9 DAVE: Okay.

14 couple of issues that he has obviously has some
15 concerns about that we're trying to work with him on.

16 DAVE: Yes, sir.

17 DICK: All right.

18 DAVE: Okay.

19 DICK: Okay. I'm going to put Heather on
20 with you, okay?

21 DAVE: Thank you.

22 DICK: Hold on.

23 HEATHER: Hi, Daddy.

24 DAVE: Hi, Heather, what ya doing?

25 HEATHER: Just sitting in a chair.

1 DAVE: You're just sitting in a chair?
2 HEATHER: Yeah.
3 DAVE: How'd you like your little ride?
4 HEATHER: It was fun.
5 DAVE: It was fun?
6 HEATHER: It was bumpy.
7 DAVE: Yeah. Well, you be a good girl and,
8 and ask for all the good things. Don't forget what
9 you know. Okay?
10 HEATHER: Okay.
11 DAVE: Okay.
12 UNIDENTIFIED VOICE IN BACKGROUND TO HEATHER:
13 Did you tell him about your ride in the bumpy truck.
14 HEATHER: I had a big, big bumpy ride.
15 DAVE: Uhm, yeah.
16 HEATHER: In that truck.
17 DAVE: Yeah. Well, I saw you walk up to the
18 gate. You had a heavy bag of clothes, didn't you?
19 HEATHER: Yeah.
20 DAVE: It took you forever.
21 HEATHER: I know.
22 DAVE: Was you warm enough in your coat?
23 HEATHER: Yeah.
24 DAVE: Yeah.
25 HEATHER: My ankle was starting to hurt.

1 DAVE: Yeah. Do you see Mark or Kevin?
2 HEATHER: Huh?
3 DAVE: Do you see Mark or Kevin?
4 HEATHER: No.
5 DAVE: No.
6 HEATHER: I will, though.
7 DAVE: Oh.
8 HEATHER: I haven't yet, though.
9 DAVE: Yeah. God promises to wipe away
10 tears from all eyes but in the meantime, it's, it's,
11 it's kind of tough, though, but God has many promises,
12 Heather. And always, always remember that.
13 HEATHER: I went in that, that big truck and
14 then I went in a car.
15 DAVE: Yeah.
16 HEATHER: And I got an apple.
17 DAVE: That's good. That's, that's good for
18 you. You be a good girl. I'll see you, okay?
19 HEATHER: Daddy?
20 DAVE: Yes.
21 HEATHER: He wants to talk to you.
22 DAVE: Okay.
23 HEATHER: Bye-bye.
24 DAVE: Bye. I love you.
25 DICK: David?

1 DAVE: Yes, sir.

2 DICK: This is Dick once again.

3 DAVE: Yes.

4 DICK: We're going to put Heather together
5 with her two brothers. I just want to assure you that
6 --

7 DAVE: Are you really?

8 DICK: Oh, certainly.

9 DAVE: Really?

10 DICK: Oh, yeah.

11 DAVE: All right.

12 DICK: We're going to put the two kids
13 together. In fact, I tried to talk her out of trading
14 me her potato chips for an apple but she ended up
15 taking them both.

16 DAVE: (Laughs)

17 DICK: She didn't want to get rid of those
18 potato chips and she especially did not want to get
19 rid of the M & Ms that she had. So -- but I know that
20 you're concerned about your children's welfare. And I
21 cannot, I cannot emphasize enough, the rest of us are
22 also concerned about the kids' welfare. I'm a father
23 myself --

24 DAVE: Yeah.

25 DICK: -- and we all love these kids.

1 DAVE: Yeah.

2 DICK: Absolutely. The most, the most
3 precious thing in the world are children.

4 DAVE: Yeah.

5 DICK: You know, we treat them like our own.
6 I, I don't care where I've ever been, all of us,
7 without exception, I don't care if they're law
8 enforcement, if they're, if they're plumbers, if
9 they're street sweepers, if they're -- all of us --
10 all of us love children. And I know there's some
11 concern out there from you, as a father, and the rest
12 of the parents, too, that, that the kids are to be
13 cared for properly. And I'll assure you, I will give
14 you my 100% guarantee that these kids will be cared
15 for properly. And they'll all await your return. The
16 kids obviously are going to miss you and their
17 friends. And the sooner we can get you all together,
18 the better off you all be. In the meantime, the kids
19 will be well treated. You, you have any questions for
20 me concerning --

21 DAVE: I, I know, you know, the system will
22 take good care of --

23 DICK: Well, I, I don't even like to talk
24 about the system. The system is -- it's not what
25 we're talking about here. We're talking about the

1 personal interest of the people that are dealing with
2 these issues in this matter. It's not the system.

3 DAVE: Yeah.

4 DICK: I'm not putting my kids in a system
5 and I will not allow them to put your kids in the
6 system.

6 DAVE: Yeah.

7 DICK: I mean that's not what this is about.
8 We're not anxious to take your kids out and put them
9 in the system.

10 DAVE: Yeah.

11 DICK: It's just not what we're about.

12 DAVE: I've been around a long time and, you
13 know, --

14 DICK: Is, is that the kind of contact
15 you've had with folks that seem to be unconcerned
16 about, about children?

16 DAVE: Oh, oh, yeah.

17 DICK: Well, --

18 DAVE: Not here but people that have many
19 varying degrees of belief in God, whether or not they
20 believe in God, the people do what they gotta do.
21 They, you know, they twist things. They turn things
22 and --

22 DICK: Well, they can. They certainly can.

1 And I'm not going to suggest to you there aren't some
2 people that do that.

3 DAVE: No.

4 DICK: However, you're not dealing with
5 those kind of people here. We have concern for these
6 kids -- DAVE: Yeah.

7 DICK: -- as though they're our own kids.
8 No one will mistreat your children. We will not allow
9 it. It will not happen. Again, you have my assurance
10 of that. It will not happen. David has suggested to,
11 to us and to you, apparently, that people are free to
12 come and go and --

13 DAVE: Yeah.

14 DICK: -- if they're -- if it becomes an
15 issue in your own mind that, you know, you --
16 certainly we'll be glad to pick you up out there and
17 you can deal with the children yourself. But in the
18 meantime, you're going to have to trust me that I will
19 insure that these kids are cared for properly.

