2 JOHN: -- reveal himself to all that were  
3 there to hear.

4 DAVID: No.

5 JOHN: What?

6 DAVID: No, he didn't.

7 JOHN: Why, why do you say that?

8 DAVID: It says neither his brethren  
9 believed on him.

10 JOHN: It doesn't -- I don't say that they  
11 believed in him. I said but he was there --

12 DAVID: He gave many infallible proofs --

13 JOHN: To reveal.

14 DAVID: It says though he gave many  
15 infallible proofs, yet they believed not on him. He  
16 could become convincing.

17 JOHN: That, that doesn't mean he's not  
18 giving them the opportunity to listen and the  
19 opportunity --

20 DAVID: Exactly. Exactly.

21 JOHN: -- to hear.

22 DAVID: Well, that's what I'm doing.

23 JOHN: And, and you're saying no, he didn't.

24 DAVID: I am saying, clearly, as the record  
25 records, this is some homework for you, Matthew, Mark,

1 Luke, and John. Look and see.

2 JOHN: Uh-huh.

3 DAVID: You've got a good mind. Search the  
4 scriptures.

5 (Ringing sound.)

6 DAVID: So, it says here thou hast put  
7 gladness in my heart more than a time their corn and  
8 wine were increased. I'll both lay me down in peace  
9 and sleep, for thou, Lord, only makes me to dwell in  
10 safety. So, I'm waiting for this, waiting on my  
11 father's next answer.

12 JOHN: Um-hum.

13 DAVID: You know, I'm resting quite well  
14 now, okay? Now, let's turn here to Psalms 18 and find  
15 out how this is going to work out. Okay? This is  
16 what I'm trying to keep from happening to, to you. I  
17 mean, I call you brethren, you know. These, these  
18 young ATF agents who lost their life out of this, if  
19 you play your cards right they'll be back shortly.  
20 Promised. I know you can't believe that right now.

21 JOHN: That's like you're, you're coming out  
22 immediately. What does shortly mean?

23 DAVID: (Chuckling.) Okay, John.

24 JOHN: Huh? A matter of --

25 DAVID: Don't, don't --

1                   JOHN:  -- semantics here?

2                   DAVID:  -- don't keep poking.  Let's learn  
3 some stuff.  Now, let's hear God.  This is God's word.  
4   Don't worry about me.  I'm just a fool.

5                   JOHN:  No, you just told me the Lo-- you're  
6 the Lord.

7                   DAVID:  Did I tell you the Lord or did God  
8 say no one can reveal the seals but the lamb?

9                   JOHN:  You told me you are the Lord, did you  
10 not?

11                   DAVID:  I did say that --

12                   JOHN:  Oh, yes.

13                   DAVID:  -- hoping you would see that in the  
14 Psalms 45 --

15                   JOHN:  Well, we're up to 18 right now.

16                   DAVID:  Okay.  Now, I love the Lord.  Why?  
17 He's my what?  Strength.  The Lord is my rock, my  
18 fortress, my deliverer, my God, my strength in whom I  
19 will trust, my buckler and the horn of my salvation,  
20 my high tower.  People keep wondering how I knew  
21 you'all guys were coming.  Well, I got a high tower,  
22 right?

23                   JOHN:  Um-hum.

24                   DAVID:  But not the one you think.  I will  
25 call upon the Lord --

1 JOHN: Well, you have two high towers.

2 DAVID: Well --

3 JOHN: Right?

4 DAVID: Not the one --

5 JOHN: The physical one and the one that  
6 isn't.

7 DAVID: The one who sees all things before  
8 they happen.

9 JOHN: The spiritual one.

10 DAVID: Exactly. I will call upon the Lord  
11 who is worthy to be praised. So shall I be saved from  
12 mine enemies. The sorrows of death can pass me and  
13 the floods of ungodly men made me afraid. The sorrows  
14 of hell can pass me about and the snares of death  
15 prevented me, prevented me from what? Well, what am I  
16 trying to do? I'm trying to teach something, aren't  
17 I. In my distress I call upon the Lord and cried unto  
18 my God. He heard my voice out of his temple. Do you  
19 know what that temple is? It's a long ways off but  
20 it's very close by. And my ears, his cry came before  
21 him even to his ears.

22 JOHN: Back up a little there.

23 DAVID: Go ahead.

24 JOHN: The temple.

25 DAVID: Uh-huh.

1                   JOHN: In my distress called upon the Lord  
2 and cried unto my God and he heard my voice -- out of  
3 his temple?

4                   DAVID: Uh-huh. That's where he's at right  
5 now --

6                   JOHN: Okay.

7                   DAVID: -- sitting on the throne.

8                   JOHN: All right.

9                   DAVID: Same as in Psalms 2. He that  
10 sitteth in heaven shall laugh. I mean, he's laughing  
11 right now at ya'll and I'm --

12                   JOHN: He's laughing at who?

13                   DAVID: He's laughing at ya'll.

14                   JOHN: Why do you say that?

15                   DAVID: Because --

16                   JOHN: We're his children too, aren't we?

17                   DAVID: Well, only if you believe his word,  
18 for he who is of God heareth God's word. Now --

19                   JOHN: Now, do you believe -- do you think  
20 and believe me when I tell you I believe in, in the  
21 Lord?

