2 MR. KORESH: -- dad dealt with me.

3 DICK: Sure.

4 MR. KORESH: And somehow I, I seemed to
5 procrastinate the period of time. You know, it's kind
6 of like, you know, my daddy used to say when he would
7 go off to work in the morning, he'd say, "Now, I want
8 you to clean up this front yard and I want to get home
9 this afternoon and I want it cleaner than the Safeway
chickens."

10 DICK: (Laughter) Did you do it?

11 MR. KORESH: And I'd say -- he goes, "You
12 hear me?" And I'd say, "Yes, sir." Says, "Okay now,
13 I mean it, I want it cleaner than a Safeway chicken or
there will be some ass whopping."

14 DICK: Uh-huh.

15 MR. KORESH: That's the way he used to talk.
16 Okay. So okay, I had plenty of time, you know, after
17 breakfast because, you know, we had Icky Twerp
18 cartoons on and, and as time progressed, you know, we
19 could play and stuff. And, and then all of a sudden
20 12 o'clock, lunch time and more cartoons on. And then
21 all of a sudden, you know, somehow after 12 o'clock --
22 it took all day to get from, you know, 7:00 in the
morning to 12:00 and somehow, somehow after 12 o'clock

1 it just seemed like 12:00, 4:30, 5:00, bang, you know,
2 just, just time would always get away from me. And I
3 would hear the truck driving up into the driveway and
4 the yard wasn't cleaned.

5 DICK: Uh-oh. You thought, uh-oh. Yeah,
6 I -- that's --

7 MR. KORESH: But I just had a problem with -

8 - DICK: Time.

9 MR. KORESH: I always procrastinated, you
10 see?

11 DICK: Yeah.

12 MR. KORESH: But I finally learned that when
13 he gave me a job to do whether it was cleaning the
14 trash or cleaning the chicken, the chicken pen or
15 whatever it was out in the back that I'd better after
16 breakfast get off my little rear end and go out and
17 start doing it. Now, it took a while but I learned
18 it's better to do it now and then enjoy a peaceful
19 afternoon of fun time until supper time until bedtime
20 than it is to, to -- you know, I learned.

21 DICK: I, I learned the same thing in the
22 same fashion.

23 MR. KORESH: The Bible says spare the rod
24 and you will spoil the child.

25 DICK: I believe that to a degree. It, it -

1 -but, you know, it has to be done, you know, with,
2 with some compassion and it has to be done only --

3 MR. KORESH: Definitely.

4 DICK: -- when, when it needs to be done.
5 Would, would you agree?

6 MR. KORESH: Only a sober adult that knows
7 what he's doing himself and has mastered the art
8 himself can administer --

9 DICK: Sure.

10 MR. KORESH: -- punishment and justice.

11 DICK: Exactly. It's a, it's a, it's a big
12 responsibility for us as parents to do that. And,
13 and, you know, I guess that brings us back to, you
14 know, why we're so concerned that these kids are
15 placed with the appropriate people. And we share
16 those concerns. We're, we're not at odds about that
17 at all.

18 DICK: Well, the social workers always will
19 ask, you know, a couple in regards to discipline and
20 if they say they were, they were using the means of
21 paddling or spanking then the social workers will not
22 give that child to those parents. I mean, that's just
23 a fact.

24 MR. KORESH: Well, David, you and I both
25 agree that the, the optimum thing here is obviously

1 for you to care for your own children and for the
2 folks inside to care for their own children.

3 MR. KORESH: Uh-huh.

4 DICK: And, and that's a decision that only
5 you can make. You know, that's up to you, Dave.
6 Nothing I can say or do will change that
7 responsibility. That's, that's your responsibility
8 and not only -- it's, it's your right to care for
9 those kids.

10 MR. KORESH: Well, like I said, our decision
11 has been made. Now, here's what I was trying to
12 explain to you before we went around and around and
13 went around --

14 DICK: Jake's barn, right?

15 MR. KORESH: -- went around the, went around
16 the world and went to different countries and, and
17 talked about the different things we saw. What I was
18 saying was is that the scripture states that there was
19 this man that was very zealous. His name was Saul but
20 he got kind of knocked in the head, and he was asked
21 by the supernatural being. Now, we're talking about
22 supernatural now. We're talking about -- not --
23 let's, let's don't -- let's say that, let's say that
24 heaven or what I'm talking about is similar to the
25 United States in comparison to the Congo. Now, a

1 greater, greater distance, but I'm saying that let's
2 say that me and you jump in our car and we drive back
3 200 years ago. Okay?

4 DICK: Okay. Okay.

5 MR. KORESH: Now, if we came into Dodge
6 City, you know, wouldn't they be surprised? I mean,
7 wouldn't they just simply fall all over their selves,
8 huh, if we drove a nice brand new car in there?

9 DICK: Wouldn't that be something? Have you
10 ever thought about that?

11 MR. KORESH: Well, the thing of it is is
12 that if you was a bad guy you'd have every bar goon
13 and bar, bar, bar saloon girl there is wouldn't you?

14 DICK: Well, I'll tell you what, I'd make,
15 I'd make Matt Dillon look like a piker.

16 MR. KORESH: Yeah. Well, I'll tell you
17 what, they would think you was, you was from outer
18 space.

19 DICK: They certainly would, they certainly
20 would. You know --

21 MR. KORESH: Or if you was in General
22 Custer's day and you came driving up on one of these
23 Bradleys?

24 DICK: With a Bradley and a, and an M-16,
25 the one, the one-eyed man would be king out there,

1 wouldn't he?

2 MR. KORESH: I tell you, and those Indians
3 that would be their, their last stand forever. I
4 mean, you know, get, get -- let them, let them go
5 around you. You know, those three, those three ports
6 on each side, you know --

6 DICK: (Laughter)

7 MR. KORESH: -- they'd, they'd -- you'd
8 really -- they, they don't know what hit them.

9 DICK: No, that's, that's true.

10 MR. KORESH: I mean, you wouldn't have to
11 use a 25 mm on them, but, but the thing of it is this:
12 that's hindsight.

12 DICK: Okay.

13 MR. KORESH: That's hindsight.

14 DICK: It is, and, and you know, that's,
15 that's dealing with the past events. And, you know,
16 in some degree I guess over the last couple of days
17 we've talked about some past events. But we want to
18 do is, is talk about the here, now and the present.

18 MR. KORESH: Okay.

19 DICK: Hey listen, the stuff's ready out
20 there. We, we've got, we've got your stuff out there.
21 I think they got that suture kit in there and the
22 photos and, and this tape that we want to get in to

2 on, let me, let me see, but I think what -- yeah,
3 we're going to drop it the same place as the phone was
4 and it's all ready. Is it dropped? Okay. We're
5 ready. Can you send somebody out?

6 MR. KORESH: Sure, we'll send somebody.

7 DICK: Okay. Hold on for a second. Let me
8 clarify. Go ahead. Let me, let me just go away from
9 you just a second. Hold on.

10 MR. KORESH: Hey, Kathy? Kathy? Kathy?

11 DICK: Okay. You got any objections to us
12 dropping that for you?

13 MR. KORESH: No.

14 DICK: Okay. He's got --

15 MR. KORESH: Is, is, is Greg close by?

16 DICK: The same as the phone.

17 MR. KORESH: Okay.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER IN BACKGROUND:
19 Tell him not to send anybody out.