20 DAVE: I've, I've seen, you know, how things
21 happen in '87, you know, when I was here and what was
22 --

23 DICK: Well, I can't, I can't address that
24 issue because I was not here in '87.

25 DAVE: Yeah.

1 DICK: But I will tell you that that will
2 not happen --

3 DAVE: And I was here looking and watching
4 what happened and, you know, and I know what I saw and
5 --

6 DICK: Okay, but let me, let me -- on the
7 other hand, I have seen in my many years people do all
8 sorts of things that, that I'm in opposition to, too,
9 but that doesn't mean I paint everybody with that same
brush.

10 DAVE: Yeah.

11 DICK: And in 1987, were -- was there not an
12 acquittal in connection with the, the event you're
talking about?

13 DAVE: Yes, there was but it cost me a lot
14 of money, you know, and it cost me the trust of a lot
15 of people around me, you know, that still look down
16 upon me and talk, you know.

17 DICK: Well, you know what, it's been my
18 experience that no matter what you and I do, there's
19 always going to be someone that looks down on us for
20 some reason. But you know what we have to do? We
21 just go beyond those kinds of people and we select our
22 group with a little more scrutiny. We look at them
and say, listen, these kind of people are not sincere.

1 You deal with, you know, with sincere people. I try
2 to deal with sincere people.

3 DAVE: Uh-huh.

4 DICK: And that's what, that's what we have
5 to do as long as we're parents for these children and
6 as long as we're true to ourselves, that, that's
7 exactly what we have to do.

8 DAVE: Yeah.

9 DICK: Listen, is David there?

10 DAVE: Well, Steve is.

11 DICK: Well, I'll talk to Steve.

12 DAVE: Yes, sir.

13 DICK: Okie doke -- hey, Dave?

14 DAVE: Yeah.

15 DICK: Listen. Please, I'll be hopefully
16 talking to the folks on and off today. You have some
17 concerns you want to bring to my attention concerning
18 your girls or your children, please get back on that
19 phone and I'll try to take care of them in the best
20 fashion I can.

21 DAVE: Okay.

22 DICK: Jim is one of those folks that we've
23 -- in the last day or so that your folks have been
24 talking to and he's as concerned as I am about, about
25 these issues.

1 DAVE: What's your name?

2 DICK: My name is Dick.

3 DAVE: Dick.

4 DICK: Yeah. So, we'll take care of those
5 little kids. I'll guarantee you we'll take care of
6 those kids. My kids are grown a little bit but I'd
7 love to have a child at home again about that same
8 age. They're a lot of fun, aren't they?

8 DAVE: Yes, sir. Jim's not there today,
9 huh?

10 DICK: No, Jim, Jim -- I'll tell you, Jim
11 put in a lot of efforts for you folks --

12 DAVE: Yeah.

13 DICK: -- and, frankly, it, it impacted on
14 him a little bit. You know, we're not hard, hearted
15 people out here.

16 DAVE: Yeah.

17 DICK: We share the same concerns that you
18 folks do. And Jim put a lot of effort into it. And
19 he was terribly disappointed that, that all of you
20 didn't come out as David suggested you would do on
21 that first day. And that takes a toll on, on us, too.
22 We're not uncaring, unfeeling people. We want to
23 deal with you in, in, in a fair and honest way. And
24 that's the way we will.

25

1 DAVE: I, you know, I'm always, always been
2 for the side of law and order. I always have been
3 and, and --

4 DICK: Well, I'm glad, I'm glad you support
5 law and order because we have to in this day and age
6 and especially when we talk about caring for our kids.
7 It's --

8 DAVE: But I've also been on the other side
9 of the fence and --

10 DICK: Sure.

11 DAVE: -- and I've seen several times now
12 what happens when people that twist and turn things
13 and lie about things to say different departments and
14 establishment and --

15 DICK: Well, --

16 DAVE: -- then the establishment without
17 talking about it to the individual, they go ahead and
18 like, you know, gang up on him and it hurts people.
19 And I've been on, you know, that side twice now, when
20 I have never ever wanted to hurt anyone and if I knew
21 anyone else that wanted to hurt anyone, I guarantee
22 you, I would be talking to you and telling you because
23 I'm a rural carrier. I work for the Post Office, you
24 know.

25 DICK: Uh-huh.

1 DAVE: In my job, I refer to law enforcement
2 all the time. They call me. The IRS calls me.
3 Sheriffs, constables, different --

4 DICK: Well, you know, --

5 DAVE: -- investigators and I let them know
6 what's going on. When things are wrong, I let them
7 know.

8 DICK: David, I'll tell you, this is an
9 imperfect world and I will guarantee you that that is
10 not going to be the case in this instance.

11 DAVE: Well, --

12 DICK: I can't speak to those issues you've,
13 you know, that you discussed at -- that have happened
14 in your past life, but I can tell you, here, today,
15 that is not going to be a problem. And it's just not
16 going to be a problem. So, listen, you call -- you
17 talk to me during the day. You come back to me if you
18 have some questions regarding your children, and I'll
19 be happy to answer them as best I can. And that's all
20 I'll guarantee you. I can't -- I don't have all the
21 answers but I'll guarantee you one thing, I'll give
22 you --

23 DAVE: I just want to say one more thing,
24 Dick. Is what we learn out of the Book just like
25 anybody else is so plain and so simple that you cannot

1 miss it, you know. There's only one person that book
2 says that can open the Book, you know.

3 DICK: I understand.

4 DAVE: And when that happens is so plain and
5 simple that it divides people, see.

6 DICK: Okay.

7 DAVE: It's not that the truth is going to
8 hurt you now. Nothing is going to happen now. It's
9 when, you know, say, it's when those things happen,
10 that's, you know, when Christ comes, that's when it
11 happens. And people, they don't see it that way.
12 They want to fight against it. Me, I say, God's true.