22                   DAVID: Well, you believe in what you know  
23 of the Lord.

24                   JOHN: And in salvation?

25                   DAVID: But, see, you believe --

1 JOHN: And in the resurrection?  
2 DAVID: You -- okay. You believe --  
3 JOHN: And in the Ten Commandments?  
4 DAVID: Well, what about the other  
5 commandments?  
6 JOHN: Do you believe in the Ten  
7 Commandments?  
8 DAVID: Oh, yes, I do. Now, with God --  
9 JOHN: All of them?  
10 DAVID: Yes, I do. When God says thou shalt  
11 not kill, he meant Israel. Of course, the Lord  
12 commanded Israel to destroy the heathen, didn't he?  
13 JOHN: He meant Israel?  
14 DAVID: Didn't he?  
15 JOHN: He, he --  
16 DAVID: Are you telling me that Moses and  
17 Israel did not kill the heathen?  
18 JOHN: Well, sure.  
19 DAVID: Okay. So, exactly, you agree then  
20 --  
21 JOHN: Well, when he said thou shalt not  
22 kill, he --  
23 DAVID: He --  
24 JOHN: -- means thou shalt not kill, doesn't  
25 he?

1                   DAVID: He -- well, then why did he command  
2 to offer the sacrifices then? You have to interpret  
3 what God tells you when God tells you as God tells  
4 you.

5                   JOHN: Um-hum.

6                   DAVID: Now, God did not talk to you. He  
7 spake to Moses (indiscernible) he spake to Israel.  
8 Now, today --

9                   JOHN: Well, he speaks to me. When I go to  
10 church, he speaks to me a little closer, doesn't he?

11                   DAVID: I don't think so.

12                   JOHN: What -- how can you say that?

13                   DAVID: Well, because you're just -- do you  
14 want to learn these Psalms or do you want to scoff?

15                   JOHN: Go ahead.

16                   DAVID: Okay.

17                   JOHN: I'm not scoffing you.

18                   DAVID: In my distress I called upon the  
19 Lord and cried unto my God. He heard me at -- my  
20 voice out of his temple. My cry came before me into  
21 his ears.

22                   JOHN: Uh-huh.

23                   DAVID: Then the, then the earth shook and  
24 trembled. You ever heard of the sixth seal? The  
25 foundations all through the hills were moved and were



1 shaken because he was wroth. Smoke out of his  
2 nostrils and fire out of his mouth devoured. Coals  
3 were kindled by it. He bowed the heavens also and  
4 came down and darkness was under his feet. He rode  
5 upon a cherub. See, the cherubs a masculine angel.  
6 Read Ezekiel when you get a chance. And did fly -- he  
7 did fly upon the wings of the wind. He made darkness  
8 his secret place, his pavilion. Round about him were  
9 dark waters and big clouds of the skies. And the  
10 brightest as before him as thick clouds passed,  
11 hailstones and coals of fire. The Lord also thundered  
12 in the heavens and the highest gave his voice.  
13 Hailstones and coals of fire. How did he talk to my  
14 enemies? Very physically.

15 JOHN: Um-hum.

16 DAVID: Yeah, he sent out his arrows and  
17 scattered them and he shut out lightning that  
18 discomfited them. And the channels of the waters were  
19 seen and the foundations of the world were discovered  
20 it by rebuke at the blast of the breath of my  
21 nostrils. He sent me from above. He took me. He  
22 drew me out of many waters. He delivered me from my  
23 strong enemy and from them which hated me, for they  
24 were too many for me. Oh, my. There's too many, huh?  
25 They prevented me the day of my calamity. Do you

1 know what a calamity is?

2 JOHN: Sure.

3 DAVID: What we're involved in now, isn't  
4 it?

5 JOHN: Yeah, it sure is.

6 DAVID: But the Lord was my stay. That's  
7 why in Psalms 2 it says yet have I set my king upon my  
8 Holy Hill of Zion. He brought me forth also onto a  
9 large place, which is back to the sea of glass. He  
10 delivered me because he delighted in me. The Lord  
11 rewarded me according to my righteousness, according  
12 to the cleanness of my hands hath he recompensed me.  
13 I have kept the ways of the Lord and have not wickedly  
14 departed from my God, for all these judgments, all  
15 seven seals were before me, and has not put away his  
16 statutes from me. I was also right before him and I  
17 kept myself from mine iniquity. You see, in one of  
18 those judgments God requires me to give up something,  
19 and I'll explain that later. Therefore, the Lord  
20 recompensed me according to my righteousness,  
21 according to the cleanness of my hands in his  
22 eyesight. Now --

23 JOHN: Yeah.

24 DAVID: -- with the merciful. Thou wilt  
25 show thyself merciful. Are you being merciful to me,

1 John?

2 JOHN: I sure am.

3 DAVID: God's going to be merciful with you  
4 then.

5 JOHN: Don't you think I am?

6 DAVID: So far. As an upright man thou wilt  
7 show thyself --

8 JOHN: Are you going to be merciful to me?

9 DAVID: Well, if you play your cards right  
10 I'm --

11 JOHN: Oh, no, no, no. Are you going to be  
12 merciful?

13 DAVID: I'm being merciful now and I'll  
14 remain to be merciful. But you --

15 JOHN: You know, because, basically, you're  
16 saying when, when you're giving your opinion you're  
17 instructing and when I say something to you you accuse  
18 me of scoffing, and I'm not doing that.

19 DAVID: No, no.

20 JOHN: Do you think I'm doing that?

21 DAVID: Do you see these words here?

22 JOHN: Huh? Answer me. Do you think I'm  
23 scoffing you?

24 DAVID: I know that you're scoffing.

25 JOHN: No. I'm really not. I'm trying to

1 understand what you have to say.

