1 lamb take the book?

2 JIM: I don't know what you mean by that.

3 DAVID: Did you see in prophecy that some
4 day, after John's day there will be a literal event
5 that will take place in heaven, and you are suppose to
6 see and be forewarned that in that event, Christ, a
7 king of kings and a lord of lords, is to take a book
8 from his father. You are without excuse, Jim. You
9 and everybody else in this world who's been privileged
10 to have a Bible, and I am not afraid for myself --

11 JIM: Well David, I --

12 DAVID: Listen, --

13 JIM: I believe you.

14 DAVID: I am afraid for the most precious
15 thing, in my purpose of existence, I'm afraid for you
16 and all of your little teeny tiny G.I. Joe's around
17 here, all your little small, little, rinky dinky
18 helicopters, your small little rinky dinky little land
19 rovers, your small little rinky dinky tanks --

20 JIM: I'm sorry, hold on David. What?
21 What? Okay, all right. Hold on, I'm sorry, hold on.

22 Okay, I'm sorry. I understand that, and I believe
23 you.

24 DAVID: Now, --

25 JIM: And yesterday --

1 DAVID: Man --

2 JIM: -- you let me down yesterday, a
3 little, David, I'm telling you, you let me down, I had
4 a hard night.

5 DAVID: Well, that may be so. I did let you
6 down. But of course, we know --

7 JIM: Can I tell you something, my own
8 feelings?

9 DAVID: Go ahead.

10 JIM: Last night after I left I, I had to
11 walk around for two or three hours by myself, I was
12 pretty, pretty devastated --

13 DAVID: Had to think a bit.

14 JIM: Huh?

15 DAVID: Had to think a bit.

16 JIM: Yeah, I had to think, I really was, I
17 mean, you know, you get that way sometimes.

18 DAVID: I mean, you know, I mean, Jim, I
19 mean --

20 JIM: I just felt --

21 DAVID: You've done so much work and
22 everything and we've made so many progressive, you
23 know --

24 JIM: I know, and, you know --

25 DAVID: And you just know that they're going

1 to ransack us and put us in a prison and, and, you
2 know, just --

3 JIM: I think you, I think you're going to
4 get your day in court and I think you --

5 DAVID: I've been in court before.

6 JIM: -- and, I know, and you've come out
7 before, but the thing is, your side is going to be
8 hurt if you come out, and you will come out, and
9 yesterday you gave your word, and it wasn't a hurdle
10 for me, really, and I couldn't sleep and I was kind of
11 worried about the whole thing, and I know that you got
12 a message to wait, and I understand that as much as I
13 can understand that David, I understand it, and I was
14 just wanting to -- I was so hurt that, you know, I was
15 hoping that your solemn promise yesterday was going to
16 be renewed when you did your prayers and your, your
17 visitation with the Almighty or -- and don't get me
18 wrong, you know, I'm just trying to explain to you my
19 feelings. I can't talk about those things like you
20 can.

21 DAVID: I understand.

22 JIM: I'm not a theologian, David, I'm just
23 a policeman, but I was hoping that maybe, you know,
24 this would change today and, although you didn't do
25 it, you were still a man of your word and frankly, I -

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DAVID: I still have full intentions of doing what I said, but the thing of it is, you got to remember, I have a headquarters too.

JIM: I understand. We broadcast --

DAVID: The problem is, the problem is, is that what you were telling me and what is actually being planned is two different things, now, so here's the case --

JIM: Well, where do you think --

DAVID: The case is, is that as long as I am able to, I am to remain, and God has strengthened me, my pulse and everything went up, and God has strengthened me for this one last thing, for one last opportunity, and that is for you and all of the agents and all of these individuals who are risking their, not just their carnal lives, but the lives hereafter, you know, and you think, you know, we're talking about a thing of life here.

JIM: I understand that.

DAVID: Now, remember, there's, there is in scripture and in theology, there is a life and then there is the eternal life.

JIM: Right.

DAVID: One's probationary. Okay. Now, the

1 key is this, I was telling Henry last night that God
2 is not as primitive as people think, you know, we're
3 talking about sophisticated equipment and all that.
4 Well, anyway, I was trying to explain to him the Book
5 of Nahum. Now in that plan, in the Book of Nahum, it
6 talks about Messiah, although Messiah was never in a
7 situation revolving around the prophecies of Nahum.
8 Now, just as in the prophecies Zephaniah, or Habakkuk,
9 it's totally different than the Messiah of Isaiah.

