2 DAVID KORESH: -- then when I got Linda
3 pregnant. And, you know, there's this guy down the
4 street, her dad thinks. No -- she won't tell who it
5 is. And, anyway, Linda and, you know, her dad, you
6 know, they had an abortion. Oh. Man, did I feel like
7 a murderer.

7 HENRY GARCIA: Sure.

8 DAVID KORESH: I mean, I'm just -- you know,
9 so, I -- so, I came back to Dallas and I just, I just
10 didn't know what to say. And, so, I called Linda up.
11 I said, you know, I says, you know, I heard you got
12 rid of the, the baby. She goes, I, I had to. And I'm
13 just like oh. And I go, look, I'm sorry. And, you
14 know, I -- she goes, I'd, I'd like to see you. I'm
15 going, like what? And I go, you want to see me? And
16 she goes, I'd like to see you. So, anyway, I, I made
17 arrangements and I drove over to her -- they had moved
18 to a house. I got the address, 2491, I think, Fordham

18 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: -- off of Garland Road.
20 Yeah. 495-511-- I thought I remembered the number.
21 But, anyway, so I drove over there and, you know, she,
22 she, she -- I drove up and they had where the garage

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1 was they made a den into it with real nice big
2 windows, and she opened the window. So, I came in --
3 and she came out and -- the way she looked at me and
4 everything and, and the way I looked at her, and I
5 just, I just -- I was just -- sort of one of those
6 weird experiences of life, you know, in the youth of
7 life. So, I went in and talked with her. I told her,
8 I says, Linda, look, I'm, I'm really sorry about
9 everything. I, I, I wish I could die, you know, I --
10 you know. And she says, you know, she was sorry about
11 it too. And I says, I says, Linda, you know, why did
12 you want to see me for? And she told me, she says,
13 you remember when I was dating Harold and all that?
14 And I go, yeah. She goes, you know, and she says, we
15 used to always go out together, all of us as a group,
16 you know, and to Lake Lavon (phonetic) and places like
17 that. I said, yeah. She goes, you know, you were
18 always so different from everybody else. She says,
19 you know, like guys who'd smoke dope, she'd -- you
20 wouldn't take it. Guys would be drinking a lot of
21 beers and you'd only maybe have a half of one or one,
22 you know. But you always seem to be able to, to be
23 with everybody else and you always seem to be, you
24 know, in the crowd and everything, but es-- you always
25 seem to be independent of everybody else and you

2 | have a good time. She says, it -- for the longest
3 | time I was hoping that, you know, I might be able to
4 | get close to you. She says, and she says, I'm the
5 | same way. She says, you know, I'm an artist, you
6 | know, I, I like other things and, and it's just -- you
7 | know, it's hard to find friends being this way.

7 | HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

8 | DAVID KORESH: And she says and I thought
9 | when, when I was dating with Harold and stuff that --
10 | you know, because Harold really lived right next to
11 | me.

11 | HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

12 | DAVID KORESH: You know, and she says I
13 | thought that, you know, I'd, I'd be able to get to
14 | know you better. She says, I guess I -- when we went
15 | around, went around about it the wrong way.

16 | HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

17 | DAVID KORESH: Now, you know, she -- this
18 | girl had a head on her. I never realized. I just
19 | thought she was another just beautiful, gorgeous girl.

20 | HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

21 | DAVID KORESH: But she really had a deep
22 | mind and she -- you know, I'm a Leo.

23 | HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID KORESH: And she's a Gemini.

2 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: And that's a real good
4 combination. But the thing of it is is that, you
5 know, we, we had the most beautiful relationship of,
6 you know, I guess carnal spirituality that could be
7 known, but, still, there was something else involved.

8 And I began to test her love and I began to drive her
9 away after about a year. Anyway, what happened was is
10 that our relationship got stronger and she got
11 pregnant again, right?

12 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: And we started going to
14 church, you know. Because like I say, we was -- we
15 wanted to -- we stopped -- we -- you know, we didn't
16 smoke. We, we didn't smoke dope. We didn't, we
17 didn't drink. I mean, we both was just like this, you
18 know, which was like cool, because, you know, now we
19 have each other now we got the only friends we need.

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: And everybody knows they just
22 did that stuff, everybody.

23 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

24 DAVID KORESH: And that was cool. Back then
25 you could buy liquor at 18 years old.

1 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: Now it's 21. So, anyway,
3 but, but what happened was we started going to church
4 and all that and just things just didn't seem right.
5 It didn't -- things started messing up. And she got
6 pregnant. And when she did, her dad ki-- oh,
7 remember, see, I lived with her. Her dad, her dad let
8 me live with her.

8 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: That was another weird thing
10 that blew me away. I lived with her in her room.

11 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

12 DAVID KORESH: And in the mornings he'd
13 knock on the door, you know, Linda, time to go to
14 school. You know, Vern, are you going to go to work?
15 You know. Weird.

15 HENRY GARCIA: Yeah.

16 DAVID KORESH: Which previously he kicked me
17 out of the house. Kicked me out of the house.
18 Anyway, so she had my first little baby girl, Shayna
19 Cull (phonetic).

19 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

20 DAVID KORESH: And being kicked out of the
21 house, boy, I went through some real, real dramatic
22 experiences, very dramatic. I could not understand

1 what's going on. And that's when -- well, what
2 happened was is that in trying to bring about this
3 situation and trying to explain the situation -- see,
4 Dick never knew that that first baby, the first
5 abortion she had, was mine.

6 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

7 DAVID KORESH: He never knew it.

8 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

9 DAVID KORESH: She never told him.

10 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

11 DAVID KORESH: And I explained -- I told him
12 later though. He goes --

13 HENRY GARCIA: You did?

14 DAVID KORESH: Yes. I told him later. I
15 says, oh, real-- I says, I said, Dick, I'm sorry, but
16 that was, that was a -- that was something I did.
17 And, you know, because he used to call me son anyway.
18 Man, you know, I loved that guy. I loved Mr. Campion
19 (phonetic).