13 DICK: Hey, --

14 DAVE: There's no one telling me, hey, we're
15 --

16 DICK: -- David?

17 DAVE: -- going to do this, we're going to
18 do that, we're going to do the other, you know.

19 DICK: David, listen.

20 DAVE: It's very plain. I just wanted to --
21 wanted --

22 DICK: I understand that.

23 DAVE: -- you to understand that.

24 DICK: I do understand that. And we, we've
25 been educated, several of us, the last few days. And

1 we're going to -- we're going to -- we're going to
2 work together. Listen, put David on for me, will you,
3 please.

4 DAVE: Well, Steve's here. I don't, I don't
5 know about Dave, you know.

6 DICK: All right. Put Steve on here --

7 DAVE: Okay.

8 DICK: -- momentarily. And then why don't
9 you go look for Dave -- David and tell him that, that
10 Dick would like to talk to him and that we're going to
11 discuss a couple of issues that he brought up earlier
12 that he's concerned about.

13 DAVE: Okay.

14 DICK: And we're working on those things,
15 and I wanted to let him know about that.

16 DAVE: Okay.

17 DICK: All right.

18 DAVE: All right.

19 DICK: All right. You get ahold of me later
20 if you got some questions for me. Thank you.

21 DAVE: Okay, no problem. Thanks for your
22 time, sir.

23 DICK: You bet.

24 DAVE: Oh, here's Sherry. Maybe she'll give
25 it to Steve.

1 SHERRY: When will you be sending the milk?

2 DICK: Sherry, we're, we're dealing with
3 those issues. Let me --

4 SHERRY: Oh, okay.

5 DICK: -- let me tell you -- let me tell you
6 something that I'm, I'm sure you're probably aware of
7 by now. You know, if it was just me, I'd have that
8 milk. I'd be driving down the driveway right now
9 with, with the milk on a bicycle --

9 SHERRY: Right.

10 DICK: -- but, but we've got to, you know,
11 we've got to run those things passed others and
12 nothing is, is simple as, hey, go get me the milk.

12 SHERRY: Right.

13 DICK: You know what I mean?

14 SHERRY: Yeah.

15 DICK: It's like going to the store, you've
16 got to get in the car, you gotta go down there, you
17 gotta do it when you're looking for milk yourself.
18 And then under these conditions, we're working on it.

18 SHERRY: Right. Well, we appreciate it.

19 DICK: Okay. All right. How you doing?

20 SHERRY: Just fine.

21 DICK: Good. How's your health?

22 SHERRY: Oh, cold.

1 DICK: It's cold out there.

2 SHERRY: Yes.

3 DICK: Really.

4 SHERRY: It's freezing.

5 DICK: You, you're -- are you the mother of
6 some of these children, Sherry?

7 SHERRY: Yeah.

8 DICK: Which kids are yours?

9 SHERRY: Well, they're not there.

10 DICK: Oh, they're not there, huh.

11 SHERRY: Listen it's really cold. I've got
12 to get back under the blanket. Here's Steve. Just a
13 minute.

14 DICK: All right. Thanks, Sherry.

15 STEVE: Hello.

16 DICK: Steve?

17 STEVE: Yes.

18 DICK: Dick. How are you?

19 STEVE: Hello, Dick, how are you?

20 DICK: I've not spoken with you before.

21 STEVE: No.

22 DICK: Jim, unfortunately, was not able to
23 make it out here today. He's not, he's not feeling
24 well. In fact, late yesterday afternoon, he kind of
25 looked like he might not be able to make it back. So,

1 he asked me to talk with you today and --

2 STEVE: Right.

3 DICK: -- he and I share the same concerns
4 about your safety, the safety of the kids and we'll
5 both working, along with others, to insure that we get
6 this thing worked out to our --

6 STEVE: Okay.

7 DICK: And I know there's some issues out
8 there that, that concern you and we've been working on
9 those things. Jim, you know, I, I'm not sure that you
10 can appreciate the kind of efforts Jim's gone through,
11 you know, the things he's done for you in the past
12 couple of days. I just want to assure you that I've
13 got the same feelings that he does and we'll continue
14 to work with it and we'll hope that he does better.

14 He also had a birthday yesterday. I hope
15 that didn't have any impact on him not feeling well
16 today, but you never know.

17 STEVE: You mean with Jim, he had a birthday
18 yesterday?

18 DICK: Yeah, Jim had a birthday yesterday.

19 STEVE: Well, tell him, happy birthday.

20 DICK: Well, I will. The next time I get an
21 opportunity to talk with him, I'll -- I took him out
22 to dinner last night.

1 STEVE: Well, that's good.

2 DICK: And you think I bought him a nice
3 steak or something, wouldn't you?

4 STEVE: What did you get him, a hamburger?

5 DICK: No, I got him a pizza.

6 STEVE: Well, that's good.

7 DICK: I got him a pizza. But we took care
8 of him, although he wasn't feeling well. He just
9 wasn't able to answer the bell today.

9 STEVE: Which agency are you with, Dick?

10 DICK: Does it matter?

11 STEVE: Well, I, I'm just curious.

12 DICK: Okay. You take a guess. What's it
13 sound -- which agency do you think I'm with?

13 STEVE: I don't know, probably F.B.I.

14 DICK: That's right.

15 STEVE: Okay.

16 DICK: Yeah, I'm with the F.B.I.

17 STEVE: Because the -- oh, it seems like the
18 only ones that we've been really dealing with are from
19 your agency other than Jim from, you know, originally
20 when this took place Sunday.

20 DICK: Right.

21 STEVE: I mean not that it matters to me. I
22 just wondered. It seemed like --

1 DICK: No, I'll tell you, it really
2 shouldn't matter because both of us have the same
3 wishes, that is, to, to --

4 STEVE: Oh, yeah.

5 DICK: -- to get this thing resolved.

6 STEVE: I believe that within all human
7 beings, you know. Everybody wants goodness,
8 happiness, peace, of course.

9 DICK: But we have to work together here to
10 insure that that happens immediately. We share your
11 concerns for the safety of the children. I was just
12 talking to Heather's father. And I hope that he knows
13 that we do share those concerns about those kids. And
14 as a father, I can assure you that, that that is the
15 case.