20 DICK: Don't send anybody out now. Wait,
21 wait until I tell you it's been dropped and then
22 somebody out, but I'll give you the word.

23 MR. KORESH: Okay.

24 DICK: Fair enough?

25 MR. KORESH: Okay.

1 DICK: Good, good. The suture kit,
2 hopefully David that'll be good for you to, you know,
3 kind of clean up your wound a little bit. I guess
4 that's what's in the thing. You, you clean up wounds
5 with that, right, or stitch up wound? I'm not a
6 doctor here.

7 MR. KORESH: Right, stitch up.

8 DICK: Okay.

9 MR. KORESH: Kathy, could -- tell -- we'll
10 send -- did Greg go out last time to get that -- he --
11 okay, yeah, so they should know him. All right.

12 DICK: Okay.

13 MR. KORESH: So send, so send Greg out
14 then --

15 DICK: Okay.

16 MR. KORESH: -- and the milk's not in it is
17 it?

18 DICK: No. Listen --

19 MR. KORESH: No, the milk hasn't come yet so
20 you just have to -- don't have no -- you don't have no
21 bread, milk at all anymore?

22 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER:

23 (Indiscernible) don't have anything.

24 MR. KORESH: Have you tried to take any of
25 the (indiscernible) or something like that?

1 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: I tried
2 everything but nothing's working. I tried everything.

3 DICK: David, don't, don't you have any milk
4 products at all?

5 MR. KORESH: Well, we, we gave, we gave, we
6 gave the last milk to, to the last -- you know, the
7 baby went out.

8 DICK: Okay.

9 MR. KORESH: And the girls like I said that
10 have the, have the newborns and the babies, you know,
11 they're breast-feeding and then all of a sudden they,
12 they start telling me that they're not producing milk
13 anymore. And I guess it's from the --

14 DICK: David, listen. Let's handle that.
15 Send the kids out and let, let us take care of those
16 kids.

17 MR. KORESH: No, let's don't do that. Let's
18 don't ask that question at this point here, okay?

19 DICK: You are -- are you ready to send
20 out --

21 MR. KORESH: I, I explained --

22 DICK: -- the other child now to -- or
23 whomever you're going to send out to pick up that
24 stuff?

25 MR. KORESH: We're going to send out Greg.

1 DICK: Greg? What, what's he, a young man?

2 MR. KORESH: Yeah, well, he's, he's a, he's
3 a, he's an adult. He's the one that picked up the --

4 DICK: Oh, okay, Greg that we talked with on
5 the phone. Okay. I'm sorry.

6 MR. KORESH: Right.

7 DICK: I thought you were talking about one
8 of the kids.

9 MR. KORESH: No, not yet.

10 DICK: Okay. Don't send him out yet. Just
11 wait, you know, let's hold here and talk to one
12 another and then --

13 MR. KORESH: Don't, don't send Greg out yet.

14 DICK: No, just hold him here and then
15 we'll, we'll give you the word. We'll give you the
16 word.

17 MR. KORESH: You know, the, the --
18 originally the initiation -- that was my initiation to
19 send the kids out. That wasn't something you all were
20 asking.

21 DICK: Listen, I, I can appreciate that 100
22 percent.

23 MR. KORESH: And Jim kept saying, well, you
24 know, let's, let's, let's -- and I said now Jim, wait
25 a minute, you know, we're going to, we're going to get

1 this resolved but unless, unless, unless you know
2 where I'm coming from?

3 DICK: Well, you know Dave, tell you what --

4 MR. KORESH: Have you, have you been sitting
5 there listening to me talk to, to --

6 DICK: No, I, I --

7 MR. KORESH: -- Henry?

8 DICK: Well, it's -- parts of it, and what
9 I've been trying to do is get some things done that --
10 to try to facilitate what you want done. While Jim
11 was talking to you, I know you were concerned about
12 these issues so I started things and works and, and
13 we've, we've gotten to it and that's, that's what I've
14 tried to do for you. And Jim, Jim --

15 MR. KORESH: Do you want that, do you want
16 that guy to come in and check on your wounds and all
17 that? Let me, let me talk to Steve real quick because
18 he's got some information he wants to relate to you.

19 DICK: Okay.

20 MR. KORESH: Just take a second.

21 DICK: Fair enough. Now, just hold Greg
22 though until I tell you, okay?

23 MR. KORESH: Okay.

24 DICK: Fair enough.

25 MR. KORESH: All right.

1 DICK: Talk to you in a minute.

2 MR. KORESH: Okay. Okay, Steve?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah?

4 MR. KORESH: Need to talk to him about that
5 newscast we just heard.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

7 MR. KORESH: They want us to move the
8 satellite back around or something. What --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: The ATF feds or the FBI?

10 MR. KORESH: Oh, this is from that other
11 organization.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Is anybody on the phone
13 right now?

14 MR. KORESH: Yes.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Who? Dick?

16 MR. KORESH: Yes. Well, let me ask you
17 (indiscernible) contact (indiscernible).

18 (Indiscernible voices in background.)

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello, Dick?

20 DICK: Yeah.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Steve here.

22 DICK: Hey, Steve.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, we're just trying to
24 get a few things resolved here I guess --

25 DICK: Okay.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- so --

2 DICK: Okay. What, what are you resolving?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Dick is funny, says what,
4 what were you resolving. Well, one, I needed to brush
5 my teeth.

6 DICK: (Laughter)

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I'm only kidding, I'm
8 only kidding.

9 DICK: No, I mean listen, is there something
10 I can help you with to resolve?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, right, right now,
12 let's see, there was -- I'm, I'm not even sure. There
13 was a few things that we needed to get done here I
14 guess
15 and --

16 DICK: Okay.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- sanitation and all the
18 rest.

19 DICK: All right.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, if there was any help,
21 I -- you know, I would definitely let you know.
22 Hello?

23 DICK: Yeah, I'm here.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I heard a click.

25 DICK: Well --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: There's (indiscernible) on
2 this phone.

3 DICK: Somebody probably stomped on the cord
4 or something.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly. Okay. Let's see,
6 was there anything -- where were we at now because
7 I've been gone for a little while here?

8 DICK: Well, I'm, I'm trying to talk to
9 David about, you know, getting someone out to pick up
10 this suture thing that we're looking -- and, and the
11 pictures --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I see, okay.

13 DICK: -- for the kids and --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: I see, okay.

15 DICK: -- that's why I asked you this
16 morning about the VHS capability. We got a tape for
17 you with the kids on it which I'm sure all the parents
18 will appreciate --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

20 DICK: -- taking a look at. And, you know,
21 we were dealing with the issues of the press
22 conference.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: David said, David said he's
24 trying to set a scriptural foundation for you that you
25 might be, be able to build on, that he might be able

1 to show you things very clearly after that point. But
2 it doesn't seem like the inner man is too responsive.

3 DICK: He's got some down time, huh?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's afraid that you're
5 another Jim.

6 DICK: Another Jim?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

8 DICK: Listen, don't paint me with that
9 brush, please.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, no, no, no.

