4 (Electronic noises)
5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?
6 HENRY: Hello?
7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Pass that over here a minute
8 (indiscernible).
9 HENRY: I'm, I'm sorry?
10 MR. SCHNEIDER: (Indiscernible) hookup
11 (indiscernible). Hello?
12 HENRY: Good morning.
13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good morning.
14 HENRY: How are you?
15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Crazy phone.
16 HENRY: It is. How are you this morning?
17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not too bad. How's
18 yourself?
19 HENRY: I'm doing okay.
20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good.
21 HENRY: David asked me to call him first
22 thing this morning so we could get Heather going.
23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Let's see. Get
24 somebody else going here too, making sure she's on her
25 way here.
HENRY: I'm sorry?
MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Let me see if I can't
get someone here on making sure she's on her way.

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HENRY: Okay.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Just a moment.

HENRY: Okay. Thank you, Steve.

(Gap)

(Indiscernible voices in background)

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I heard they're getting someone to get her there.

HENRY: I'm sorry?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, they're getting someone to get her there.

HENRY: Oh, okay. Everybody sleep okay?

MR. SCHNEIDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Do you want Heather to be heading out or --

(Indiscernible voices in background)

MR. SCHNEIDER: Can we give you a call right back there?

HENRY: I'm sorry?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, can we give you a call right back there?

HENRY: Sure.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Going to try to get ahold of David there and, and see if there's anything else or whatever else there --

HENRY: Okay.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. I'll give you a call right back.

HENRY: Okay, fine.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, bye.

1 HENRY: Thank you. Bye-bye.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

4 HENRY: Good morning.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, good morning.

6 HENRY: Just wanted to make sure that -- you
7 know, I wasn't sure whether I was going to call you or
8 you were going to call me.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. They're, they're in
10 the process yet I guess.

11 HENRY: Okay.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: He still wants to get a few
13 things and I think --

14 HENRY: Okay. Is --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- she wants to take some
16 things with her or something I guess.

17 HENRY: Okay. Is David okay this morning?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Yeah, he's all right.

19 HENRY: Okay.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm just kind of looking
21 down here to see if they're -- what they're all doing
22 here yet.

23 HENRY: Okay.

24 (Gap)

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

HENRY: Yes?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Let, let me get Rachel here
for a second and see just what's going on.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Just a moment.

3 (Gap)

4 (Indiscernible voices in background)

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Rachel? Do you want to
6 check (indiscernible). Pardon? I was going to check
7 to see if (indiscernible).

8 (Gap)

9 RACHEL: Hello?

10 HENRY: Good morning.

11 RACHEL: Good morning.

12 HENRY: Rachel.

13 RACHEL: Yes.

14 HENRY: How are you?

15 RACHEL: Well, I was trying to get some
16 sleep.

17 HENRY: I'm sorry, I didn't -- I, I, I
18 didn't ask him to wake you.

19 RACHEL: Well, he's trying to -- he was
20 trying to get the closest female to do something I
21 guess.

22 HENRY: I'm sorry?

23 RACHEL: He was trying to get the closest
24 female nearby to do something I guess.

25 HENRY: To do what?

26 RACHEL: You know, to check on Heather.

27 HENRY: Oh, okay.

28 RACHEL: I, I believe she's sleeping.

1 HENRY: Heather is, is sleeping?

2 RACHEL: Um-hum.

3 HENRY: Okay. What happened is, when I
4 spoke to David last night he asked me to call first
5 thing this morning so we could --

6 RACHEL: Um-hum.

7 HENRY: -- you know, so we could get her
8 out. I didn't want to interfere with your, with your
9 prayer meeting, so --

10 RACHEL: Oh, yeah, right.

11 HENRY: -- so that's why I called, you know,
12 at about this time. I didn't want to call any
13 earlier. I didn't want to call at 6 o'clock, but --

14 RACHEL: Um-hum.

15 HENRY: -- you know, at the same time I
16 didn't want to interfere with your prayer meeting.

17 RACHEL: Well, I hate to wake her up.

18 HENRY: Well, do you want, do you want me
19 to, to call you back in just a little bit?

20 RACHEL: Well, you mean in a few minutes you
21 think she's going to be awake? Is that what you're
22 saying?

23 HENRY: Well, do you think she's not going
24 to be awake?

25 RACHEL: Sorry?

HENRY: Did you not think she's going to be
awake?

RACHEL: Well, I don't know what time she

1 | went to bed. Just a minute, okay?

2 | HENRY: Okay.

3 | (Gap)

4 | (Indiscernible children's voices in
5 | background)

6 | (Gap)

7 | RACHEL: Is this Jim I'm speaking to?

8 | HENRY: This is Henry.