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: I mean -- but I didn't
22 understand his mentality when it came to I can -- so I
23 can sleep with Linda, but not to get her pregnant? I
24 mean, I don't -- anyway, that's just, that's just a
25 part of this experience, you know.

1 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: You know, but the thing of it
3 is is this. When he kicked me out, like I say, I, I
4 stayed in a car. And I worked and I stayed in the car
5 and it just created a lot of problems. Things got
6 rougher and rough. So, I ended up one night really
7 cussing God out. I mean, I mean, I'm talking about I
8 was --

8 HENRY GARCIA: How long after was it?

9 DAVID KORESH: Huh?

10 HENRY GARCIA: How long after?

11 DAVID KORESH: Oh, this was after about a
12 month or two of being out in the car.

12 HENRY GARCIA: Okay.

13 DAVID KORESH: And I was like really,
14 really, you know, talking to the heavens, right?

15 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

16 DAVID KORESH: And then -- oh, it's --
17 that's when, that's when I had to line up. Because
18 what happened was is I -- as I'm, I'm out in this
19 field, you know, doing my thing, expressing my
20 emotional patterns to, to this God, because the most
21 precious thing in my life's been taken away from me
22 thanks to me, circumstance of the situation. Linda
23 told me, she says, she says, you know, she says, your,

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1 your love is the best love in the world, she says, but
2 it's like candy, too much it rots -- you know, she
3 says, you know, we've got to, we've got to get into a,
4 a situation to where, you know, we, we get normal,
5 which is true. I needed to get out and I needed to,
6 to, to work and get a house and a car and all that
7 kind of stuff, right?

7 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

8 DAVID KORESH: And she got a lot of pressure
9 from her parents because, you know, here she was in
10 high school, you know, probably 11th grade or so, you
11 know, and she ends up pregnant, you know.

12 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: Or was she in 12th grade?
14 She may have, may have been in 12th grade when she was
15 pregnant. Anyway, but, but the key is this. She
16 still wasn't 18 yet.

17 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

18 DAVID KORESH: So, I'm out here and all of a
19 sudden, all of a sudden this -- phew -- this presence
20 enshrouds me. And I'm talking about it's authority
21 encompasses me. And here I am zeroed in, and all of a
22 sudden I start shaking and I'm scared to death. I
23 mean, you'd be scared if you was out in the field and
24 all of a sudden two black guys came at you, wouldn't
25

1 you?

2 HENRY GARCIA: Sure.

3 DAVID KORESH: Yeah. Well, this was worse
4 than that. And some of the things that I was saying
5 you would never say as a five-year-old to your father.
6 Never. Know what I mean?

7 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

8 DAVID KORESH: Sometimes, sometimes a
9 slippery tongue can be a lack of knowledge. And, all
10 of a sudden, this zero, zeroed in on me. And here I
11 am looking at the sky, but all of a sudden it's like,
12 it's like I'm being watched from every angle. And
13 there's this, there's this being confronting me and
14 it's like I have no place to run, Henry.

15 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

16 DAVID KORESH: No place to run. And it is
17 -- one part of me is terrified and the other part of
18 me is awed. Like, you're real? You know, it's kind
19 of like, you're real? Really? Re -- you know.

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: And this voice says to me, it
22 says -- in the most sublime communication. It's like
23 -- it, it wasn't -- it's not a voice such as -- see,
24 when I'm talking to you, you don't see what I'm
25 seeing. It's a voice that imparted a picture

1 completely perfect in my mind.

2 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: You know.

4 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

5 DAVID KORESH: It, it overruled all my
6 perception banks and, and it sort of like jammed m--
7 any kind of perception except what it wanted me to
8 know.

9 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

10 DAVID KORESH: And he says, you're really
11 hurt, aren't you? And, and, you know, 19 years of
12 life flash in front of me, just like on a film. The
13 whole d-- aura of being. Everything.

14 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

15 DAVID KORESH: You know, I mean, just like,
16 like a, like a, like a million experiences of tears
17 and pain, you know, and disappointment, that everybody
18 has, you know.

19 HENRY GARCIA: Sure.

20 DAVID KORESH: It says, you're really hurt,
21 aren't you? You've loved Linda for about a year and
22 now she's turned her back on you. And now she's
23 rejected you. And which, you know, that's, that's the
24 climactic thing, because the, the most highest
25 elevation of human completeness is, is marriage,

1 right?

2 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: Right? Okay. That's, that's
4 the climactic purpose of maturity.

5 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

6 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Then from marriage you
7 develop into, you know, your, your superiority of
8 whatever you're going to develop into.

9 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

10 DAVID KORESH: Okay. You know, and it's
11 like this is gone. The highest reach, after being so,
12 so, might I say, choosy and so restraintive from, you
13 know, a relationship, all of a sudden this
14 relationship comes, supposedly I've made in heaven,
15 people talk about it, and it, and it is gone.

16 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

17 DAVID KORESH: And then a voice all of a
18 sudden -- it, it re-- it, it reviewed to me all of
19 these weird and strange and unique and enstrengthening
20 experiences throughout my whole childhood and life.
21 And it says, don't you know that for 19 years I've
22 loved you and for 19 years you've turned your back on
23 me and rejected me? And all of a sudden everything is
24 like bang. It hit me all at once. Ah. What an
25 ability to forget the reasons and the purposes of

1 life. So, from that point I had this, you know,
2 knowledge of what the next phase that I had to
3 experience and to do. Because, see, Linda, she's a
4 part of my life and my experience.

5 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

6 DAVID KORESH: I mean, I can sympathize with
7 people that make those mistakes.

8 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: I could never condemn anybody
10 for making it, because it seems to be good, but it
11 turns out sour.

