JIM: Yeah, uh-huh.

DAVID: Okay. You know, I mean -- but what happens is is that -- there's a reason for that. Now, I was born in 1959 -- 1960 because I had to be born then, Jim, there's a reason. Because when the Papacy got back its political power and world leaders began to flow back into the mains of this ecclesiastical spiritualistic governmental sociological knowledge from the, you know, it encodes all the knowledge of every empire all the way back to the beginning of time, basically.

What happens is -- it's in 19 -- 1960, the United States of America elected its first Roman Catholic president, of which God became very angry. Why? Well, because Roman Catholicism, remember, is a religion based upon something that Christ says would be an abomination and make it desolate, something that will evade the truth. Now, it evaded the truth willfully but those that came afterwards, not so willfully. I'm saying, you know, Roman Catholicism was the first political religious organization to deny

1 the revelation of Jesus Christ which was a prophecy
2 which all Christians were supposed to look to. And
3 they kept the scriptures and the Bibles away from
4 people for the longest time and yet promoted to them
5 through a tradition or hearing of another religion
6 which was not the original religion of the Bible. And
7 God did not bless them with miracles. He did not
8 bless them with power. He did not bless them with
9 gifts. But they just simply made a garmetry
10 (phonetic) up and tried to promote, you know, riches
and glory in things seen instead of things unseen.

11 But, anyway, the point is this. In 1961
12 this nation passed a rider bill making Sunday laws
13 constitutional. Now, remember, God blessed this
14 nation because of the strict church and state
separation, okay.

15 Now, now, I've been here 33 years, okay.
16 And, Jim, I understand the power of cartoons. I
17 understand the power of T.V., you know. Like it says,
18 the revelation had power to bring fire down from
19 heaven in the sight of men, decieve the world by the
20 means of those miracles. You know, that's not talking
21 about literal fire. It's talking about light. In the
22 light of communication, the light that enlightens and
warms and -- like you watch a movie, if you take the

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1 music away, the audio, you don't get the effect. But
2 when you have the, the audio and the music and the
3 scene all together, man, you surely are affected.

4 But, but what we're saying is -- we're
5 saying that this is the way God is going to judge.
6 The message is a door open in heaven and this is
7 wisdom, you know. We're either going to listen and
8 want to know these seals or God's going to wipe this
9 whole world off the -- just like in the days of Noah -
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10 JIM: That was a good lesson, David.

11 DAVID: Well, --

12 JIM: You, you really know your stuff.

13 DAVID: Well, let me, let me explain. What
14 you don't know about me is you don't know about my
heart. You don't --

15 JIM: Is it good?

16 DAVID: See, sometimes you have to reverse
17 back to a child's story, Jim.

18 JIM: Uh-huh.

19 DAVID: Now, here's a little child's story.
20 This child's story is for all the wise men of the
21 world. Now, there may not be wise men that want to
22 backtrack and become like a little child but such is
the kingdom of God. Remember that. And Christ tells

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1 his disciples, except you become as little children,
2 you shall in no wise enter into the kingdom of God.
3 Now, here's the little child's story. Where does God
4 sit? He sits on a throne. What does he have in his
5 right hand? A book sealed with seven seals. Who did
6 he give the book to? The King of Kings and the Lord
7 of Lords. The one who loves us, the one who died for
8 us and the one who promises again to bring that
9 knowledge to us, the one that will come, not as a
10 glorious angel clothed with the cloud whose faces were
11 the sun, whose feet are as pillars of fire, not as one
12 who will stand on earth and the sea but as one which
13 unfolds the seven thunders of mystery of God as the
14 prophets declared. And the prophets said, when we see
15 him, there's no beauty we shall desire him. He's a
16 man despised and rejected of men, a man acquainted
17 with sorrow and grief and we -- were our eyes from
18 him. But sad to say, Nahum and Zephaniah and
19 Habakkuk, Oshea, Obadiah, they tell the same story but
20 a little differently, a little differently. It says,
21 what do you imagine against the Lord, for does one
22 come out of thee that imagineth evil against the Lord,
23 a wicked counsellor. Affliction shall not rise up
24 again the second time, although Christ warned in the
25 Gospel. For where are some of the carcasses that the

1 eagles be gathered together. Nonetheless, Habakkuk
2 cried, regard ye among the heathen and wonder
3 marvously, for I will work a work in your day that you
4 will not believe, though it be told you.

5 How come they won't believe that this little
6 story of the man with seven seals is going to forever
7 set the decisions of heaven in regards to what they
8 are going to do to this little world in a time when
9 all of your preachers and all of your teachers are
10 hollering every day, Jim, that Christ is coming soon,
11 Christ is coming soon. Get ready. Get ready. Get
12 ready. Isn't what their -- isn't that what they're
13 hollering every day? Christ is coming soon. Christ
14 is coming soon.

15 But what about the cry of the one man
16 saying, the seven seals, the seven seals?

17 JIM: Well, a lot of people have heard it
18 this week.

19 DAVID: Not really. I've been cut off. But
20 that's all right because --

21 JIM: But --

22 DAVID: -- but God is -- well, see, if they
23 would -- they, they -- people are complaining on the
24 other radio stations. KRLD doesn't like me too much
25 but on the other radio stations around the country,

1 they're complaining because, you know, they're seen a
2 very clear reality between the 45th Psalm and the
3 first seal which is definitely far more enlightening
4 than what the preachers and teachers have been saying.
5 And they would like to really ask more direct
6 questions and get me to answer. But, of course,
7 they're kind of upset because, you know, the feds,
8 those who claim to have authority over God at the
9 present time and over reasoning of God, you know, they
10 claim that they don't want me to get out and talk to
11 anybody. So, you know, we're kind of sitting here.
12 And I'm waiting for instructions from, from my
13 headquarters to, to learn and see just exactly how I'm
14 supposed to speak to you in regards to what you're
15 fixing to witness in regards to -- like I say, look up
16 in the sky, you know.