2           DAVID: With the merciful thou wilt show  
3 thyself merciful. Be merciful, John. That's what I'm  
4 trying to say.

5           JOHN: Well, I think I am.

6           DAVID: With an upright man thou wilt show  
7 thyself upright. With the pure thou wilt show thyself  
8 pure. And with the forward, those who interrupt and  
9 those who aren't learning, listening to learn, thou  
10 wilt show thyself forward. For thou wilt save the  
11 afflicted people. We're being afflicted right now,  
12 John, but thou wilt bring down high looks. Arrogancy  
13 seeks to be humbled. Why? For thou wilt light my  
14 candle. There are seven candles where I come from and  
15 I know clearly what light they shine. The Lord my God  
16 will light in my darkness --

17           JOHN: David, do you believe some  
18 afflictions can be brought upon people by their, their  
19 own actions, though?

20           DAVID: Oh, definitely. I mean, the actions  
21 of Christ got nothing but affliction upon him two  
22 thousand years ago.

23           JOHN: Sure. Sure.

24           DAVID: But his actions were justified and  
25 preordained by God.

1                   JOHN: How long did it take people to  
2 understand that?

3                   DAVID: Well, two thousand years they  
4 haven't --

5                   JOHN: Hey --

6                   DAVID: -- understood yet, have they?

7                   JOHN: Many haven't. Many haven't.

8                   DAVID: Some even today don't understand.  
9 For by thee have I run to a truth. Now, this is  
10 what's fixing to happen. And by my God have I leaped  
11 over a wall. For God, his way is perfect. You know  
12 those seven seals?

13                   JOHN: Um-hum.

14                   DAVID: The word of the Lord is tried. You  
15 need to learn those seals, John. He's a buckler to  
16 all those that trust in him, and a buckler is someone  
17 that prepares you for war. For who is God save the  
18 Lord and who is a Rock save our God? It is God that  
19 girdeth me with strength and maketh my way perfect.  
20 He maketh my feet like hind's feet. Now, here's the  
21 verse we need to look at. He setteth me upon my high  
22 places. He teacheth my hands to war so that a bow of  
23 steel is broken in my arms. Thou hast given me the  
24 shield of thy salvation and thy right hand is holding  
25 me up and thy gentleness hath made me great. Thus the

1 Lord has made steps under me that my feet did not  
2 slip. I have pursued mine enemies and overtaken them,  
3 neither did I turn again till they were consumed. I  
4 have wounded them that they were not able to rise.  
5 They are fallen under my feet. Well, thou hast girded  
6 me with strength unto the battle. Thou subdued under  
7 me those that rose up against me. Thou hast also  
8 given me the necks of mine enemies that I might  
9 destroy them that hate me. They cried, but there was  
10 none to save them. Even to the Lord, but he answered  
11 them not. Then that I beat them small as the dust  
12 before the wind. I did cast them out of the dirt in  
13 the street. Thou hast delivered me from the strivings  
14 of the people. Thou hast made me the head of the  
15 heathen. Sometimes through violence you have to teach  
16 people a lesson, John. You know that.

15 JOHN: Are, are you trying to tell me  
16 something here, David?

17 DAVID: Is God telling you something through  
18 this prophecy? Do you know who has the key of David?  
19 Do you know who has opened the Psalm up to you  
20 forewarning you of the events that I am trying to keep  
21 you from fulfilling?

21 JOHN: Um-hum.

22 DAVID: People whom I have not known shall  
23  
24

1 | serve me. Not everybody knows me. But they're fixing  
2 | to know me. But I wish we could do it the first way.

3 | As soon as they hear of me they shall obey me and --

4 |           JOHN: Why do you say you wish we could do  
5 | it the first --

6 |           DAVID: Well --

7 |           JOHN: -- way?

8 |           DAVID: Let me keep explaining.

9 |           JOHN: What, what makes you think we can't?

10 |           DAVID: Well, because you'all jumped in on  
11 | top of me. Let me explain. The stranger shall submit  
12 | themselves unto me. The stranger shall fade away and  
13 | be afraid of their close places. The Lord liveth and  
14 | blessed be my rock. Let the God of my salvation be  
15 | exalted. It is God that avengeth me and subdueth the  
16 | people unto me. Save me from mine enemies. Yea, thou  
17 | liftest me up above those that rise up against me.  
18 | Thus, deliver me from the violent man. Therefore will  
19 | I give thanks unto thee, O Lord, among the heathen and  
20 | sing praises unto thy name. Great deliverance giveth  
21 | he unto his king and showeth mercy unto his anointed,  
22 | to David and to his seed forever more. Now, these  
23 | events of the sun and the stars being darkened of the  
24 | sixth seal, we're right now in the fifth seal. In the  
25 | times that I have -- as it says in the Psalms, my

1 times are in my hand -- I have an allotted amount of  
2 time to teach the people who wish to know the seals.  
3 And as we turn from the fourth and go into the fifth  
4 seal, no longer is the beast assist the opening of the  
5 fifth, sixth, and seventh seal. Why?