9 | RACHEL: Henry, sorry.

10 | HENRY: That's okay.

11 | RACHEL: Okay. David said that he wants to
12 | see some things start clearing up and --

13 | HENRY: I'm sorry?

14 | RACHEL: He wants to get some things cleared
15 | up.

16 | CHILD'S VOICE: Mama.

17 | RACHEL: And that is, first of all, he wants
18 | to see that the children will be going to their
19 | relatives.

20 | HENRY: Okay.

21 | RACHEL: And he also said we need six
22 | gallons of whole milk.

23 | HENRY: Six gallons of whole milk?

24 | RACHEL: Um-hum, for the babies that are
25 | still here. That's dirty, Bobby, don't touch that.
You want a banana?

 (Child's laughter)

 HENRY: Okay.

1 RACHEL: What?
2 (Indiscernible voices in background.)
3 RACHEL: (Indiscernible) Oh, that's real
4 nice (indiscernible) went to the bathroom before he
5 went to bed.
6 CHILD'S VOICE: Cold (Indiscernible).
7 RACHEL: Well, get back under the blanket.
8 Sit down.
9 CHILD'S VOICE: (Indiscernible)
10 RACHEL: Sit down.
11 CHILD'S VOICE: (Indiscernible)
12 RACHEL: Bobby, sit down. Sit down.
13 (Child crying in background)
14 RACHEL: What's the matter? Sit down. Sit
15 down.
16 (Child crying in background)
17 RACHEL: What's the matter (indiscernible).
18 (Children's voices in background)
19 RACHEL: (Indiscernible) Bobby? Bobby?
20 CHILD'S VOICE: Uh-uh, uh-uh.
21 (Child crying in background)
22 RACHEL: Star, don't. Star, don't make her
23 cry.
24 (Child's laughter)
25 RACHEL: She thought you wanted a bite.
CHILD'S VOICE: (Indiscernible)
RACHEL: (Indiscernible) that means the
blanket's wet now.

1 CHILD'S VOICE: No, it isn't.
2 RACHEL: Well, it's not?
3 CHILD'S VOICE: (Indiscernible)
4 RACHEL: Okay.
5 (Child's voice in background)
6 (Child's laughter)
7 RACHEL: Careful. Hey, watch out. Bobby.
8 (Child's laughter)
9 (Gap)
10 (Children's voice in background)
11 (Gap)
12 (Child crying)
13 (Gap)
14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello, Henry?
15 HENRY: Hello.
16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good morning again. Yeah, I
17 was, I was talking over here with David --
18 HENRY: Um-hum.
19 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and, and he's got
20 concerns, you know, that there's been some talk shows
21 and so forth from the radio and of course that's about
22 the only way we're getting our information other than
23 yourself. But his concern is about the children that
24 have left here already. And from the beginning when I
25 guess we were working this out and speaking with Jim
also, we were under the understanding that they would
be going to their homes or to their relatives' homes
very soon. And from some of the reports we've heard,

1 | you know, he's not been happy and that or neither are
2 | the parents that are here because they're hearing
3 | about what they're all being taken through or put
4 | through. At the same time we've heard much said about
5 | foster homes and they had a woman psychologist on
6 | where she was saying how she thought it was abnormal -
7 | -

7 | HENRY: Um-hum.

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- that the children were
9 | well-behaved. I mean, if that's the society overall,
10 | I mean and that -- we -- I know society has
11 | degenerated into that where there's no such thing as
12 | discipline anymore --

12 | HENRY: Um-hum.

13 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- where no doesn't mean no
14 | and --

15 | HENRY: Um-hum.

16 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- so if there is a child
17 | who seems to be -- well, to us there's no question, no
18 | matter where these children travel or who comes to see
19 | or visit them, they've always had the very highest
20 | compliments.

20 | HENRY: Um-hum.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: And these children they're -
22 | -as you can see and observe, they've never been beat.

23 | HENRY: Right.

24 | MR. SCHNEIDER: But, you know, these are the
25 | things we're concerned about right now.

1 HENRY: Um-hum.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: But originally when we
3 worked this out with Jim and we talked with him we
4 were under the impression that it wouldn't be long,
5 days is what it seemed, and --

6 HENRY: Yes.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- they would be to their
8 destination.

9 HENRY: Um-hum. See that -- I think that
10 that's what the impression was, that, that this was a
11 very temporary situation which was going to be such
12 that David was going to lead everybody out and they
13 would be quickly reunited with their parents.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, David said to those
15 that, you know, know and love them, he's, he's
16 speaking with me right now.

17 HENRY: Pardon me?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Wait just a minute. What?
19 Oh, with nonreligious relatives.