12 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: You know. So, what happens
14 is is that in the, in the continual phases of
15 judgment, before Christ can judge of the world he has
16 to really know where the world's coming from. See,
17 the best, the best drug-buster is a guy that's been in
18 drugs. You know what I mean?

19 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

20 DAVID KORESH: The best lawyer is the guy
21 that's been someone involved in criminal activity, to
22 be, to be factual.

23 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

24 DAVID KORESH: So, the, the -- Christ cannot
25 judge the world or the end of the world until finally

1 the fulfillment of Genesis states, you know, man's
2 become as one of us, knowing good and evil. And until
3 Christ reveals something about God that no one's ever
4 known before pertaining to the meaning of God says
5 man's become as one of us, knowing good and evil?

6 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

7 DAVID KORESH: The reason why God doesn't
8 condemn man for evil is because God has put men like
9 an incubation experience so they can know good and
10 evil and decide throughout their pattern of life what
11 they really want to pursue.

12 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: Not based on the law of any
14 exaction of commandment, but based upon an emotion
15 that we arrive to after we break that standard of
16 righteousness. I mean, you don't have to
17 (indiscernible) in the law to be a carnal being in
18 this world and be unhappy because the purposes of
19 light and truth, which you perceive, you don't come up
20 to.

21 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

22 DAVID KORESH: I mean, like, for instance,
23 you could, you could be driving in a car, going to go
24 home to your wife, right?

25 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

1 DAVID KORESH: And do you love your wife?

2 HENRY GARCIA: What?

3 DAVID KORESH: Do you love your wife?

4 HENRY GARCIA: Sure.

5 DAVID KORESH: Okay. So, you're thinking
6 about you love your wife, how much you love her. You
7 know, and you're thinking about getting some flowers
8 and stuff. You know, you really love her. You, you
9 want to see her. And you come in through the front
10 door and you go in, all of a sudden, right off the
11 bat, the first thing you say to her is say, Martha,
12 what is this doing in the floor? And you get right
13 into an argument. That ever happen to you?

14 HENRY GARCIA: Sure.

15 DAVID KORESH: And afterwards you tell
16 yourself, you say, what is going on with me? I came
17 in up to this door with every anticipation of giving
18 her a hug. You know, I had all these good thoughts
19 and good intentions. And what sours this inability to
20 activate -- or, for instance, you want to do something
21 nice to her and then she's in a, she's in a, a pissy
22 mood.

23 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

24 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Well, see -- but, see,
25 the longing and the desire of man to seek after this

1 righteous and to pursue this good is the basis of
2 where I come from and the reason why I am what I am.
3 That seems confusing right now. I know the psalms,
4 for number one, are too many. You see?

5 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

6 DAVID KORESH: But the key note is this.
7 God said he would give me Linda later. Then the next
8 experience would revolve later on in regards to my
9 experience with the churches. Okay?

10 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

11 DAVID KORESH: But, anyway, to make a long,
12 long story short, which this will all be brought out
13 in the judgment anyway, in 1985 --

14 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

15 DAVID KORESH: -- the time came for me to,
16 to be able to incorporate everything that I've learned
17 as a man. Because I'm just like you and everybody
18 else around here.

19 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

20 DAVID KORESH: You know, we've done some
21 things. We've experienced some things. And,
22 basically, if I go to a bar and stuff like that, you
23 know, I can talk to a guy and say, you know, is this
24 really all that fun? And everybody will tell me, nah,
25 not really. It's just -- that's all the best we've

1 got to do right now.

2 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: So, that way I don't judge
4 anybody based upon their works of the world. I base
5 -- my judgment is based upon -- I come my rewards with
6 me to give every man according as his works shall be,
7 not what his work is.

7 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

8 DAVID KORESH: Now, you can't know what the
9 free gift is, what the work shall be, unless you know
10 what God says will be.

11 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

12 DAVID KORESH: You know? I mean, you cannot
13 have a reward from God once the truth begins to be
14 revealed based upon what you've done already.

14 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

15 DAVID KORESH: Now, if this truth was not in
16 the world, then you'd be given a reward according as
17 your work has been.

18 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: Of course, you know, if you
20 guys in law enforcement are sincere --

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: -- and you're really trying
22 to do good --

23

1 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: -- then you're righteous with
3 God.

4 HENRY GARCIA: That's right.

5 DAVID KORESH: Because you can only, you can
6 only walk in the light of the law as you know the law.

7 HENRY GARCIA: Exactly.

8 DAVID KORESH: You see, that's why God
9 placed Israel in subjection to the nations of men.
10 And Paul explains: Look, Israel, Paul says, you're
11 missing the point. Does not even the Spirit of God
12 even work in the Gentiles? For if the Gentiles which
13 have not the law do by nature the things contained in
14 the law -- like do you have to have a law to tell you
15 to feed your baby or to give it some clothes or change
16 its diaper?

17 HENRY GARCIA: Really.

18 DAVID KORESH: Do you have to have a law to,
19 to, to see your friend, next-door neighbor over there
20 with the smile on his face and his, and his wife, and
21 here you're with your wife, and you see his grass is
22 growing a little bit high over there and he's out
23 there and his lawn mower won't start. Do you have to
24 have a law to say hey, friend, would you like to
25 borrow my mower till you get yours fixed? No.

1 HENRY GARCIA: That's right.

2 DAVID KORESH: I mean, you know, you don't
3 have to have a law to basically be obeying a feeling
4 and emotion, to not only feel for yourself but feel
5 for others that are of the same proportion of matter.
6 I mean, you know, it's -- it -- this is what Paul
7 tried to explain.

8 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: So, Paul -- you know, Paul
10 begins to explain to the Romans that the law of God
11 was not revealed from Sinai, you know, to make people
12 a righteousness -- a standard of righteousness, but it
13 was revealed that all mouths might be stopped and
14 everybody might become guilty before God.

