2 JIM: -- be able to get back with him in a
3 little while.

4 RACHEL: Okay. All right.

5 JIM: All right. You want to go ahead and
6 tell him? I'll --

7 RACHEL (to Koresh): He said just wait on
8 that for now because he needs to work on that. He
9 doesn't want, you know, them to get excited, so just
10 wait and he'll let us know when he can do it.

11 RACHEL TO JIM: He said okay.

12 JIM: Okay. Yeah. I understand that's --
13 the problem and we'll see if we can help you out on
14 that.

15 RACHEL: Well, Cyrus has been bugging me for
16 about the past -- I don't know how long I've been on
17 the phone with you, but he's been bugging me ever
18 since I've got on the phone to talk to you.

19 JIM: Well, let me talk to him.

20 RACHEL: So I will let him talk to you.

21 JIM: Okay.

22 CYRUS: Hi.

23 JIM: Hi, Cyrus.

24 CYRUS: Hi.

25 JIM: Do you know who this is?

1 CYRUS: What?
2 JIM: Do you know who this is?
3 CYRUS: Yes.
4 JIM: Who?
5 CYRUS: Jim.
6 JIM: Yeah. How are you doing?
7 CYRUS: Fine.
8 JIM: What are you doing today?
9 CYRUS: Nothing much.
10 JIM: Nothing much?
11 CYRUS: No, because there's no room to play
12 in here.
13 JIM: There's no room to play? Well, you
14 better get some room.
15 CYRUS: The bed's on the floor.
16 JIM: Uh-oh. You got any good toys in
17 there?
18 CYRUS: No.
19 JIM: You don't? What's your favorite toy?
20 CYRUS: I'd say what thing is -- I don't
21 know.
22 JIM: You don't know? Don't you have like a
23 truck or --
24 CYRUS: A motorcycle is my favorite thing.
25 JIM: Oh. I bet it's a little yellow

1 Suzuki. Is it?
2 CYRUS: And swimming.
3 JIM: Yeah? Swimming?
4 CYRUS: Yeah.
5 JIM: You can swim?
6 CYRUS: Yes.
7 JIM: Boy, you must be pretty big. How old
8 are you? Seven?
9 CYRUS: What? Yeah, I'm seven.
10 JIM: You're seven and you can swim already?
11 CYRUS: Yeah.
12 JIM: Do you like horses?
13 CYRUS: Not that much.
14 JIM: No?
15 CYRUS: No.
16 JIM: Not that much? What do you like the
17 most, what kind of animals? What's your favorite
18 animal?
19 CYRUS: Toy guns and stuff. That's not
20 cheap.
21 JIM: Toy guns?
22 CYRUS: Yeah.
23 JIM: That's the ones you like?
24 CYRUS: Yeah. At Wal-Mart?
25 JIM: At Wal-Mart. What's your favorite

1 kind, a cowboy six-shooter?

2 CYRUS: Yeah.

3 JIM: You like those cowboys, huh?

4 CYRUS: Uh-huh.

5 JIM: That's good. That's good. Well, is
6 everybody doing okay in there?

6 CYRUS: Yeah.

7 JIM: Okay. You're going to come on out and
8 we're going to see you soon, I hope.

9 CYRUS: Yeah.

10 JIM: Are you? You're going to walk out and
11 see us soon?

11 CYRUS: Yeah.

12 JIM: Mark and Kevin and everybody got some
13 ride in those big --

14 CYRUS: Tanks.

15 JIM: -- tanks, yeah. You like those?

16 CYRUS: Yeah.

17 JIM: Yeah. We want you to come out, you
18 know. Cyrus?

18 CYRUS: What?

19 JIM: We want you to come out and bring all
20 your friends, all the kids and everybody.

21 CYRUS: Yeah.

22 JIM: And your moms and stuff and everybody

1 can stay together. Come on out. You know, we're
2 going to have you come out so you can all be together.

3 CYRUS: Jim?

4 JIM: Yeah.

5 CYRUS: I sprained. my foot.

6 JIM: You spanked your foot?

7 CYRUS: I didn't spank it. I sprained it.

8 JIM: Oh, you sprained it.

9 CYRUS: I can walk a little, though.

10 JIM: How did you do that?

11 CYRUS: I went to -- I just fell and it
12 sprained it.

13 JIM: Is it swollen up?

14 CYRUS: It's not that bad now.

15 JIM: Yeah. We have a doctor out here and
16 when you come out, we'll have him look at it. Okay?

17 CYRUS: Yeah.

18 JIM: Make sure you're all right.

19 CYRUS: Can I talk to Kevin?

20 JIM: No. He's not here right now.

21 CYRUS: Oh. Is Mark?

22 JIM: No. They're, they're together, but
23 they're not right where I am. They were here earlier.

24 CYRUS: They're my cousins.

25 JIM: They are?

1 CYRUS: Yeah.

2 JIM: They came out and we gave them some
3 Coke and candy and they got a ride in that tank and
4 they really thought it was neat. They said it was
5 bumpy, though.

6 CYRUS: They thought what was bumpy?

7 JIM: That tank.

8 CYRUS: Oh.

9 JIM: They thought it was a bumpy ride, but
10 they liked it. They're having fun. They're doing
11 good.

12 CYRUS: How come they took them in the tank?

13 JIM: Well, that was just to give them a
14 ride in it.

15 CYRUS: Oh, they wanted a ride in it?

16 JIM: Yeah. Do you want a ride? Have you
17 ever ridden in a tank?

18 CYRUS: No.

19 JIM: Yeah. I think it would be neat.
20 Don't you?

21 CYRUS: How come they didn't go in a car?
22 We didn't know they went in the tank.

23 JIM: Yeah. They went in that tank. They
24 walked down and got in it and drove away. Then they
25 came over here to see me.

1 CYRUS: How come they didn't go in a car?

2 JIM: Oh, because we didn't have a car over
3 there.

4 CYRUS: Oh.

5 JIM: Yeah. They did later. The tank just
6 drove them to a car and then they got in the car.
7 Then they came over here.