6 JOHN: No longer is what? I'm sorry.

7 DAVID: Well, you see, when the first four  
8 seals are opened in heaven, one of the beasts they  
9 come and see. Now, if you understood the mystery of  
10 the beasts, then you would understand the story of a  
11 great king called Nebekenezzer --

12 JOHN: Um-hum.

13 DAVID: -- and how God has foretold him of  
14 the rise and fall of empires, how that in the time of  
15 the end these empires be brought unto a judgment.  
16 Well, we are fulfilling a prophecy. And the world who  
17 knows it not, naturally it's going to scoff.  
18 Naturally it's going to make decisions contrary to the  
19 will of God. Now, how can they know what they're  
20 doing if the words of truth are hid from them? Well,  
21 how come they haven't been studying the scriptures?  
22 All of this time has been given. At least the past  
23 five hundred years. Especially America. How come men  
24 having known that when there's time no longer a  
25 mystery of God will be finished. Has God declared to



1 his servants, the prophets? How come your church and  
2 your ministries didn't forewarn you of these things?  
3 Let's turn to the Book of Nahum now. This is more  
4 meaty. But it'll explain something about your little  
5 chariots and stuff out here. The prophets are  
6 considered mysteries to many because when the prophets  
7 wrote of the events, they had to describe things they  
8 saw in the future by things that they were familiar  
9 with in their day. Do you understand that statement,  
10 John?

11 JOHN: Oh, I'm trying to find the Book of  
12 Nahum. Hang on.

13 DAVID: Okey-doke.

14 JOHN: Probably going the wrong direction.

15 DAVID: Okay. You keep going to the right  
16 towards the end of the book. It's, it's in the  
17 prophetic writings. You got Ezekiel, Daniel --

18 JOHN: Gotch ya.

19 DAVID: It's after Daniel.

20 JOHN: Okay. Gotch ya.

21 DAVID: Okay.

22 JOHN: Go ahead. I'm sorry. I didn't -- I  
23 was trying to find this and you were saying something.  
24 It's like me trying to chew gum and walk. Give me a  
25 break.

1                   DAVID: Okay.

2                   JOHN: Go ahead. I'm at the Book of Nahum.  
3 And you were saying something.

4                   DAVID: Okay. I'm trying to find it myself.  
5 Anyway, the book starts off with God as jealous,  
6 right?

7                   JOHN: Yes.

8                   DAVID: God is furious. The Lord revengeth,  
9 right?

10                  JOHN: Um-hum.

11                  DAVID: Okay.

12                  JOHN: Did you find it?

13                  DAVID: Yeah. I've got it.

14                  JOHN: Okay.

15                  DAVID: Because I usually just -- I just  
16 usually quote these books, because I -- my book, my  
17 book is not like your books either. So, anyway. This  
18 is the vision of Nahum, burden of Nineveh. God is  
19 jealous, the Lord revengeth. The Lord revengeth and  
20 is furious. Now, why would God be jealous for?  
21 Remember, every thought of God harmonizes with every  
22 thought of God. Remember in Psalms 45 God said he  
23 thought his son was the fairest of men? Remember  
24 that?

25                  JOHN: Um-hum.

1                   DAVID: Maybe some may not think that. But,  
2 anyway, God being jealous, the Lord revengeth, the  
3 Lord of vision is furious. The Lord will take  
4 vengeance on his adversaries. Remember in Psalms 2  
5 the heathen raged and they go against God's word? And  
6 he said to his anointed let's break his bands of son?  
7 And they don't want those seals, do they?

7                   JOHN: Hmm.

8                   DAVID: He reserveth wrath for his enemies.  
9 The Lord is slow to anger and great in power, that  
10 will not at all acquit the wicked. Okay? The Lord  
11 hath his way in the whirlwind. Remember Psalms 18?

12                   JOHN: Um-hum.

13                   DAVID: And the storm and the clouds are the  
14 dust of his feet. Remember Psalms 18? We just read  
15 it, didn't we? He rebuketh the sea and maketh it dry  
16 and dries up all the rivers. Bashan languisheth and  
17 Carmel and the flower of Lebanon languisheth. The  
18 mountains quake in him and the hills melt. The earth  
19 is burned at his presence. Yea, the world and all  
20 they that dwell therein. Who can stand before his  
21 indignation? Who can abide of the fierceness of his  
22 anger? His fury is poured out like fire and the rocks  
23 are thrown down by him. A person you don't want to  
24 get on the wrong side of, right?  
25

1                   JOHN:  Yep.

2                   DAVID:  But the Lord is good though, John.  
3 Even though he's -- can get angry, he is good.  A  
4 stronghold in the day of trouble.  He knoweth them  
5 that trust in him.  You know, you trust in the father,  
6 don't you?  You trust in his word, don't you?  You  
7 know that the lamb is going to come and reveal the  
8 seals, don't you?  But with an overrunning flood he  
9 will make an utter end of the place thereof.  Darkness  
10 shall pursue his enemies.  Now, what do you imagine  
11 against the Lord?  He will make an utter end.  
12 Affliction shall not rise up a second time.  Huh?  
13 Second time.  Remember two thousand years ago?

14                   JOHN:  How many times have affliction risen  
15 up?

16                   DAVID:  Now, remember --

17                   JOHN:  You, you were saying it's only risen  
18 one time.  You --

19                   DAVID:  Wait a minute.

20                   JOHN:  Right?

21                   DAVID:  Wait a minute.  This affliction  
22 revolves around with verse 15.  Behold up on the  
23 mountain the feet of him that bringeth good tidings.  
24 Okay?  This affliction deals with God being jealous  
25 and the Lord revenging.  He knows, and the trust in

1 him. This has something to do with God and the seven  
2 seals, a message for the latter days. Watch and I'll  
3 show you. Now, those whose thoughts, according to  
4 Psalms 2, are contrary to God's thoughts, they imagine  
5 an evil against the Lord. He'll make an utter end.  
6 Affliction shall not rise up again the second time.  
7 Two thousand years ago when Christ came the first  
8 time, did they not imagine evil against the Lord? Did  
9 they not choose to crucify him?