16 STEVE: Uh-huh.

17 DICK: Now, listen, there were some things
18 that I know you're concerned about and David,
19 specifically, mentioned to us --

20 STEVE: All right.

21 DICK: -- that's he concerned about. And if
22 he's there, I'd love to be able to talk with him and
23 explain a couple of these things to him. Can you get
24 him for me, please?

25 STEVE: Just one moment.

STEVE: I'll talk -- talk to me for awhile because right now he's got some physical problems that --

DICK: Got some physical problems, huh?

STEVE: Yeah, that he's working out right now.

DICK: Yeah. I've got some physical problems myself. What, what's, what's wrong with him this morning?

STEVE: Well, you know, I mean, of course, after being like on his back for some time --

DICK: Okay.

STEVE: -- and after that trauma of being shot --

DICK: I thought those, those conditions had pretty much corrected themselves?

1 abdomen and --

3 STEVE: -- also to the hand --

4 DICK: Well, I understand --

5 STEVE: -- in the wrist area.

6 DICK: Well, I understand that he spoke with
7 Henry about getting some surgical equipment out there
8 and --

9 STEVE: He did? Well, I wasn't aware.

10 DICK: Okay. Well, that was my
11 understanding, that, that he was concerned about the
12 ability to sew up some wounds or something of that
13 nature. And we're, we got that request and we're
14 absolutely going to work on that for you.

15 What other, what other concerns does he have
16 about his immediate medical problems?

17 STEVE: Right now, I'm not too certain. It
18 seems like he is recovering. I mean I --

19 DICK: Okay.

20 STEVE: The truth of the matter is the kind
21 of wounds that he has -- I've never been familiar with
22 gunshot wounds or anything like it --

23 DICK: Well, nor am I, nor am I.

24 STEVE: But he -- I mean the recovery is,
25 I've never heard anything like it.

1 DICK: Yeah. Well, you know --

2 STEVE: He's doing extremely well.

3 DICK: Well, you know, sometimes you're
4 surprised at what the human body can do. There's no
5 question about that.

6 STEVE: Right.

7 DICK: And recuperative powers are really
8 good. But if, you know, if he has these problems, --
9 well, what does he -- the obvious answer to that is to
10 get him to a doctor but -- and we're, you know, we're
11 in a position to do that but explain to me what these
12 additional problems he -- is he developing additional
13 problems or is this --

14 STEVE: No. I think --

15 DICK: -- again related to --

16 STEVE: -- it's probably from, you know,
17 being bed ridden or basically --

18 DICK: Yeah.

19 STEVE: -- on his back for so long.

20 DICK: Well, you've got to get him up and
21 around a little bit, you know.

22 STEVE: He's a little weak and sore, you
23 know, the bones and everything, the muscles get sore -

24 - DICK: Sure.

25 STEVE: -- from laying and --

1 DICK: Yeah. Well, that's, that's exactly
2 right. You've got to get around and get a little
3 mobility.

4 STEVE: Right. It would appear like he's
5 lost about three pints of blood, I would imagine.

6 DICK: Really?

7 STEVE: Possibly more even.

8 DICK: But he's not weakened or feverish or
9 anything of that --

10 STEVE: No, no.

11 DICK: Okay.

12 STEVE: Not at this time, no.

13 DICK: Okay.

14 STEVE: No, he seems to be, if anything,
15 improving.

16 DICK: How are you doing?

17 STEVE: I'm doing fairly well, I guess.

18 DICK: Yeah.

19 STEVE: The weather could be better.

20 DICK: Weather could be better but I'll tell
21 you what --

22 STEVE: Can you do anything about that?

23 DICK: Well, let me tell you something, it
24 depends on where you're from. It depends on where
25 you're from.

1 STEVE: Well, I'm from Hawaii.

2 DICK: Well, I can see this might be a step
3 down but I'm from the mid-west where there's about a
4 foot of snow and this is like a --

5 STEVE: Where in the mid-west?

6 DICK: -- breath of spring for me.
7 Cleveland.

8 STEVE: Oh, really?

9 DICK: Yeah. And a lot of snow. I spoke to
10 my wife last night and was anxious to find out what
11 the newspapers are printing out, out that way
12 concerning everything that's going on.

13 STEVE: Right.

14 DICK: And she tells me that my young son is
15 out there with a snow blower, cussing his dad because
16 he's not there to do the work and he's going to have
17 to get up and do it himself.

18 STEVE: So, they, they flew you down here,
19 then, huh?

20 DICK: Yeah, I came on down. You know,
21 there are a number of us that share -- when these
22 kinds of things happen --

23 STEVE: Uh-huh.

24 DICK: -- there are a lot of us that think
25 that, you know, that we have something to offer in

1 terms of being able to deal with people. We're not
2 concerned about tactical things, those kinds of
3 things. We all share one common concern. That is the
4 safety and compassion for people that unfortunately
5 get involved in these kinds of things.

6 STEVE: I believe that.

7 DICK: Well, that's --

8 STEVE: That's all your job then in the
9 department is one where you normally are an a
10 negotiator or you --

11 DICK: No, no, no, no, no, un-ah, no. I
12 just, you know, I'm a street agent and --

13 STEVE: Oh, okay.

14 DICK: -- I, I do those kinds of things that
15 we traditionally do but, but --

16 STEVE: Right.

17 DICK: -- I'm here now to try to deal with
18 these kinds of problems and try to help you out and
19 get you out and get you back on to your life, go on
20 about your life.

21 STEVE: Right.

22 DICK: And frankly, when, when that's done,
23 we'll all go about our lives. But --

24 STEVE: Right.

25 DICK: -- in the meantime, we can work

1 together, I think, to resolve this. Do you know what
2 I'd like to see? I'd like to see the rest of the
3 kids, you know, come on out and join the rest of the
4 kids here. You know, one of the issues that came up
5 here that I wanted to discuss directly with David but
6 maybe just -- I just hit it with you a bit --

6 STEVE: Okay.

7 DICK: -- is that the concern about the
8 kids' welfare out here.

9 STEVE: Right.

10 DICK: Please, there is not that concern.
11 We are handling this. The kids are happy. They would
12 be much happier if they're with their parents but
13 short of that, they're being well cared for.