9 JIM: All right.

10 DAVID: But of course, we know that Christ
11 promises in Matthew 24, that when he comes it will be
12 like lightning from the east shines to the west, that
13 either he's saying it will be so plain everybody will
14 know it, or he says it could be like a light that
15 shines to the east to the west. But of course, what
16 we're dealing with is we're dealing with a carcass
17 there too, that's a dead body.

17 JIM: Um-hum.

18 DAVID: And we're dealing with something to
19 do with eagles being gathered together. Now, whether
20 we come out literal eagles or whether we're talking
21 about a meaning referring to those who gathered
22 together with this carcass, individuals, we should, we
23 should know. Well, in one part of Isaiah's prophecy,
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1 as I said before, Isaiah said when the Lord comes,
2 he'll come with a strong hand.

3 Now you have documents that are in your office,
4 and these documents clarify and state the wishes and
5 the wills of those who are above you. All right, now,
6 when the ATF agents came in here, they had a document,
7 supposedly, you know, which said something about me
8 being under arrest or something. I mean, they never
9 got that out, they never were, you know, was made very
10 clear. It wasn't a procedure of coming and
11 approaching to someone and as far --

12 JIM: I understand.

13 DAVID: -- and as far as this other baloney,
14 Robert knows that I jog every day, all the way up and
15 down this road. You all could have arrested me any
16 day jogging up and down the road. I mean, you know,
17 this stuff --

18 JIM: I understand.

19 DAVID: -- is going to be brought out. Now,
20 here's the point.

21 JIM: Well, you should bring it out, I think
22 that's good. I want you to bring it out.

23 DAVID: That's why I want to talk to Robert,
24 I want to ask him. You know, why didn't he just, you
25 know, just when I was jogging out there on the road,

1 | you know, and, like I say, you ain't carrying no
2 | weapons when you're jogging are you?

3 | JIM: Right.

4 | DAVID: You know? I mean, Robert and them
5 | do. They were doing some jogging too.

6 | JIM: Right.

7 | DAVID: But when you carry a fanny pack,
8 | what do you got?

9 | JIM: Right.

10 | DAVID: Okay, so the thing of it is, that
11 | would have been a whole lot better, Jim.

12 | JIM: Well, I understand that, and when you
13 | come out --

14 | DAVID: Okay?

15 | JIM: -- when you come out, you can confront
16 | Robert and talk to him about that.

17 | DAVID: Yeah, we know that's going to
18 | happen. Now, here's the thing.

19 | JIM: Well, why not? I mean, you can talk
20 | to him.

21 | DAVID: Well, like I say, get him on the
22 | phone for me as soon as you can. I would like to --

23 | JIM: You know what I'm starting to think,
24 | David, I'm starting to think, this is unusual for me,
25 | you know, bear with me, but I'm, I'm starting to think

1 that when you, when you walk out with your people that
2 the authorities, I mean, somehow are unknowingly
3 helping you fulfill some prophecy. That's what I see
4 happening.

5 DAVID: Well, Jim --

6 JIM: I see that, your walking out as --

7 DAVID: -- let's -- you get your Bible out
8 there. Let's take a look at a couple of prophecies,
9 honestly. Bear with this fool just a little longer
10 and let's just --

11 JIM: David, you know I don't know the
12 scriptures like you.

13 DAVID: No, no, no, no, hey, you've got to
14 open your book and take a look and see what the guy's
15 saying. Maybe the prophecies are a bunch of nuts, or
16 maybe you're just lying --

17 JIM: No, no.

18 DAVID: Maybe you have no faith at all in
19 the Bible.

20 JIM: No, but aren't the prophets the ones
21 who clarify the word for the people who don't
22 understand it and bring the message?

23 DAVID: Aren't the prophets the one who
24 testified before what they were told of God regarding
25 the coming of the events of Messiah?

1 JIM: Right.

2 DAVID: In other words, how would it be,
3 what it would be like when Messiah would appear.

4 JIM: But, but, what I'm saying, David,
5 didn't they explain things to people so they'd
6 understand, I mean, you know I've never lied to you.
7 You know that's true. I have called you and told you
8 everything that was happening and I've never lied to
9 you. If I didn't know, I said, "I don't know." I
10 haven't tried to fool you on any -- you know that's
11 true. I've told you I don't know the scriptures.