11 DICK: Please.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, okay.

13 DICK: I mean, that's not fair to me is it,
14 huh?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, I didn't, no, I
16 didn't, I didn't say that in a, in a nasty or bad way
17 or anything. I --

18 DICK: No listen, I want to tell you
19 something about Jim.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

21 DICK: Jim worked his tail off for you guys.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, don't -- okay,
23 you're missing the whole point.

24 DICK: Okay, okay.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: My, my comment must have

1 | went over your head.

2 | DICK: It, it probably did. I was
3 | probably --

4 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Have you ever been a person
5 | that has looked at religion or tried religions or
6 | looked at the Bible or Buddhism, Hinduism, whatever?

7 | DICK: Well, not to the degree you have, I
8 | want to be truthful with you.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, no, but the whole
10 | thing is though, I mean what's in every man there's a,
11 | a yearning to know what we're doing, where we're
12 | going, how we got here, all that sort of thing.

13 | DICK: Sure.

14 | MR. SCHNEIDER: And I -- and we're a group
15 | of people here that --

16 | DICK: We're all introspective to some
17 | degree aren't we?

18 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes. But I mean, what he's,
19 | you know, trying to reach with you is there's a lot of
20 | men that wrote in a book where almost two billion
21 | people called Christians or call themselves Christians
22 | say they believe in this book called the Bible.

23 | DICK: Uh-huh.

24 | MR. SCHNEIDER: And all these men left their
25 | testimony about final -- the final days of Earth's

1 history. And it's very clear to a lot of people that
2 there's something to it but they're not sure what;
3 they don't have the ability to pull the pieces of the
4 puzzle together for this big clear picture that is
5 formulated now for people to look at, evaluate and
6 judge. So I mean what he was sharing with you as I
7 walked up was something he wanted to help give you
8 somewhat of a foundation.

8 DICK: Um-hum.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: And in giving you
10 information you can go anywhere in the world, take
11 that information, see if it can be controverted, from
12 the Pope to the -- this scholar, that scholar, with a
13 DD, a Ph.D, whatever.

13 DICK: Um-hum.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: And it's not going to happen
15 because I've traveled with him, found the same. But -

16 - DICK: Well, you, you suggested to me it was
17 difficult for you to understand and I suppose to a
18 degree you're, you're still learning, are you not?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I'll always be learning.
19 Whatever, whatever religion is -- true religion is
20 education.

21 DICK: Sure, a continuing education.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's really what it is.

1 Yeah, it's constantly advancing and understanding and,
2 and becoming more -- pardon?

3 MR. KORESH: (In background) Things that
4 apply.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Things that apply is right,
6 the application, the usage --

7 DICK: Um-hum.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- of knowledge for the
9 betterment of one's self --

10 DICK: Sure.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- more -- greater
12 fulfillment and advancement.

13 DICK: Well, we can learn from each other
14 there's absolutely no question about that.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

16 DICK: I, I think there are some things that
17 I can pass on to you that you probably would find
18 helpful.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: We're going to be staying in
20 contact with you frequently here if there's anything
21 else, otherwise I'll be getting off the phone.

22 DICK: Well, let's hold for a minute until
23 we get this --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 DICK: -- this resolved on the dropping of

1 the photo for you and everything.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, all right, sure, sure.

3 DICK: And this -- and apparently --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: What, what was the latest
5 thing on that, Dick? I didn't --

6 DICK: Well, the latest thing like
7 everything else, there -- you know, all, all things
8 come to he who waits --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

10 DICK: -- and --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, but I mean what were
12 there details -- you're in the process now -- what --

13 DICK: No, it's not in the process. I know
14 you're probably of hearing in this process and you
15 know what? I'm tired of telling you that too, but
16 they are going to be there momentarily.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I see, okay.

18 DICK: We're getting them into, into
19 position but we, we don't want you to send anybody out
20 until, until they're dropped.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. So --

22 DICK: And you and I can continue to talk to
23 one another and they tell me that it's going to be
24 done shortly. Now, by whose definition, you know?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

1 DICK: I, I know, I know that --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

3 DICK: -- it seems that as though it takes a
4 good deal of time and I, I wonder myself why things
5 take the time that they do.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

7 DICK: But you know what? We're all
8 concerned about one another's safety and that's,
9 that's what runs this, this thing and we just want to
10 ensure that you folks know that we don't want any harm
11 to come to, to anyone. And, you know, I was kind of a
12 little concerned this morning about David talking
13 about these Bradleys and blowing up Bradleys or
14 something. Well, I'm -- again, I'm not a, a weapons
15 specialist but to me I'm kind of concerned.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I -- what, what
17 did -- I'm sorry. I wasn't here at -- what kind of
18 comments?

19 DICK: Well, he said, well, he said, "Hey,
20 if these Bradleys come in I've got something that'll
21 take care of Bradleys and we're researched this and we
22 know what that might take."

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, really? Okay. I wasn't
24 here for that.

25 DICK: Well, now I'm a little concerned

1 about things. I don't know what that means.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, probably what it means
3 is this. I mean, I didn't hear the conversation but
4 I, I was here from Sunday on when, when the
5 negotiations began like I told you earlier with Jim
6 when he gave his word as did Gary and a number of
7 others since then that only would these three vehicles
8 come to the perimeter at the very closest, none would
9 ever be on the property. So that was an agreement
10 made right from the beginning, that no personnel of
11 any of the agencies or the militia, the military,
12 would be on the property. But that has been violated
13 constantly and as time has gone more and more by even
14 running over guard shacks, other kinds of shacks,
15 property they know not what's inside, there could be
16 valuables, they don't know. I mean, such disregard in
17 the first place.

18 DICK: Well, I, I --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, but, but last --

20 DICK: -- share your concern.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- but the night before --
22 was it last night? Yeah, last night 50 feet away from
23 the one part of the building on the back side, 50
24 away, and then they get up --

25 DICK: Steve, can I ask you a question?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes.

2 DICK: Let me ask you a question.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes.

4 DICK: I find that extremely difficult to
5 believe, okay?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: But now I -- we all viewed
7 it though.

8 DICK: You, you heard --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes --

10 DICK: -- did you hear something or did you
11 see something?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, we saw, we saw.
13 We --

14 DICK: You saw?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, we looked right at the
16 Bradley --

17 DICK: 50 feet from the building?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: It came from the white
19 garage as we call it in the back or the north side of
20 the property, came over toward what we call the
21 gymnasium, the big open building.

22 DICK: Okay. 50 feet from the building. Is
23 that what you're telling me?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: 50 feet, that's what I was
25 told.

1 DICK: Okay. Now, that's a question.

2 That's what you were told.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, it, it doesn't matter
4 it was 50 or -- okay, at the extreme it would be 100
5 feet.

6 DICK: Okay.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: At the extreme.

8 DICK: All right.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: It doesn't matter to me if
10 it was 150.

11 DICK: Too close is what you're telling me.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, it's on the property.

13 DICK: Okay.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's contrary to the word
15 given.

16 DICK: Okay.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: And one of these -- they get
18 out, they're fiddling around, fooling around, they're
19 getting into things. They have been into vehicles in
20 the -- like toward the -- in the wee hours of the
21 morning. What is going -- and then what are they --
22 what's so cute about they drive on the property on the
23 dirt road up where the guard shack was --

24 DICK: Um-hum.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and then they come and sit

1 in on the property where they said they'd be on the
2 outside. There's no one on the road so there should
3 be no problem of them sitting in the middle of the
4 road.