13 STEVE: Okay.

14 DICK: Well cared for. And they're
15 together.

16 STEVE: Okay. That's good.

17 DICK: They're together.

18 STEVE: That's good to know.

19 DICK: Well, are you a father?

20 STEVE: Yes, I am.

21 DICK: Are your children in there or are
22 they elsewhere?

23 STEVE: There's one here and that's --

24

25

1 DICK: One of your children is there?

2 STEVE: Uh-huh.

3 DICK: Who's, who's that?

4 STEVE: Well, I think the whole list was
5 given to you.

6 DICK: Right.

7 STEVE: Right.

8 DICK: Well, a number of the kids, I think
9 David --

10 STEVE: Right.

11 DICK: -- gave us eight kids yesterday. One
12 of those children are your's?

13 STEVE: Just a moment. He's asking me a
14 question. Just a minute.

15 STEVE: Okay.

16 (Pause)

17 STEVE: I guess he was saying, now, we --
18 yeah, we gave a list of names but he hasn't given all
19 the names, apparently.

20 DICK: Okay. Would you like to give us the
21 rest of the kids' names?

22 STEVE: I don't know.

23 DICK: Okay. Well, I thought that was -- I
24 thought that's what the list --

25 STEVE: Well, I just don't know. That's --

1 just a minute. When I said I don't know, just a
2 moment.

3 DICK: Okay.

4 (Pause)

5 STEVE: So, Dick, then how long have you
6 been down for?

7 DICK: Down here?

8 STEVE: Yeah.

9 DICK: Oh, I've been here a few days. I've
10 been trying to assist Jim here in --

11 STEVE: I see.

12 DICK: -- trying to do those things. You
13 know, it's difficult for one person to try to get all
14 these things done and --

15 STEVE: Oh, yeah.

16 DICK: -- I keep trying to assist him in
17 getting some of these things handled and insuring that
18 we can deal with you folks as best we can within, you
19 know -- let's face it, we're all, we're all restricted
20 in some degree with what we're able to do. You are, I
21 am, we all are.

22 STEVE: Uhm.

23 DICK: The very nature -- we are what we
24 are. That's the case. And we're trying to deal with
25 these issues as they came -- and as they come up as

1 you put them to us and then it takes more than one
2 person to do that.

3 STEVE: Yeah.

4 DICK: And, you know, the kind of people
5 that we're trying to let you talk with are those
6 people that share those concerns. Kids -- I was
7 telling David this morning -- kids, there's just
8 nothing more precious in this world than kids.

8 STEVE: Uh-huh.

9 DICK: To you, to me --

10 STEVE: I'd have to agree with you.

11 DICK: There just is no -- we certainly can
12 agree on that, can we not?

12 STEVE: Oh, positively.

13 DICK: Yeah. So, I welcome the opportunity
14 to be able to talk with you folks and, and try to
15 assist in getting this resolved to all our mutual
16 satisfactions. We're not here to, to run over you,
17 okay?

17 STEVE: Okay.

18 DICK: Absolutely, that's not what --

19 STEVE: Wait just a minute. Let me see --
20 let me see what he's doing. Now, just a minute.

21 DICK: Put him on. I want, I want to talk
22 to him.

23

24

25

1 STEVE: Okay. Let me try.

2 (Pause)

3 STEVE: He made some major moves here. They
4 tried to, you know, move him around and change him and
5 turn him over. He says he needs just a little bit of
6 rest and then --

6 DICK: Okay.

7 STEVE: It's like being beat up again and
8 then it's like you gotta relax and just --

9 DICK: Well, tell him that's the way I feel
10 everyday.

11 STEVE: I mean physically. I mean it's -- I
12 mean, you know, I've been observing, you know, since
13 this -- since this incident happened, what -- you
14 know, his recovery program.

14 DICK: Yeah.

15 STEVE: Every time he makes a major move or
16 he -- anything like that, of course, it takes the wind
17 out of him and his strength -- hello?

18 DICK: I'm still here.

19 STEVE: Oh, yeah. Once in awhile this phone
20 --

21 DICK: I know. You know -- let's face it,
22 the phone is not the best instrument in this world, do
23 you know what I mean? You know, it's like I, I tried
24

25

1 to draw an analogy. My wife wakes me up an hour
2 earlier now than she used to a year or two ago because
3 --

4 STEVE: Oh, boy.

5 DICK: -- it takes me longer to get going in
6 the morning.

7 STEVE: No, kidding.

8 DICK: Yeah, yeah. Well, we all have, you
9 know, as we grow a little older, we grow a little
10 wiser, perhaps, but, certainly, a lot slower.

11 STEVE: This is true.

12 DICK: Are you guys using the phone that we
13 sent in to you? That shouldn't, that shouldn't be a
14 big problem.

15 STEVE: No. We actually have gone and I
16 guess apparently they've used the line and everything
17 else and for that reason, there hasn't been that
18 problem.

19 DICK: Yeah. It seems like we got a better
20 connection than we did before.

21 STEVE: Yeah.

22 DICK: It's just -- are you on the phone now
23 that we sent in to you?

24 STEVE: No. In fact, we're using the other
25 phone. It seems to work a little better. We tried

1 the, the -- the lines seem to be the main thing.

2 DICK: Okay.

3 STEVE: And we have the phone, too, we tried
4 it. And then we went back to this one. This one
5 seems to be a little better to speak into.

6 DICK: Okay.

7 STEVE: Yeah.

8 DICK: Well, let me tell you something, now.
9 We spent a lot of money on that phone. So, don't
10 throw it away. Just put it to use, put it to good use
11 out there.

12 STEVE: Oh, no, we wouldn't do that. You
13 spent a lot of money on that phone?

14 DICK: (Laughs) We know how the government
15 is. They've got to keep track of every dollar they
16 spend.

17 STEVE: Yeah, I know. Right. Right.

18 DICK: They've got to keep track of every
19 dollar. So, how's David doing? Is he, is he ambling,
20 rolling over your way or what?