12 DAVID: Exactly, so --

13 JIM: I've told, I've told you that
14 everything, whatever we've said, what I said or
15 Henry --

16 DAVID: Catholics don't know the Bible.

17 JIM: Well, I'm not saying that.

18 DAVID: It's not promoted to know scriptures
19 in Catholicism. All you're to learn is your
20 catechism.

21 JIM: I see.

22 DAVID: The rules of the church.

23 JIM: You know it, David. You know. I know
24 you know it. You've told me about it.

25 DAVID: Oh, Jim.

1 JIM: I, hey, I understand that. I really -
2 -How can we come to an agreement and how can we get
3 back to where we were yesterday and start moving some
4 of the people --

5 DAVID: Well, like I said, you deal with
6 your bosses, I'm dealing with my father now.

7 JIM: All right.

8 DAVID: You all can go ahead and laugh --

9 JIM: I'm not laughing, David.

10 DAVID: -- and stand back and ridicule and
11 speculate over where we're coming from, but it's like
12 this, this is the United States of America, and we may
13 be just chalked up as one more cult group.

14 JIM: Not to me you're not.

15 DAVID: But there are seven seals and as
16 long as you do not permit me to show you --

17 JIM: I did permit you. We let you play
18 your tape for an hour on a national network.

19 DAVID: Wait a minute, wait a minute, wait a
20 minute, wait a minute. What did you learn from that
21 tape?

22 JIM: One thing I learned is you let me
23 down, you didn't keep your word.

24 DAVID: You weren't listening to the truth
25 anyway.

1 JIM: Well, David, I'm trying to understand,
2 and I'm trying to --

3 DAVID: You're trying to understand why our
4 actions have been so dramatic in regards to your
5 systematic, bureaucratic system of government.

6 JIM: Okay.

7 DAVID: We have gone against you. The big
8 guy, the little guy's come up and pushed at you. We
9 told you, you're not going to come here and push your
10 little ATF butt around.

11 JIM: Right.

12 DAVID: We are Americans too.

13 JIM: All right, I understand that.

14 DAVID: We have bothered no one. We will
15 serve and believe God and contend on a foundation of
16 doctrine, in the fear of God, as light opens and as
17 doctrine is properly weighed and measured, being
18 systematically harmonized with scripture, text,
19 chapter, book, then we develop an infallible,
20 conclusive picture of what God's will is. Not just a
21 little verse here, not just a little verse there. No.
22 The content must be complete. Now, the very last
23 doctrine is not going to be like Martin Luther's
24 doctrine.

25 JIM: All right.

1 DAVID: Martin Luther stood up and put his
2 finger right in the face of your church. But
3 remember, the Roman Catholic Church use to rule
4 Europe. The Pontiff was the highest form of power
5 known to the governments of man. Do you remember
6 that?

7 JIM: Um-hum, right.

8 DAVID: Now, when Martin Luther --

9 JIM: I understand.

10 DAVID: -- was, was by his little self, he
11 discovered in the scriptures, according to Timothy's
12 writings, Paul to Timothy, --

13 JIM: That's my brother's name.

14 DAVID: Yeah, well, he learned by -- Martin
15 Luther learned by reading the Bible that Paul said
16 that the Spirit told him that in later days there'd be
17 some who depart from the faith, giving into seducing
18 spirits and doctrines of devils forbidding to marry.

19 JIM: Right.

20 DAVID: And commanding to abstain from meats
21 which God has blessed. Now, Luther knew point blank
22 that the Papacy taught celibacy, taught celibacy for
23 its priests. Well, we began, he began a search and
24 research and found other documents according to the
25 new covenant. So he married Katherine Van Voyn

1 (Phonetic) in 1525. This man, by being enlightened
2 with the words of God, the words of the prophets, he
3 went ahead and he took a step against his traditional
4 faith as a Catholic and began to stand more on the
5 documents that the Catholics said they believed, but
6 yet they did not teach, nor did they do.

6 JIM: You're right about that.

7 DAVID: Now --

8 JIM: And I know you're right about that.

9 DAVID: So, in 1530, he developed enough
10 points from scripture to prove that the Papacy was not
11 founded on a scriptural foundation and that many of
12 its laws and many of its edicts were contrary to the
13 foundation established in the new testament.