8 CYRUS: Oh, the tank drove it -- the tank
9 drove them to where?

10 JIM: It just drove them down the street, a
11 way, so they could have a ride, and then --

12 CYRUS: And then dropped them off into the
13 car and then the car took them to your place?

14 JIM: Right. That's right. Um-hum,
15 exactly. And I'm over here at the airport with all
16 these airplanes and stuff and we're in a big hangar
17 out here.

18 CYRUS: I like, I like airplanes.

19 JIM: Do you?

20 CYRUS: Yeah.

21 JIM: When you come over you can see all
22 these. Okay?

23 CYRUS: Yeah.

24 JIM: I'll let you see all of them. There's
25 even helicopters over here. Do you like helicopters?

1 CYRUS: Yeah.

2 JIM: They got helicopters, airplanes, you
3 know, all kinds of stuff.

4 CYRUS: Jets?

5 JIM: Jets? Yeah, they got jets. And I'm
6 inside this big giant hangar. You wouldn't believe
7 how big it is.

7 (Cyrus speaking to Rachel in background.)

8 CYRUS: Yeah.

9 JIM: Yeah. Well, I want to see you come
10 over here.

11 CYRUS: Could I come over in the car?

12 JIM: Yeah, if you -- come on out. Tell
13 your mom you want to come and I'll arrange it for you.

14 CYRUS: Oh.

15 JIM: You got to tell your mom.

16 CYRUS: What did you say?

17 JIM: You got to tell your mom you want to
18 come out and see Jim and ride in the tank, and I'll,
19 I'll call, I'll call that tank and have him waiting
20 for you if you want to.

21 CYRUS: I want to go in the car. Tanks are
22 kind of bumpy.

23 JIM: Yeah, I know, but just for a little
24 while they're all right, just for a few minutes. All
25

1 right?

2 CYRUS: Yeah.

3 JIM: And then at least you get to see the
4 inside, see what that looks like. I'll bet there's
5 not too many kids you know that have seen the inside
6 of a tank anyway.

7 CYRUS: I know. I never been in a tank
8 before.

9 JIM: I know. Yeah. We take your picture
10 and show you what it looks like with you in that tank.
11 That's what soldiers use, don't they?

12 CYRUS: Yeah.

13 JIM: Yeah. They have tanks like that.

14 (Cyrus whispering in background.)

15 CYRUS: Did you know what they did to Mark?

16 JIM: What?

17 CYRUS: Well, what did they do?

18 JIM: Oh, where did they take him? Cyrus?

19 CYRUS: Why did those people make, make him
20 take his jacket off and everything?

21 JIM: Oh, I don't know. I didn't see him do
22 that. I don't know.

23 CYRUS: Well, that's what they did.

24 JIM: Oh, they did?

25 CYRUS: Yeah. They shouldn't because it

1 makes you kind of nervous.

2 JIM: Yeah. I know that. I can understand
3 that. It's okay, though. Mark was fine when he got
4 here and he was real happy. He talked to his mom and
5 he was fine.

6 CYRUS: He was real happy when he got there
7 and he talked to his mom?

8 JIM: Yeah. He's real happy and he was
9 sitting right next to me in this chair and he was
10 eating a candy bar and a Coca Cola. And I said,
11 "How's that tank?" and he said, "It's fun, but it's
12 bumpy."

13 CYRUS: Yeah. Did the tank drive him all
14 the way there?

15 JIM: No, just a little ways and then he got
16 in the car. Then he was able to get in a car, a
17 police car, one with lights on the top. You ever
18 ridden in a fire truck?

19 CYRUS: A what?

20 JIM: A fire engine or police car?

21 CYRUS: No.

22 JIM: Well, that would be fun, wouldn't it?

23 CYRUS: Yeah, maybe, but I wouldn't want to
24 drive in one. I'd rather go in a tank than one of
25 those.

1 JIM: Yeah? Tanks are big. Airplanes are
2 really neat, though.

3 CYRUS: I know.

4 JIM: Well, let me talk to your mom.

5 CYRUS: Okay. Here she is.

6 RACHEL: How come you didn't let the
7 children have those puppies?

8 JIM: Rache?

9 RACHEL: Yes.

10 JIM: I'm sorry. I didn't hear you.

11 RACHEL: How come they didn't let the
12 children have those puppies?

13 JIM: What we did, we took them to a vet, a
14 veterinarian.

15 RACHEL: Um-hum.

16 JIM: And he said they needed some vitamins
17 and some kind of formula or something. He said they
18 were a little bit sick and they were so newborn, you
19 know?

20 RACHEL: Yeah.

21 JIM: And so he was taking care of them.
22 That's the last I heard.

23 RACHEL: Well, we heard it on the radio that
24 they are --

25 JIM: I can't hear you barely.

1 RACHEL: We heard that they already have new
2 homes, all of them.

3 JIM: Well, I think what -- the vet had told
4 us that each one of them had to be inoculated,
5 vaccinated and hand bottle fed for a few days to get
6 their strength up.

7 RACHEL: Um-hum.

8 JIM: I guess, you know, maybe -- was the
9 mother killed or something?

10 RACHEL: Yes.

11 JIM: Okay.

12 RACHEL: They killed all, all those of
13 David's dogs.

14 JIM: Okay. Well, that's the reason they
15 were weak, so the vet had to give them out for -- you
16 know, to be actually bottle fed and, you know, to get
17 their strength up. They're cute little things.

18 RACHEL: Um-hum.

19 JIM: When they -- what are they, malamutes
20 or something?

21 RACHEL: Well, actually we weren't too happy
22 about the cross-breeding.

23 JIM: Oh.

24 RACHEL: We wanted a pure breed and we had
25 the dogs in the front yard blocked off so that, you

1 know, they wouldn't get out and -- to get to the other
2 dogs and so the dogs on the outside wouldn't get to
3 them but, anyway, a male dog from the outside -- I
4 don't know how he got in, jumped over --

5 CYRUS IN BACKGROUND: Jumped in.

6 RACHEL: Jumped over. Oh, yeah, he jumped
7 over because the female dog was in heat, so he jumped
8 over and he was not a malamute, so he's the one that
9 got her pregnant.

10 JIM: Oh, I see.

11 RACHEL: He was a brown -- he was totally
12 brown. I don't know what kind of dog he was. He was
13 kind of a husky looking dog.