20 HENRY: I'm sorry?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: He, he mentioned with
22 nonreligious relatives.

23 HENRY: I'm, I'm not understanding the --
24 this last part.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, meaning the, the
relatives -- a lot of these relatives that they'd be
go to -- going to are not religious anyway.

HENRY: Um-hum.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: They're not with the
2 message, they're not with our group anyway, none of
3 them are. So for that reason we didn't -- David did
4 not see that there should be a problem there at all.

5 HENRY: Well, there isn't. I mean, I, I
6 don't think that that's a problem if -- well, I can
7 look into this thing, you know, and does, does he
anticipate that this is going to be a, a --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, Henry, just, just a
9 minute, he's, he's saying -- he's saying something
10 that -- there's nothing that would make us more mad
11 than if some kind of a psychologist got ahold of them
12 like this -- this woman that's advocating
13 homosexuality or, or saying --

14 HENRY: We are doing everything to ensure
15 that nothing -- you know, that they're not treated as
16 guinea pigs. You know, we want the best for this
children -- for these kids.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: You, you would know -- of
18 course though Henry you would know that in this world
19 there are psychologists now that are very high
ranking, in fact even with the Clinton organization.

20 HENRY: Um-hum.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Here we're talking about the
22 President of the United States --

23 HENRY: You know, one of the --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- wait now, where to them
25 homosexuality is -- that should be a freedom of choice

1 and, you know, I mean it influences on children and so
2 forth. Well, you know, that is the most -- to us it
3 is a very extreme opposite of what we're all about.

4 HENRY: Okay. Listen, I've just been handed
5 something to -- you know, with respect to the children
6 and let me tell you what, what I've just been handed.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

8 HENRY: Apparently the children are being
9 kept together for their own security and comfort,
10 okay?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's okay.

12 HENRY: Okay, until, until every -- you
13 know, until everybody walks out.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Can I -- just hold on.

15 HENRY: Okay, until everybody walks out.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: He says that the children --

17 HENRY: And the child --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Henry, just wait, wait let
19 me tell him, let me tell him.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: He says that the children
21 are being kept together right now for their own safety
22 and so forth, being they're used to one another. Are
23 you say -- that's not what the authorities are saying.

24 That's -- we're not -- you know, like for instance,
25 remember the news conference and so forth?

HENRY: Um-hum.

MR. SCHNEIDER: We're getting different

1 information than that, Henry.

2 HENRY: Okay. We have been advised that the
3 -- that it's a policy of the, of the Child Protective
4 Services to turn the children over to relatives. In
5 those cases where the --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: (Indiscernible) wait --
7 David -- do you have your Bible there? He's going to
8 show you a few scriptures really quick. We want to
9 show you what real social welfare should be. Here,
10 I'm going to -- just a moment. Are you over there,
11 David?

12 (Pause)

13 MR. KORESH: Look at the (indiscernible)
14 hello?

15 HENRY: Good morning.

16 MR. KORESH: Hello?

17 HENRY: Hello?

18 MR. KORESH: (Indiscernible), Henry. That
19 means good morning.

20 HENRY: How are you?

21 MR. KORESH: Huh?

22 HENRY: How are you?

23 MR. KORESH: We're -- we, we -- you know,
24 we're very good. We're, we're doing all right.

25 HENRY: Okay. I understand that you have a,
a, a concern and I want to advise you, number one,
that the children are being kept together for their
security --

1 MR. KORESH: Remember --

2 HENRY: -- and comfort.

3 MR. KORESH: -- we're monitoring, we're
4 monitoring every lie that we've been told beginning
5 with, you know, with Jim --

6 HENRY: If you give me -- I have -- you
7 know, I listened to you to great, you know -- I
8 listened to you when --

9 MR. KORESH: I know, but if, but if, if you
10 don't --

11 HENRY: -- okay, now I want you --

12 MR. KORESH: -- apply it then like I say --

13 HENRY: Listen to me for a second this time.

14 MR. KORESH: I will.

15 HENRY: Just give me a chance --

16 MR. KORESH: I do.

17 HENRY: -- give me a chance to tell you.

18 Okay. What the Child Protective Services have advised
19 us is that it is their policy to turn the children
20 over to relatives in those cases where the parents are
21 not available, okay?

22 MR. KORESH: The parents are all available.

23 HENRY: Give, give me an opportunity to
24 finish saying what I want to say and then I'll give
25 you a chance to say what you want to say, okay?

MR. KORESH: Okay, that'll work. Go ahead.

HENRY: Okay. Since the Child Protective
Services don't know when the parents are going to come

1 out, you know, they will hold them until everybody
2 walks out. Now, we are prepared because we, we felt
3 that you might have a concern to provide you with a
4 videotape if you'd like to see what exactly is going
5 on with the kids. How about that?