17 JIM: Well, David, give me a chance for a
18 minute.

19 DAVID: I will.

20 JIM: I've been a pretty good listener. And
21 I think you really know your stuff, and I'm really
22 amazed at the knowledge you have on that subject.
23 It's, it's inspiring, really. One thing you said,
24 you, you told me you had a good heart.

25 DAVID: Well, I love you, Jim.

1 JIM: And, and I believe that. I mean I've
2 been talking to you all this time, and I believe that.
3 And I -- you can tell me that and I believe it.
4 Now's the time, I think, to give everyone a sign, you
5 know. They've heard your --

6 DAVID: I've been giving you a sign.

7 JIM: They've heard your words but let them
8 see your actions, you know.

9 DAVID: Well, I --

10 JIM: Why don't we -- why don't we do
11 something. Why don't you -- why don't you send out
12 those eight children you mentioned before?

13 DAVID: No. Stop playing games with me or
14 I'm going to stop talking to you all together and you
15 can do what you want to do.

16 JIM: What?

17 DAVID: Okay.

18 JIM: That's what you said. I didn't say --

19 DAVID: Well, that's right. And I'm going
20 to do it when I am ready to do it.

21 JIM: Oh, I thought you were ready to do it.

22 DAVID: I didn't say that.

23 JIM: Oh, I'm --

24 DAVID: I told you I'd give you their names.

25 JIM: Oh, okay, I'm sorry. All right. Go

1 ahead. I thought you were ready to do it.

2 DAVID: And remember this is -- this is --
3 this is my flesh and blood we're talking about now.

4 JIM: Hey, I'll treat them like they're my
5 own. They will be well cared for. You have my word
6 on it. I, I thought you wanted to send them out. I
7 thought you were ready.

8 DAVID: I'm going to.

9 JIM: I thought you were the only one
10 waiting.

11 DAVID: No, no, no, no. I am the only one
12 waiting but, also, I'm asking counsel and receiving
13 counsel from God.

14 JIM: I understand that.

15 DAVID: You know, let's take a break now
16 cause I'm fixing to have to journey back up on this
17 pot again --

18 JIM: Okay, buddy, be careful now.

19 DAVID: And let's --

20 JIM: Don't get hurt.

21 DAVID: Okay. But here's the deal. Let's,
22 let's, let's -- why don't you grab your Bible and go
23 read Joel, just the Book of Joel real quick and learn
24 a little bit about that sixth seal, about sun, moon
25 and stars being darkened?

1 JIM: Okay.

2 DAVID: I mean you'll, you'll never
3 understand everything there but just look at it and
4 see the parallel between Revelation 6:12 and, you
5 know, what it says right there in Joel about the sun,
6 moon and stars being darkened because you know when
7 that happens, Jim, I mean, you know, you and everybody
8 else is going to mess your pants. But I want to
9 establish a communication with you to where you know
10 these things ahead of time. And, you know, I, I would
11 like to see you get on your knees, not in front of
12 everybody else, but you, your personal self, and say
13 to God in heaven, you know, God, I don't know this
14 guy, I don't know these seals, for what he is telling
15 me is about as straight as anybody can say it, and I
16 just -- I just wish I can understand better. You
17 know, forgive me. I mean, you know, I'd like to --
18 I'd like to really see you make it out of this.

17 JIM: Okay.

18 DAVID: Okay. Read, read the Book of Joel
19 and we'll call you back in a little bit, okay?

20 JIM: Take a break, okay. See you later.

21 DAVID: Bye.

22 JIM: Okay.

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1 STEVE: Hello.

2 HENRY: Hello.

3 STEVE: Hello, Jim?

4 HENRY: Henry.

5 STEVE: Henry, is Jim there yet?

6 HENRY: No.

7 STEVE: He's not? Would you ask him to give
me a call back.

8 HENRY: Do you need something, Steve?

9 STEVE: I was just going to give him -- tell
10 him thanks for take care of -- taking care of some of
11 the problems we were mentioning.

12 HENRY: Like what?

13 STEVE: Originally, on the very night that
14 we first start communicating, Jim and myself, and then
David and himself, we were -- to take right now?

15 HENRY: I'm sorry?

16 STEVE: We had come to an agreement about
17 having like the Bradleys on the perimeter of the
property and we said that was okay.

18 HENRY: And --

19 STEVE: He gave his word that there'd be no
20 -- that wouldn't happen again after that. Well, since
21 that time, like I complained to you last night, you
22 know, and I believe it was this morning -- I'm

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1 starting to forget what time's when -- but after they
2 ran over one shack, then the guard shack, and in this
3 building fooling around. Last night they were running
4 around the perimeter, going in cars, out of cars, you
5 know -- you and I, we've been talking. Jim and I have
6 been talking. If we were bad guys, you know, they
7 could have been pecked off, of course.

7 HENRY: Uh-huh.

8 STEVE: But we had come to an agreement that
9 none of that kind of thing would be going on. And
10 they're doing it more and more. Even a moment ago,
11 I'd say, twenty minutes ago, half hour ago, they took
12 the Bradley right behind -- 50 feet from the
13 gymnasium.

13 HENRY: It's 50 feet from the gymnasium?

14 STEVE: So, I said -- we said to Jim, okay.
15 What, you know, you -- you brought up to me,
16 remember, Henry, about how we didn't come through the
17 other day and so forth?

18 HENRY: Uh-huh.

19 STEVE: Well, this has been ongoing since
20 day one, that this was to be taken care of but it
21 never has been.

21 HENRY: Okay.

22 STEVE: And I thought because maybe Jim
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1 maybe got through to the commander or something
2 because all of a sudden that thing took off and went -
3 - anyway, there's been three of them, I said, on the
4 property right down by the shop. They go into that
5 building there. There's always fooling around down
6 there. I mean -- but to think that they even come out
7 and run around and get into vehicles and things like
8 that.