10 JOHN: Well, we all know what happened.

11 DAVID: Okay. And affliction did rise up,  
12 didn't it? But we have a promise not the second time.

13 For while they be thrown together as thorns -- you  
14 know the wicked are a bunch of thorns, right? And  
15 while they are drunken as drunkards, these people are  
16 out of their minds. They shall be devoured as stubble  
17 fully dried. They're going to be burned. There is  
18 one come out of thee -- and as I'm talking to you  
19 right now, this is happening -- that imagineth evil  
20 against the Lord, a wicked counsellor. Thus sayeth  
21 the Lord, though they be quiet and likewise many -- I  
22 mean, outside they're very quiet out here, aren't  
23 they? But there's many of them, isn't there? Yeah,  
24 there's a lot of them. Yet thus shall they be cut  
25 down when he shall pass through. Hey, my father's

1 coming to pay a visit. I know you don't believe that  
2 yet, but let's keep learning and maybe you might.  
3 Though I've afflicted thee, I will afflict thee no  
4 more. Talking about us right here. For now will I  
5 break his yoke from off thee and I will burst thy  
6 bonds asunder. See, y'all have got this yoke on me  
7 right now. You know, you --

7 JOHN: No, no, no.

8 DAVID: -- call me --

9 JOHN: -- no.

10 DAVID: -- you call me the --

11 JOHN: That's your interpretation of it.

12 DAVID: Well, now, exactly. Let me explain  
13 why. Let's finish the book before we make our  
14 opinions out. It says here, this is a conversation  
15 between somebody and somebody. It's a situation of  
16 somebody having a yoke on somebody else and someone  
17 says I'm going to break thy bonds asunder and I'm  
18 going to deliver you. And the Lord hath given a  
19 commandment --

18 JOHN: Wait. Why do you say we have a yoke  
19 on you? Huh?

20 DAVID: Look, you're being judged by my law  
21 right now and you're not afraid. And you're telling  
22 me to come out and be judged by your law. And I'm  
23  
24  
25

1 trying to tell you that I would more than love to be  
2 judged by your law.

3 JOHN: But it's your law, too.

4 DAVID: No.

5 JOHN: Yes, it is.

6 DAVID: See, my law comes from a God above  
7 this world. You don't understand yet, John.

8 JOHN: Well, sure I understand. I  
9 understand that we're all going to be judged by our  
10 actions. We're going to be --

11 DAVID: Exactly. Right now.

12 JOHN: -- judged by our deeds.

13 DAVID: Your case -- every thought of your  
14 mind is being judged right now.

15 JOHN: Well, that's for --

16 DAVID: In regards --

17 JOHN: -- everyone.

18 DAVID: -- in re-- in regards to the way  
19 you're --

20 JOHN: That's --

21 DAVID: -- dealing with this truth.

22 JOHN: That, that -- you're, you're trying  
23 to say, you know, you think that I'm, I'm trying to be  
24 facetious about it or something. I'm not.

25 DAVID: No, I'm not.

1 JOHN: I'm, I'm being serious.

2 DAVID: Okay.

3 JOHN: I'm trying to be. And we will all be  
4 judged --

5 DAVID: At the judgment --

6 JOHN: -- not only by the Lord, right? Will  
7 we? Don't you believe that?

8 DAVID: How does Christ judge? He reveals  
9 truth. I've come to give you my reward. Do you want  
10 the knowledge that I have ahead of time? You want to  
11 escape -- (Unidentified voices in background not  
discernible.) -- from making a wrong step --

12 JOHN: Sure.

13 DAVID: -- a wrong decision?

14 JOHN: Sure.

15 DAVID: Okay. The Lord hath given a  
16 commandment concerning thee that no more thy name be  
17 sown out of the house of thy gods. I will cut off the  
18 graven image of the molten images. I will make thy  
19 grave for thou are vile. Up on the mountains --  
20 behold up on the mountains the phoenix hand that  
21 bringeth good tides that publisheth peace. O Judah,  
22 keep thy solemn feast. Perform thy vows, for the  
wicked shall no more pass through these, early cut  
off. He that dasheth in pieces has come up before thy

1 face. Okay. Here you guys are. Want to dash us to  
2 pieces, right?

3 JOHN: No. How many times did I tell you  
4 not?

5 DAVID: Okay. But you already started,  
6 though.

7 JOHN: But you don't listen to me, do you?

8 DAVID: You already started. You came in  
9 through the gate just like the prophet says. You came  
10 --

11 JOHN: No. What I said --

12 DAVID: -- in through the gate --

13 JOHN: -- is what happened happened and we  
14 all regret --

15 DAVID: And you can --

16 JOHN: -- what happened.

17 DAVID: -- feel. Now, watch. This will  
18 explain exactly the very moves you made already.

19 JOHN: Let, let me ask you something and  
20 then continue, okay?

21 DAVID: Go ahead.

22 JOHN: Let me just ask you something. Are  
23 you telling me -- and, and I just want you to clarify  
24 it. That's all.

25 DAVID: Go ahead.

1                   JOHN: Are you telling me that you are not  
2 answerable to the Constitution of the United States  
3 and the laws of the lands of the United States?

4                   DAVID: I am answerable to the laws as far  
5 as you can see, but I'm also --

6                   JOHN: No, no. You're not answering the  
7 question.

8                   DAVID: Yes, I am.

9                   JOHN: Are you answerable only to the law of  
10 God or are you answerable to the Constitution of the  
11 United States?