6 MR. KORESH: Well see, they -- the
7 helicopter shot up my room all to pieces and our VCR's
8 and stuff like that -- Steve, do we have a VCR
9 anywhere? Oh, we still got one that works, not shot
10 up? Okay. Okay. We do -- we, we --

11 HENRY: Okay.

12 MR. KORESH: Standard or high eight? Okay,
13 yeah, we -- okay, we, we have, we have a standard and
14 a high eight remaining.

15 HENRY: Okay. We're -- listen, I've been
16 working with you and for you with this thing all the
17 way, not just about this thing but everything, okay?
18 So I -- if you have a concern I appreciate your, your
19 telling me and give me a chance to respond to it or to
20 look into it. That's all that I ask.

21 MR. KORESH: Well, we -- that's all we've
22 been doing.

23 HENRY: Okay, and that's what I've been
24 doing for you. We will provide you with a, with a
25 tape so that you can see the children and I know that
your fears will be, you know, you know, that, that we
can clear up any misunderstanding or any misimpression
that, that's coming forth.

1 MR. KORESH: Well, we, we do understand and
2 agree that anything that states that our children are
3 abnormal and stuff because they're well behaved --
4 see, one, one thing that's, that's implied is that,
5 you know, the children have gone through a dramatic,
6 dramatic experience.

7 HENRY: Um-hum.

8 MR. KORESH: That may be true. But the
9 thing of it also is is that our children have also
10 been taught just as Joseph, Isaac, you know, just as
11 all the children of the ancient patriarchs --

12 HENRY: Sure.

13 MR. KORESH: -- the knowledge of God, the
14 knowledge of trust. I mean, what kind of, what kind
15 of story of this is that a child hears about Abraham
16 who goes off and he's told by God to sacrifice his own
17 son? Now, here is a definite biblical story of child
18 abuse. I mean, what, what, what a test to a child's
19 mind, that my son the Lord shall provide unto thee a
20 sacrifice? The father, where is the lamb? The Lord
21 shall provide. And all of a sudden, son, the Lord has
22 provided you for a sacrifice. Now, what, what a
23 dramatic experience.

24 HENRY: Um-hum.

25 MR. KORESH: You know, what a, what a, what
a shock to a child, a young man.

 HENRY: Um-hum.

 MR. KORESH: You know?

1 HENRY: Um-hum.

2 MR. KORESH: And then all of a sudden, the
3 Bible tells that Isaac complied, you know?

4 HENRY: Um-hum.

5 MR. KORESH: And Isaac, Isaac is going to
6 allow his father to, to kill him for a sacrifice and
7 about the time that the knife started coming down
8 towards his son's chest (indiscernible) the Lord, you
9 know, grabbed the arm of Abraham --

10 HENRY: Um-hum.

11 MR. KORESH: -- and said, now I knowest that
12 thou fearest me. Now, come off of it. You need to
13 rip that part of the Bible out. Now --

14 HENRY: Well --

15 MR. KORESH: -- now, now I have, I have
16 never brought any of my children to that point, never,
17 ever, never and I've never been required to. But the
18 thing of it is is that when Zachariah states, "Smite
19 the shepherd, the sheep shall be scattered, my hand
20 shall be upon the little ones," you know, somebody on
21 the, on the radio the other day had the audacity and
22 the nerve to misquote or mistranslate the passage
23 saying, you know, the Bible does say smite the
24 shepherd, sheep will be scattered and it says, you
25 know, God will sacrifice the little ones. No, that's
not what it says. Nowhere in the Hebrew manuscript or
text does it say that --

HENRY: Um-hum

1 MR. KORESH: -- at all. And yet, you know,
2 this case of biblical apparent child abuse is praised
3 by Christians as one of the most sober tests of child
4 obedience.

5 HENRY: Um-hum.

6 MR. KORESH: You know, Christ says to the,
7 to the, to the other angels before they destroyed
8 Sodom and Gomorrah, and we know what the sin of Sodom
9 and Gomorrah was, don't we? Ezekiel says, "Idleness
of time and fullness of bread," --

10 HENRY: Um-hum, um-hum.

11 MR. KORESH: -- you know, and they, and they
12 went after strange flesh.

13 HENRY: Um-hum.

14 MR. KORESH: You know, they says, you know,
15 "Bring these men that we may know them," in other
words, they wanted to -- they were homosexuals.

16 HENRY: See, one of the things that's
17 happening here is once the, once the press has nothing
to report they want to try to manufacture something.

18 MR. KORESH: No, this was an interview with
19 the actual social workers out here.

20 HENRY: Well --

21 MR. KORESH: This is the social workers
22 talking. And, and the thing of it was there was,
there was questions given to them.