8 HENRY: When you say -- is that in the back
9 or in the front?

10 STEVE: Both. Both. There were men last
11 night toward the wee hours of the morning, like I
12 said, that got into a little Mazda out there. They
13 were viewed. And also into a white pick-up truck.
14 The dome lights came on. They were also moving around
15 else -- other places. Like just not too long ago
16 they, you know, we watched them all the time.
17 Everybody came back reporting the same thing, a lot of
18 witnesses.

18 HENRY: Okay. Okay. I'll work on that.

19 STEVE: All right. But we just -- he wanted
20 me to call back and say thanks to him because,
21 apparently, we were hoping that maybe he was wanting
22 to hold up that side again and start working.

23 HENRY: What, now?
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1 STEVE: I said when we were last talking to
2 Jim, we were going to give him a call back --

3 HENRY: Oh, okay.

4 STEVE: -- and let him know, oh, okay, you
5 know, he said we'd -- yeah? Oh, you -- just a moment.

6 HENRY: Oh, okay.

7 STEVE: There's someone here that wants to
8 talk to you --

9 HENRY: Okay.

10 STEVE: -- by the name of Cohen.

11 HENRY: By the name of what?

12 STEVE: Cohen.

13 HENRY: Cohen?

14 STEVE: C-O-H-E-N.

15 HENRY: Okay.

16 STEVE: Just a moment.

17 [Gap]

18 COHEN: Hello.

19 HENRY: Hello.

20 COHEN: I'm going to make a statement in
21 Hebrew.

22 HENRY: You're going to make a statement
23 what?

24 COHEN: In Hebrew language and --

25 HENRY: Can --

1 COHEN: -- I wish you could record it.

2 HENRY: Well, do you have a recorder there?

3 COHEN: Do we have a recorder here? No, we
4 don't.

5 HENRY: What is -- well, what's your full
6 name, Cohen?

7 COHEN: One moment.

8 HENRY: What is it?

9 COHEN: Just Cohen. It's just Cohen for
10 now.

11 HENRY: Is that your first name or your last
12 name?

13 COHEN: That's my last name, --

14 HENRY: And your first name?

15 COHEN: -- and my only name for now.

16 HENRY: I'm sorry?

17 COHEN: It's my only name to be publicized
18 for now.

19 HENRY: Well, you know, nothing is going to
20 be publicized, Cohen. If you want to make a tape that
21 you want, you know, to be, to be -- is this a message
22 for some kids or something?

23 COHEN: Well, it's for whoever wants to
24 hear, okay.

25 HENRY: Well, we don't have the capability

1 of, of recording -- I think, I think that David, you
2 know, as you know, made a recording. Do you want to
3 make a recording like that?

4 COHEN: Hold on one second, please.

5 COHEN TO UNIDENTIFIED INDIVIDUAL: Do we
6 have a recorder --

7 (Pause)

8 COHEN: Look, I'm from Israel, okay.

9 HENRY: I'm sorry?

10 COHEN: I am from Israel.

11 HENRY: Well, good.

12 COHEN: And I want to make a statement to
13 some people over there.

14 HENRY: Okay. Well, why don't you -- why
15 don't you do this. Why don't you get the same tape
16 recorder that, that David used and make a recording.
17 And if you want to send a couple of kids, we'll take
18 the tape and the recording. How about that?

19 COHEN: Well, you see, I would like to make
20 the recording now --

21 HENRY: Go ahead and make it now.

22 COHEN: -- before it --

23 HENRY: We'll, we'll wait, we'll wait on
24 this. As soon as you have it, we'll pick it up.

25 COHEN: I know that that could take some

1 hours and I would --

2 HENRY: What could take some hours?

3 COHEN: -- like to get a response

4 beforehand, before --

5 HENRY: No, no, no, no, you're not going to
6 -- it's not going to take any time. It took, it took
7 a long time to make David's statement because he had a
8 long statement that he wanted to make. But you can
9 make yours as long or as short as you want.

9 COHEN: I'll make it very short, okay?

10 HENRY: Well, good. Do you want to call me
11 back when it's ready?

12 COHEN: I am ready now, if you don't mind.

13 HENRY: Well, I don't have the capability to
14 record it here. If you want to record it, use the
15 same recorder that, that David had and we'll pick it
16 up. It's that simple.

17 COHEN TO UNIDENTIFIED INDIVIDUAL: They want
18 me to record it here and send it.

19 COHEN: One second, please. We don't have
20 tapes, I'm told. We have no tapes left.

21 HENRY: Okay. Do you want us to leave some
22 there at the, at the place where we picked up the
23 kids?

24 COHEN TO UNIDENTIFIED INDIVIDUAL: Do you
25

1 want them to bring some up?

2 COHEN: No. Just maybe, you know, if you
3 can hear this -- if you can hear this, and I'll tell
4 you the message, if somebody can interpret it. Well,
5 if not --

6 HENRY: See, we don't have any, you know,
7 the capability, you know -- if it's in, in, in Hebrew,
8 we can't translate it. We don't have anybody here
9 that, you know, -- if it was in Spanish, I could
10 probably --

11 COHEN: I know, I know you have -- I know
12 you have ability to record stuff, okay?

13 HENRY: And you have the same ability there.

14 COHEN: And you have been recording our
15 conversations. You have been taping and bugging
16 telephones. So, it's not too hard for you to do this.

17 HENRY: And it's not so hard for you to do
18 it there either, you know. What, what is the problem?
19 Why don't you want to do it there?