12                   DAVID: United States.

13                   JOHN: Okay.

14                   DAVID: And to God's law.

15                   JOHN: But you're not willing to be judged  
16 by that law.

17                   DAVID: Yes, I am. I told you, I'm ready to  
18 come.

19                   JOHN: But you said I have this yoke around  
20 you.

21                   DAVID: Well, what hap--

22                   JOHN: And I'm telling you that you can walk  
23 out that door any time you want. However, you have  
24 told me that you're waiting to hear the word, and I'm  
25 not arguing with, with you about that.

1                   DAVID: Well, I appreciate that. It shows  
2 you're being merciful.

3                   JOHN: Well, it shows that I believe you  
4 telling me what you believe. I don't necessarily have  
5 to believe it, but I believe you believe it.

6                   DAVID: Okay. Fine. Well, here's what I  
7 believe. He that dasheth in pieces has come up before  
8 thy face. Keep the munition. What's munition?

9                   JOHN: Well, you and I both know what that  
10 is.

11                   DAVID: It's weapons, isn't it?

12                   JOHN: Sure.

13                   DAVID: Watch the way.

14                   JOHN: Where are you? Where are you? What  
15 paragraph?

16                   DAVID: We're in Chapter 2, verse 1.

17                   JOHN: Yeah. I'm in 2.

18                   DAVID: Okay. Watch the way. What does  
19 that mean? Make thy loins strong. Fortify thy power  
20 mightily, for the Lord will turn away the exodus of  
21 Jacob, that's exodus of Israel. In other words, God's  
22 people in this prophecy don't look so hot, do they?  
23 The emptiers have emptied them out and marred their  
24 vine branches. The shield of the mighty men is made  
25 red. The valiant men are in scarlet. The chariots

1 shall be with flaming torches in the day of his  
2 preparation. Huh. The fir tree shall be terribly  
3 shaken.

4 JOHN: Um-hum.

5 DAVID: The chariots shall rage in the  
6 streets. They shall jostle one against another in the  
7 broad waves. They shall seem like torches. They  
8 shall run like the lightning. Rooooor, Rooooor (siren  
9 sound) -- is you heard all night long out here. Man,  
10 they're fast, you know? They get up and go, don't  
11 they?

12 JOHN: Um-hum.

13 DAVID: Now, y'all lost the first round.

14 JOHN: No. We all lost the first round.

15 DAVID: Well, not really, because --

16 JOHN: Yes, we did.

17 DAVID: Let me explain.

18 JOHN: You don't think so?

19 DAVID: Let me explain. If those young  
20 men's soul was not right with God according to the  
21 knowledge they had?

22 JOHN: Um-hum.

23 DAVID: They've lost forever. Now, if their  
24 soul was right, then they won. That's what I'm  
25 saying. But now what happens is, it says, he shall

1 recount his worthies. In other words, they step back  
2 and they re-enfortify (sic). Okay?

3 JOHN: Um-hum.

4 DAVID: And that's what y'all have done.  
5 You've got a lot more --

6 JOHN: That's what we have done.

7 DAVID: Yeah. If you --

8 JOHN: Not you'all. You have done, we have  
9 done.

10 DAVID: No, no, no. We already, we already  
11 know how many we got. Y'all went and got  
12 reinforcements. They shall stumble on the --

13 JOHN: You're not fortified?

14 DAVID: Huh?

15 JOHN: You're not fortified?

16 DAVID: We're fortified.

17 JOHN: Sure.

18 DAVID: But, but you went --

19 JOHN: But is it necessary?

20 DAVID: Well, you see, the thing of it is  
21 it's only necessary --

22 JOHN: I mean, from what you're reading and  
23 from what you're telling me --

24 DAVID: Let's repeat. Okay?

25 JOHN: And, and I'm not going to, I'm not

1 going to argue. Your interpretation is your  
2 interpretation. All right?

3 DAVID: Okay.

4 JOHN: But by what you were reading to me in  
5 your interpretation --

6 DAVID: Do you believe --

7 JOHN: -- I should go tell, tell all the  
8 ministers and all the rabbis and all the others here  
9 in Waco that they'd better start fortifying their  
10 churches, right?

11 DAVID: That's not who the prophecy is  
12 addressed to.

13 JOHN: Huh?

14 DAVID: Remember, who only can reveal the  
15 book?

16 JOHN: But the question is are you the Lord?  
17 Are you Christ? Are you Cyrus? Are you David? Are  
18 you the lamb? Who are you?

19 DAVID: When the prophecy --

20 JOHN: Right now who are you?

21 DAVID: I'm one trying to show you the seven  
22 seals. Now, go --

23 JOHN: But who did you tell me you were?

24 DAVID: -- go learn what that means.

25 JOHN: Who did you tell me you were?

1                   DAVID:  If God sits on the throne, if he  
2 gave the book to the lamb --

3                   JOHN:  Yes.

4                   DAVID:  You know who I am.  And you know who  
5 I claim that I am.

6                   JOHN:  And you claim that you're the Lord.

7                   DAVID:  I am Christ.

8                   JOHN:  Well, you didn't say that.  You said  
9 you claimed to be the Lord.

10                  DAVID:  Christ is the same as the Lord.  
11 King of Kings and Lord of Lords.  The Prince of the  
12 kings of the earth.  Yep.  What can I say?  Shall I  
13 lie?  No, I will not lie.  And, as I said before, my  
14 father sits on a throne and he said to wait.  And  
15 you're being judged, John.