23 HENRY: See, once -- I'm sure, there's no
24 question in my mind, that once you see the tape this
25

1 issue will be, you know, settled. There should be no
2 question in your mind --

3 MR. KORESH: So they're still --

4 HENRY: -- that these kids are being --

5 MR. KORESH: -- they're still all together?

6 HENRY: -- taken care of in the fashion that
7 we've said that they were going to be taken care of.
8 You know, there's no reason for anybody to --

9 MR. KORESH: Well --

10 HENRY: -- to do anything except to, you
11 know, to tell the truth and, and the video will speak,
12 will speak for itself.

13 MR. KORESH: In the manner and fashion that
14 originally we were, we were agreeing with, with Jim
15 and all that was that each one of the children were
16 given the names of closest of kin which is --

17 HENRY: Okay.

18 MR. KORESH: -- usually the grandparents.

19 HENRY: Okay.

20 MR. KORESH: And it's, it's a guarantee that
21 the majority of all the grandparents, matter of fact
22 all the grandparents which are not involved in this
23 message --

24 HENRY: Um-hum.

25 MR. KORESH: -- you know, are the ones that
are, you know, the children always allowed to, to
visit and commune with their, with their, you know,
close kin and stuff like that.

1 HENRY: Okay. See, as I was saying, you
2 know, everybody was assuming and has been assuming
3 that it's just a question of time that, you know, when
4 you would be coming out.

5 MR. KORESH: Yeah, but when we come out we
6 also know in the process that all these women and all
7 these men and stuff are going to a system and they're
8 not going to be with their children. So --

9 HENRY: Well, I -- you know, I, I don't --

10 MR. KORESH: -- we know that as a fact.

11 HENRY: -- I don't know that, that everybody
12 is going to be, you know, incarcerated. Some of the
13 men, you know, will probably be and then some of the
14 men that, that need to, to receive medical attention
15 are going exactly there. But it's going to have to be
16 sorted out. That doesn't mean that everybody is going
17 to be incarcerated. I don't think that there's going
18 to be charges against everybody.

19 MR. KORESH: Right.

20 HENRY: So, you know --

21 MR. KORESH: But we assume that there will
22 be until it's sorted out, that's just the way it is.

23 HENRY: Well, it's not going to take that
24 long to sort this thing out in terms of who's going to
25 be charged and who's not going to be charged. But in
any case, I'm willing to work with you, I have no
problem with this, you know? You've worked with us,
you know, you told me yesterday that you were going to

1 give me Heather, we're ready to, to, to come and pick
2 up Heather and if you have other requests in addition
3 to this I'll look into it. I, I'm ready to provide
4 you a video, you know, whatever is on your mind we're,
5 we're willing to work with you.

6 MR. KORESH: Well, Heather definitely wants
7 to be with her two brothers. Now --

8 HENRY: Okay.

9 MR. KORESH: -- let me, let me explain to
10 you a little case history with, with Heather.

11 HENRY: Okay.

12 MR. KORESH: Okay? Now, Heather and Kevin
13 and Mark are some of the children that -- you know,
14 they've not always been with us, although they've,
15 they've been associated to the movement for quite some
16 time not in the respect that since, since I came along
17 and instructed the, the people of the, of the so-
18 called movement.

19 HENRY: Um-hum.

20 MR. KORESH: Okay. Now, now, now, we was
21 talking about earlier there's always been men who have
22 studied the scripture and found little gems of light
23 and which they've inquired into, you know, Luther and
24 Knox and Wesley we was talking earlier about this.
25 And the -- this group of people believed that one day
there would come someone, you know, David. The, the
scripture talks about the, the House of David or David
would come again one day; the shepherd --

1 HENRY: Um-hum.

2 MR. KORESH: -- which they know to be as, as
3 Christ, right?

4 HENRY: Um-hum.

5 MR. KORESH: Okay. Well, finally naturally
6 when, when, when men in their hunger and desire to
7 know truth study scripture on their own they're not,
8 they're not themselves able to know all the details
9 but there are certain gems of light in the scripture
10 which are just obvious.

11 HENRY: Um-hum.

12 MR. KORESH: You know, such as the passage
13 in the last days it shall come to pass, blah, blah,
14 blah. Well, whatever there may be, there's an
15 obvious, and though a person may not be inspired of
16 God to know the details of the event, at least they
17 see in the shadows of it that there is a shadow and
18 the shadow points forward to a literal fulfillment of
19 whatever the scripture may imply.

20 HENRY: Uh-huh.

21 MR. KORESH: And so when I come along, you
22 know, what I do is I -- naturally I have to be sent to
23 those people who are the most promoted and the most
24 complete in the knowledge of the obvious.