20 COHEN: Because it's, it's a thing of this
21 moment. This is the moment that it has to be done.

22 HENRY: Well, that's fine. Go ahead it --
23 go ahead and do it this moment.

24 COHEN: Okay.

25 HENRY: We'll, we'll give you -- we'll give

1 you the tape and you can make it at whatever moment
2 you want to make it.

3 COHEN: Okay. Thank you. So, this is the
4 statement.

5 HENRY: Wait a second. Wait a second. Wait
6 a second. I'm saying, you know, if you want to record
7 it, we will give you a tape so that you can record it.

8 COHEN: Okay.

9 COHEN TO UNIDENTIFIED INDIVIDUAL: They want
10 to give us tapes.

11 COHEN: I just want to speak the statement
12 now to you.

13 HENRY: It's not going to mean anything
14 because we don't understand anything that you're going
15 to say anyway.

16 COHEN: It is going to mean -- it is going
17 to mean -- and later on you can work out with Mr.
18 Schneider or Mr. Koresh about sending a tape, that
19 will be fine, too.

20 HENRY: Okay. That --

21 COHEN: Okay?

22 HENRY: Okay. So, we'll send -- okay. So,
23 we'll send the tape into you.

24 COHEN: That you have to work out with Mr.
25 Koresh and Mr. Schneider.

1 HENRY: Okay. Let me talk to him.

2 COHEN: Can I make the statement first?

3 HENRY: No, let me talk to him.

4 COHEN: One second, please. Okay. I guess
5 we'll have to find a tape here. We'll look for it --

6 HENRY: Okay.

7 COHEN: -- and I'll give you over to Mr.
8 Schneider.

9 HENRY: Okay.

10 COHEN: Thank you for your help.

11 HENRY: Thank you.

12 STEVE: Hello.

13 HENRY: Hello.

14 STEVE: Yeah.

15 HENRY: What's going on?

16 STEVE: What's going on?

17 HENRY: Uh-huh.

18 STEVE: There's a man here from Israel who
19 wanted to make a statement, apparently.

20 HENRY: To whom?

21 STEVE: I -- gee, I don't -- who did you
22 want to make a statement to? To, I guess, someone
23 that he knows in Israel.

24 HENRY: Does he want to come out?

25 STEVE TO COHEN: He asked me, do you want to

1 | come out? Yeah.

2 | COHEN: Come out from here?

3 | STEVE: Yeah.

4 | COHEN: No way. I'm staying --

5 | HENRY: Does he want to come out?

6 | STEVE: He says, no, I don't.

7 | HENRY: He doesn't?

8 | STEVE: Should I give him back -- here, you,
9 | you tell him.

10 | COHEN: Hello.

11 | HENRY: Do you want to come out?

12 | COHEN: No, sir, thank you. Otherwise, I
13 | would have come there to make my statement.

14 | HENRY: Well, think --

15 | COHEN: I appreciate your initiative,
16 | though.

17 | HENRY: Well, you know, if you want to make
18 | a statement that you want everybody to hear, I'm sure
19 | that, that we'll find somebody that will take your
20 | statement, you know, in person.

21 | COHEN: Well, I'm, -- I am sure -- I am
22 | confident that you have heard that we do believe there
23 | is a God on the throne which will make our statements
24 | known. So, I rest on that.

25 | HENRY: Okay.

1 COHEN: And I still tell you thanks.

2 HENRY: Okay.

3 COHEN: See, I am Jewish, and I'm from
4 Israel. And the point that I'd like to present to
5 some of my friends, I'll let you know it right now if
6 you wish to know.

7 HENRY: No. Let me -- go ahead -- go
8 ahead --

9 COHEN: It's, it's basically that the
10 Christianity and Judaism talk about the same
11 prophecies from the same book. And how that even in
12 the rabbinical teachings, they teach the same
13 prophecies and they have come to light together
14 underneath the revelation that Christians don't know
15 of.

16 HENRY: Uh-huh.

17 COHEN: They just don't know what it means.

18 HENRY: Uh-huh. Well, see, making
19 statements like that are fine and, you know, and we
20 don't have any problems with any of that but, see,
21 when you make a statement like that, you're making it
22 basically to me. If you want to reach somebody, you
23 know, probably you need to, to cease and desist with
24 this isolationism that you're involved in and --

25 COHEN: Yes.

1 HENRY: -- probably need to come out and,
2 and make your statements known.

3 COHEN: Well, as I said before, I repeat --

4 HENRY: But, you know, that's fine. If you
5 feel that, that you want to be within the compound,
6 then that's fine.

7 COHEN: I know why I am here, sir.

8 HENRY: That's fine. That's fine.

9 COHEN: I do know. I appreciate and know --
10 I know your lack of understanding in, in our behalf
11 because you don't know where we are coming from.

12 HENRY: Okay. Well, that's fine. If you
13 want to -- if there -- is there somebody that, that,
14 that you want us to contact and tell them that you're
15 safe?

16 COHEN: No. They should know already.

17 HENRY: Okay.

18 COHEN: They should know already.

19 HENRY: Okay. Well, if you want to go ahead
20 and make that recording, feel very free to make it and
21 if you have difficulty finding a tape, let me know.
22 Otherwise, call me back as soon as you have it
23 finished and we'll, we'll pick it up.

24 COHEN: Okay.

25 HENRY: Okay, Cohen.

1 COHEN: Now, just let you know one more
2 thing, one last thing. Do you know why Jews laugh at
3 Christians?

4 HENRY: I'm sorry?

5 COHEN: Because -- do you know why the Jews
6 laugh at Christians?

7 HENRY: Why Jews laugh at Christians?

8 COHEN: At Christians. They think it's
9 funny to be a Christian, that it's silly because none
10 of the prophecies were fulfilled 2000 years ago. You
11 know why Christians laugh at Jews? Because they don't
12 believe that it can be as easy as believing in a man
13 to be saved. Now, we're both right and we're both
14 wrong, okay. Now, everything has come together and
15 the statement has been made. One man can teach the
16 seven seals. Why don't all people want to hear this?