15 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

16 DAVID KORESH: In other words, nobody's
17 good.

18 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: You know. But the desire and
20 the spirit to do good is where Paul explains: For I
21 know the law is spiritual, Paul says, but I am carnal
22 so to understand. Paul says, that which I would do
23 the law, I do not, but that which I hate, sin, that I
24 do. Paul says, oh, wretched man that I am, who's
25 going to deliver me from this body of sin and death?

1 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: Paul says, in the flesh I do
3 one thing, but in my mind I want to do another thing.

4 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

5 DAVID KORESH: Paul says, I thank God that
6 through Christ I can serve God through the spirit
7 although I might make a mistake in the flesh.

8 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: Okay. So, this, this, this
10 is where the enmity comes toward man begins to push
11 forward. Now, in 1985, I went to Israel because there
12 was a calling. Okay?

13 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

14 DAVID KORESH: Now, a lot of people will not
15 really -- don't understand me from the years of 1978,
16 '79, to 1985 because a lot of transition took place
17 during that time. A lot of my friends and stuff just
18 could not -- did not know where I was coming from and
19 where I was going.

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Like at the Seventh
22 Day Adventist Church -- I joined the Tyler Adventist
23 Church. Now, again, I've always had a problem with
24 this so-called church fellowship. When I would have
25 these visitations or experiences, right, I would, I

1 would tell people, and they would sit there and go,
2 yeah. Hello?

3 HENRY GARCIA: Yes. Yes.

4 DAVID KORESH: They would, they would sit
5 there --

6 (Clicking.)

7 HENRY GARCIA: Hello?

8 DAVID KORESH: Why? What is it?

9 HENRY GARCIA: What --

10 DAVID KORESH: Leave it alone over there.
11 (Clicking.)

12 DAVID KORESH: Leave it alone. Okay. Just
13 leave it alone. Someone -- okay. They would say --
14 they would, they would smile at me and say oh, you
15 really? Yes. Really? Interesting. No -- really?
16 Well, praise the Lord. And then behind my back do you
17 know what they were doing?

18 HENRY GARCIA: What?

19 DAVID KORESH: They were saying that this
20 was an effect of drugs. And I never ever was ever
21 addicted or into any drugs. I mean, I have to admit
22 once I tried some marijuana.

23 HENRY GARCIA: Once?

24 DAVID KORESH: Once. But the thing of it
25 was is that in trying that junk -- you see, have you

1 ever done any long-distance running?

2 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Do you know after
4 you've warmed up and after you get your second wind --

5 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

6 DAVID KORESH: -- how it seems like you can
7 go forever and ever if you pace yourself?

8 HENRY GARCIA: Right.

9 DAVID KORESH: Okay. My distances was from
10 our street down to the shooting range, which was
11 approximately six-and-a-half miles.

12 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: And I did that back and forth
14 every evening after -- well, right before it got too
15 dark.

16 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

17 DAVID KORESH: Okay? Now, right when I
18 would get right back to about approximately 50 to 75
19 yards from the street sign down our road to where our
20 house was, we lived in like a ranchette --

21 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

22 DAVID KORESH: -- I would, I would put all I
23 had into it that last duration of yardage and, and
24 there would be such an adrenalin, such a high, and
25 such an awareness of physiology, I mean, it would be

1 almost like spiritual --

2 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: -- that I would get off of
4 this, I -- look, I have -- there, there has never been
5 anything that I have ever done in pot or beer, as long
6 as I never done, that, you know, that matches it. So,
7 when you've got this kind of opened perception of
8 reality of your physical and your -- you know, your
9 mind -- when your mind and your body is in shape,
10 you're in health, right?

11 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

12 DAVID KORESH: Then, hey, man, that's all
13 you need. When you're able to wake up in the morning,
14 ah, you feel good. You jump right out of the bed.
15 You know, you run. You get a shower. You go to --
16 you're skipping around, you know, to get your
17 breakfast. You feel good. I mean, you know, you, you
18 just feel frisky all day.

19 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

20 DAVID KORESH: You know. When you're able
21 to go to work all day nice and hard. You come home.
22 Ah, you take a shower. You want to go out a couple
23 hours, you know.

24 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

25 DAVID KORESH: That, that's, that's life.

1 HENRY GARCIA: Exactly.

2 DAVID KORESH: Anything less than that is
3 death.

4 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

5 DAVID KORESH: So, you know, these, these
6 friends and all that, you know, like, you know, hey,
7 man, you want -- try this, you know. And, like, well,
8 no thanks. So, man, aren't you cool? I say you know
9 I'm cool. You know. I mean, who's jams are you
10 listening to?

11 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

12 DAVID KORESH: They said well, man, if you,
13 if you smoked some of this, you'd really play good
14 guitar. No, I don't need to smoke that to play
15 guitar.

16 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

17 DAVID KORESH: You know, I, I get high on
18 the music. I, I -- at least I know what I'm listening
19 to.

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: You know. And, so, what
22 happens is is -- you know, so, finally, he broke down
23 and he -- this guy had some of this stuff, it's
24 supposed to be some really great stuff from, from
25 Hawaii or Hockeypo-- or Hokey-pokey or something like

1 that. I -- well -- I can't, I can't remember what the
2 name was. It's some kind of Hawaiian stuff. Right?
3 It's supposed to be real good. So, you know --

4 HENRY GARCIA: What kind of Hawaiian stuff?

5 DAVID KORESH: Huh?

6 HENRY GARCIA: Hawaiian stuff?

7 DAVID KORESH: Yeah. It was, it was
8 Hawaiian marijuana stuff.

9 HENRY GARCIA: Oh, okay.

10 DAVID KORESH: You know, some grass. And,
11 you know, I took, I took so-- you know, a couple of
12 hits off that thing, you know, and I'm like sitting
13 there, and all of a sudden, man, this weird sensation
14 started creeping up over me. I mean, weird. It's
15 like a couple of hands coming up, up my back and
16 around my neck --