13 JIM: Right. I understand.

14 DAVID: So, when he nailed his thesis up,
15 people began to read and then all hell broke out.

16 JIM: Um-hum.

17 DAVID: Do you know how many people died
18 because of Martin Luther's doctrine?

18 JIM: I don't know.

19 DAVID: Millions. Millions were considered
20 cultic, demonic, heretic; they were told they were
21 proscribed, they were told to recant by the -- Scott,
22 no, no, don't do that.

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1 JIM: You okay David?

2 DAVID: Yeah, I'm all right. Now, so you
3 see --

4 JIM: I, I, --

5 DAVID: The, the government of that day was
6 the Roman Catholic Church and Martin Luther was the
7 cult leader. He was the devil. He was the demon. He
8 was the idiot and he was the fool, and he was told to
9 recant over and over at the risk of his life. But do
10 you know what happened? There were certain
11 individuals that were lawyers, certain individuals
12 that were kings and they began to listen to this man,
13 and they began to think, for once, on their own. And
14 so what happened is, is that, as they began to think,
15 Martin Luther's life was preserved.

16 JIM: Um-hum.

17 DAVID: But he was at least allowed time to
18 really lay out his complete thesis. Okay.
19 Nonetheless though, there were people that were
20 beginning to join the Lutheran Church, as I said
21 before, the Jesuit priesthood was developed, which was
22 the Roman Catholics military, and they went out and,
23 like I said, the blood flowed. But the same as when
24 John Knox came in and started the Presbyterian, or
25 Wesley with the Methodist, or Campbell with the

1 Baptist. Each of these reformers were men who asked
2 an honest question in their day in regards to
3 scripture that many organizations were not adhering
4 to. So this is how we came out of the dark ages.

5 JIM: All right.

6 DAVID: This is how we came out of the
7 covering of the minds of men from the Papacy.

8 JIM: Um-hum.

9 DAVID: Now, but the dark ages was foretold
10 by Christ already. The prophets had already been told
11 of the abomination that would make desolate. When men
12 are turned away from God, and his laws, and his
13 precepts, that infidelity and immorality increase to
14 such high levels men become worse than base beast of
15 the field. Their passions, their pride, their
16 arrogancies (sic), all these things overcome them and
17 they do not know how to properly rationalize in the
18 fear of God. Now, if you don't fear God, you cannot
19 properly respect nor love man.

20 JIM: I agree with that.

21 DAVID: Okay, now, here's the deal. The
22 world has become ultimately corrupted in that when the
23 churches are infiltrated by a spirit so contrary to
24 the spirit of Christ, that men will stand in pious
25 position of religious leadership, and they know

1 nothing about the real spirit of sacred faith in God
2 based upon nothing but God's word, then they try
3 themselves to become the oracle of God. They give
4 their opinions instead of doctrine.

5 JIM: You're talking about, David, like
6 those ministers?

7 DAVID: I'm talking about, like, the
8 minister -- like the Pope, for instance.

9 JIM: Um-hum, um-hum.

10 DAVID: Claimed such a high piety with God,
11 claims to be vicegerent of God --

12 JIM: Um-hum.

13 DAVID: And yet, hey, where is the truth? I
14 mean, you know, the church is not just a bunch of
15 prayers.

16 JIM: Oh, I agree with you.

17 DAVID: You know, God wants --

18 JIM: It's what's inside.

19 DAVID: -- us to listen to him.

20 JIM: It's what's inside, I understand.

21 God also, yeah.

22 DAVID: God is a truth. God is a word.

23 And --

24 JIM: And God is as good as his word.

25 DAVID: Well, here's the thing. When we see

1 that Christ was taken back to heaven, a lot of the
2 prophecies and promises did not come to pass. That's
3 why in Acts Chapter 1, as his disciples walked with
4 him, they said, "Lord, is it now at this time that
5 thou will restore the kingdom again to Israel?" The
6 hope of Israel has been to be freed from amongst the
7 gentile nations that God has allowed to rule over his
8 people.