17 HENRY: Uh-huh.

18 COHEN: I have been shown -- I have not been
19 taught by tricks. I have been shown, I have read, and
20 I keep reading the books myself.

21 HENRY: Okay.

22 COHEN: And I, I would just wish that you
23 read them yourself in your free hours.

24 HENRY: Okay.

25 COHEN: Okay. God bless. Here is Mr.

1 Schneider back with you.

2 HENRY: Okay.

3 COHEN: Thank you, sir.

4 HENRY: Thank you.

5 STEVE: Hello.

6 HENRY: Hello.

7 STEVE: Yeah. See, apparently, he wanted,
8 wanted to talk someone. I didn't know if he wanted to
9 go or what or --

10 HENRY: Okay.

11 STEVE: -- just requested to talk to you.

12 So, --

13 HENRY: Okay. Well, that's fine. I think
14 he wants to make a recording and if he makes it and
15 wants to send it out, we'll be --

16 STEVE: Oh, oh, I'm sorry. He's talking to
17 me now. I'm sorry, Henry, just a minute.

18 HENRY: Okay.

19 (Indiscernible conversation in background.)

20 STEVE: Oh, some friends of yours in the
21 Israeli army? Oh, okay. Is that what you mean -- who
22 you wanted to -- oh, I see. Okay. Anyway. Well,
23 yeah, we just going to give you a call and then tell
24 you -- tell -- I thought it was going to be Jim on
25 there where -- David wanted to say thanks to him

1 anyway.

2 HENRY: Is David there?

3 STEVE: Pardon?

4 HENRY: Is David there?

5 STEVE: Yeah, sure he is.

6 HENRY: I'll talk to him.

7 STEVE: Oh, just a minute.

8 STEVE TO DAVID: Henry would like to talk to
9 you.

10 STEVE: Okay. Heather is going to be coming
11 out in the morning, Heather Jones.

12 HENRY: Heather Jones?

13 STEVE: Yes.

14 HENRY: How, how old is Heather Jones?

15 STEVE: Heather is, I think, --

16 STEVE TO HEATHER: What are you, nine? Nine
17 years old.

18 HENRY: Nine years old?

19 STEVE: Right.

20 HENRY: Okay. Anybody else?

21 STEVE TO OTHERS: Anyone else or is that it
22 or --

23 STEVE: Yeah, I guess for right now because
24 she's the only one I guess they talked to. Like just
25 even now, he even asked her, and she said, yeah, she's

1 willing to go out.

2 HENRY: Okay. Does -- is -- does he want to
3 send anybody out now or just in the morning?

4 STEVE: Apparently in the morning because it
5 look like -- well, in ask-- you know, of course,
6 everybody gets to be asked. So --

7 HENRY: Uh-huh.

8 STEVE: And she said he asked and I guess in
9 the morning she wanted to go. She said she wants to
10 get some sleep first.

11 HENRY: Okay.

12 STEVE: Pardon?

13 HENRY: Okay.

14 STEVE: Oh, Heather is right here. I guess
15 David says let her talk to you.

16 HENRY: Okay.

17 STEVE TO HEATHER: Here you are, Heather.

18 HEATHER: Hello.

19 HENRY: Hi, Heather.

20 HEATHER: Hi.

21 HENRY: How are you?

22 HEATHER: Fine.

23 HENRY: We are looking forward to seeing you
24 and meeting you and spending some time with you. Is
25 your full name Heather Jones?

1 HEATHER: Yes.

2 HENRY: Do you have a middle name?

3 HEATHER: Nicole.

4 HENRY: Heather Nicole Jones?

5 HEATHER: Uh-huh.

6 HENRY: And you're nine years old?

7 HEATHER: Yeah.

8 HENRY: Well, good. Is there somebody or
9 something special that you'd like, like a particular
10 something, kind of soda or something? What kind of
11 soda do you like?

12 UNIDENTIFIED VOICE IN BACKGROUND: Tell him
13 you want to go with Mark and Kevin, all right.
14 Heather, tell him you want to be with Mark and Kevin.

15 HEATHER: I want to be with Mark and Kevin.

16 HENRY: Okay. Well, we will put you
17 together with Mark and Kevin as soon as you come out.
18 Do you want to come out now?

19 HEATHER: No, in the morning.

20 HENRY: In the morning?

21 HEATHER: Yes.

22 HENRY: Early in the morning? We'll pick
23 you up early in the morning then, okay?

24 HEATHER: Yes.

25 HENRY: Okay. Well, you take good care.

1 You get some rest and then we'll pick you up, Heather.

2 Okay?

3 HEATHER: Yes.

4 HEATHER: Are there any other kids that want
5 to come out, Heather?

6 HEATHER: I don't know.

7 HENRY: Oh, okay. Well, we are ready to,
8 you know, we are ready for you and looking forward to,
9 to seeing you as soon as you are ready. So, we will
10 pick you up in the morning.

11 HEATHER: Okay.

12 HENRY: Okay. I'll talk to David now.

13 HEATHER: Okay.

14 HENRY: Hello.

15 DAVID: Hello? Henry?

16 HENRY: Hello. Hello.

17 DAVID: Hello.

18 HENRY: Hello.

19 DAVID: Oh, you're here. Hello.

20 HENRY: Yes, I can hear you now. Who's
21 this?

22 DAVID: This is, this is Dave.

23 HENRY: Hi, David, how are you?

24 DAVID: Oh, doing all right. Now, let me
25 tell you something about Heather, all right?

1 HENRY: Okay.

2 DAVID: She's a real sensitive young lady.

3 HENRY: Okay.

4 DAVID: So, you know, be real nice with her.

5 And she's real cute, real pretty, but she's real
6 sensitive.

7 HENRY: Okay.

8 DAVID: She cries real easy.

9 HENRY: Okay. We'll make sure that, that
10 that word gets passed around.

11 DAVID: All right. You -- you've ever heard
12 of Mr. Rogers Neighborhood?

13 HENRY: Yes.

14 DAVID: Ouch. You have a voice that's kind
15 of pleasant like his a little bit, very, very
16 disarming. It's really nice. And I wanted to call
17 Jim up and to, you know, thank him for getting these,
18 these, these guys out here out of the back of our --
19 out of the back of our ears back here.