14 JIM: Yeah.

15 RACHEL: And so they're not full breeds.

16 JIM: Oh, I see.

17 RACHEL: But the malamutes were.

18 JIM: Yeah. I saw -- they kind of -- don't
19 they kind of have like a little black face or
20 something?

21 RACHEL: You know, they're from Alaska,
22 those type of dogs, and they have black and white in
23 them.

24 RACHEL TO CYRUS: Did they have grey at all?

25 CYRUS: Part wolf.

1 RACHEL TO CYRUS: Do they have grey? Do
2 they have grey in them? Did the dogs have grey in
3 them or is it just black and white? Malamutes.

4 RACHEL: I think it's just black and white,
5 but they're -- they get -- in the wintertime they get
6 really furry. Not just black and white, maybe, maybe
7 have some brown and different colors in them, you
8 know. It's --

9 JIM: Right.

10 RACHEL: It's, it's just a kind of a
11 mixture, but they're real -- they get real furry and
12 husky type.

13 JIM: Yeah.

14 (Cyrus talking to Rachel in background.)

15 JIM: I love dogs. They're, they're cute.
16 Those are -- they're well cared for.

17 RACHEL: Um-hum. Yeah. We just wanted to,
18 you know, get them out of here because they did need
19 some special attention.

20 JIM: Well, I know you, you did and in any
21 case we got them to the vet and --

22 RACHEL: The kids were having to feed them
23 out of baby bottles.

24 JIM: Well, hey, that's exactly what the vet
25 said, yeah. He said they had to be like hand fed, you

1 know.

2 RACHEL: Um-hum.

3 JIM: And he gave them some vitamins and he
4 said they were just fine except they're just so little
5 that, you know, without their mother they had to have
6 the vitamin boost and the, and the hand feeding, so I
7 think that was why they did it that way. Is there
8 some other dogs out there?

8 RACHEL: Other dogs?

9 JIM: Yeah. Is there any other dogs?

10 RACHEL: I don't know. I don't know if they
11 killed them or not.

12 JIM: They -- of course, we know there's
13 some dead. That's the ones the guys want to bury, you
14 know.

15 RACHEL: Yeah. Well, those are right in the
16 front yard. The other -- we had some others and they
17 were just roaming around. They're all just stray
18 dogs. I mean, people like to drop off dogs in the
19 country, I think.

18 JIM: Oh, yeah.

19 RACHEL: And we'd get dogs and we'd try to
20 get rid of them and after awhile we just stopped
21 trying to get rid of dogs.

22 JIM: Um-hum, I understand.

23

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1 RACHEL: Because sometimes you get rid of
2 them and they come back.

3 JIM: Yeah.

4 RACHEL: But I don't know if we have any
5 more or not because I don't know if they -- they may
6 have killed them.

7 JIM: Yeah. Well, how's David doing?

8 RACHEL: Let's see. I can't really tell.
9 There's -- I can't even see him.

10 JIM: You know, we're ready if you want to
11 send some other children out.

12 RACHEL: Just a minute. Let me see if I can
13 talk --

14 JIM: Yeah, talk to him. You know --

15 CYRUS: Jim?

16 JIM: Hey, Cyrus.

17 CYRUS: Are we going to be able to get -- go
18 to our grandma?

19 JIM: Well, we'll try. Where's your grandma
20 at?

21 CYRUS: She's in --

22 CYRUS TO RACHEL: Is she in Tyler?

23 CYRUS: She lives in Chandler.

24 JIM: Where?

25 CYRUS: Chandler.

1 JIM: Chandler, Oklahoma?
2 CYRUS: Huh?
3 JIM: Chandler, Texas? Oh, yeah. Okay.
4 Yeah. Well, we can, we can give them a call and see
5 if we can get in touch with them, you know.
6 CYRUS: It's Chandler and it's by Tyler.
7 JIM: By Tyler. Okay.
8 CYRUS: We really want to be with our
9 grandma than with someone we don't know.
10 JIM: Hey, let me check on that for you.
11 Okay?
12 CYRUS: Yeah.
13 JIM: Okay? Do you like your grandma?
14 CYRUS: Yeah.
15 JIM: Okay. Yeah.
16 (Cyrus whispering in background.)
17 JIM: Give me her name, Cyrus, so I can
18 check on it.
19 CYRUS: Cyrus --
20 JIM: No, not your name, your grandma's
21 name.
22 CYRUS: Oh, Bonnie.
23 JIM: Bonnie what?
24 CYRUS TO RACHEL: Bonnie what?
25 CYRUS: Wait a minute, okay?

1 CYRUS TO RACHEL: Momma? Mommy? Mommy, is
2 Grandma's name Bonnie what? He might get us -- we
3 might get to be able to go to Grandma's house. Her
4 name is Bonnie what?

5 RACHEL TO CYRUS: He'll put you in a foster
6 care home.

7 CYRUS TO RACHEL: No. He's going to -- me,
8 but he needs Bonnie's -- and then her last name.

9 RACHEL TO CYRUS: Haldeman.

10 CYRUS: Bonnie Haldeman.

11 JIM: Haldeman?

12 CYRUS: Yeah.

13 JIM: Okay.

14 CYRUS: Here's my momma.

15 JIM: Okay. Rache?

16 STAR: Hi.

17 JIM: Hi. Hey, is Rachel there?

18 STAR: No.

19 JIM: Who is this?

20 STAR: Star.

21 JIM: Star? Oh, okay. How are you doing?

22 STAR: Fine.

23 JIM: Are you going to come out and see me?

24 STAR: Hum?

25 JIM: Are you going to come out and see me?

1 This is Jim.

2 STAR: Yes.

3 JIM: Okay. Good. I want to see you later.

4 Okay? All right? Would that be good?

5 STAR: Okay.

6 JIM: All right. Let me talk to your mom.

7 STAR: What?

8 JIM: Is your mom there?

9 STAR: My dad is.

10 JIM: Oh, is he there?

11 STAR: He's talking to her.

12 JIM: Oh, your dad's talking to her?

13 STAR: Yes.

14 JIM: Okay.

15 STAR: But now she's here.

16 JIM: Okay. Let me talk to her.

17 RACHEL: Jim?

18 JIM: Hey, Rache, Bonnie Haldeman, is that
19 Cyrus' grandmother?

20 RACHEL: Yes.

21 JIM: They told me that she was already here
22 in Waco.

23 RACHEL: Uh-huh.

24 JIM: And she was supposed to be going with
25 the Health and Human Services people to some hearing

1 on Tuesday --

2 RACHEL: Uh-huh.

3 JIM: -- to get custody of the kids.

4 RACHEL: Oh, really?

5 JIM: Yeah. That's what they told me.

6 RACHEL: Of which ones?

7 JIM: Well, apparently -- no, they didn't
8 tell me. All of them. All of them or all of them she
9 wants. I don't know how many grandchildren she has
10 there.