5 DICK: Well, you know what my explanation to
6 David was?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Then they ran over that
8 shack. What was that all about? Why --

9 DICK: Well, if there's --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- why didn't you guy -- why
11 didn't Jim tell me ahead of time do you mind if we run
12 that over for -- so we can have a --

13 DICK: Hey, hey, do you think Jim knew that?
14 We have told you -- Steve, every time we're aware of
15 movement we've told you about it.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, who's controlling
17 these guys? Are they on their own --

18 DICK: Well, I was telling --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- are they their own
20 nation?

21 DICK: (Laughter)

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: (Indiscernible) against
23 someone else here or --

24 DICK: Give, give me, give me a moment so --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

1 DICK: Give me a moment. You know,
2 sometimes people are -- have a different interest.
3 The guys that gravitate toward, you know, riding in
4 tanks and jumping out of airplanes and stuff like that
5 are a --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I agree, I agree with you.

7 DICK: -- little different mindset than you
8 and I, right?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: I agree.

10 DICK: You know, so when they get a chance
11 to use a Bradley -- probably half of them have never
12 been in a Bradley before -- and I never have and I
13 hope I never do.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I thought the same thing.
15 In fact --

16 DICK: Yeah.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- it reminded me of a lot
18 of kids in there --

19 DICK: Absolutely.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- having an opportunity to
21 play or --

22 DICK: Hey, let's drive this baby and see
23 how it works, you know?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, sure, but somebody's
25 got to be above these guys --

1 DICK: Well --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- in control of all this.

3 DICK: -- we, we, we, are, we are, okay? I
4 mean --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. What I mentioned
6 there was not to go through the details again as I did
7 earlier with you, but it was in response to what you
8 told me and what part --

8 DICK: Okay.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- of that conversation was.

10 DICK: Okay. All right.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, I mean if intimidation
12 or any factors of -- we understand to some degree each
13 other's -- the mind set involved here.

13 DICK: Sure.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: So -- just a minute. Okay.
15 What you say is you -- are you listening?

16 DICK: Yeah.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: What you say is you want us
18 alive, but what you're actually doing -- the actions
19 you're showing, I mean, those vehicles and what
20 they're doing do not show what is coming out of the,
21 out of the mouths of some of you guys.

21 DICK: Well, listen --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what he said.

23

1 DICK: -- listen. Since Sunday morning
2 there has not been anyone hurt at all has there?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: What -- and what, what do
4 you think about our part of allowing your men right
5 from the beginning to come in and take those bodies,
6 take the wounded? We didn't even want to see them
7 dead or wounded in the first place, but what did you
8 think that -- about that on our part --

8 DICK: Well --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- come on in and get those?
10 Do you know that when you guys entered that front --
11 that door -- well, not you, it was the ATF of
12 course -- that immediately I -- I didn't even know
13 what was going on. I heard the gunshot, Wayne Martin
14 and myself, the attorney, we're on the phone calling
15 911, we're screaming to this -- we said, "Who do we
16 have?" he said his name was Larry; "Larry who?", Larry
17 Lynch. We're screaming, there's women and children
18 here, people are dying, they're getting wounded: what
19 is going on? Call them off, call them off, let's
20 communicate: that's what we were screaming.

19 DICK: Okay.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: And, and, and, and I want to
21 tell you something --

22 DICK: Okay.

23

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and the FBI, I hope we
2 can meet --

3 DICK: Hold, Steve --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Wait now --

5 DICK: -- Steve, just --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I hope you can look --
7 huh?

8 DICK: -- Steve, give me a break on my ears.
9 Let's talk, you know, you're getting kind of excited.
10 Let's -- you know, I know, let's try to, to talk to
11 one another a little, little more quiet, my ear hurts.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: He said his ear hurts. I am
13 -- I do have a strong voice.

14 DICK: Yeah, please. I mean, I, I have a, I
15 have a --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

17 DICK: -- tendency to do that too, so --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Excuse me for that, excuse
19 me.

20 DICK: Yeah, let's just -- let me say the
21 stuff has been dropped out there, okay? But there's
22 apparently a fellow outside your place there getting
23 water or something?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: When? Where?

25 DICK: Right now, or, or seconds ago --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, if that's so I know
2 nothing about it.

3 DICK: Well, please make sure that the folks
4 know that --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, okay, let's do it both
6 ways.

7 DICK: Okay.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: If you want to -- if you see
9 a guy getting water and you pick him off -- well, you
10 know, just --

11 DICK: No, I --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, listen to me.

13 DICK: Okay.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: The same with your guys --

15 DICK: Okay.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- which have been violating
17 this thing since Sunday night.

18 DICK: That's what I'm trying to tell you.
19 I've always told when they were going to move.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I -- yes, but it has not
21 quit on your side, period, not one --

22 DICK: Is Greg there?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and not once have you
24 people told us that you were going to do those kind of
25 things. That's what I'm trying to say.

1 DICK: Well, we've --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Even though we've been --

3 DICK: -- tried to call you -- every time we
4 know there's going to be movement we have tried to
5 call you.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: That has not happened that
7 way. And then also that message that has come across
8 on the TV is that these -- we called -- when they call
9 us we answer right away.

10 DICK: Okay.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what has been told.
12 And when you call us it's been said that you don't
13 always get us. Well, anytime this phone rings we pick
14 it up to answer and always have to talk to you people.

15 DICK: Steve, the simple answer to that is
16 if that's true, we didn't say that, and secondly --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: It was said and --

18 DICK: I mean I'm talking about me --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

20 DICK: -- the guy that's talking to you --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: It was the ATF.

22 DICK: -- or Jim. What we have --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: It was the man

24 (indiscernible)

25 DICK: -- what, what we have is, is

1 equipment -- if we call you and you don't answer maybe
2 the equipment is not ringing through. I mean, that,
3 that's, that's a minor thing there.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. Just, just a
5 second --

6 DICK: It means absolutely nothing.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- Dick, I'm talking -- I
8 guess there's a request here. Just a second.

9 DICK: Okay. Is Greg ready to go out and
10 pick --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Dick, is the milk out there?
12 They dropped something off now or --

13 MR. DICK: Well, they dropped off the, the
14 kit, the suture kit and --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: The -- suture kit.

16 DICK: -- and some photographs and --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Photographs.

18 DICK: -- videotape.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: The videotape.

20 DICK: Yeah.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

22 DICK: Yeah. And that should be out there.
23 You, you ready to send to Greg out?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, Greg is ready to go
25 now.

1 DICK: Okay. Hold on for a second and let -

2 - MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

3 (Indiscernible voices in background.)

4 DICK: Hold on for a second, okay? I got to
5 get this last confirmation. You know, this is like
6 dealing with my wife.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Dick?

7 DICK: Yeah?

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: See, what bothers me is look
9 at how quick you can radio and say it's okay for him
10 to come out to even the Bradley that dropped it off
11 and how come there's not that control about the other
12 two, three that are around --

12 DICK: Well, it's not quick. We've been --
13 I've been telling you --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, it was. Look at how
15 quick you, you were able to, okay, he can now come out
16 and, and, you know, they just dropped it off. You
17 guys have some efficiency with the technology and, you
18 know, through communications (indiscernible).