20 HENRY: Okay.

21 DAVID: And there's about 50 feet behind us
22 here on the back south side of our gymnasium --

23 HENRY: Uh-huh.

24 DAVID: -- making some of the guys kinda
25 itchy.

1 HENRY: Sure.

2 DAVID: You know.

3 HENRY: Uh-huh.

4 DAVID: You know, and we have, we have a
5 connection with, you know, a lot of the Israeli
6 activities and stuff and, and Mr. Cohen just wanted to
7 tell some of his friends, you know. Of course, you
8 know, a lot of people are really concerned about his,
9 his coming to this country to, to learn more about the
10 seals.

10 HENRY: Uh-huh.

11 DAVID: Of course, see, the way you deal
12 with -- the way you deal with the Jews is like --
13 well, Paul explains in Romans 11, he explains how that
14 God did not cast away his people which he foreknew --

14 HENRY: Uh-huh.

15 DAVID: -- but is engrafting the gentiles so
16 that the gentiles can learn what the Jews failed to
17 understand which is, you know, the prophecies --

18 HENRY: Okay.

19 DAVID: -- the truth about Messiah, the way
20 he's coming and all that. So, anyway, Paul says in
21 the latter days that Jew and Gentile will again be
22 unitified through some means. Paul says, if the, if
23 the rejection of the Jews be the salvation of the
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1 world, then what would be the acceptance of the Jews?

2 But life from the dead. You know, he explains a
3 really great event happens when the, when the Jewish
4 mind and the Christian mind are blended together and
5 both find out that they're both headed for the same
6 direction. It's just one has a zeal for the law and
7 the other has a zeal for the love of Christ. And
8 they've got to blend these two together.

8 HENRY: Uh-huh.

9 DAVID: So, the way -- the way you teach a
10 Jew is you don't -- you don't teach a Jew about Jesus.
11 You, you show them how that in the prophecies
12 (Indiscernible) latter days certain implements or
13 signs are to be looked for in regards to Messiah. Of
14 course, they know that and they agree to that.

14 HENRY: Uh-huh.

15 DAVID: But -- now, remember, there is a lot
16 of different sects of Judaism. So, you know -- okay.
17 Now, but once you basically connect the Torah with
18 these prophecies, then they, you know, yeah, they
19 believe it. They believe it. That's, that's, that's
20 the key unless they're, you know, unless they're
21 conservative or, you know, liberal Jews. Like a lot
22 of liberal Jews don't even really study the Bible at
23 all. But, anyway, the point I'm making is, then you
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1 say, well, isn't it kind of strange how that
2 Christianity really started by Judaism --

3 HENRY: Really?

4 DAVID: -- and that, you know, it was really
5 a controversy between the rabbis and one -- one rabbi
6 whose name was Hoshouah (phonetic) and how -- it's
7 funny how the, you know, all the Gentiles believe in
8 the God of Moses and the prophets because of this one,
9 you know, apostate Jew that, that, you know, -- the
10 Jews wouldn't accept his message so he gave his
11 message to the Gentiles.

12 HENRY: Uh-huh.

13 DAVID: And so they'll admit, they'll admit
14 that it was -- it began with them, you know, with
15 Hoshouah. You know, then you say but, you know,
16 really what's weird is how in the last -- one of the
17 last books of that, of that prophesy was that it was
18 promised that one day that these seven seals would,
19 would be known and they would come to pass.

20 HENRY: Uh-huh.

21 DAVID: So, then you start showing them the,
22 you know, -- because you're not, you're not really
23 saying accept Christianity because they won't listen
24 to you now.

25 HENRY: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: But just kind of show it to them as
2 an obstacle like. Well, just take a look at some of
3 this stuff like they say they believe in, you know.

4 HENRY: Uh-huh.

5 DAVID: And you show them the seven seals
6 and low and behold, it's the very pictures of their
7 prophetic writings. And you go, you know, it's, it's
8 kind of weird to keep rejecting this one rabbi when
9 there's so many of them today that are having
10 arguments with each other, you know. And yet they're
11 all pointing to the same truth for the latter days.

12 HENRY: Uh-huh.

13 DAVID: So, they kind of go like, wow, you
14 know, like bla, bla, bla, you know. They kind of
15 like, yeah, yeah, this, this explains a lot of things
16 here.

17 HENRY: Uh-huh.

18 DAVID: So, you know, you know, if the
19 Christian world would not reject the seven seals, then
20 there could be a blending, but it seem -- what happens
21 is is that when the Gentiles have the opportunity to
22 learn these seals --

23 HENRY: Uh-huh.

24 DAVID: -- and they reject it, then God's
25 going to, you know, bury -- my concern is he's going

1 to execute wrath of vengeance of the heathens such as
2 they have never heard. You know, we was talking about
3 the other night about their flaming torches and their
4 --

5 HENRY: Right.

6 DAVID: -- you know, Joel says gather the,
7 the mighty men together. Let them come down, right?

8 HENRY: Uh-huh.

9 DAVID: And it says, from thence cause the
10 Almighty was to come down, Oh God, you know.

11 HENRY: Uh-huh.

12 DAVID: But then God turns around and
13 chooses the Jews back again and seals the 144,000
14 which are of Israel because, you know, it, it goes to
15 prove that even though God has punished his people and
16 God has given their riches, which is the promises to
17 the Gentile world, the Gentile world is, sad to say,
18 is going to reject a greater blessing than the Jews
19 did. And the Jews get to pick the ball back up again.
20 It's kind of like fumbling and, and recovery, you
21 know.