8 JIM: Um-hum.

9 DAVID: Because the truth of God and the
10 laws of men do not harmonize in every degree. So that
11 when the laws of men direct men to go contrary to the
12 laws of God, men must take their stand to either be
13 with God and God's law, or with man and man's law.
14 That's why, in order to receive the seal of the living
15 God, you've got to know what God's will is. You've
16 got to understand his law, the nature of his law, and
17 his will. Okay, now, if a person would turn from that
18 and become roughly ignorant over these issues, then
19 what will happen is, is that prophecy, which is God
20 foretelling of future events, how they shall come to
21 pass and what they shall involve, will be fulfilled
22 without these individuals. And that's why the bible
23 warns about the beast and its image. God has declared
24 that the nations of the earth that will rule over
25

1 Israel are limited. The time for Israel's captivity
2 has been preordained and limited. That's why when you
3 read Daniel 2, and Daniel 7, Christ talks about the
4 abomination of making desolate spoken by the Daniel,
Prophet Daniel --

5 JIM: Um-hum, okay.

6 DAVID: Daniel tells you that the empires
7 will consecutively as so: Babylon will first rule
8 over Judea, of which they have.

9 JIM: Um-hum.

10 DAVID: Then Nebuchadnezzar, that was the
11 King of Babylon. And then the Medes and Persians,
12 Isaiah foretold, would overthrow Babylon and rule over
13 Judea. And then Grecia was to come in and overthrow
14 Medes Persia, but it was just split up into four parts
15 because of the four generals. See, Alexander
16 originally had four generals and he died without an
heir.

17 JIM: Um-hum, I understand.

18 DAVID: So, what happens is, out of the
19 northern region of this empire, there rised up another
20 empire which is to again, we established all of the
21 other ones back together, and we know what that one
was, it was Rome.

22 JIM: Um-hum.

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1 system.

2 JIM: Well --

3 DAVID: Being ignorant of what system you
4 are really under, not realizing what God has
5 forewarned about this power. You were ignorantly
6 involved, which you cannot be condemned for. Why
7 Christ died on the Cross.

8 JIM: I was just a little boy.

9 DAVID: Yeah, see, so Christ died on the
10 cross so that people are forgiven based upon what they
11 know or don't know, you see?

12 JIM: All right.

13 DAVID: In other words, under the gospel of
14 the new covenant, let's say a woman was a nun, okay,
15 and that's all she knew. All she knew is the
16 catechism. All she knew is what she was taught and
17 she never really had an opportunity or chance to
18 understand the scriptures.

19 JIM: Um-hum.

20 DAVID: Well, then she'd be judged based on
21 how good a nun she was. That's the way it's in the
22 Judgement of Christ. As you receive Christ therefore
23 walk ye in him, grounded and rooted, built up in love
24 and to the full acknowledgement of the understanding
25 of the faith taught best. Okay, are you on my line?

1 Oh, okay, we're back.

2 JIM: That's just me. I bumped it.

3 DAVID: Okay, now. So where we're at today,
4 we have the Lutherans, and they've got a little bit
5 better light on the subject of Christ than the
6 Catholics do.

6 JIM: Well, what about the Christians?

7 DAVID: Well, now, see, here's the deal. In
8 the days of the Lutherans and the days of the
9 Catholics, they were fighting every day --

10 JIM: Right.

11 DAVID: -- over doctrine. Truth meant
12 something back then.

12 JIM: Where did the Christian's come in?

13 DAVID: Well, what happens is if you're
14 talking about the original followers of Messiah, then
15 you're talking about Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, and
16 you're talking about, you know, the Apostles, yeah,
17 where did they come in at?

18 JIM: Yeah, well --

19 DAVID: That was before the Roman Catholic
20 Church wasn't it?

21 JIM: Right.

22 DAVID: Well then, why don't we back up back
23 then, okay?

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1 JIM: Um-hum.

2 DAVID: Okay, so let's see what they
3 believed in. Let's John, on the Isle of Patmos was a
4 prisoner to Rome because of preaching Christ the King,
5 right?

6 JIM: Right.

7 DAVID: That's treason, isn't it?

8 JIM: Um-hum.

9 DAVID: Okay, and he had a vision and he
10 wrote to the seven churches of Asia, which were the
11 Christian churches amongst the gentiles, and he said
12 that after these things, after these counsels are
13 given, sometime in the future, the Spirit's going to
14 show us what must shortly be hereafter. And John said
15 something about in the future, there's going to be a
16 God who sits on the throne in heaven. Okay? And that
17 God's going to have a book with seven seals.

18 JIM: Um-hum, okay.

19 DAVID: And that the lamb is going to take
20 it, open it up and that the lamb is going to come with
21 his reward and give it to every man.