18 DICK: You know, you know, you know when I
19 gave them these photos? I gave them these photos a
20 long time ago. Nothing is done quickly, unfortunately
21 and when you're dealing with these numbers of people
22 it can't be. I mean, that's a fact of life. Let's,

23

1 let's face it.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, --

3 DICK: You're used to that.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- basically, the, the tenor
5 of what I'm saying you can pick up on being that we're
6 somewhat disappointed and, and unsatisfied because of
7 the movement of these men. I think last night might
8 have been the first time they calmed down a little, I
9 didn't really get too many reports.

9 DICK: Um-hum, well, good, and we, we keep -

10 - MR. SCHNEIDER: And I hope that's because of
11 your --

12 DICK: Well, we're --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- your involvement and
14 maybe Henry, I don't know.

15 DICK: Exactly, we're trying to get this
16 thing -- we're trying to get this thing -- we're
17 trying to communicate those kinds of things to the
18 others that are part and parcel of this, of this
19 thing, okay?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, Dick, he's going to be
21 heading out then now if that's okay.

22 DICK: Okay. Hold on for just a second
23 here --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right, all right.
25

1 DICK: -- let me, let me, let me see.

2 (Indiscernible voices in background.)

3 DICK: You were pleased with that conference
4 -- that press conference this morning though?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I liked the, the man
6 that spoke on the behalf of your --

7 DICK: Okay.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- agency.

9 DICK: Yeah.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: I thought, you know, he was
11 very mild-mannered.

12 DICK: Sure.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, I liked everything
14 about him, trying to be frank, honest --

15 DICK: Good.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and --

17 DICK: Well, you've got to be.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: I really -- you know, I've
19 never had a problem with the department -- the Federal
20 Bureau of -- all my life, I was growing up as a kid
21 (indiscernible)

22 DICK: You ever dealt with FBI agents?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I haven't.

24 DICK: Well --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: But I've had people that

1 i've known that have had good experiences with them.
2 I've always held certain agencies like that in a very
3 high esteem. I grew up as a little boy looking at
4 policemen, firemen in the same light as something one
5 would want to be or at least you'd think to be when
6 you're young and I've always had the highest regard
7 for agencies like this. That one I never knew
8 anything about because I was never involved in
9 alcohol,
10 tobacco --

11 DICK: Okay. Well --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- or firearms was that
13 department.

14 DICK: Let's discuss that a bit. First of
15 all, send, send Greg out, okay --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

17 DICK: -- or whomever. Send them out to
18 tell -- make the pick-up.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's, he's ready to go.

20 DICK: Okay.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's got the clearance?

22 DICK: He's got to go on out and take the
23 gear.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Go ahead.

25 DICK: Let us know when he's gone just so I

1 can pass it on.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: The tape and suture -- a kit
3 of sutures and forth. Okay. He's heading out.

4 DICK: Okay. He's heading out the door now?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

6 DICK: Okay.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, not yet. He's, he's
8 just heading down. He's --

9 DICK: He's heading down. He's --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: He'll be at the door in
11 about 30 seconds.

12 DICK: Okay. Okay. Well, listen, I -- you
13 know, that, that was a positive note that you passed
14 on to me, I appreciate that. You know, I've been
15 with -- MR. SCHNEIDER: What was the man's name
16 again that was a spokes person for your department
17 there?

18 DICK: Ricks.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Rick, that's right.

20 DICK: Yeah. You know, I've been with the
21 FBI for, for a good many years and I've, I've always
22 felt --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Very professional.

24 DICK: -- felt that I could get along with
25 people well and, and our organization deals with

1 people I think very fairly and compassionately.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, so far I would agree
3 with that. I don't know of any incidences that I've
4 ever heard from anybody that has had anything bad to
5 say. I've known a lot of situations that have come
6 where you, you men did very well. I mean, you used a
7 lot of wisdom and sense in certain situations.

8 DICK: Sure.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I've never heard anything
10 really bad to be honest with you.

11 DICK: Well, we take pride in that. That's
12 what we're here to do. We're here to, to certainly
13 enforce the, the violations of, of law, but, but we're
14 here to do things within the parameters of the
15 constitution.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I like to hear that.
17 That's great.

18 DICK: And that's, that's -- I've been in
19 the Bureau 20-some years now, 22 years, and I've
20 always, I've always done that and, and the agents I
21 deal with act in the same fashion. And I don't think
22 that you'll have anybody inside there that would
23 quarrel with, with that at all.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 DICK: We, we're going to continue to do

1 that and that's why we're dealing with you here.
2 That's why we were asked to go ahead and, and deal
3 with you because we --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know that I would have
5 thought that -- there was a few questions actually
6 asked by the press. I would have --

7 DICK: Okay.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- thought that Rick would
9 have been able to even answer better than the other
10 ATF agent. The guy seems to be very mute and -- I --
11 well, I suppose if I was in his shoes after what took
12 place I guess I would be too and no one wants to
13 incriminate themselves.

14 DICK: Well, that's why -- you know, that's
15 why you guys are going to have to get the word out.
16 Now listen, I --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I would like even ahead of
18 time to -- I'd like to get some of the -- the accounts
19 that were seen as to what happened.

20 DICK: That's what we're asking you to do.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, before walking out,
22 that's what I'm talking about. I'd like to see a
23 little reaction to the -- what -- the accounts of --

24 DICK: But, but you know what?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- some of the --

1 DICK: You have to tell them.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I want to tell you
3 something. There were some of these women and young
4 kids that were actually at the, the wall, the front
5 area --

6 DICK: Okay.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- when all those bullets
8 started riddling through the sides missing little
9 babies. I -- you ought to -- I ought to take pictures
10 and send the pictures out.

11 DICK: Steve, that's exactly what we're
12 asking you to tell the world.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: You -- you'd be amazed.

14 DICK: Okay? No, that's what I'm asking you
15 to do, tell the world. The press wants to hear that,
16 the court wants to hear it, the U.S. Congress --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: If they do then put a line -
18 -why don't you -- why did you cut our lines off then
19 if the press wants to hear? Let us dialogue with
20 them.

21 DICK: Well, we've got to resolve the --
22 this, this incident first.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: No -- you -- actually you're
24 doing it your way of course, you, you say you have to.
25 Yeah, in your --

1 DICK: No, no, I said we --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- from your eyes you need
3 to --

4 DICK: -- have to. We have to, Steve. That
5 is -- that means -- you still there?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

7 DICK: Okay. That means you folks there and
8 us we have to get this resolved. You will have every
9 chance, every chance to tell exactly what you want to
10 tell. And you know what? You're going to tell it to
11 so many people and have so much opportunity you're
12 going to be -- there are going to be people standing
13 in line to represent you.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: I guess, you know, my
15 reaction to that is kind of ho-hum, of course, because
16 there's no better --

17 DICK: But why? Why?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- because there's no better
19 time than the present especially with --

20 DICK: Yeah, but listen, listen --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- something as --

22 DICK: -- you told me moments ago that your
23 dealings with the FBI have been --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I've -- I told you
25 also I've never dealt with them, but my --

1 DICK: Well --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- observations, what I know
3 about them, what I've seen have been --

4 DICK: What you've seen --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- held very high.

6 DICK: -- and others, and others that you
7 know that have dealt with the FBI.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

9 DICK: I am telling you and they are telling
10 you that you will get every opportunity to express
11 those concerns. Congressional oversight is being done
12 on this incident. This is not -- this has never
13 happened in law-enforcement history. It's going to
14 be, it's going to be picked apart. It's going to be
15 examined. It's going to be critiqued. It's going to
16 be argued. All those things will be done. And you're
17 going to be part of that operation. You're going to
18 be listened to. You're going to get the opportunity.