25 HENRY: Right.

MR. KORESH: I mean, I'm not going, I'm not
going to be sent to the papacy --

HENRY: Um-hum.

1 MR. KORESH: -- because the papacy is not
2 going to believe anything on me --

3 HENRY: Um-hum.

4 MR. KORESH: -- because they're not going to
5 use any of the unaccepted doctrines that they do not
6 accept as evidence of my authenticity, you know?

7 HENRY: Um-hum, um-hum.

8 MR. KORESH: Okay, so, so there -- it just
9 happens that a small little remnant group on the face
10 of the earth here in Waco, Texas was the ones that God
11 chose for me to come to --

12 HENRY: Right.

13 MR. KORESH: -- because, you know, they
14 already believed in a large degree in regards to, you
15 know, someone in the latter days coming --

16 HENRY: Um-hum.

17 MR. KORESH: -- under, you know, in the, in
18 the name or under the lineage of David.

19 HENRY: Um-hum.

20 MR. KORESH: And so when, when, when, when
21 I, I come and I show them all the things that they are
22 to believe and tie it all together in the light of the
23 Revelation and, and state my purpose being the, the
24 off root and offspring of David, then all of a sudden,
25 wow, you know, they, they get the fruit of their
faith.

 HENRY: Sure.

 MR. KORESH: The, the light is made manifest

1 and they --

2 HENRY: Um-hum.

3 MR. KORESH: -- begin to realize the actual
4 nature of this fulfillment.

5 HENRY: Uh-huh.

6 MR. KORESH: Okay. So anyway, the people
7 here are concerned in regards to, you know, here they
8 have submitted and, you know, through my counsel and
9 through my promises revolving around the prophecies,
10 you know, as, as Isaiah 49, where they are guaranteed
11 by God that although, you know, they temporarily lose
12 their children to the, to the beast, to the system --

13 HENRY: Um-hum.

14 MR. KORESH: -- God promises to very, you
15 know, miraculously and, and very, you know, through
16 great means of judgment to judge the system by this
17 means and also to, to promise to reunite these
18 children with those parents who've had faith in what,
19 you know, the prophecies --

20 HENRY: Right.

21 MR. KORESH: -- and, and these things.

22 HENRY: Right, right.

23 MR. KORESH: Okay, and of course, one of the
24 great abominations and desolations in which, you know,
25 in the New Covenant in Hebrews talks about is that,
you know, the thing that brings the greatest wrath of
God is the most, you know, defacive image that man
portrays of God and one of -- one image that God is

1 totally defaced by is when mankind abuses himself with
2 strange flesh. In other words, Paul states right
3 before the flood that there were men with men working
4 that which is unseemly.

5 HENRY: Um-hum.

6 MR. KORESH: You know what I mean?

7 HENRY: Right.

8 MR. KORESH: And reaching into themselves
9 with just recompense which is meat. Of course, you
10 know, the -- the subject is they received a disease
11 which they couldn't get rid of, they deserved it.

12 HENRY: Um-hum, um-hum.

13 MR. KORESH: And it was in the days of Noah
14 it is today, the, the epidemic of AIDS --

15 HENRY: Um-hum.

16 MR. KORESH: -- you know, this virus
17 which --

18 HENRY: Exactly.

19 MR. KORESH: -- which deals with a terrible
20 breaking down of the immunity of man against disease
21 and stuff.

22 HENRY: Um-hum.

23 MR. KORESH: And women burning in their
24 hearts with women, you know, forsaking the natural use
25 and going after women. And, well, you know, this is
something that definitely people may be born with
these propensities --

HENRY: Um-hum.

1 MR. KORESH: -- but they're not to be
2 exonerated and flaunted in the sight of God because
3 it's nonproductive --

4 HENRY: Exactly.

5 MR. KORESH: -- you know, it does not work
6 that way.

7 HENRY: Um-hum.

8 MR. KORESH: It's a very (indiscernible) you
9 know, it just doesn't -- God didn't make it that way.

10 HENRY: Right.

11 MR. KORESH: You know, we can play mud pies
12 and that's just imagination, but, but we don't really
13 eat mud pies, it doesn't work.