22 JIM: Okay.

23 DAVID: Which is the knowledge of the seven
24 seals. And that will be the salvation for the world.

25 JIM: I understand.

1 DAVID: Okay, now, let's see here. But I
2 bet you the Papacy didn't really take John at his
3 word, didn't they?

4 JIM: No, I guess not.

5 DAVID: Because they sure built up a lot of
6 churches on earth, which Paul and all of them says we
7 did not adorn our outward bodies, nor did we adorn the
8 tabernacle on earth because Christ is sitting into a
9 place not made by hands. We're suppose to keep our
10 minds open just like the Prophecy says. God is a
11 spirit, he is a truth and he is a light and he's got a
12 word and he's got something to say and we're to know
13 what it is, and that makes us living churches --

14 JIM: Um-hum.

15 DAVID: -- instead of having a big, old,
16 nice, fancy, expensive building, we're suppose to have
17 heads full of knowledge.

18 JIM: David, I, I understand that. I know
19 you can speak of your religious views all day, and,
20 and I think it's compelling and I appreciate it. How
21 can you and I --

22 DAVID: Well, the thing of it is, why is it
23 compelling?

24 JIM: How can you and I move forward though
25 to --

1 DAVID: We are moving --
2 JIM: -- to resolve this situation?
3 DAVID: -- forward.
4 JIM: We are?
5 DAVID: Yeah, we are.
6 JIM: Okay, well, tell me where we are.
7 DAVID: Where we're at right now is I'm
8 waiting just to see --
9 JIM: Okay, that's super. I believe you, I
10 trust you.
11 DAVID: Well, you didn't let me finish.
12 JIM: Okay.
13 DAVID: You got your Bible there?
14 JIM: I'm sorry, no, I don't. I don't.
15 DAVID: You didn't bring it today?
16 JIM: No, I, there's, there was another guy
17 here last night and I don't, don't see it here. But
18 tell me, how can we -- tell me about waiting. What's
19 going to happen? Tell me. Just be straight with me.
20 DAVID: Well, I'm, I'm trying to avoid
21 something here.
22 JIM: Not, not scripture, David, I can't
23 understand it.
24 DAVID: Well, if you can't understand it
25 there's no reason for me to talk to you anymore, Jim.

1 JIM: Well, that's not true, I --

2 DAVID: It is true.

3 JIM: No.

4 DAVID: Otherwise we're just blowing wind.

5 JIM: No, that's not true, David. We --

6 DAVID: Look, you do not respect my
7 authority. You think you have me out-gunned. You
8 think you have me out-numbered.

9 JIM: We know that's not true.

10 DAVID: Well, look, you don't know that's
11 true. Maybe all I got here is a BB gun. I might just
12 have one last bullet. I might have an atomic bomb
13 here.

14 JIM: Let's not --

15 DAVID: You don't know that. You don't know
16 whether I have all kinds of mines around the perimeter
17 of this place. Yeah, you've been, you've been looking
18 at me for eight months. How long have I been
19 preparing for this?

20 JIM: Listen, I regret what happened. I
21 wish in hindsight that this was handled a little bit
22 differently, --

23 DAVID: Oh, I wish --

24 JIM: You know that.

25 DAVID: I wish that --

1 JIM: Wish, we could have talked before this
2 started.

3 DAVID: Well, that would be a good thing to
4 start at, but it's too late now, Jim, for that.

5 JIM: I understand, but the --

6 DAVID: I do want Robert on the phone, if I
7 might, because I want to talk to him just like I would
8 talk to a son of mine.

9 JIM: Okay, well why can't you tell me
10 what's going to happen next, after we wait a while? I
11 mean, is, is something going to happen inside?

12 DAVID: Well, I'm still going to send some
13 more kids out.

14 JIM: Okay, good.

15 DAVID: But here's the, here's the thing
16 now.

17 JIM: All right.

18 DAVID: Well, I'll tell you what.

19 JIM: Can you do that?

20 DAVID: You get you, you get you a Bible, --

21 JIM: Can you --

22 DAVID: We'll bear with this fool just a
23 little longer --

24 JIM: Okay.

25 DAVID: -- and I'll give you a Bible study,

1 and then I'll send another kid out to you, okay? Fair
2 enough?