17 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

18 DAVID KORESH: -- you know, and puffing up
19 my eyes. And, and I'm going like, hey, you know, and
20 like they're going, well, you don't ever do it so it's
21 probably going to -- you're probably going to be
22 really hit hard the first time, you know, and all this
23 stuff. And we're like riding and they've got this
24 music on real loud in the back, you know. And it's
25 like -- you're sitting there. It's like, you know,

1 get me out of this place. Man, someone's going to
2 drive this car up a signpost, you know. You know, get
3 me out of this nightmare. It's like, you know, you
4 wanted to wake up. I like to be alert --

5 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

6 DAVID KORESH: -- you know, and it's -- and
7 I said forget that stuff. And, so, so, afterwards,
8 you know, people -- you know, I'd hang around with
9 people that did that stuff and I kind of like -- you
10 know, like, you know, look, I'm athletic. I'm cool.
11 You know, I had long hair. You know, I was a guitar
12 player. You know. But at least I could play
13 guitar --

14 HENRY GARCIA: Right.

15 DAVID KORESH: -- and turn around and go
16 play football.

17 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

18 DAVID KORESH: At least I could play guitar
19 and rock-and-roll and get people, you know, out there
20 moving and stuff or whatever, play ballads and get
21 people, you know, with a nice attitude, and still at
22 the same time get out there and ride motorcycle all
23 day long, you know, or, or run.

24 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

25 DAVID KORESH: So, you know, I just, I just

1 | didn't need that stuff.

2 | HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 | DAVID KORESH: So, in 1985 things had
4 | developed to a maxim (sic) to where, you know, there
5 | had been just too much controversy over the concept of
6 | the purpose of scripture. Some people think that the
7 | Bible is a record of other people's stories. So, you
8 | could read them and know how God dealt with them and
9 | you can have your own experience. Others believe that
10 | the Bible has a prophetic utterance, that it forewarns
11 | of the last-day events. Others believe as others
12 | believe that. But, anyway, after seeing and pursuing
13 | and understanding so many things about, you know -- I,
14 | I, I've been, I've been rejected and I've been
15 | accepted. I've been, I've been the wellest (sic) and
16 | I've been the sickest. I've had big money and I've
17 | had no money.

16 | HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

17 | DAVID KORESH: I've been called special
18 | student, retarded --

18 | HENRY GARCIA: Hmm.

19 | DAVID KORESH: -- and I've been called a
20 | genius.

21 | HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

22 | DAVID KORESH: I mean, you know, I get to
23 |
24 |
25 |

1 look at things from both sides of the coin.

2 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: Okay. So, in 1985 when I was
4 in Israel I had an unusual -- a very unique
5 experience. I took my wife Rachel over there. That's
6 when I married Rachel. I'd already -- I'd al-- I was
7 told to come to Mount Carmel Center. Okay? So, I
8 came there. And through certain events I married a
9 young girl named Rachel Jones.

9 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

10 DAVID KORESH: I was told to.

11 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

12 DAVID KORESH: And we've been married for --
13 how many years now, Rache? Nine years now complete,
14 right?

14 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

15 DAVID KORESH: Hey, Rachel?

16 HENRY GARCIA: Nine years?

17 DAVID KORESH: Yeah, nine years. Rachel?
18 And it has -- has it ever been boring?

19 RACHEL (ASSUMED): No. (Barely
20 discernible.)

20 DAVID KORESH: Uh-uh. You still love me?

21 HENRY GARCIA: (Chuckling.)

22 DAVID KORESH: But --

23

24

1 HENRY GARCIA: What did she say?

2 DAVID KORESH: Huh?

3 HENRY GARCIA: What did she say?

4 DAVID KORESH: She, she's over there

5 laughing.

6 HENRY GARCIA: (Chuckling.)

7 DAVID KORESH: No, she's -- it's, it's, it's
8 like I say. It's strange, but it's -- you know, she's
9 very precious. And she used to, she used to get upset
10 about my stories of Linda and Sandy because, you know,
11 she, she's always felt that God's kind of cheated her
12 a little bit in some of the social graces. But --
13 Rachel's a very beautiful girl.

14 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

15 DAVID KORESH: Long, beautiful blond hair.
16 Very beautiful girl.

17 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

18 DAVID KORESH: You know. But, anyway,
19 there, there's more to it. So, in 1985 I took this
20 little girl over to Israel, and she was pregnant and
21 we were going to have our baby in Israel.

22 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

23 DAVID KORESH: And this was going to be my
24 first son -- or first little boy. We, we named him
25 after, we named him after Cyrus, according to

1 | Isaiah 45.

2 | HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 | DAVID KORESH: Of course, I wanted him to
4 | bear that name as a first name because of the
5 | involvement of what it had prophetically and, and the
6 | significance prophetically, which, you know, Cyrus is
7 | the English translation for the word Koresh.

7 | HENRY GARCIA: Okay.

8 | DAVID KORESH: Okay. And that's one of the
9 | words that -- the Hebrew terminologies or, or the
10 | ancient Hebrew, they don't, they don't know the
11 | meaning of this word. They don't know the meaning of
12 | it. The Revelation says Christ has the name of which
13 | no one knows but he himself. See? So, his name is
14 | the Word of God, but what does this Koresh mean?
15 | Anyway, so, when I was in Israel, I was, I was given
16 | all the details. Rumor had it that Russian cosmonauts
17 | were in their satellite stations and they had wired
18 | down to their headquarters that they were quite
19 | disturbed because they had saw seven angelic beings,
20 | angel-like beings, coming towards the Earth.