11 RACHEL: Oh, okay.

12 JIM: Do you know?

13 RACHEL: Well, I don't know what she's
14 doing, so --

15 JIM: Okay. I mean, do you want the kids to
16 be with her?

17 RACHEL: Yeah, because I mean, I'd rather
18 have them with somebody close, you know.

19 JIM: Okay. Well, I mean --

20 RACHEL: Anyway, Steve wants to talk to you.
21 Okay?

22 JIM: Okay.

23 RACHEL: David said to tell you he'll be
24 having a baby here in a little bit.

25 JIM: Oh, no, no.

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RACHEL: Not --

JIM: I know what you mean.

RACHEL: Not him. It's someone else.

JIM: Oh. Is one of the ladies really
having a baby?

RACHEL TO DAVID: He said is one of the
ladies having a baby?

RACHEL: Two of them.

JIM: Two of them?

RACHEL: Um-hum.

JIM: Yeah. That's not today, is it?

RACHEL TO DAVID: He said is that today?

RACHEL: No, not today.

JIM: Okay. I'm saying if they're that
close, though, do we need to send them out?

RACHEL TO DAVID: He said they're that
close, we need to send them out.

RACHEL: We might let someone come in like a
midwife or something.

JIM: Oh, we can't let anybody come in.

RACHEL: Well, then we'll just have to do it
ourselves, won't we?

JIM: Okay. Rache?

RACHEL: Yeah.

JIM: Okay. Sure you don't want to let them

1 | come out? I mean, we'll get them to the hospital.

2 | RACHEL: They don't -- you know, if they
3 | don't want to, they want to.

4 | JIM: Well, I understand.

5 | RACHEL: So if you don't want to let a
6 | midwife come in, then we'll just have to do it
7 | ourselves.

8 | JIM: Okay. All right.

9 | RACHEL: I mean, yeah, I've had three
10 | children and I've had --

11 | JIM: That's your decision.

12 | RACHEL: I had all my three children at
13 | home.

14 | JIM: Yeah. I understand.

15 | RACHEL: You know?

16 | JIM: That's your decision. If you need
17 | anything, medical supplies --

18 | RACHEL: Can I ask you something?

19 | JIM: Yeah.

20 | RACHEL: Why is it that you'll let a doctor
21 | come in to help David, but you won't let a midwife in
22 | to deliver a baby?

23 | JIM: Well, we won't let a doctor in to help
24 | David.

25 | RACHEL: I thought that's what you said to

1 me.

2 JIM: No. I have a doctor here --

3 RACHEL: Oh, okay.

4 JIM: -- with me at the airport and what I
5 will do is you tell me about his wounds --

6 RACHEL: Okay.

7 JIM: -- and I will advise you that the
8 doctor says this or if you do this. You see, that's
9 what I meant. If he comes out he can see the doctor.
10 We can't send anyone in, you know.

11 RACHEL: Okay.

12 JIM: Because, you know, they wouldn't go.
13 They'd be afraid, you know.

14 RACHEL: Right. Steve wants to talk to you.
15 Okay?

16 JIM: Okay.

17 STEVE: Hello, Jim.

18 JIM: Steve, how are you doing?

19 STEVE: Not too bad. Yeah. I was listening
20 to that on the radio. I didn't see it actually on
21 T.V. about the, the press conference that was given
22 and --

23 JIM: Yeah.

24 STEVE: -- it's always entertaining to see
25 what some of the ATF agents or the FBI agents are

1 going to say, how they say it, the implication of it,
2 the connotations used.

3 JIM: It's not very accurate, I know.

4 STEVE: Number one, you know, I don't --
5 like yesterday, I mean, like we were talking, how they
6 gave the information out that guys here had a gun
7 battle with the Sheriff's Department in '87. I mean -
8 -

8 JIM: Well, that's not right.

9 STEVE: Well, you mean to tell me these
10 agencies with all the evidences, all the different
11 equipment at hand and everything else, they can't get
12 the facts together before they go on national,
13 international?

13 JIM: Well, they should.

14 STEVE: I mean, yeah. Well, that sounds
15 nice, you telling me that they should, but you're in a
16 position where you -- you know, I'm cut off. I can't
17 talk to anybody but yourself, so you can sympathize
18 with me and say nice things to me like this, but when
19 it keeps on coming out on the T.V. and like what was
20 said about David in this conference earlier today,
21 "Well, he's miraculously recovering," and then, of
22 course, all the laughter. If you got to see what you
23 guys did to him -- I did. I thought -- he thought I
24

1 thought he would have been dead within hours of that.

2 He was laying on the floor. We dragged him along.

3 He's never moved from that place.

4 JIM: Well, I know that.

5 STEVE: That's the truth.

6 JIM: I know that.

7 STEVE: And when -- you showed concern
8 because you thought like yourself as there may be Gary
9 and Henry that he would die and I tell you the truth,
10 we thought more than likely originally he would.

11 JIM: I'm glad he's better.

12 STEVE: Well, yeah, I am too, but, you know,
13 it's the way it was stated even to the press like, you
14 know, it's a, it's a sarcasm to his -- you know, the
15 lamb and the seven seals. Only the lamb can open up
16 the seven seals. And then he's never claimed to be
17 Jesus Christ. He never said he was.

18 JIM: I agree. He's never said that.

19 STEVE: He did state that only the lamb can
20 open the seven seals and he offers to show people all
21 throughout the scriptures the seven seals.