3 JIM: Well, wait just a second. Just one
4 child? I'd like to --

5 DAVID: Well, this one wants to go.

6 JIM: Oh, who, who is it, can you tell me?

7 DAVID: His name's Mark.

8 JIM: Mark? Okay. How old is he?

9 DAVID: I think he's about ten.

10 JIM: Ten?

11 UNIDENTIFIED VOICE IN BACKGROUND: Twelve.

12 DAVID: Oh, he's twelve? Okay, he's twelve.

13 JIM: Twelve? There's nobody else wants to
14 go, David?

15 DAVID: Well, not, no, not of the kids. I'm
16 going at -- we're fixing to go down to a lot of the
17 babies.

18 JIM: Well, you know, we know you've sent
19 two and I just, we feel a little --

20 DAVID: Like I say, we're, we're kind of
21 like at a mediation now.

22 JIM: Right.

23 DAVID: Like I said, you guys can come in at
24 anytime you want --

25 JIM: We're not coming in.

1 DAVID: -- you can bang or can blow up --

2 JIM: No.

3 DAVID: -- or, you know, try your tear gas
4 on us, you know, see if that works.

5 JIM: It's not happening. It's not
6 happening. That's not happening. (To the background)
7 Hey, get that stuff out of here. This guy's bringing
8 boxes in here. I'm sorry. Hey, that's not going to
9 happen. We're not coming in there. If I let you talk
10 to Robert, I mean, would that make you feel better?
11 Could we then get back to maybe --

12 DAVID: Well, I just want Robert --

13 JIM: -- you know, let somebody out?

14 DAVID: -- I just want to explain, you know
15 -- well, I'm going to do that anyway, but I just want
16 to explain to Robert that, you know, we could have had
17 a good relationship.

18 JIM: Yeah, well, you know, if you have a
19 message I'll send it to him.

20 DAVID: Why don't he give me a call? I want
21 to talk to him on the phone.

22 JIM: Well, I don't think he's in town.

23 DAVID: Well, tell him to give me a call
24 then. Call through somewhere or something.

25 JIM: Listen, on that, on that one child, I

1 think it makes everybody more comfortable if two come
2 out.

3 DAVID: Forget it! Now, Jim, let's get
4 serious now.

5 JIM: Okay, I'm just trying to -- that's the
6 way you wanted to do it before and I was just -- I
7 want to do it the same way. I'm sorry. That's all I
8 was going on.

9 DAVID: Oh, Jim, I've been praying for you
10 so hard. You guys, you guys are just too smart for
11 your own britches.

12 JIM: David, we just want everybody to be
13 safe.

14 DAVID: Look, there is no safety in this
15 world right now. Remember how crazy Noah was? Yeah,
16 I'm crazy, (makes noise), I'm crazy.

17 JIM: You're not crazy.

18 DAVID: Okay? Look, but let me tell you
19 what I'm crazy about.

20 JIM: Um-hum. What?

21 DAVID: I'm crazy about the fact of how well
22 the Prophet Zachariah foretold of a time when there
23 would be four horses that would go to and fro through
24 the earth and nobody would care. And you know, it's
25 funny how those four horses, the same horses that

1 revelation talks about as being a revelation of Jesus
2 Christ, now you guys just do not care, but you're
3 going to care for on that day --

4 JIM: I care. I care.

5 DAVID: No, you, come on, Jim, in that day
6 God says, "I will bring down the haughtiness of men,
7 and their prides should be laid low," and it says,
8 "because they regard not the works of my hand."

9 JIM: Um-hum.

10 DAVID: In Jeremiah 16, you know what God's
11 allowed happen to Jews?

12 JIM: Um-hum.

13 DAVID: They were slaughtered and
14 everything. Given over to the hands of the wicked of
15 the world. But God says, but afterwards, the tables
16 will turn.

17 JIM: Um-hum.

18 DAVID: Now, have you ever heard of the
19 remnant?

20 JIM: The what?

21 DAVID: The remnant.

22 JIM: To remnant? No.

23 DAVID: The last little group of anything is
24 called a remnant.

25 JIM: Um-hum.

1 DAVID: Like remnant carpet.

2 JIM: Right, yeah, I understand.

3 DAVID: Okay. Well, the Bible talks about a
4 later day of the little remnant. A little remnant
5 that did not bow down to the beast or its image.