19 But, you know, what has to be done is you have to
20 come out to be able to do that. How, how else would
21 you do it? How else would you do that?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Very easy. The
23 communication line is going to be open right now where
24 there can be a dialogue, there can be a given a
25 response -- a lot of things can be opened up, many of

1 the issues right from here before one even does that.
2 I've seen too many times in the past through others
3 that have been arrested and so forth that they're
4 taken away never to be heard from again until they're
5 in a court of law and they never really do because of
6 their circumstances or the environment have an
7 opportunity to really open up as to what really took
8 place.

8 DICK: Is Greg, is Greg back, Steve?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, he isn't.

10 DICK: Okay. Well, let me know when he
11 comes back in, will you?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I will, I will.

13 DICK: Okay. Now listen, a case in point
14 was those two ladies the other day.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

16 DICK: You heard that they'd been charged
17 with this and that. We went --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: By the way, who was behind
19 making such a quick move to do such a thing as that in
20 the first place?

21 DICK: Well, you know, it's not us, I'll
22 guarantee you. And again, I told you I'd never lie to
23 you and I'm telling you I don't know but we got it
24 taken care of didn't we? We went to them and said,
25

1 listen, these are elderly ladies, you think they're in
2 there shooting out the doors? Absolutely not. And
3 what we did, we went to the appropriate people and
4 said this is, this is not right, this is just not
5 acceptable. And they took care of it.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Isn't it funny how in
7 different countries or societies or situations
8 something can either be murder, it can be war, it can
9 be killing? Isn't it something? Like -- a country,
10 someone's in their home and someone else is trying to
11 blow apart their house. What do they do? Depends
12 upon what country at what time apparently you live
13 doesn't it? Like I'll tell you the truth, what I've
14 seen and noticed from a lot of people for a long time,
15 where were the FBI and the agencies when the L.A.
16 riots were taking place? Where was the protection for
17 those people? If they didn't have some of their own
18 firearms and so forth what would have they done? See,
19 even at this very -- what about the billions of
20 dollars that are being moved around because of drugs
21 and so forth? Where are all the agencies there
22 getting all these big guys constantly?

23 DICK: You know what? You know what? I'll,
24 I'll address that issue with you very clearly. I used
25 to work narcotics years ago.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh.

2 DICK: You know, resources are unbelievably
3 short in this country to deal with an issue like that.
4 You think that I do not have the same opposition to
5 those kinds of activities that you do?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm sure you do.

7 DICK: 100 percent. I've got children in
8 the school system, we all do. That is not acceptable
9 to us in any fashion.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, can I, can I
11 give you an example of the way I've seen it through
12 the years?

13 DICK: Sure, sure.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Like for instance I'm living
15 in Hawaii where one Saturday night there was a church
16 group of us playing a game of volley ball.

17 DICK: Uh-huh.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: And we came back to the
19 cars. One of the cars had been broken in, hundreds of
20 dollars stolen and some different items had been also
21 taken out of the car. We contacted the police. They
22 came an hour and a half later. Never heard from them
23 again. I had a car stolen back in the seventies.
24 Called the department up, also never heard from them
25 again. But one day I'm driving down the street with

1 my wife and a female police officer came off of a, a
2 ramp and hit is broadside. I saw her coming. I tried
3 to get away, swerved in the oncoming lane to give her
4 room --

5 DICK: Um-hum.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- but she still got me.
7 And within minutes, within minutes there's like six
8 squad cars there at her help. And what is going on?

9 DICK: Well --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Do you know what I'm saying?

11 DICK: Absolutely, I know exactly.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: You always find police
13 officers if you're two, two miles an hour over the law
14 going down the road but when I've ever called them
15 because of theft or because of other problems,
16 seriously, I don't know what's happened.

17 DICK: Okay. Well, let me ask you --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: I really don't know what's
19 happened.

20 DICK: -- you mean you've only gotten one
21 ticket in your life?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, no, of course not.

23 DICK: Okay. Well, how many times? I mean,
24 this is obviously a very minor point. But --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: But, you know, you

1 understand what I'm saying.

2 DICK: -- many of the times that you've
3 done -- broken the law -- I mean, let me say this. We
4 all speed. But how many times we've been picked up
5 for speeding because there's nobody there? We -- we,
6 and I'm going to say loosely law enforcement in
7 general, we have only so much ability to address all
8 these problems and please don't hold us to --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, I don't. I'm just
10 saying overall what the problem is, it starts at a
11 very small level of course is what I'm saying.

12 DICK: But, but I understand that. The rest
13 of the law-enforcement people understand that. You
14 know --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm sure they do because --

16 DICK: -- sure we do.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- they're involved in the
18 same process --

19 DICK: Exactly.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- the same society and, you
21 know, I mean it, it goes for everyone of course.

22 DICK: It's, it's, it's something -- you
23 know, we would love to address all crime. Let's face
24 it --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: True, true.

1 DICK: -- we can't do it.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I agree.

3 DICK: Absolutely cannot do it. So what we
4 have to do is prioritize certain things and deal with
5 it as best we can with the resources available to us,
6 you know?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

7 DICK: And what I might want to address and
8 what my bosses might want to address are two different
9 things. In much the same way you probably have some
10 difference of opinion with, with, with David don't
11 you?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, by the way, Dick, I
13 wanted to let you know they're back with, with the
14 supplies --

14 DICK: Okay. Good.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- inside the building.

16 DICK: Is that, is that, is that what you're
17 looking for?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Whoops, someone just stepped
19 on the cord.

19 DICK: Okay.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Now, what were you
21 saying? I didn't hear that.

22 DICK: Well, I'm just saying that's, that's
23
24
25

1 | what you're looking for?

2 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Apparently so. I --

3 | DICK: Okay. Take a look at those pictures.

4 | I think you'll be happy with them. I, I hope --

5 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

6 | DICK: -- what it does is make the, the
parents feel good in there. Okay?

7 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm sure it will.

8 | DICK: It will.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: We'll hook it up to the --

10 | DICK: Okay. Well, why don't you go ahead
and take a look at that and --

11 | MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

12 | DICK: -- I'll get back to you in a short
13 | time and tell David that I -- you know, I appreciate
14 | talking to him, I'd like to talk to him again --

15 | MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

16 | DICK: -- when we get back and listen, it's
17 | been good talking to you.

18 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. He's worn out from
that conversation already. He's already sleeping.

19 | DICK: Well, I hope that's not true because
20 | I think we can work together all three of us.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, what I mean is -

22 | - DICK: Oh, you mean physically --

23 |

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you know --

2 DICK: -- he just --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

4 DICK: -- he has a difficult --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly. Exactly.

6 DICK: Okay. Well, hey, let him -- you got
the --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: We'll let him rest for a
8 little while. I'll come --

9 DICK: Well, that or, or --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- back and peek in on him
and (indiscernible).

11 DICK: Okay. Or get, get the cord over to
12 him, phone over to him there. But listen --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, it is. The phone is
14 right by him.