14 HENRY: Um-hum.

15 MR. KORESH: So anyway, anyway, how are you
16 doing this morning?

17 HENRY: I'm doing okay. I want to, you
18 know, make sure that I don't interfere with, with your
19 prayer meeting. I know that that's coming up and
20 that's why, you know, I'm, I'm not trying to hurry you
21 up, but --

22 MR. KORESH: The daily --

23 HENRY: Yes.

24 MR. KORESH: -- the daily sacrifice, morning
25 and evening.

 HENRY: Okay. Well, if, if we can work on
getting Heather out, I, I will get the, the tape to
you, I will work on this. Make sure that if there is

1 some inconsistency, if there is something that's not
2 exactly the way that you feel it should be, we'll work
3 on it. You know, I --

4 MR. KORESH: Okey-doke. Well, I'm not, I'm
5 not, I'm not jumping up and down like a --

6 HENRY: Okay, okay.

7 MR. KORESH: -- madman hollering and
8 screaming, I'm just simply trying to remind you that,
9 you know, especially like with what me and Jim, you
10 know, had already stated --

11 HENRY: Sure.

12 MR. KORESH: -- that certain things were --

13 HENRY: Sure.

14 MR. KORESH: Anyway, you're probably pretty
15 tired now aren't you?

16 HENRY: I am.

17 MR. KORESH: I see, okay. Well --

18 HENRY: Is Heather coming out now?

19 MR. KORESH: Yeah, we'll go ahead and send
20 her out --

21 HENRY: Okay.

22 MR. KORESH: -- like I say, but, you know,
23 she, she (indiscernible) oh, okay. Now, like I also
24 said to Jim earlier, you know, you know, if, if you
25 all need more money, now this is something that we're,
we're --

26 HENRY: No, no, no, no, no.

27 MR. KORESH: -- at your, we're at your mercy

1 for --

2 HENRY: We're not asking for money.

3 MR. KORESH: -- for doing these things.

4 HENRY: We, we, we don't --

5 MR. KORESH: But we need some milk.

6 HENRY: Oh, okay.

7 MR. KORESH: You know, I mean, I mean this
8 is something that's just strictly on the, on the
9 merits of, of, of, you know, your own tender hearts,
10 but we need approximately six gallons of milk. We
11 have a lot of baby feeders here --

12 HENRY: Okay.

13 MR. KORESH: -- and the thing of is is that,
14 of course, you know, the, the physical aspect of the
15 women under certain kind of -- women lose the ability
16 to produce milk under these conditions.

17 HENRY: Um-hum.

18 MR. KORESH: And so --

19 HENRY: Oh, yeah, I see what you're saying.

20 MR. KORESH: -- if, if at all possible, if
21 at all possible --

22 HENRY: Okay.

23 MR. KORESH: You know, we sent the last bits
24 of milk with the children with you all --

25 HENRY: Um-hum.

MR. KORESH: -- you know? But if you all
could, if you all could just send us some, you know,
regular whole milk --

1 HENRY: Okay.

2 MR. KORESH: -- you know, six gallons of it
3 we would, we would more than be grateful to you.

4 HENRY: Okay. Okay.

5 MR. KORESH: Is that, is that asking too
6 much?

7 HENRY: No.

8 MR. KORESH: Thank you very much. He said,
9 he said he would do it, Rach.

10 HENRY: Okay. I'm going to, I'm going to
11 work on the milk. I want you to send Rachel out and
12 then I'll -- I'm sorry --

13 MR. KORESH: Not Rachel --

14 HENRY: Not Rachel.

15 MR. KORESH: -- Heather.

16 HENRY: Send them both out. No, okay, go
17 ahead and send Heather out and then I'll call you as
18 soon as she gets here, hopefully I'll, you know,
19 everything squared away by then.

20 MR. KORESH: Okay. Well, when, when the van
21 comes to pick her up, you know, can you all bring the
22 milk and that way when we send her up there then, you
23 know, we could just bring the milk back?

24 HENRY: Well, I think the, the, the van is
25 already -- I'm not -- I think that they're already in
place, but I'll -- I can either -- I can send it to
you as soon as we -- let, let's get her out and then
let me send you the milk.

1 MR. KORESH: Okay. All right. Okay. So,
2 you want us to, to take Heather up to the same water
3 tower as we did before?

4 HENRY: Yes, yes.

5 MR. KORESH: Okey-doke. Okay. I'll --

6 HENRY: Wait, wait a second. Are you
7 sending her out on foot?

8 MR. KORESH: Well, no, that's, that's,
9 that's a long ways to walk. We'll do it just like we
10 did before, the, the little car, Sita and -- huh? --
11 Sonya, just drive her up there.

12 HENRY: You're going to send Sonya like to
13 where the ambulance was, you know, that armored
14 ambulance?

15 MR. KORESH: Well, the reason why they
16 brought the armored ambulance that time was is because
17 of the puppies. They wanted to, to make sure wasn't
18 putting any bombs or something along with the --

19 HENRY: Uh-huh.

20 MR. KORESH: -- with the little child. But
21 if you'd like to do that too we can do that.

22 HENRY: Okay. Can you walk -- can Sonya
23 walk her to the, to the -- to that location?

24 MR. KORESH: Yeah, well, if you want if
25 she's going to go there she could walk herself there.

 HENRY: Okay. Yeah, that, that'll be good.