16                  JOHN:  Aren't we all?

17                  DAVID:  I've already been judged.  I already  
18 got the book.  I have already been judged.  Did you  
19 know that?

20                  JOHN:  What about those people in there with  
21 you?  Have they been judged?

22                  DAVID:  They accept my judgment, because in  
23 my judgment I don't condemn any.  I give --

24                  JOHN:  You don't what?

25                  DAVID:  -- people the truth and the truth

1 will set them free.

2 JOHN: You don't condemn anyone?

3 DAVID: None. The condemnation comes when  
4 men reject the truth. You see, God sent not his Son  
5 to the world to condemn the world. Never has.

6 JOHN: Well, well, from my questioning you,  
7 you're probably in your mind saying now, you know, I'm  
8 rejecting the truth.

9 DAVID: I didn't say that, Jim. I'm saying  
10 --

11 JOHN: John.

12 DAVID: -- let's reason to-- John -- I'm  
13 saying we're reasoning together.

14 JOHN: I hope so.

15 DAVID: Exactly. I mean, you've got to,  
16 you've got to fight with us. It, it would be crazy  
17 for you to, to just begin starting off this procedure  
18 and saying, oh, yeah, man, when the guy really opens  
19 it up, it's like he knows what he's talking about,  
20 like he's the Lord.

21 JOHN: But you're --

22 DAVID: Don't be a fool.

23 JOHN: -- you're saying that you're Christ.  
24 Did Christ run from his accusers or, or did he have a  
25 confrontation with his accusers and was he judged by



1 his accusers?

2 DAVID: He was judged by his accusers.

3 JOHN: But you're not willing to be judged  
4 by the law --

5 DAVID: I did --

6 JOHN: -- of the land?

7 DAVID: -- not say that. Stop putting words  
8 in my mouth.

9 JOHN: Well, you said you were going to  
10 answer to another law.

11 DAVID: I am answering to one and both of  
12 the laws. See, for your lack of knowledge of the  
13 prophecies, for your lack of knowledge of the truth --

14 JOHN: Yes?

15 DAVID: -- you're making all these  
16 statements based upon what you perceive.

17 JOHN: No. It's what you told me.

18 DAVID: Anyway, let's, let's look --

19 JOHN: Go ahead.

20 DAVID: -- at this.

21 JOHN: You -- I mean, did you tell me or  
22 didn't you?

23 DAVID: I told you --

24 JOHN: That you didn't have to answer to the  
25 law of the land, that you only --

1 DAVID: I said --

2 JOHN: -- answered to a higher law.

3 DAVID: Okay. For instance, right now --

4 JOHN: Yeah.

5 DAVID: -- here's where we're at. I told  
6 you I was going to come out and be judged by your law.

7 That's what I --

8 JOHN: And you said that you were coming out  
9 immediately.

10 DAVID: Okay. I said I was coming out  
11 immediately.

12 JOHN: Yes.

13 DAVID: And then I said --

14 JOHN: You couldn't.

15 DAVID: -- I couldn't. Now, I also said two  
16 thousand years ago I'm coming soon.

17 JOHN: Oh, you did?

18 DAVID: Didn't I? Read the gospels. But my  
19 father said no. Now, fear God, don't fear me. And  
20 when you learn to fear God and learn that his word is  
21 the truth --

22 JOHN: Uh-huh.

23 DAVID: -- then you can put your trust in  
24 me. I will show you the words of God. Don't worry  
25 about me.

1 JOHN: David --

2 DAVID: Worry about your --

3 JOHN: Was Christ armed, David?

4 DAVID: With two swords.

5 JOHN: Was Christ armed?

6 DAVID: With two swords.

7 JOHN: What did he do with his two swords?

8 DAVID: He told his brethren --

9 JOHN: Did he hurt anybody with them? Did  
he --

10 DAVID: Not, not yet.

11 JOHN: -- harm any one with them?

12 DAVID: Not yet.

13 JOHN: But did he?

14 DAVID: He destroyed -- he destroys -- he  
destroyed (indiscernible) --

15 JOHN: We do -- we know what he did to the  
16 money changers and to the others, but did he harm  
17 anyone with his two swords?

18 DAVID: Who do you think -- this -- look.  
Do you want to learn this or not, John?

19 JOHN: Just trying to see where you're  
20 coming from, David. I'm trying.

21 DAVID: Psalms 45 is the first seal. The  
22 lamb is going to destroy his enemies. Yes or no?

23

24

25

1 JOHN: Sure.

2 DAVID: All right.

3 JOHN: So, according to Psalm 45, yes.

4 DAVID: According to Psalms 45, the first  
5 seal, which must be hereafter. Now, let me tell you  
6 something. I came into this world in 1959 butt naked.