22 HENRY: Oh, okay, yeah.

23 DAVID: You understand what I'm saying?

24 HENRY: Yeah. That makes sense.

25 DAVID: So, anyway, but -- okay. I wish Jim

1 would tell us when he's coming and going.

2 HENRY: Um --

3 DAVID: He's probably real tired of talking
4 with us anyway, I guess.

5 HENRY: Well, he just, you know, he's been
6 on since real early -- he had been on since really
7 morning. So --

8 DAVID: Yeah. Yeah, I guess --

9 HENRY: -- I guess he went to get a little
10 rest, I guess, and get a bite to eat.

11 DAVID: Well, I thought -- I thought -- I
12 thought you called me up at what 6 or 7?

13 HENRY: Yeah.

14 DAVID: And he came on later than that I
15 thought.

16 HENRY: Well, he did, actually he did but,
17 but he came in here early --

18 DAVID: Is he a heavy set guy or what?

19 HENRY: He's a big guy.

20 DAVID: Yeah.

21 HENRY: He's not, he's not so heavy set but
22 he's a big guy.

23 DAVID: Yeah, about what, six-two, six-one?

24 HENRY: Yeah, about six-two.

25 DAVID: Yeah. That's good.

1 HENRY: Uh-huh.

2 DAVID: Ohhhh.

3 HENRY: Well, you know, I, I think a lot of
4 what you're saying makes a lot of sense, okay. But I
5 think that when they say, but, it doesn't really mean
6 but. It's -- I think it's important that you be given
7 the opportunity to reach a lot of people. I think
8 it's important if, you know, if you, if you've had
9 this kind of an effect on somebody that's Jewish, you
10 know --

11 DAVID: Oh, lots of Jewish people.

12 HENRY: Well, there you go, you know. Then,
13 then it's important that, that you have a, a
14 capability -- not capability -- facility to, to talk
15 to a lot more people than what you have within the
16 compound.

17 DAVID: Well, I will.

18 HENRY: We think that that's important.

19 DAVID: I will.

20 HENRY: I really do.

21 DAVID: No, I will.

22 HENRY: Well, good. Well, good.

23 DAVID: You know, the, the Jews -- the
24 Jewish people, the Jewish nature's is a very zealot,
25 very zealous, you know.

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HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Ever since '48, you know, --

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: -- these people will get up and kick
some butt if they've got to.

HENRY: Sure.

DAVID: Just as, just as Ishmael, you know,
mentality is, you know -- like, like, like a lot of
people don't understand about a lot of the
Arab/Israeli situations, you know.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: The terrorism and things like that,
you know.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: But these people -- that's one of --
that's one of the things about nations based upon a
region -- a religious political system.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: It's just like the Crusaders, you
know. It was -- religion has always been revolvant
with war --

HENRY: Yeah.

DAVID: -- for some reason.

HENRY: Yes.

DAVID: Unless you get into a capitalization

1 type religion to where -- well, like Peter says, there
2 shall come a time when men will think that gain is
3 godliness, you know.

4 HENRY: Uh-huh.

5 DAVID: The more you get, the more godly you
6 are, you know.

7 HENRY: Yes.

8 DAVID: That's where you get into the
9 concepts of St. Nicholas or Santa Claus, you know, ho,
10 ho, ho, you been good.

11 HENRY: Uh-huh.

12 DAVID: You know, he's been checking his
13 list, checking it twice, who's naughty or nice. You
14 get good presents if you're a goody boy.

15 HENRY: Uh-huh.

16 DAVID: But, you know, the thing of it is is
17 that a lot of things that the Jews stumble over in
18 regards to the New Testament is that they know, and
19 this is --this is actually a theological fact amongst
20 your major scholars of the world. And that is from
21 that from '75 to approximately -- 90% of all prophetic
22 writings were not fulfilled according to Matthew,
23 Mark, Luke and John. I mean as far as Messiah coming
24 and as far as him taking the kingdom and having all
25 those babies and stuff he was supposed to have had.

1 And a righteous lineage and a righteous seed and
2 liberating Israel from the power of the nations and
3 going and destroying and smiting all the heathen from
4 the four corners of the earth. I mean, you know, like
5 men in the prophecies talk terrible things about
6 what's going to happen to the heathen and their
7 children.

7 HENRY: Uh-huh.

8 DAVID: And the women should be ripped into
9 pieces and they shall not spare little children. And
10 Babylon's going to fall -- you know, the whole -- the
11 whole Judaic books of Isiah all the way through not
12 only talk about a merciful Messiah but also a
13 destroying Messiah. That once after Messiah has shown
14 mercy, he commanded as a law, the day will come when
15 he will return again and reveal that mercy towards the
16 wicked is unrighteousness.

16 HENRY: Uh-huh.

17 DAVID: And he will then vindicate his
18 purposes up on the heathen. But there are still --
19 there are still very zealous people, whether it be
20 Jewish or Catholic or Lutheran or Methodist or
21 Presbyterian or Baptist. Although religions may be
22 confused, there's one principle that deals with not
23 the names of dominations but the hearts of men. There
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1 are men, no matter what creed or sect or domination
2 they may be connected to, have a heart that wants to
3 know the truth that can make them better people.