15 DICK: Okay. You take -- make sure he gets
16 some treatment there --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

18 DICK: -- that he needs with that, with that
19 kit there. And take a look at those -- I think that
20 you'll be happy with what, what, what I've got done
for you and, and I hope so --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

22 DICK: -- because that was not an easy thing
23

1 to do. You know, I -- we pushed for that.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: What? Medical supplies?

3 DICK: Well, the, the medical supplies. But
4 I'm talking more, more about the, the, the kids. We
5 felt that that was absolutely necessary to, to get
6 that stuff to the parents. And frankly, I went out on
7 a limb for you.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, obviously from your
9 point of view you guys are working on a
10 psychologically emotional perspective also between the
11 children and the parents so it's not only --

12 DICK: What we're working on --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- it's not only that
14 you're --

15 DICK: -- is human understanding --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

17 DICK: -- and concern.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, let's --
19 bottom line is you would like us to come out and
20 so -- and I agree with you. If I was in your, your
21 chair sitting there also, I understand, I understand
22 from every perspective and I feel --

23 DICK: Well, let's look at it from the human
24 perspective rather than --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's -- we are --

1 DICK: -- you want to do this, we want to do
2 that.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, no, you're
4 right, that's what we are doing. We are doing that.

5 DICK: Okay. Well, let's, let's continue
6 to, to talk --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

8 DICK: -- like that and we'll get it done.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: We will, Dick, we will.

10 DICK: Won't we?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: We sure will.

12 DICK: Darn right. All right.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Appreciate -- in calling --

14 DICK: We'll be back to you.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Real good. Thanks,
16 Dick.

17 DICK: Bye now.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good-bye.

19 * * * * *

20 SHERRIE: Hello?

21 DICK: Hi. This is Dick. Who's this?

22 SHERRIE: This is Sherrie.

23 DICK: Sherrie, how are you?

24 SHERRIE: Fine.

25 DICK: Good. Did you get those pictures of

1 your kids

2 SHERRIE: Yes.

3 DICK: Good. What did you think of them?

4 SHERRIE: Great.

5 DICK: Good. They lessen your concern a
6 little bit?

7 SHERRIE: A little, but the, the tape seems
8 to be blank.

9 DICK: Oh, come on don't tell me that. The
10 tape is blank?

11 SHERRIE: Yeah, yeah.

12 DICK: Oh, come on.

13 SHERRIE: Just a minute. Let me get the
14 guys that were working with it. Just a minute.

15 DICK: Okay.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1 (IN
17 BACKGROUND): It's three minutes and so many second
18 long. Got all the kids on there. Wasn't blank this
19 morning.

20 DICK: I assume we ran it before we sent it
21 out. We all saw it.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: We all saw
23 it.

24 DICK: I mean, they were transferred over
25 though.

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: That was a
2 copy that the tech guys gave me. They said, "Here's a
3 copy." That's right.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: Did they
5 rewind it to the stops?

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: That's
7 possible. They said, "Here, here's a copy of that
8 tape and here's the other tape. I have the, the -- "

9 DICK: Rewind it all the way back -- I
10 assume that they tested the copy they gave. Yeah.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

12 DICK: Yeah.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello, Dick.

14 DICK: Hey, Steve. You're going to tell me
15 that that thing is blank, that tape?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, it is.

17 DICK: Did you run it back to the stops, all
18 the way back?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, all the way back.

20 DICK: And you played it and --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

22 DICK: -- and, and you see nothing on there?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Nothing's on it. We tried a
24 couple of VCRs. We took a couple of videos we had
25 that were, you know, purchased, regular VHS videos.

1 They worked but this didn't.

2 DICK: Well, that's, that's hard for me to
3 believe.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I -- strange, it is. In
5 fact --

6 DICK: I'm telling you, sometimes it's
7 exasperating to try to work things out because --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know, I know. In fact, we
9 thought maybe it might be at the very end of the tape.
10 It looked like kind of a long tape, maybe a two-hour
11 tape so --

12 DICK: No, no, it, it should have been at
13 the beginning of the thing.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

15 DICK: But, but that, that is --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know weird things --

17 DICK: I'm going to talk with some, with
18 some people to see what --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, weird things do happen
20 because I once did a nice video and I went back,
21 looked it over and then rewound it once. And then I
22 handed it to a guy. He told me there was nothing on
23 it. I said, what? I said, I just went and checked
24 the whole thing through. This was like six months
25 ago. And the same thing had happened to me so --

1 DICK: No, that, that shouldn't happen this
2 time and I'll apologize for that --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's okay.

4 DICK: -- and work on it. How --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's all right.

6 DICK: -- how about the pictures now?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: The pictures --

8 DICK: The pictures --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- yeah, they're --

10 obviously they're here and they're the --

11 DICK: Okay.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- mothers and the different
13 ones are looking at them and --

14 DICK: Good.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and I think they're happy
16 with what they see.

17 DICK: Good. Well, I'll tell you what. Let
18 me -- you know, once you and I have spent some time
19 together --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

21 DICK: -- why don't you let me talk to those
22 folks. I want to make them know that we're real
23 concerned about their kids and I'll do whatever I can
24 to make them feel a little better about that? How
25 about David's stuff?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, in fact, right now
2 he's sleeping.

3 DICK: Okay, but he did get some of the --
4 get the stuff that he needed there?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. They pulled it in. I
6 don't think -- I think some of the nurses they pulled
7 it out of the box, looked it over. I think it's like
8 you say it's something they can use and --

8 DICK: Okay.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: But they, they are not --
10 they, they want to let him finish sleeping and then as
11 soon as he wakes up --

12 DICK: They'll fix him up?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

14 DICK: Okay.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, thank you for that also.

16 DICK: Well --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I really appreciate it.

18 DICK: -- all right. We're, we're trying to
19 work with you, we're trying to work with you.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know you are, I know you
21 are.

22 DICK: Well, good. The kids, kids are --
23 they're doing well, they really are.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I believe that. I, I
25

1 | could tell and even by the -- they had a -- I believe
2 | it was some of the social workers there on TV? I just
3 | got to catch the last part of that and I -- from what
4 | I heard they, they stated a few fairly decent things.

5 |
6 | DICK: Okay. Well, I knew that they were
7 | going to attempt to do that. I didn't realize it was
8 | going to be on TV already.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

10 | DICK: But I know -- you know, I don't want
11 | to be redundant, okay?

12 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

13 | DICK: But I do know that everybody is
14 | concerned about the welfare of those kids.

15 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

16 | DICK: I suppose to a degree, you know, that
17 | welfare can be reached by different means and, and
18 | there may be some honest and, and legitimate
19 | differences of opinion there.

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

21 | DICK: But I know we're all concerned about
22 | the kids and getting those kids to their loved ones.

23 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

24 | DICK: And it may not be done today or
25 | tomorrow, but it'll be done as quickly as we can sort

1 this out.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

3 DICK: And you got to -- you have to bear
4 with us.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- you, you are sure about
6 that yourself then? It doesn't seem like there would
7 be a problem ultimately for them to get
(indiscernible)

8 DICK: Oh, yeah, ultimately. Listen -- our,
9 our ultimate goal and hope that is that they're going
10 to be reunited with, with their actual parents.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

12 DICK: And, and, and, you know --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 DICK: -- we've, we've I think indicated
15 that and, and it will happen.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

17 DICK: It's a question of, you know --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: But you would know more
19 about that from, you know, the lawful point of view
20 than I would --

21 DICK: Yeah.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- never being involved in
23 such --

24 DICK: Well, let's face it. The, the
25

1 parents are -- everybody wants their -- unless there's
2 some absolute reason that somebody's an unfit parent -
3 -

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah.