21 STEVE: No. Right now he's stationary in
22 one place because of a lot of movement, trying to move
23 around to find a better place that wasn't so sore
24 after laying for so long.

25 DICK: Well, don't disappoint me, now. I

1 want to talk -- I want to talk to David.

2 STEVE: Oh, I know that. I know that.

3 DICK: Do you know what I mean?

4 STEVE: Oh, yeah, you will (Indiscernible) -

5 - DICK: I've been, I've been looking forward
6 to talking to you two guys.

7 STEVE: You will definitely be talking to
8 him.

9 DICK: Good.

10 STEVE: It's just that right now it's -- it
11 took a little energy out of him to do all the moving
12 and --

13 DICK: Well, you've got to give him --
14 you've got to give him a vitamin or two. You got any
15 little Carters little liver pills or something you can
16 give him?

17 STEVE: Oh, we've got a lot of vitamins and
18 natural remedies like herbs and so forth.

19 DICK: Yeah.

20 STEVE: And --

21 DICK: Well, maybe instead of us sending
22 stuff in, you could send me some of those herbs out
23 here.

24 STEVE: Well, it's possible.

25 DICK: We didn't talk about that. Maybe we

1 | could -- maybe we could reverse this thing a little
2 | bit. I, I could use a little shot of that.

3 | STEVE: Yeah, this is one group that has
4 | always wanted to have a wholesome, a total outlook
5 | about life. I mean when it comes to health, the
6 | mental, the spiritual --

6 | DICK: Sure.

7 | STEVE: -- all of it together.

8 | DICK: You know, that's, that's just been
9 | something over the last years that a lot of us have
10 | become aware of that, you know, the health foods and
11 | that kind of thing --

11 | STEVE: Right.

12 | DICK: -- improves both your body and your
13 | mind. Now, some people tell me I haven't got much of
14 | a mind to improve but we've got to work with what
15 | we've have, don't we?

16 | STEVE: Well, see, Dick, in honesty, you
17 | know, I am concerned about the direction of this
18 | country. I mean just because --

18 | DICK: Sure.

19 | STEVE: -- I have an opportunity to talk
20 | with, you know, but I heard it wasn't too long ago
21 | where the drug -- I don't know if it was the Drug
22 | Enforcement -- no, I think it was the FDA -- I don't

23 |

24 |

1 know if it was -- it's been in the past year where I
2 guess they did a raid on a number of health food
3 stores and I guess they're target was gathering up --
4 I don't know whether it was Vitamin C or different
5 vitamins but it's like they want to put a close to any
6 alternative type medicines or healing programs other
7 than the AMA.

7 DICK: Really?

8 STEVE: Yeah.

9 DICK: I thought, I thought it was just the
10 opposite. In fact, I know in the area of the country
11 where I live, there were a lot of markets that deal
12 with nothing but natural products.

13 STEVE: Well, this is true, you know.
14 You've got -- there's health food stores all over
15 America. Like where I'm from, Hawaii, is especially
16 loaded. I mean it's a place where people like to jog
17 and stay fit and so forth.

17 DICK: Yeah.

18 STEVE: There has -- there is definitely a
19 strength, a power behind this FDA --

19 DICK: Yeah.

20 STEVE: -- to close down any other
21 alternative styles of healing other than -- I mean AMA
22 have been trying to monopolize since the day they were
23
24
25

1 instituted and brought about with their drug programs
2 which --

3 DICK: Yeah.

4 STEVE: -- does not cure problems but just
5 hides, hides the problems for a --

6 DICK: Sure.

7 STEVE: -- later time to be taken care of
8 but --

9 DICK: Well, let's hope that they're not
10 successful if that's exactly --

11 STEVE: Well, yeah, but you see this in a
12 lot of the different agencies, you know. There's good
13 men in every agency. There's, you know, honest,
14 sincere people trying to do --

15 DICK: Sure.

16 STEVE: -- the best they can for society and
17 their own well-being and, of course, there's always
18 other elements, mostly --

19 DICK: Sure.

20 STEVE: -- like parasites to live off the
21 rest.

22 DICK: Yeah.

23 STEVE: But --

24 DICK: Well, how's, how's your, how's your
25 child doing out there, well?

1 STEVE: Very well. Oh, yes.

2 DICK: Good. Good.

3 STEVE: There's no problem here, yeah.

4 DICK: Taking good care of him or her?

5 STEVE: Yes, very well.

6 DICK: What do you have, a boy or a girl?

7 STEVE: A girl.

8 DICK: Girl. Yeah, I've got one -- I've got
9 one of each. I've got one of each. What, what's your
10 daughter's name?

11 STEVE: Well, you'll -- we'll tell that a
12 little later.

13 DICK: Okay. Okay. I'm just --

14 STEVE: Yeah, I know. I understand.

15 DICK: You know, I'm sure -- as a father,
16 you're caring for her as best you can under these
17 conditions.

18 STEVE: Right. Right.

19 DICK: And Steve, I'll tell you, you know,
20 you don't know me, okay.

21 STEVE: Yeah.

22 DICK: And you just don't know me but I'm
23 going to guarantee you, I share that same concern for
24 those kids that you do.

25 STEVE: I believe that.

1 correct but let me pose a question to you.

2 STEVE: All right.

3 DICK: Okay. You and I probably have some -
4 - would, would -- if we were to get out here and sit
5 down at a table and talk to one another, we would
6 agree in a lot of areas and disagree in some areas,
7 would we not?

8 STEVE: Well, this is true.

9 DICK: We, we would -- that's just obviously
10 the case but how do you work those issues out? And
11 one way that I know of is to converse, to talk, to
12 work together. It, it -- am I all wrong about that?