4 HENRY: Uh-huh.

5 DAVID: More sensitive.

6 HENRY: Yeah.

7 DAVID: They want more power for more mercy,
8 you know.

9 HENRY: Uh-huh.

10 DAVID: Not power to rule but power to do
11 good.

12 HENRY: Uh-huh.

13 DAVID: And this is -- this is one of the
14 implements that a lot of religions, you know, lack.
15 They don't have the power of the Pentecost, you know.
16 Their power is in money and in spiritual persuasions,
17 you know. Donate your dollar.

18 HENRY: Yes.

19 DAVID: You know what I'm talking about.

20 HENRY: Sure.

21 DAVID: You're, you're kind of agnostic,
22 aren't you?

23 HENRY: No. (Laughter) I'm a Catholic.

24 DAVID: Well, I mean -- but, but how much
25 catechism have you learned?

1 DAVID: You know, Rome -- you know, Rome --
2 most people think Rome was barbaric, don't they?

3 HENRY: Uh-huh.

4 DAVID: Rome was really a very democratic
5 government, you know.

6 (Click in the phone)

7 HENRY: God.

8 DAVID: Did you hear me?

9 HENRY: Yeah.

10 DAVID: It's funny how this thing clicks.

11 HENRY: Yeah.

12 DAVID: It's just, you know, there, there
13 are ways of -- there are ways of punishment for --
14 capital punishment was really -- it seemed really
15 cruel but really it was really a pretty good system.

16 HENRY: Uh-huh.

17 DAVID: It kept the crime rate down way low.

18 HENRY: Sure.

19 DAVID: I mean an open crucifixion was --
20 hey, you know, you didn't -- you didn't have as much
21 crime as you have today, nowhere near.

22 HENRY: Uh-huh.

23 DAVID: Of course not as much people either
24 but still nevertheless -- I mean that, that shows the
25 side of the hard cold facts of, of criminal, criminal

1 activities, you know.

2 HENRY: Uh-huh.

3 DAVID: But, anyway, and they said they
4 recently gave a guy a lethal injection here the other
5 day or something like that.

6 HENRY: Gave him a what?

7 DAVID: A lethal injection.

8 HENRY: Oh, yeah.

9 DAVID: Capital -- who was that guy?

10 HENRY: I'm trying to think. Was that in
11 Arizona?

12 DAVID: I think it was in Texas, wasn't it?

13 HENRY: Was it in Texas?

14 DAVID: Yeah. Texas has the death -- it has
15 the capital punishment code.

16 HENRY: Yeah, it does but I don't -- I can't
17 remember --

18 DAVID TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: What's that
19 guy's name on the radio today that just died, got
20 capital punishment? I forgot his name. No, don't do
21 that, Bobby. Want some bread, Bobby? My little girl.
22 Bobby. Say hello and -- do you want to say hello to
23 Henry? Here, say hello. Just talk to her ear and see
24 what she says.

25 HENRY: Hello. Hello. Hello, Bobby.

1 Hello, Bobby. How are you? What are you doing,
2 Bobby? How old are you, Bobby?

3 DAVID: She's just -- she was just sitting
4 there eating her bread and smiling real big. She's a
5 button.

6 HENRY: How old is she?

7 DAVID: She's about one.

8 HENRY: Oh, well.

9 DAVID: But she's -- how old exactly is
10 Bobby now? Fourteen months.

11 HENRY: Fourteen months.

12 DAVID: Oh, she talks, too. She talks good.

13 HENRY: Does she?

14 DAVID: Yeah.

15 HENRY: That's good. That's good.

16 DAVID: She's great. All of Rachel's babies
17 walked early, talked early. She even cut up early.

18 HENRY: How old -- I mean how many kids does
19 Rachel have?

20 DAVID: Well, she's got three.

21 HENRY: That's good. That's good.

22 DAVID: Yeah. What, what Bobby?

23 HENRY: Now, she's making noise.

24 DAVID: Yeah, did you hear her?

25 HENRY: Yeah. Hi, Bobby, Hi, Bobby.

1 DAVID: Okay.

2 HENRY: Are you able to walk now or not?

3 (Bobby makes noise on the phone).

4 HENRY: Hi. Hi. Hi, Bobby.

5 DAVID: Oh, anyway, she don't like the phone

6 HENRY: How are you doing healthwise? Are
7 you --

8 DAVID: Oh, I'm getting better.

9 HENRY: Are you able to walk?

10 DAVID: Well, I'm able to climb up on the
11 pot.

12 HENRY: Oh. That's tough.

13 (David laughs)

14 DAVID: It takes a -- it takes a long --

15 I've got a little -- what is it, a 2-1/2 gallon -- oh,

16 boy, the first time it was -- day -- yesterday, day

17 before -- anyway, I tried to lean up in it, and I kept

18 passing out. Of course, they say that, that I've

19 lost, what, over three pints or maybe a quart of

20 blood.

21 HENRY: Jesus.

22 DAVID: How much was it? Anyway, -- nah,

23 she said it was over three pints. All that I bled

24 over there and then --

25 HENRY: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: -- and I -- see, I bled three
2 different places and this last place I've soaked two
3 blankets.

4 HENRY: Jesus.

5 DAVID: But, you know, people are laughing
6 and snickering and all that but they can go ahead and
7 laugh. If they, if they had -- if they had this
8 happen to them, they wouldn't be laughing.

9 HENRY: That's for sure.

10 DAVID: God knows that.

11 HENRY: Yeah.

12 DAVID: But, anyway, --

13 HENRY: Do, do you -- I mean can you walk?

14 DAVID: Well, no. What I did was --

15 HENRY: Not really.

16 DAVID: -- I have to -- I have to -- one
17 leg's bound, right?

18 HENRY: Uh-huh.

19 DAVID: So, I have to kind of move it over
20 and then I have to kind of creep up with my one arm.

21 HENRY: Jesus.

22 DAVID: See, I, I, I, I do a lot of one arm
23 push-ups.

24 HENRY: Uh-huh.

25 DAVID: And I, I --

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(Tape ends.)