 MR. KORESH: Okay.

 HENRY: That'll be real good.

1 MR. KORESH: Well, he's saying that they,
2 they'll bring the six gallons of milk afterwards.

3 HENRY: I will.

4 MR. KORESH: (Indiscernible) that what
5 they're saying.

6 HENRY: We will.

7 MR. KORESH: Okay. Then, then you all can
8 bring the, the six gallons of milk and the armored
9 vehicle too and we'll just send one of the ladies up
there and --

10 HENRY: Okay.

11 MR. KORESH: Do you think Sonya can pick up
12 six gallons of -- yeah, she could. That'd be easy.
Okay then.

13 HENRY: Okay. She coming out now?

14 MR. KORESH: Yeah, we'll, we'll be sending
15 her out right now. Where -- just, just bring the
16 armored vehicle up and then once we see it she'll be
out there, okay?

17 HENRY: What is she wearing?

18 MR. KORESH: What's she wearing? Is her
19 coat blue or what? What will she be wearing? Go find
20 out real quick what color her coat is. Anyway, you'll
21 -- her -- she's little and her hair is real blond.

22 HENRY: Oh, okay. Okay. You can go ahead
and send her then. Go ahead.

23 MR. KORESH: All right. She'll be out in a
24 little bit.

25

1 HENRY: She's nine year, she's nine years
2 old isn't she?

3 MR. KORESH: Heather's nine, right.

4 HENRY: Okay.

5 (Gap)

6 MR. KORESH: What about the tanks? I'm
7 sorry, Sherrie, I didn't understand you. What did you
8 say?

9 (Indiscernible female voice in background.)

10 MR. KORESH: Oh, it's a red coat.

11 HENRY: It's a red coat?

12 MR. KORESH: And a red hood.

13 HENRY: And she's got real blond hair?

14 MR. KORESH: Right.

15 HENRY: Okay.

16 MR. KORESH: So, what does it say here? It
17 says need --

18 HENRY: Milk.

19 MR. KORESH: Oh yeah, we already got this.

20 HENRY: Okay.

21 MR. KORESH: This note right here? Yeah,
22 the, the girls told me last night that --

23 (Indiscernible female voice in background.)

24 MR. KORESH: Oh, okay. Yeah, we
25 (indiscernible) until he -- he said, he said he'd
work, he'd work with us on that. Oops.

 HENRY: Are you okay?

 MR. KORESH: Oh, yeah, I just -- it was --

1 are you ready? You scared? Okay. Now, now, you may
2 need to jump around and scream a bit so you'll be
3 considered normal.

4 HENRY: (Laughter) Don't tell her that.
5 You're going to confuse her.

6 MR. KORESH: You know, you know, well, no,
7 like I say, we've always taught all of children that's
8 of adult is to be respected, you know.

9 HENRY: I know.

10 MR. KORESH: You know, as a parent and --

11 HENRY: And they've, they've all been real nice,
12 they've all been real nice.

13 MR. KORESH: I know, but I tell you, when I
14 was down there with those social workers that time,
15 that time when you all should have arrested me when I,
16 when I first had those -- someone says we were abusing
17 our children?

18 HENRY: Uh-huh.

19 MR. KORESH: You know, and I went down there
20 with Rachel and, you know, Star, Cyrus and Bobby, and
21 we was, we was down there and, and, well, Mr. Koresh,
22 what age do you believe that children should be
23 disciplined -- you know? These Mrs. Koon and Ms. --
24 what was their names? These overweighted ladies that
25 eat too much and sit on their butts too much which
definitely is -- is definitely a bad way to raise
children, I mean, you know?

HENRY: Sure, sure.

1 MR. KORESH: I mean, a parent should at
2 least stay in shape and keep themselves in good health
3 so they can live a long time with their children.

4 HENRY: Really.

5 MR. KORESH: You know?

6 HENRY: Um-hum.

7 MR. KORESH: And these big old fat ladies
8 are in there, you know -- now, don't get me wrong. I,
9 I liked them, I -- you know, but they got this Bible
10 in there and everything. And I says, I says, I says,
11 well, I believe in disciplining children upon
12 conception -- I'm sorry, pardon me? What do you mean,
13 Mr. Koresh?

14 HENRY: (Laughter)

15 MR. KORESH: Sort of like, you know -- and I
16 told them, I said, listen, I says, you know, God gave
17 to Israel the law, something to put in their heart, in
18 their mind --

19 (Tape ends abruptly)