19 | HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

20 | DAVID KORESH: And, you know, that, that was
21 | kind of like, you know, was it, was it a, was it a
22 | pun? Was it a truth? Was it a joke? I mean, you

23 |

24 |

25 |

1 know, was it a make-believe or whatever -- well, it,
2 it doesn't make any difference. I mean, if it was
3 true, the question would be why would Russia of all
4 people want to give significance to angelic beings?
5 But, anyway, I know it's true and I know why it was
6 true. Because the seven angels of Revelation 14. You
7 see, God chooses one person to judge the world. God
8 chose one man, Noah, who had lived, who had thought,
9 who had dreamed, who had experienced, who had cried,
10 who had laughed, who had hungered, who had thirsted,
11 who had been sad, who had been, you know, refreshed
12 with drink, who had known woman and children. God
13 used one man, Noah, not the whole world, one man, to
14 bring that world to judgment. And those who did not
15 hear him perished. Just as God used one man, Moses,
16 and God used one man, Elijah. And all the way through
17 the record, men were risen to proclaim a testimony
18 about the sons of God. So, likewise, in the days of
19 Christ, Christ says if you've seen me you've seen the
20 father. Not that the father looks like Christ at all,
21 but that the Word of God -- Christ is the Word of God.
22 You cannot know Christ unless you know the Word of
23 God. Christ referred to the scripture that was
24 proclaimed to be the words of God. Not the words of
25 Moses, but the words of God. Not the words of Isaiah,

1 but the words of God. Not the words of the men that
2 God had used as instruments, but as the words of God.

3 And when this Word of God, the Promise, was
4 fulfilled, it was definitely made flesh. So,
5 likewise, in the last testament of the New Testament.

6 I had an experience in 1985 to where I was privileged
7 to see things and go places that modern science and
8 modern technology of our generation could never, with
9 the billions of millions of dollars that they could
10 make or wish they had or whatever -- they could ever
11 be able to go such distances and see such heights and
12 perceive such depths of reality.

13 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

14 DAVID KORESH: But --

15 BOBBY: Mom --

16 DAVID KORESH: -- the wisdom of the
17 heartbeat in the channelling of the emotions -- the
18 child who is upset because, you know, he is interested
19 in a bee or he wants to learn about hummingbirds
20 first, not ABC's -- okay. Man may have a system and
21 we may have to be processed through it, and man may
22 not be intelligent enough to realize that some
23 precious --

24 BOBBY: Mom --

25 DAVID KORESH: -- articles may be found in

1 young people that take a little more time to develop
2 than others. Just because a child --

3 BOBBY: Daddy?

4 DAVID KORESH: -- does not, you know, go in
5 the --

6 BOBBY: Daddy?

7 DAVID KORESH: -- patterns of the, of the
8 norm --

9 BOBBY: Daddy?

10 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

11 DAVID KORESH: -- does not mean that child
12 -- BOBBY: (Not discernible.)

13 DAVID KORESH: -- is retarded or special,
14 you know.

15 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

16 DAVID KORESH: Because that ch-- same child,
17 you know, in this world, just as the --

18 BOBBY: Daddy --

19 DAVID KORESH: -- as the plants are, you
20 know -- furnish oxygen for man and man --

21 BOBBY: (Not discernible.)

22 DAVID KORESH: What baby? Okay. Well, go
23 potty. (Chuckling.)

24 HENRY GARCIA: (Chuckling.)

25 DAVID KORESH: That's little Bobby. Okay.

1 Anyway, what I'm saying is, you know, God does see the
2 tears of the children. He really does. And he sees
3 the way they see. You know, like when I was standing
4 there that day and I was saying, you know, I'm in
5 retarded class, you know --

6 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

7 DAVID KORESH: You know, my mother just
8 thinks but no, you're in -- you're, you're -- you
9 know, have a learning disability. Well, well, that,
10 that doesn't mean that there's not -- there's
11 something wrong.

12 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: It just means that maybe I'm
14 interested in something else right now.

15 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

16 DAVID KORESH: And, you know, okay. In
17 regards to maturity, what I had done at ages, you
18 know, 17 -- 18 -- to this young 16-year-old girl, you
19 know, was wrong.

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: By law it was wrong. But,
22 you know, the law needs to have an understanding that
23 really what, really what's wrong is giving young
24 people such freedom to be ensnared in that youth and
25 that age to where they are so prone to do evil based

1 upon their ignorance.

2 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: Because, you know, the lesson
4 that I had to learn after doing that wrong was such a
5 bitter, hard lesson of inner pain that, you know, I
6 never wanted to have to go through it again. But
7 nonetheless, still, where I learned these ills --
8 where I, where I learned these ills at, where I was
9 taken, to, to be shown these things when I heard that
10 this young girl was impregnated with something from me
11 that, that seemed to give me a reason for being that
12 superseded anything to do with being a special student
13 or a special child, because it's like somebody was
14 inhousing (sic) a part of me that made me responsible
15 to promote me to want to be more responsible, to
16 develop myself more highly to protect that, see, that
17 --

16 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

17 DAVID KORESH: -- offspring.

18 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: Now, that, that's something
20 in the hearts of men that, that God judges. Okay.
21 And although it turned out to be a bitter experience
22 yet, the lesson became very fruitful in the respect
23 that -- well, in 1985 -- well, like I say, you come up
24
25

1 | hither and you notice how in the judgment when it says
2 | who is worthy, it says no man, doesn't it?

3 | HENRY GARCIA: That's right.

4 | DAVID KORESH: It doesn't say Christ, does
5 | it?

6 | HENRY GARCIA: Uh-uh.

7 | DAVID KORESH: It just says simply: no man.

8 | DAVID KORESH: So, we're not dealing with,
9 | you know -- okay. For instance, Christ was a man,
10 | wasn't he?

11 | HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

12 | DAVID KORESH: But when they confronted
13 | Christ, he says, well, good -- Matthew says, call no
14 | man good, for only one is good, your Father, which is
15 | where?

16 | HENRY GARCIA: In heaven.