22 JIM: Right. Steven, I know that and the
23 only thing that they --

24 STEVE: That way -- see, that way, Jim, God
25 says who this person is. You see what I'm saying?

1 JIM: I understand.

2 STEVE: But, I mean, well, what -- do you
3 have any kind of -- probably no influence, but you
4 probably can at least communicate. Can't -- what
5 about these conferences?

6 JIM: I promise that I will and let me tell
7 you that what we have communicated up there, Henry and
8 I, is that -- and I'm sorry and I apologize for that
9 comment on the T.V. that was made that way. If that
10 man made it, it shouldn't have been done that way,
11 but, but we have passed up, okay. I want you to know.

12 STEVE: Okay.

13 JIM: And that was that Sunday David was
14 hurting. Okay?

15 STEVE: Um-hum.

16 JIM: That was Sunday evening. You
17 remember?

18 STEVE: Oh, yeah, for sure.

19 JIM: And --

20 STEVE: But it's these kind of sarcastic
21 comments, the way they're, you know, put out.

22 JIM: I think, I think that was very
23 inappropriate for them to do that and I will pass that
24 up and I think it is inappropriate.

25 STEVE: I mean, this is really -- I really -

1 -to tell you the truth, I'm really teed off. I hate
2 to see how this country of America has digressed and
3 your type of agencies are one of the biggest causes
4 for it. You -- some of you young guys like
5 yourselves, you have a job. You've become a
6 professional in an area. At the same time there is
7 getting to be a Big Brother. You're part of it. You
8 do your job right and you may have a family and so
9 forth, but there's still a vigilance of freedom that
10 needs to be kept up. Read the writings on the
11 statements of people like Abraham Lincoln or Jefferson
12 or Madison, the great principles laid down, so things
13 that are happening now
14 that -- which you are more a part of than anybody,
15 would never take place. Like I can't talk to the
16 outside world. You've taken care of that, your kind
17 of people.

16 JIM: I understand.

17 STEVE: The press are so far back that you
18 guys could come and blow us away and they wouldn't --
19 and you could write -- give any kind of a story you
20 wanted.

20 JIM: We're not going to blow you away.

21 STEVE: I don't care if you -- let me tell
22 you something, Jim. I really don't care if you did or
23
24
25

1 didn't. In the first place, the point being, there is
2 a God that you and I stand before whether you and I
3 believe it or not and on one day all of us give an
4 account. And I mean, we, this group, does fear God
5 first over man.

6 JIM: I believe that.

7 STEVE: I know you believe that.

8 JIM: I know this.

9 STEVE: But, you know, it's starting to
10 become annoying after all these days of sitting here.
11 When I see this kind of stuff and you hear it on the
12 radio, I mean, I've known for years what's been
13 happening.

14 JIM: Well, Steve --

15 STEVE: No, no. Listen to me, please. I
16 just want to get something off my chest --

17 JIM: Okay.

18 STEVE: -- because, you know, after awhile
19 it gets very annoying.

20 JIM: I understand.

21 STEVE: For years and years as a young
22 person I was into the study of history because one
23 does not want to repeat the mistakes of others. I've
24 always wanted to see why there was a first World War,
25 why a second World War, so I've taken a lot of history

1 classes through high school and so forth. Many
2 questions were raised, but few answered and the
3 answers that were given never really made a lot of
4 sense. There was not a lot of logic or sense to those
5 answers. Then I started hearing about a group called
6 the Council on Foreign Relations, a group called the
7 Trilateral Commission.

8 JIM: I've heard -- hey, I've heard of that.

9 STEVE: I know. The Illuminati. Come to
10 find out, they're real organizations with the
11 Rockefellers and all these great merchants behind all
12 of these politicians, all of these puppets.

13 JIM: Is it --

14 STEVE: But your, but your agency and all
15 those are part of that whole thing, taking away the
16 freedoms of America and using innuendos and all sorts
17 of the ways to go about doing it, more legislation,
18 more regulations, more laws, so that ultimately a
19 person has no freedom. So taxed to death that you
20 never have a choice with the hard earned money you
21 make to choose to where it should be paid.

22 JIM: Yeah.

23 STEVE: I mean, think of this whole thing.

24 JIM: I understand.

25 STEVE: But here you're a part of an agency,

1 a part of the government, that has done some of the
2 most -- I saw that Gun Owners of America, that video.

3 JIM: Um-hum.

4 STEVE: I don't know if you ever got to view
5 that one that talks about your agency, how you're law
6 breakers and what you did to those two policeman that
7 were good cops all their li-- all those 20 years out
8 in New Jersey.

8 JIM: Right.

9 STEVE: I mean, that -- I mean, if that
10 doesn't tee off an American that's into freedom, and
11 I'm for your freedom also, for your freedoms of
12 choice.

12 JIM: Right.

13 STEVE: But what you guys have already
14 showed me, what you did with the Weaver case, I mean,
15 that already bothered me and here now I'm involved in
16 something like this.

17 JIM: Yeah.

18 STEVE: Whatever happens to me I hope that
19 you have yourself right with God, that you're not part
20 of an organization or part of something that -- I
21 mean, God condemns that kind of thing. You might
22 think he condemns a lot of things we're doing and from
23 what you've heard about us, but you've gotten to hear
24
25

1 a lot of things out of the mouth of David here.

2 JIM: Yeah.

3 STEVE: And you go find your greatest
4 theologian in the world. If there -- if there's some
5 truth to that Bible -- I think you said your
6 background was Catholic?

7 JIM: Well, when I was a little boy and then
8 now I'm a Christian.

9 STEVE: Whatever that means. You know, I
10 mean, I'm not a Christian. I've always wanted to be a
11 Christian, but a Christian is something I have not
12 seen in my whole lifetime. But, anyway, aside from
13 that -- but, you know, I'm again concerned about
14 what's going on. All my years in this country of
15 American I've always loved the Constitution and the
16 statements of men like Abraham Lincoln and Jefferson,
17 some of these men, but this country is no longer what
18 it was then. Now there's men that have -- very
19 powerful men that, that -- those guys that do get
20 into office. I mean, when you look at someone like
21 Bush and Clinton, both associated with the Trilateral
22 Commission, who are you voting for? Just like in '80
23 you had what's his name, Anderson and Carter, Carter
24 being the first member, the first one to become
25 President in '76, handpicked by Rockefeller in '73.