6 JIM: Right.

7 DAVID: Now, unless you know what the
8 Prophets say about the remnant, you won't know what I
9 believe.

10 JIM: Um-hum.

11 DAVID: Now, if you knew what it said, then
12 you would know what I believe.

13 JIM: Um-hum, I see.

14 DAVID: And then you would understand what
15 you must do --

16 JIM: Yeah.

17 DAVID: -- in order for me and you to become
18 in perfect harmony.

19 JIM: I see. Well, can you tell me what
20 that is?

21 DAVID: Well, like I said, you get your
22 Bible out, give me a call, I'll give you the study and
23 then I want to send you some puppies and Mark.

24 JIM: Puppies?

25 DAVID: You shot my, you shot my dog.

1 JIM: Oh, is that right?

2 DAVID: Yeah, my, my beautiful dog.

3 JIM: I'm sorry, I'm sorry. Okay, let's go
4 forward with your plan like you would. You're going
5 to send out the child and the dogs and then we'll do
6 the scripture?

7 DAVID: Let's do the scripture first. You
8 got your Bible around there anywhere?

9 JIM: That's not what you said though.

10 DAVID: That's what I said.

11 JIM: Well, okay.

12 DAVID: You got your Bible there anywhere?

13 JIM: I can get one in a few minutes.

14 DAVID: Okay, well, look, I need to, my
15 mouth is drying out --

16 JIM: Okay.

17 DAVID: -- I got to --

18 JIM: Okay, let's take a break.

19 DAVID: I'll tell you what --

20 JIM: Listen, one thing I don't want you to
21 do, don't get mad at me. I'm just, you know --

22 DAVID: I don't get, it's -- I'm never, I'm
23 not mad, I -- I don't know how to get mad. All my
24 life.

25 JIM: You -

1 DAVID: I just get sad, now, Psalms 2, it
2 says, "Kiss the son, lest he be angry." At least if
3 you're angry.

4 JIM: Um-hum.

5 DAVID: I don't have that -- I don't know
6 how to get mad.

7 JIM: Right. I understand. I -- I mean --

8 DAVID: (To background) Please Rach? I've
9 got to --

10 JIM: Hey there, David, there's some
11 vehicles going to start moving --

12 DAVID: All right.

13 JIM: It's just shift change.

14 DAVID: No problem.

15 JIM: Don't worry about it. And listen, I
16 know we're in a difficult situation, okay, but you've
17 been, you've been straight and I'm trying to be
18 straight.

19 DAVID: Have you ever thought about dying
20 and going to hell, Jim?

21 JIM: Sure, everybody thinks about that.

22 DAVID: Why do you, why do you worry about
23 going to hell for?

24 JIM: I don't want to.

25 DAVID: You worry about dying for your sins

1 and being punished for all those naughty things you
2 did?

3 JIM: I suppose, don't you?

4 DAVID: No, I don't. No, I don't.

5 JIM: Well, listen, let's take a break and
6 get a drink and let's call back and work out -- is it
7 Mark? Did you say Mark?

8 DAVID: Yeah, Mark.

9 JIM: And the, and the puppies, and let me
10 set up to get the puppies cared for and one other
11 thing I wanted to tell you is get that, I got that
12 money over to the Human Services guys. I've taken
13 care of that for you, you know, for the children.

14 DAVID: Yeah, maybe you can bring -- yeah,
15 well we know, we know that they're not going to use
16 that properly.

17 JIM: Well, I can't say, you know, but I
18 think they will. They assured me they would, let's
19 put it that way, because they assured me they would.

20 DAVID: They figure it's a donation to them,
21 we know.

22 JIM: Well, I don't know what they've done
23 before.

24 DAVID: Well tell them to send me a
25 telephone then, and that cord --

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JIM: Okay.

DAVID: -- so we don't have all this crazy -
-(To the background) Do we have one already opened
Rach?

JIM: I'll try on the telephone. Hey,
David?

DAVID: Sir?

JIM: What time do you want to hook back up?

DAVID: Oh, well, as soon as you get the
Bible and all that down.

JIM: Okay, just a second.

DAVID: Give me a buzz back.

JIM: Okay, it's like, 1:30, how about,
about a half hour or so?

DAVID: Okay, that would be fine.

JIM: Okay, just rest easy, huh?

DAVID: Yeah.

JIM: I'll talk to you. Okay?

DAVID: All right.

JIM: All right, bye.

DAVID: (To the background) Here Rach.