17 | DAVID KORESH: In heaven. But you know
18 | what's realizing amazing and what's really awesome
19 | about this Christ of 2,000 years ago is that he said
20 | when you see me you've seen the Father, for I and my
21 | Father are one. He says, and that day you shall know
22 | that I am in the Father and the Father is in me. Now,
23 | this is kind of confusing. Like, well, what, what's
24 | being said here? Well, anyway, the one who really
25 | sits on the throne -- okay?

1 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: -- is really Christ.

3 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

4 DAVID KORESH: See, Isaiah says his name
5 will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God,
6 Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace. So, when it
7 says no man, remember, rock relates to matter. And
8 we're all made out of rocks, aren't we?

8 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: I mean, we're, we're of the
10 atomic world. Okay. Now, a lot of Christians would
11 not agree with me because they'd say well, look, the
12 Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit are one. Well,
13 that, that's what John implies to say, which is true
14 to a degree. But it's, it's, it's got another angle
15 that you have to look at it from. John says there are
16 three that bear record in heaven: the Father -- which
17 that's the one on the throne, right?

17 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

18 DAVID KORESH: The Word --

18 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: That's his book, isn't it?

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: And the Holy Ghost.

22 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

23

24

25

1 DAVID KORESH: And these three bear record.
2 So, then, where's Christ? Well, all the New
3 Testament says Christ is at the right hand of God.
4 What's at the right hand of God? A Word. But it's
5 not flesh, is it?

6 HENRY GARCIA: No.

7 DAVID KORESH: No, because when Christ is
8 sitting on high and went back to heaven, he, he, he
9 put back on his divinity.

10 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

11 DAVID KORESH: But in the form of humanity.
12 Is is something the world doesn't understand yet.
13 It's really, it's really awesome. Now, now that we
14 know that Christ is in the Father and the Father is in
15 him -- I and my Father are one, right?

16 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

17 DAVID KORESH: You see, we could not bear to
18 see the glory of the Father in the way he really is.

19 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

20 DAVID KORESH: He's consumed in fire, isn't
21 he?

22 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

23 DAVID KORESH: So, God became flesh. Hebrew
24 says that God, with the same life and spirit of the
25 beginning, became flesh --

1 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: -- was begotten through us --

3 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

4 DAVID KORESH: -- just as God had formed
5 Adam and brought Eve forth and brought Cain and Abel
6 and said that all the way through -- God can also just
7 as easily as that predominant light or that power, the
8 first cause, the originator of the spirits of men, can
likewise come through man.

9 HENRY GARCIA: Um-huh.

10 DAVID KORESH: Okay. So, that's why Christ
11 is the first begotten. Now, we know that he was
12 perfect, but Christ, which we know is God, says to his
13 disciples 2,000 years ago, he says, but there will be
14 many of you standing with me right now that shall not
15 see death until you shall see the kingdom of heaven
16 come in power. Well, he took Peter, James, and John
17 up to the Mount. And while they prayed, they awoke
and they saw Moses and Elijah and Christ, right?

18 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: And they all turned into
20 transparent light, one light. Now, the meaning of
21 this is this. The meaning is is that the Word of God
22 that gave light and brought forth all creation is the
23 same spirit that is the life of Adam, the same breath
24
25

1 that said let there be light is the same breath that
2 breathed a portion of that light into the nostrils of
3 Adam, right?

4 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

5 DAVID KORESH: Okay. So, John says: In the
6 beginning was the Word. The Word was with God. The
7 Word was God. All things were made by him. And
8 anything that was made that was not made by him, in
9 him was life, and the life was the light of men. So,
10 Adam opened his eyes, didn't he?

11 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

12 DAVID KORESH: After receiving the spirit.
13 Now, then John goes on to say: And this light from
14 the beginning shown in darkness, but the darkness
15 comprehended it not. It says: This light came to his
16 own, which was the Jews --

17 UNIDENTIFIED CHILD (BACKGROUND): Mommy.

18 DAVID KORESH: -- and the Jews received him
19 not. But to those that received him --

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: -- to them gave he power to
22 become the sons of God. Now, Peter says we're
23 begotten again. See, we already all, all of us here,
24 the whole world, we're already the sons of God. I
25 don't mean spiritually or an-- I mean literally. I

1 mean literally. When Adam and Eve sinned, God said
2 there in Genesis: Behold, man's become as one of us
3 now. Right?

4 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

5 DAVID KORESH: Knowing good and -- we've got
6 to go the hard road, don't we?

7 HENRY GARCIA: Yeah.

8 DAVID KORESH: We're prodigals, aren't we?

9 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

10 DAVID KORESH: Good and evil.

11 HENRY GARCIA: Right.

12 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Now, now, see, that's
13 where -- I don't like this evil. All my life I have,
14 I have hated evil. But Paul says we've got to
15 struggle. Those of us who are sons of God, we have to
16 struggle. That which we don't do -- we don't want to
17 do, we do. I mean, I don't want to eat more than
18 maybe two, maybe three chocolate chip cookies. I
19 mean, that's too much carbohydrates as it is.

20 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

21 DAVID KORESH: Okay? Especially the Bermann
22 (phonetic) chocolate is not that good for you. But my
23 hand somehow just seems to grab another chocolate
24 chip. You know what I mean?

25 HENRY GARCIA: Yes.

1 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Some people never have
2 this problem. Some people, they would just like --
3 now, I like -- oh, I like a nice -- on a long hot day,
4 I like a nice cold glass of beer. One, just one. But
5 I want it real, real cold.

6 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

7 DAVID KORESH: At the end of the workday.

8 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: You know, and I want to be
10 able to sit back and go, whew, thank you, Lord. And I
11 want to, like, like the law of Moses says, to tie the
12 liquors with strong drinks.

13 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

14 DAVID KORESH: They have a municipal purpose
15 for them. But anything good can be made evil if used
16 out of portion (sic).