1 Every cabinet member belonged to the Trilateral
2 Commission. What on earth is this? What's happened
3 to this country. But you don't read about it in the
4 press. Is it controlled, is the question? Well, how
5 come you don't get a broader view of things?

6 JIM: Yeah.

7 STEVE: And those men that are on these talk
8 shows even, right away if there's someone in there
9 that starts speaking logic or sense or if they raise a
10 question about your agency or anything else, who's
11 watching the watchdog. You understand?

12 JIM: Right.

13 STEVE: Who's watching the watchdog? Right
14 away they get -- usually are taken off or the time is
15 out. I mean, I've watched this all my life. I've
16 always considered myself to be a conservative, someone
17 who is not into taxes, who's into the freedom of
18 people so that they can express themselves. They can
19 create. They can do -- as long as they're not hurting
20 their fellow man, they're doing the best. But, I
21 mean, that's not the way this country is degenerating
22 to and this is what the Bible shows in advance.

23 JIM: Right.

24 STEVE: But, you know, me watching this --
25 you know, like you hear this on the, on the radio and

1 so forth. Here we go again. But maybe, if we're
2 right, what we're telling you through the Bible and
3 David's showing you, there's going to be a one last
4 time. People are going to be answering. There's
5 going to be someone that's going to open up a book
6 that has to do with your eternal salvation, my eternal
7 salvation. If it's not him, it's going to be
8 somebody.

8 JIM: Right.

9 STEVE: And I could give you enough chapters
10 and verses right now where you can go back to the Old
11 Testament. It talks about a man that comes in the
12 final days that can open up and show information of
13 the future pertaining to one's salvation, and they
14 can't controvert it. That's what all these prophets
15 talk about. Yet you've got all these theologians,
16 ministers, priests that are totally unaware of it,
17 totally unaware.

17 JIM: Yeah.

18 STEVE: Because I've met with them myself
19 and they're quiet. They don't know how to answer you.
20 They can't.

21 JIM: Well, you know, it's hard to get into
22 a debate, Steve, with you for those ministers. I
23 mean, you're a pretty bright guy and you know your --
24
25

1 STEVE: No. I'm a person that has always
2 loved truth.

3 JIM: Right.

4 STEVE: Whatever I am or not. You know,
5 some said I can speak and this, that. I -- there's
6 many that can speak ten times better than myself.
7 But, besides that, I don't care about that. I'm a,
8 I'm a being that has awareness, that experienced good
9 things, bad things. We all want to experience the
10 good. We want fulfillment. We want joy, happiness.
11 We all do. There's something wrong with a being that
12 does not want that. So I've always tried to
13 understand what it is that could ensure that you could
14 have it forever. Why do we have to die? Why is there
15 the problems that there are with and between people?
16 So I've always wanted to find a way out of all of
17 this, so my whole life has been one of looking for the
18 truth of my own awareness, my own being and direction
19 and trying to help -- once obtaining as much as I can,
20 always looking for more, trying to help others see the
21 same thing if they have an honesty of heart.

22 JIM: Well --

23 STEVE: But, you know, and --

24 JIM: I know, Steve. You and -- in fact,
25 Henry and I talked about this this morning before he

1 left and you and David have impressed both of us with
2 your, your knowledge and --

3 STEVE: Well, you know --

4 JIM: And I --

5 STEVE: But if the knowledge is only air, if
6 it's only words in the air by a little cultic group
7 that's weird and, you know, you listen with one ear
8 and pass it off with the other, I mean so what. You
9 know, I don't want to -- I want to try to be honest
10 with you. I don't want to play any games with you.

11 JIM: Well, you have been honest.

12 STEVE: You're right, I have been, but I'll
13 be -- you know, I don't know -- you know, I've seen so
14 many men like Gonzalez come in and listen and I -- to
15 tell you the truth, I was -- right from the beginning
16 I thought that he was just -- I didn't think he was
17 honest, but I hoped that there might be something in
18 him where he could be.

19 JIM: Well --

20 STEVE: I really did. But, I mean, not to
21 even say that there isn't. Maybe, maybe he is
22 somewhat convicted but, like I told you, I hold
23 nothing against the man. In fact, I still like the
24 guy. I really do.

25 JIM: Well, I can see how that bothers you,

1 you know, the deception, and I can appreciate that.

2 STEVE: Well, no, it -- that part doesn't
3 because, you know, I can understand that there are
4 times that if there's something that seems volatile or
5 there's a dangerous situation. No, that's why I say,
6 that's not, that's not a problem.

7 JIM: Yeah.

8 STEVE: But what was a problem -- if you've
9 been listening to the news, I'm glad there's Americans
10 that have good minds, that are raising questions,
11 basic questions, of human freedom and realities with
12 the Constitution like why you guys did what you did,
13 why wasn't the sheriff who we've invited out here --
14 they've come out on their own. They've never had harm
15 from us.

16 JIM: Yeah.

17 STEVE: But why didn't they come and serve
18 him with a warrant and he said he would have -- but
19 now you -- there is no question. If you were on the
20 grounds or in an airplane watching, you will know for
21 a fact you guys start firing on us.

22 JIM: Well, that needs to come out. You
23 need --

24 STEVE: Yeah. What about Weaver? What's
25 happening with the Weaver trial? Let me see how you

1 | guys do and what kind of freedom and access he has to
2 | defend himself of that case.

3 | JIM: Okay. But, Steve, let's talk about
4 | Weaver. He walked out of there safely, right?

5 | STEVE: Well, what -- how come his wife got
6 | killed? What about -- wasn't it the boy and --

7 | JIM: That was a tragedy.

8 | STEVE: Yeah. Well, why did you guys do
9 | that?

10 | JIM: Well, a U.S. Marshal was killed,
11 | wasn't he?