13 STEVE: No, if that opportunity is there --

14 DICK: Absolutely.

15 STEVE: -- or presents itself but I --
16 because of the situation I'm in, you would know better
17 than I would that upon walking out, I really don't --
18 I think the voice will be silenced. I really --

19 DICK: Well, no, you know what?

20 STEVE: I think it will be stifled. It will
21 be very rigid. It will be asking (Indiscernible) type
22 questions. I mean, obviously -- I'm 43 years old and
23 through the years watching court cases, watching
24 people in different situations with agencies, with
25 judicial systems and so forth, you know, there are a

1 lot of wrongs that are done. There's --

2 DICK: Absolutely. You know --

3 STEVE: I've seen, I've seen a big erosion,
4 you know, when it comes to the court systems, when it
5 comes to judges and the corruption and so forth. What
6 can be done about it? Well, you know, there's always
7 those that are honest that try to do something but it
8 seems like the tide keeps them going to the negative
9 side, as I see --

10 DICK: You know, you see that and hear --
11 would you, would you suggest that I probably in many
12 instances might have a different point of view than
13 you?

14 STEVE: You probably do.

15 DICK: And I agree, too. And I agree with
16 that same -- with that same capitalization. I do not
17 like what is being done either in some instances but
18 you know what, how can we get it resolved if we don't
19 talk about it?

20 STEVE: Well, I agree. I mean there's --
21 communication is the thing and, of course, all the
22 problems that are, the majority of them come because
23 of a lack of understanding of what one is going to say
24 and --

25 DICK: Impatience, lack of patience.

1 STEVE: Positively. In fact, that's an area
2 like I was telling Jim when I was talking to him the
3 first night. I lack in that area also.

4 DICK: All of us do to some degree.

5 STEVE: When it came -- when it came to the
6 time of that we were going to come out and so forth
7 and his God told him to wait, well, you know, I'm not
8 used to waiting myself, you know. It's --

9 DICK: It's difficult to wait.

10 STEVE: Well, sure it is.

11 DICK: It is. It takes a lot of patience
12 but, you know, I'm hoping that you and I can work out
13 some things here and, and David. I'm anxious to talk
14 to both of you. And I know there were some concerns
15 expressed by both of you with, with such issues as the
16 safety of the kids and are they together. Yeah,
17 they're, they're together. You've got my word on it.

18 STEVE: Well, see, it's, it's really a
19 pleasure talking with you. The (indiscernible) you
20 know, some of the problems we had right from the
21 beginning was when like Jim, meaning well, and then it
22 was furthered by Gary and then Henry, of course, that
23 in speaking with them -- Jim from the beginning, right
24 away because of the incident that took place later in
25 the day, it was agreed upon by both parties that it

1 would be allowed -- we wouldn't mind that these
2 Bradleys would be on the perimeter of the property.
3 But when they started like running over shacks and
4 having two or three --

5 DICK: Uh-huh.

6 STEVE: -- of them on the property and
7 moving around like behind the gymnasium, 50 feet away,
8 yesterday and deploying men out, getting into their
9 automobiles in the middle of the night, things of that
nature, --

10 DICK: Can, can, can I address that point
11 with you?

12 STEVE: You sure can.

13 DICK: Okay. You've got to understand that
14 this is a multi-agency effort and if I were the boss,
15 you and I could probably work this thing out perhaps a
lot faster.

16 STEVE: I believe that if you had been the
17 boss, Jim -- Dick, I don't think this would have ever
18 happened. If you would have come to the door and
19 knocked at the door like hundreds and thousands of
20 people have, come to this property, and you would have
21 had a warrant. You would have phoned. He would have
22 gone with you. There would have been no problem
23 whatsoever. The Sheriffs that have been here before
24
25

1 that have been invited here, we've gone down to talk
2 with them on our own. There has never been a problem
3 that way. We've always gone out of our way -- if
4 we've heard through the grapevine or someone says
5 there's a rumor that they're concerned about us, I'll
6 go down there and speak with them even though there's
7 a reserve on their part in wondering what we're up to
8 or whatever because I can understand and appreciate
9 where they're coming from. If it was me on the
10 outside, back in Hawaii, and I saw this crazy looking
11 place out in the country and you hear all these rumors
12 and things about it and, obviously, just looking at
13 the property and the structure, it's bizarre looking
14 to me also. It really is.

15 DICK: Well, bizarre is in the mind of the,
16 the observer.

17 STEVE: But, still, you understand what I'm
18 saying? I mean it is out of the ordinary, let's say.
19 I mean that, that's for sure.

20 DICK: Okay. Let me, let me address --
21 again, as you bring these points up, if you don't
22 mind, I'll interrupt you --

23 STEVE: But I was -- the only point I was
24 going to say about that is the way this came about, I
25 mean it's so shocking to me.

1 DICK: Well, you know what, Steve, --

2 STEVE: It really was.

3 DICK: -- it's shocking to a lot of people.

4 STEVE: I'll be honest with you. Let -- I'd
5 like to tell you the truth. I hear what the press is
6 saying. I would like -- it'd be great that they're --
7 the facts would be made known but, of course, there's
8 no way for us to talk to the media. You've cut us off
9 from that also. See, it's hard to really develop and
10 believe that -- and have this trust relationship when
11 the freedom of the press has been cut off and there's
12 only a one sided story given by your agencies which is
13 so far from factual. To think a man gets up on it
14 before all the press and talks about a gun battle in
15 '87 first he says. And he said it was with the
16 Sheriff's department, with these young men here.

15 DICK: Okay. Steve. Steve.

16 STEVE: So, I -- wait, wait, just let me say

17 --

18 DICK: And then give me a moment --

19 STEVE: Okay.

20 DICK: -- to address that.

21 STEVE: Then I talked to Henry. So, they
22 had that corrected. They says, excuse me, it, it was
23 not with the Sheriff's department --

24

25

1 DICK: Exactly.

2 STEVE: But then he went on to say it was un
3 '88. I mean what does it take to look at a case
4 history from the past and get a few facts down?

5 DICK: Listen, Steve, --

6 STEVE: All right.

7 DICK: -- half the time when you read a box
8 score for a football game, it's wrong.

9 STEVE: He said -- oh, and then this person
10 yesterday said it was against a rival member. Well,
11 he was no rival at all.