17 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

18 DAVID KORESH: So, I want to like take that
19 glass of beer and sip on it, you know, and just sit
20 back and relax and let it loosen my nervous system up,
21 let me relax and maybe get ready for a good night's
22 sleep. But there's some people, no, they want to take
23 that thing and down it and grab another one and down
24 it and drink two or three beers before the hour is out
25 and act crazy.

1 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

2 DAVID KORESH: And, you know, and it's kind
3 of like this sin stuff is so powerful that man, not
4 understanding the reasons for it, forget that the law
5 was revealed so we might feel our separation from God
6 that we might desire our reuniting with God. So, now,
7 finally God came in the flesh as of -- as in the form
8 of humanity, which he became his only begotten Son,
9 didn't he? Not, not all the glory was revealed,
10 right? Only the glory of God that was revealed in
11 Christ, right? The spirit was not given in measure to
12 him, John says. He had the power and the ability to
13 do all works of God, didn't he?

12 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

13 DAVID KORESH: Because he was the Son of
14 God, wasn't he?

15 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

16 DAVID KORESH: And to those who believed
17 that he was, to them gave he power to become the sons
18 of God, right?

18 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: Even those who believed on
20 his name.

21 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

22 DAVID KORESH: So, therefore, they are
23
24
25

1 brethren. Paul says that he, the God, the originator
2 of us all he that sanctifies and those who are
3 sanctified, his sons are all the same.

4 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

5 DAVID KORESH: We have to agree with what
6 he's doing. Okay. For instance, David was a man
7 after God's own heart, right?

8 HENRY GARCIA: What? What?

9 DAVID KORESH: The Bible says David was a
10 man after God's own heart.

11 HENRY GARCIA: Right.

12 DAVID KORESH: But, now, wait a minute. God
13 doesn't commit adultery, does he?

14 HENRY GARCIA: No.

15 DAVID KORESH: No.

16 HENRY GARCIA: No, no, no, no.

17 DAVID KORESH: And if he ever did, he
18 doesn't anymore. But remember, man knows good and
19 evil. Well, wait a minute. Then why would the
20 scriptures say David was a man after God's own heart?

21 Well, this is the position that I'm in right now, to
22 help you understand where I'm coming from, you see.
23 You know, I may act -- okay. I'm, I'm -- well, I'm
24 going to -- when we come up, we're going to be
25 punished. See, I know that. Because, you know, as it

1 appears by all means, we've done wrong.

2 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: I understand that.

4 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

5 DAVID KORESH: But, you see, David of old,
6 he loved his God. And when he made a mistake or if he
7 did wrong, God would punish him --

8 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: -- but he would not rebel
10 against the punishment.

11 HENRY GARCIA: Right.

12 DAVID KORESH: Therefore, what would happen
13 is is that he would be in agreement with the mind of
14 God to receive the punishment --

15 HENRY GARCIA: Right.

16 DAVID KORESH: -- that God's wisdom ordained
17 for him to have.

18 HENRY GARCIA: Right.

19 DAVID KORESH: Therefore reconciling, making
20 his heart equal with the heart of God. Well, what
21 would you rather have, be destroyed and die, be lost,
22 or rather get punished?

23 HENRY GARCIA: That's it.

24 DAVID KORESH: I mean, I would rather have a
25 father say to me, all right, boy, didn't I tell you

1 not to do that? Yes, father. Come here, son. We're
2 going to take care of this right now.

3 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

4 DAVID KORESH: I mean, you know, and, and
5 get the smiting and realize that, well, you see, I
6 have to be smitten now because I'm not really
7 understanding what the lesson really is. Okay. For
8 instance, a little child, you tell him, now, don't go
9 out in the road there. Well, they don't understand
10 about cars and being ran over and being killed.
Right?

11 HENRY GARCIA: That's right.

12 DAVID KORESH: So, you have to mediate the
13 wisdom by saying, now, if you go out in that street,
14 if I catch you going out this gate, I am going to
15 light your little rear end up and you're going to know
not to ever go out there again.

16 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

17 DAVID KORESH: So, you take them and, you
18 know, now, this should be done in love, and you give
19 them a good swat on their bottom. And they don't fear
the cars, but you know what they fear, don't you?

20 HENRY GARCIA: Right.

21 DAVID KORESH: The, the lesser evil to
22 prevent them from the greater evil.

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1 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Then, finally, they
3 go, they go -- oh, they go, Mom, I realize why you
4 used to whip me on my butt for, because you didn't
5 want me to get ran over out in that street.

6 HENRY GARCIA: Uh-huh.

7 DAVID KORESH: You see. So --

8 HENRY GARCIA: Right.

9 DAVID KORESH: So, that's -- that, that's,
10 that's what we deal with now. So, this is -- like
11 people ask me, do you spank your kids? Yes, I
12 discipline my kids, but with understanding. Remember,
13 I was taken far, far, far out of this world in 1985.
14 You know.

15 HENRY GARCIA: Yes.

16 DAVID KORESH: I was taken to places above
17 beyond, unbelievably unspeakable.

18 HENRY GARCIA: And that, and that's --

19 DAVID KORESH: But all --

20 HENRY GARCIA: -- (indiscernible)

21 DAVID KORESH: -- I was given, all I was
22 given to speak was a riddle that revolved around these
23 seven seals.

24 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

25 DAVID KORESH: Now, see, I may not be smart,

1 but you don't have to be smart to be able to
2 understand basic principles of love and all of these
3 things.

4 HENRY GARCIA: Um-hum.

5 DAVID KORESH: Okay. So, you know, that's
6 why I was talking to Jim and stuff, you know, so much,
7 because, see, one thing I realized about you and Jim
8 is that I know you've got a knowledge and, and
9 psychology and the knowledge and, you know, these
10 things, but you do actually within your own soul,
11 unlike Gary, you do have an actual sensitive spot to
12 wish to understand how to work with your clients.

13 HENRY GARCIA: See, one of the things that
14 you said --