12 | STEVE: Yeah. I heard that they shot his --
13 | the dog first and the kid. Anyway, it sounds from all
14 | --

15 | JIM: I agree with you. I mean, it was
16 | tragedy on both sides. It was terrible and I --

17 | STEVE: I don't -- I just wonder about BATF.
18 | I've heard not that many good things about it. I
19 | just know that --

20 | JIM: I understand.

21 | STEVE: Huh?

22 | JIM: I understand. I've heard -- I know.
23 | I'm familiar with --

24 | STEVE: But at the same time I know there's
25 | good people in every organization in everything. I

1 mean, the same with religion. There's more bad people
2 in religion than there are good and I could even be
3 one. I mean, you know. So it's not that it's just
4 one organization or one agency or anything else.

5 JIM: Right. I mean, there's good people in
6 an organization and there's bad people. I agree with
7 --

8 STEVE: But obviously, you know, after
9 hearing all this, you know, one becomes very
10 concerned. Here we go with the same old stories we've
11 seen and heard all the time and the truth always gets
12 buried. Does one really get an opportunity to speak
13 out and to try to defend themselves?

14 JIM: You know --

15 STEVE: I've seen -- I don't know if you
16 have, but I've seen in a court of law many times
17 judges cut off someone that was trying to speak to
18 bring out information.

19 JIM: I don't disagree with you. I don't
20 disagree with you, but I've also seen the other side
21 where judges --

22 STEVE: Rare and few between.

23 JIM: -- force the truth. Well, they'll
24 force the truth and they want the truth. I think your
25 side needs to be heard and --

1 STEVE: Oh, it will be heard but, you know,
2 I believe that it will be heard the way God has said.
3 I mean, hopefully it can be heard, you know, the way
4 I would like also, the way you're speaking about, but
5 whether you believe it or not, I believe that the
6 whole world will get to see and hear the issues that
7 have begun here, that have come by that tape.

8 JIM: Right.

9 STEVE: If we had an open access which you
10 guys cut off on us to, you know, the press, we'd be
11 speaking about these issues of the Bible and, and
12 bringing up the issues that many ministers have tried
13 to close off for years like -- I've been -- I was a
14 Seventh Day Adventist for a lot of years and my mother
15 first was a Catholic. That was her background. My
16 dad was a Lutheran. My dad became an Adventist. My
17 mother then became and it was quite a process before
18 she came. She took my dad to a meeting where a priest
19 was leading out. My dad was asking so many questions
20 the priest couldn't answer. That started raising
21 questions in her own head about her religion,
22 Catholicism.

23 JIM: Yeah.

24 STEVE: So -- but in the process one day --
25 I mean, I'm raised as an Adventist, but then in high

1 school I got away from it. I wanted to try worldly
2 things.

3 JIM: Well, Steve, you know, I just want to
4 tell you this. I really appreciate all the time you
5 spent with me in the last few days and you've been
6 straight and I -- and through this hard time -- you
7 know, it's been a hard time for all of us -- you have
8 been straight and I just want to tell you that I
9 appreciate that. I really do. I really do. I mean,
10 you always, you know, come out and tell me like it is
11 and --

12 STEVE: But I just wanted to make a point,
13 though, because you see it in all things in life and
14 that is once become an Adventist, then because I saw
15 more truth with that religion than any other because I
16 sat down and compared Buddhism, Hinduism, Shintoism,
17 Zoroastrianism. All these world religions I studied
18 them, compared all the denominations, their
19 challenges, their statements, back and forth, back and
20 forth, and the one that held the most clarity and it
21 would seem substance, had the strongest, strongest
22 foundation was the Seventh Day Adventism, but then
23 once joining that church and seeing the corruption in
24 it, as any other, and that really they were doing
25 nothing with the little bit of truth they had, one day

1 someone starts showing me a little more. Well, it
2 raised questions in my mind. I took it back to the
3 church. That church immediately shut me off from
4 speaking to the people I was part of. I had given
5 tithes, offerings, thousands of dollars. I'd spent
6 \$60,000 on education.

7 JIM: I always wonder what some of those
8 churches do with that money, don't you?

9 STEVE: Well, yeah. We'll, I'll tell --
10 like the -- all these churches are worth billions of
11 dollars.

12 JIM: They buy a bunch of gold statues and
13 --

14 STEVE: Well, that's some of them. You
15 know, like the Eastern Orthodox, Catholicism, they're
16 into the ornate and all the rest and beautiful
17 furnishings where say somebody like the -- some of the
18 Protestants, the Adventists, for instance, which I was
19 part of, have billions of dollars from tithes and
20 offerings that they put into money orders, into the
21 stock market and so forth and --

22 JIM: I'll tell you, there's some, there's
23 some people controlling that stock market.

24 STEVE: Well, I don't know a whole lot. I
25 mean, I've read a lot of books about it, but at the

1 same time, you know, I'm --

2 JIM: You don't think that's kosher, do you?
3 I mean, you don't think that's right?

4 STEVE: Well, of course, it isn't. Of
5 course, it isn't.

6 JIM: I mean, there's --

7 STEVE: Anyway.

8 JIM: That's manipulated.

9 STEVE: See, what I was saying, though, is
10 how I finally got involved in such a thing as this was
11 I was actually removed from the Seventh Day Adventist
12 church because of raising questions they could not
13 answer. Even when they kicked me out, the very day
14 they did, I stood at their pulpit and I says, "Why are
15 you kicking me out?" I says, "All I wanted to do was
16 raise questions about some of these scriptures you do
17 not know anything about or, if you do, show me or tell
18 me." They removed me, not because I was an adulterer,
19 because I smoke or drink because I didn't do things
20 anyway or because I didn't go to church or whatever
21 else because there were people in that church that did
22 do all the things that were against their varied views
23 and their laws and so forth. But Satan is not --
24 isn't bothered by anybody, what they do, unless you
25 raise issues to do with something that is true, the

1 realities of God. So ultimately my wife and I and
2 many others were removed, about almost -- about
3 somewhere around 20 of us from one church alone, about
4 20 from one church alone.

5 JIM: Is that right?

6 STEVE: Yes. All because of raising
7 questions that were in the Bible which they could not
8 answer. So from that day to this the ones that have
9 given us more hard times than everybody, not the
10 government, mind you -- Jim, it's not been the
11 government. It's been religious ministers with
12 doctorate degrees, Ph.D.s, D.D.s.