12 DICK: But that's somebody's interpretation,
13 okay. We cannot -- one of the things --

14 STEVE: Or nor was he a member, by the way.

15 DICK: Okay. In this country we do not have
16 influence over the press. From the out --

17 STEVE: No, no, the man that spoke was from
18 your department (Indiscernible).

19 DICK: Well, absolutely, but let me, let me,
20 let me go on for just a minute and --

21 STEVE: All right.

22 DICK: -- and finish this thought, okay.
23 You've got to understand that with this kind of, of
24 event here, okay, it's a media event, okay. We are
25 doing our best to insure the information that leaves

1 here is true and correct; however, my own personal
2 example, having come from another area of the country,
3 I'm not aware of the history in this portion of the
4 country that happened. So, if somebody tells me that
5 this thing that you're referring to happened in 1987
6 or 1997 --

6 STEVE: I just gave that as an example.

7 DICK: Well, I understand but what I'm
8 telling you is that many things are in error that are
9 said because the people that are saying them are not
10 always up -- they're trying, they're trying to collate
11 a lot of information. Let's face it, sometimes people
12 make mistakes and --

12 STEVE: Right. In view -- the man should
13 have says, I don't know, instead of saying that it was
14 a -- you know, some of the information givein -- I
15 wasn't even told -- why even bother giving something
16 unless you have the facts before you --

17 DICK: Well, let me say this. We try -- we,
18 meaning the people that make a sincere effort to
19 correct those, those inaccuracies. That's all we can
20 do. We will try to correct them. But, you know, some
21 of those issues like the, you know, the event you just
22 talked to -- that's in the past and I know you're
23 concerned about it. Let's don't let it happen.

23

24

25

1 STEVE: Well, no, no, no, I --

2 DICK: Let's don't let it happen in the
3 future. Let's just don't let it happen.

4 STEVE: Yes. All I was -- that's what I'm -
5 - that's the implication is, though, what took place
6 then and the reaction to it, how's it brought up, the
7 misinformation is a ground to what happened just
8 Sunday.

8 DICK: Sure.

9 STEVE: I mean in --

10 DICK: Sure.

11 STEVE: -- the first place there's no
12 relationship whatsoever but what took place Sunday,
13 the question is will the truth ever come out? Oh,
14 yes, it will but it might be in God's court, the
15 higher court of which Revelation 4 talks about. I
16 mean, you know, it's not something that the people of
17 the world, whether they think they're religious or not
18 or whatever, really want to talk about but everything
19 we do is in relation to the Bible. We believe that
20 there is a truth in the universe.

19 DICK: Absolutely.

20 STEVE: And that truth --

21 DICK: Absolutely.

22 STEVE: -- (Indiscernible) found also on
23
24
25

1 this earth. There's a pathway, there's a, a map, a
2 guide book for mankind who's definitely in confusion.
3 After 6000 years of human history, we should all be
4 able to come to the place and say, it doesn't work
5 down here. No matter what we do and how we try to
6 bring peace about on the earth, it just can't happen.

7 There's just so many --

8 DICK: But we can improve it. Can't we
9 improve it?

10 STEVE: Well, if anything, it's not
11 improving. It's going downhill. If you read the
12 prophecies --

13 DICK: Well, let's restrict ourselves to
14 this event, okay, to this, to this incident here.

15 STEVE: Well, --

16 DICK: Can we not improve it? And that's
17 what I'm here to --

18 STEVE: Well, I would sure like to.

19 DICK: -- do with you.

20 STEVE: I would sure like to.

21 DICK: Okay. Now, listen, let me tell you
22 something that appeared in the paper today, all right.
23 Again, like I told you, I talked to my wife last
24 night. And the media attention, it's weaning
25 somewhat. It's weaning somewhat.

1 STEVE: Well, sure, because there is nothing
2 happening right now --

3 DICK: Well, --

4 STEVE: -- and they thrive on and, you know,
5 --

6 DICK: But you know what now -- you know
7 what they're looking at now?

8 STEVE: No.

9 DICK: Not the sensationalism. They're
10 looking at issues. That's what we want to talk about,
11 issues. The paper this morning --

12 STEVE: Well, that sounds good.

13 DICK: Pardon me?

14 STEVE: That sounds great.

15 DICK: Okay. The paper this morning, the
16 local Waco paper, in one of the sections in the paper,
17 what does it say?

18 STEVE: I don't know.

19 DICK: Congressional inquiry into the
20 shooting. Obviously, there is absolutely no one in
21 this country that wanted to see something like that
22 happen and I include all of the officers that were
23 here, all of you folks in there, and all of us in --
24 that have any knowledge of this. Absolutely nobody
25 wants things like this to happen. And the

1 congressional people are now making an inquiry into
2 this thing. We're getting down to the nuts and bolts
3 of these issues. What -- why did they do what they
4 do? It's going to be a large, large inquiry, and the
5 F.B.I. is going to be part of that as is --

6 STEVE: And, and, and -- hello?

7 DICK: I'm still here. I don't --

8 STEVE: (Indiscernible) this phone --

9 DICK: Well, you know, it's gotta be on your
10 end. It's not, it's not here.

11 STEVE: It is. I know it is. It is on my
12 end.

13 DICK: Well, is your instrument -- did you
14 drop it or --

15 STEVE: No, it's, it's okay. I'll just
16 probably -- as long as I don't move around with it, I
17 guess it's all right.

18 DICK: Well, you think you want to change
19 phones?

20 STEVE: No, it's okay. Go --

21 DICK: Okay. Okay. Well, as I --

22 STEVE: What?

23 DICK: You still there?

24 STEVE: Yeah, still here.

25 DICK: I don't know. Maybe the satellites

1 are fouling us up, who knows. In this day and age,
2 all I can figure out is how to -- is how to pick the
3 phone up and dial it.

4 STEVE: Right.

5 DICK: But at any rate, the congressional
6 inquiry is going to address just the same issues as
7 you guys have mentioned to us.

8 STEVE: All right.

9 DICK: And we, you know, who can obviously
10 tell that story, the people that were there, and, and
11 I include you and the people inside there. You're
12 obviously the people that have to tell the people that
13 are making the inquiry into this matter what happened.
14 Now, obviously, ATF is going to tell their version of
15 what happened. And you're hearing some of that on
16 television. You cannot address those issues because
17 you're not here to do it.
