true.

19 DAVID KORESH: He creates wars. He rose up
20 this nation --

21 HENRY: But God moved to you --

22 DAVID KORESH: -- and he's going to also --

23 HENRY: -- God moved to you to give us your
24 promise and he did that --

25 DAVID KORESH: Ezekiel 33.

1 make a great, great difference, but you can't do it
2 within there. You need to come out strong.

3 DAVID KORESH: I will. I promise.

4 HENRY: Are you ready to do it now?

5 DAVID KORESH: I cannot go beyond the
6 commandment of my Father.

7 HENRY: Can you do the right thing now?

8 DAVID KORESH: I am doing the right thing
9 now.

10 HENRY: The right thing, the right thing
11 sometimes confuses us --

12 DAVID KORESH: I am not of this world --

13 HENRY: -- because, because it is a great
14 responsibility, but you've been thrust into that
15 position. You've been thrust into a position of great
16 responsibility. You need to embrace it.

17 DAVID KORESH: Oh, yes.

18 HENRY: You need to come out strong with
19 this one.

20 DAVID KORESH: I will.

21 HENRY: Then come out now.

22 DAVID KORESH: Why don't you --

23 HENRY: For God's sake, come out now. Help
24 me to help you to help everybody that is waiting.

25 DAVID KORESH: If you would look to the one

1 on the throne, you wouldn't speak like you're speaking
2 now. You would stop trying to promote the peace in
3 his image and his word.

4 HENRY: I am not trying to promote anything

5 --

6 DAVID KORESH: You are.

7 HENRY: -- except to make you live up to
8 what everybody believes is your word.

9 DAVID KORESH: And will you live up to what
10 you also promised?

11 HENRY: What can I -- what are we --

12 DAVID KORESH: You, you cannot back your
13 words. I can back mine.

14 HENRY: If you can, then come out now.

15 DAVID KORESH: My words are backed by God.

16 HENRY: Your word was --

17 DAVID KORESH: Your words are backed by man.

18 HENRY: Your word was, your word was --

19 DAVID KORESH: Whose words do you think
20 shall win?

21 HENRY: Your word was you will come out
22 immediately.

23 DAVID KORESH: That's right.

24 HENRY: Whether you realize it or not,
25 you're losing face.

1 DAVID KORESH: I also said, I also said --
2 look.

3 HENRY: We want you to come out so that
4 everything that you said, whether it was immediately
5 or not, is still looked upon as being the truth.

6 DAVID KORESH: Yes. 2,000 years, I come
7 quickly, so I will come out immediately. Just like I
8 said, 2,000 years ago I come quickly. Time is an
9 awesome thing. Now, believe me, have faith in what
10 I've said because I just didn't speak to you words
11 from the words -- man's mouth. I speak to you words
12 from God's word.

13 HENRY: That's right and, if God told you to
14 tell us that you would promise that you would come out
15 right away. Then you're not, you're not living up to
16 what God asked you to do.

17 DAVID KORESH: I know --

18 HENRY: It's a great responsibility.

19 DAVID KORESH: I know.

20 HENRY: It's a tremendous responsibility
21 because, because within, within the compound you have
22 that sanctuary, that safeness, and coming out is
23 threatening, but, but you can't be threatened because
24 you are not acting for yourself. You are speaking for
25 a lot of people within the Christian community.

1 That's a fact that you placed upon yourself by taking
2 that responsibility. Now we need to move forward.

3 STEVE: Henry, it's Steve.

4 HENRY: Hey, Steve.

5 STEVE: Hey. I was listening over on the
6 side here so, of course, I can only hear the one side
7 of the conversation.

8 HENRY: Um-hum.

9 STEVE: But I must admit that was -- I
10 grabbed a Bible here and I was following along. You
11 know, I don't know how much you know about the
12 historocity (phonetic) of the Christian --