13 JIM: Well, do you think they -- those --
14 some of those people provide this wrong information to
15 the government?

16 STEVE: I don't know. I know that Marc
17 Breault has. I know that he's been an adversary since
18 he left, about six months after he left.

19 JIM: You know, I --

20 STEVE: I'm sure the rest because they
21 couldn't contend with David in places like London.

22 JIM: Right.

23 STEVE: When they can't do it -- here's what
24 -- well, let me give you an example real quick. I met
25 a -- when I was removed from that church in Hawaii,

1 temporarily I stayed with a friend, Paul Fatta, my
2 wife and I, and he had another roommate and we were
3 staying there because we were getting rid of our
4 place, and in the process we'd raise every day the
5 issues because he was a member of the same church,
6 this man by the name of Bob Garcia. And the guy
7 couldn't contend with the information we had. It was
8 just too overwhelming what we had gotten from David.
9 So in the process then he kind of stayed away from us
10 because he just knew he couldn't handle it and he knew
11 that we had things that were right. So months and
12 months went by and guess what -- about a year goes by
13 and then that shootout happens in Texas. Well, then
14 he had a reason why he never joined us or became part.
15 He says, "Well, look at what this guy finally went
16 and did. He was involved in some shootout and so
17 forth. That's why I never came in because I could
18 tell that ahead of time."

17 JIM: Well, then they are judging you when
18 they don't even know the facts.

18 STEVE: Oh, no. I mean, he couldn't do it
19 by the Bible is what I'm saying, so he waits and an
20 issue comes about later of something he reads not
21 knowing what it was about. But the whole thing is
22 from the Bible he could not contend with what we had,
23
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25

1 but at the same time when he brought that up, what
2 happened, I says, "Well, look at Luke 22, verse 36
3 through 8, when Christ told his own disciples to take
4 swords with them."

5 JIM: Wait. Hold on, Steve.

6 STEVE: Sure.

7 JIM TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: What did you
8 say? Okay.

9 JIM: All right. He wants me.

10 STEVE: Pardon?

11 JIM: All right. I'm sorry. They're
12 calling me for -- hold on.

13 JIM TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: I was talking
14 to Steve. Okay.

15 JIM: Hey?

16 STEVE: Yeah.

17 JIM: Can I call you in a little while?

18 STEVE: Sure. Call me back.

19 JIM: Okay. And I'm working on two things.
20 Okay?

21 STEVE: Okay.

22 JIM: One is a phone.

23 STEVE: All right.

24 JIM: And the other is those dogs.

25 STEVE: Will it be bugged?

1 JIM: No, it's not going to be bugged. And
2 those dogs.

3 STEVE: Yeah. Okay.

4 JIM: Okay? Because --

5 STEVE: Jim, you're really telling me that
6 the phone that we would get from you would not be
7 bugged?

8 JIM: Hey, if you think it's bugged, treat
9 it that way.

10 STEVE: I mean, can you tell me for a fact
11 ahead of time, though, that it won't be? I want you
12 to tell me that and then I won't even have a problem.

13 JIM: I'm not fixing the phone.

14 STEVE: Okay. But I want you to -- you're
15 the negotiator now.

16 JIM: Right.

17 STEVE: All the world -- I mean, all the
18 press world, everybody, it all comes down to you
19 talking to me.

20 JIM: Right. Right.

21 STEVE: Whatever you tell me, I'm going to
22 take.

23 JIM: Right.

24 STEVE: And there are ways for --

25 JIM: Well, I'll tell you what --

1 STEVE: -- us, of course, to get messages
2 out to the world anyway.

3 JIM: I know that.

4 STEVE: We're just waiting to give you guys
5 an opportunity to show your honesty and so forth --

6 JIM: We're not going to bug the phone.

7 STEVE: -- and you've done well so far.

8 JIM: Yeah. Well, we won't bug it.

9 STEVE: Okay. All right.

10 JIM: I can't. I mean, I'm not going to
11 even see it probably, so --

12 STEVE: Right, but I want your word in
13 behalf of all the agents.

14 JIM: Okay. You got it.

15 STEVE: Okay, good.

16 JIM: And if you feel differently, don't use
17 it.

18 STEVE: No, no, because I -- when I tell you
19 -- the only reason why we're receiving it, accepting
20 it, is because we want to -- this phone here, your
21 agencies keep on saying that we -- you take our calls
22 but you'll call us. A lot of times the phone rings
23 and we don't answer it. That's not -- any time it's
24 ever rung we've picked it up at least within about
25 three, four rings.

1 JIM: No. We know that, Steve. We know
2 that.

3 STEVE: Well, why -- whatever -- whoever the
4 guy is, I think it's Jamar or whatever the guy's name
5 is, get it straight. I mean, I don't -- that's bad,
6 those little things like that because there's no truth
7 to it.

8 JIM: Yeah, right and I'll pass that on.
9 And, listen, if we were trying to send you some bugged
10 phone, you know, we'd have sent it in the first day
11 and tried to force it on you. You guys asked us for a
12 phone --

13 STEVE: I know. That's what I'm saying.

14 JIM: -- for a week. I mean, we're not
15 trying to trick you.

16 STEVE: No, no, of course not. That's what
17 I'm, that's what I'm agreeing with you.

18 JIM: Right. We'll take care of that. I'll
19 check on it. The other thing is let me square away
20 the, the thing with the dead dogs.

21 STEVE: Okay, and then get back to me.

22 JIM: Yeah, and don't let those guys walk
23 out because I don't want to, you know.

24 STEVE: No. I'll tell them.

25 JIM: I mean, we want to tell them -- tell

1 those armored cars that he's going to come out and do
2 that, you know.

3 STEVE: Right. No, I'll tell him not to.

4 JIM: Okay, Steve.

5 STEVE: I'll tell him not to.

6 JIM: Hey, I'll talk to you in a little
7 while.

8 STEVE: Okay. Thanks, Jim.

9 JIM: Okay, Steve.

10 STEVE: Okay, bye.