5 DICK: -- and I certainly don't get any
6 indication of that from --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly, right.

8 DICK: -- from anybody that we've dealt with
9 here.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: This is true.

11 DICK: Yeah.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm sure of that.

13 DICK: Well, good, good.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

15 DICK: Good.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

17 DICK: Well, when are you going to me
18 something? Are you going to do something for me now?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: What do you have in mind?

20 DICK: Huh?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: What do you have in mind?

22 DICK: Come on out.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Come on out?

24 DICK: Listen, I, I just, I just want you to
25 feel good about with, with the kids, okay?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know, I know.

2 DICK: Okay.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: To tell you -- well, it's --
4 I've never -- I mean, this is -- obviously this is a
5 very strange predicament to be in and I wish it would
6 have never happened. Like none of us here ever
7 dreamed of such a thing. But at the same time we're
8 still waiting to see what he might have to say. We
9 want to give him that opportunity -- the very reason
we're in here in the first place.

10 DICK: Okay.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: So --

12 DICK: Well, and Steve, we can work this
13 out, you know?

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I'm sure we can. I'm
15 sure we can.

16 DICK: You know, you might have to take it
17 on yourself to -- if, if that's your belief and, and
18 maybe you and Dave can work this thing out between
19 you.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I've been talking with
21 him and communicating with him as -- you know, as
22 frequently as I can because --

23 DICK: Um-hum.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- of his health problem,
25

1 but --

2 DICK: Sure. Well, he's going to need some
3 help from you obviously. He can't do it all himself.

4 You know, that's, that's why for instance, you know,
5 Henry's been here and --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

7 DICK: -- and Jim has been here and, and
8 I've been here because, you know, we can't -- it can't
9 be done by, by yourself.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

11 DICK: David can't do it by himself. He
12 needs some, some, some assistance and some support
13 from you. And, you know, I'm hoping that we can work
14 these things out between us.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, we definitely want to
16 do that, want to try. So, you know, we'll keep on
17 communicating, keeping the lines open and --

18 DICK: You know, one, one thing I, I'd like
19 you bear in mind here --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

21 DICK: -- okay, I've gone to bat for you on
22 a couple of these different things and I think they've
23 worked out and you've indicated as such and, you know,
24 I need you to go to bat for me between the two of us,
25 you know? I need you to go to bat for me. I want to

1 be able to tell me boss that listen, I got this done
2 and in return they, they were grateful and --
3 something for me.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I realize -- you know, I
5 realize that the part you play from your position and,
6 you know, your office that that's normally what you
7 would do. And I -- in fact, like I told you if I was
8 in your shoes I'd be doing the best I could --

9 DICK: Um-hum.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- to alleviate anything, to
11 break down the barriers to get it taken care of,
12 everyone to come out. And normally I'm with you on
13 that. But the situation is, you know, right now I
14 would like to do anything I can for you. If you have
15 a request I'll tell you I'll try to. But it still
16 comes down to the people are here not really to listen
17 to me so much, but they're here because they heard
18 this man open up the Bible, see, and that's where the
19 conviction lies.

20 DICK: Well, I know that.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, just so you
22 basically understand that's -- it's pretty hard to go
23 against an individual's convictions of things that --

24 DICK: Oh, and I don't --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

1 DICK: -- and I'm not asking you to go --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I know you didn't say
3 it --

4 DICK: No, no.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I know you didn't. You
6 didn't imply it --

7 DICK: No.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- not to say that you even
9 did.

10 DICK: No, but you know, it's been my --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: But see, that's what I'm
12 saying. See, that's where the difficulty lies for --

13 DICK: Oh, I know that. But it's also been
14 my experience that when people -- they'll listen to
15 reason and reason is all we're asking for here.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you're going to find
17 these are the most reasonable -- if you wanted to
18 speak with anyone here you can get any kind of a
19 discussion you would like with them --

20 DICK: Um-hum.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- asking questions, making
22 points and --

23 DICK: Sure. You know what? That's, that's
24 a good idea because, you know, I, I indicated earlier
25 I think I wanted to talk to each and every one of

1 these folks to make sure that they feel comfortable
2 with what we've been able to do with their kids.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure -- in fact, you know, I
4 told them --

5 DICK: Okay.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- even the last few days,
7 David did, anyone that would like to talk with anyone
8 on the phone feel free to do so.

9 DICK: Okay. Well, let's do that. Why, why
10 don't you let me talk to the gal I was speaking with
11 earlier. She was going to see if that tape worked.
12 Listen, if that tape doesn't work --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Who was -- I, I didn't know
14 who it was because I was in another part of the
15 building.

16 DICK: Sherrie.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sherrie?

18 DICK: Yeah, the mother of one of the kids.
19 And you know what we're going to do? You guys go
20 ahead and fiddle with that tape some more so you're
21 quite convinced and we'll send you down another one
22 and this time we'll make sure that we'll get one that
23 works.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I would imagine you must
25 have a copy. That was maybe a copy of another one

1 | you --

2 | DICK: Yeah.

3 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. That's good. That's
4 | strange.

5 | DICK: Yeah, yeah. And you know who, who
6 | we're particularly concerned about too is Sita because
7 | I know she was very concerned about her kids and had
8 | sent some Bibles out and the kids' dolls.

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh.

9 | DICK: So I certainly would like to speak to
10 | her. And --

11 | MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, I'm in a place
12 | right now -- usually this time of day there's --
13 | everybody is around.

13 | DICK: Um-hum.

14 | MR. SCHNEIDER: They're like on top of you -

15 | - DICK: Okay.

16 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- it's hard to hear. But
17 | right now no one's even around where I'm sitting.

18 | DICK: Okay. Well, I'll tell you what.

18 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah?

19 | DICK: Why don't you, why don't you go round
20 | those folks up and I'll call you back in 15 minutes?

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. We can do that.

22 | DICK: How's that? Can we do that?

23 |

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Let me see now. I'm trying
2 to take a look to see where some of these people might
3 be. If you would you could pass the word that there's
4 an FBI agent by the name of Dick. He's a negotiator.
5 He's very open. He wants to give people an
6 opportunity to talk with him or if they'd like to ask
7 him questions, he'd like to give them some offers.
8 Just --you know, he wants to be friendly with them and
9 see what he can do in their behalf. So, you know, if
there's any of the people around, you know --

10 (Indiscernible voices in background.)

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, yeah, right. Or even
12 now. If there's anybody now he's more than willing
13 and would like to talk to anybody.

14 (Indiscernible female voice in background.)

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, okay. They told me --
16 see, I didn't even realize the time but they said it
was worship hour.

17 DICK: Okay.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: From between 2:00 and 3:00
19 we just kind of sit down --

20 DICK: 2:00 and 3:00?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- read the -- yeah, right
22 at 3:00 or thereafter. I'll call you or you can call
me and I'll start trying to get something going.