7 JOHN: Didn't we all?

8 DAVID: Yes.

9 JOHN: We'll go out that way too.

10 DAVID: I came through your system and I  
11 learned your laws and I abided by all of your laws.  
12 I kept all of your laws. And in 1985 --

13 JOHN: Wait, wait a minute. You kept all of  
14 the laws?

15 DAVID: All of the laws.

16 JOHN: Okay.

17 DAVID: In 1985, when I was in Israel, I  
18 received additional laws. Okay? And I'm trying to  
19 explain to you in all honesty and in all soberness,  
20 it's time to fear God and give glory to him for the  
21 hour of his judgment is come. This will bring the  
22 fall of confusion. That's what I'm trying to explain  
23 to you. He that dasheth in pieces has come up before  
24 thy face. God is speaking to somebody. God says to  
25 that somebody keep the munition. Watch the way. Make

1 thy loins strong. Fortify thy power mightily. The  
2 Lord had turned away the exodus of Jacob. The people  
3 of God in this prophecy are not very -- they don't  
4 look very good. As the exodus of Is-- for the, for  
5 the emptiers have emptied them out and marred their  
6 vine branches. These people look in a bad situation.  
7 The shield of the mighty men is made red in this  
8 event. The valiant men are in scarlet. The chariots  
9 shall be with flaming torches in the day of his  
10 preparation. This belligerent power, the one who  
11 dashes in pieces, Daniel will tell you who that power  
12 is. And it says it is the chariots will have flaming  
13 torches on them. Fir trees shall be terribly shaken.  
14 These chariots, Nahum says, will rage in the streets.  
15 They shall jostle one against another in broad waves.  
16 They'll seem like torches. They'll run like the  
17 lightnings. They're pretty fast, aren't they?

18 JOHN: Um-hum.

19 DAVID: They're tanks, John. He shall  
20 recount his worthies. You know, they come together to  
21 get more numbers, to get refortified?

22 JOHN: That's an interpretation that they're  
23 tanks, isn't it?

24 DAVID: He recounts --

25 JOHN: Huh?

1                   DAVID: He shall recount, meaning he  
2 rennumbers his worthies. They shall stumble in their  
3 walk though. By their moving forward, they get in  
4 trouble.

5                   JOHN: Um-hum.

6                   DAVID: They shall make haste to the wall  
7 thereof and the defense shall be prepared, and the  
8 gates of the rivers shall be opened and the palace  
9 shall be dissolved. Now, we're getting to the real  
10 weird aspect. And Hazab shall be led away captive.  
11 She shall be brought up and her maids shall lead her  
12 as with the voice of doves. Hooo, hooo, hooo, hoh.  
13 Tabern (phonetic) upon their breasts. But Nineveh is  
14 of old, like a pool of water, stagnant. And they  
15 shall flee away. Stand, stand, shall they cry, but  
16 none shall look back. Someone at that point is told  
17 to take ye the spoil of silver. Take the spoil of  
18 gold, for there's none end of the store and the glory  
19 out of all the pleasant furniture. She's empty, void  
20 and waste, the heart melted, the, the knees smite  
21 together, and much pain is in all loins and all faces  
22 of them shall get a blackness. Where is the dwelling  
23 of the lions -- these tough guys, huh? The feeding  
24 place of the young lions -- they thought their sons  
25 were going to rule, huh? Where is the lion? Even the

1 old lion walked, and the lion's weapon, none made them  
2 afraid. Man, they thought they were so powerful,  
3 didn't they? The lion did tear in pieces enough for  
4 his whelps and strangled for his lioness and filled  
5 his holes with prey and his dens with raven. I  
6 understand. It's just a job to keep yourself going,  
7 right? All these guys out here are just making a  
8 living, aren't they? Behold I'm against thee, said  
9 the Lord of hosts. And I will burn her chariots in  
10 the smoke and the sword shall devour her young lions.  
11 And I will cut off thy prey from the earth and the  
12 voice of thy messengers shall be no more heard.  
13 That's what you're doing. You're giving me a message,  
14 right? We've had --  
15 JOHN: I think you --  
16 DAVID: -- several of them.  
17 JOHN: I think you're trying to give me a  
18 message, aren't you, David?  
19 DAVID: Well, I'm saying y'all keep  
20 negotiating with us and stuff. But woe to the bloody  
21 city.  
22 JOHN: No. I'm trying to reason with you  
23 and trying to be rationale with you.  
24 DAVID: And I'm not being rationale with  
25 you, correct?

1 JOHN: You're really not, are you?  
2 DAVID: You don't believe this prophecy, do  
3 you?  
4 JOHN: I --  
5 DAVID: You don't believe --  
6 JOHN: -- believe that --  
7 DAVID: -- you've got --  
8 JOHN: -- I believe that --  
9 DAVID: -- tanks out there, did you?  
10 JOHN: -- you believe --  
11 DAVID: You don't believe you've got --  
12 JOHN: -- what you're telling me.  
13 DAVID: Why would you have tanks out there?  
14 JOHN: To protect our people from your  
15 weapons.  
16 DAVID: From our weapons?  
17 JOHN: From your weapons. Your admitted  
18 weapons.  
19 DAVID: Huh. Well, you know the weapon I  
20 haven't admitted is the greater and above all the  
21 weapons you could ever know of?  
22 JOHN: You've admitted that one.  
23 DAVID: God.  
24 JOHN: Yeah. Well, didn't you just tell me  
25 you're the Lord?



1                   DAVID: Who is this bloody city in Chapter  
2 3?

3                   JOHN: Babylon.

4                   DAVID: It's all full of lies and robbery  
5 and the prey departeth not. If yours had to go to  
6 work in a system like this, the noise of a whip, those  
7 rattling wheels, prancing horses, and jumping  
8 chariots. Horses lifted up both the bright sword and  
9 the glittering spear, and there's no -- there's a  
10 multitude of slaying and a great number of carcasses.  
11 There's none end of their corpses. They stumble upon  
12 their corpses, because of the multitude of the hoard  
13 under the well-favored harlot. Who is that harlot?  
14 You know. Babylon, the mistress of witchcrafts that  
15 sells nations to her whoredom and families to her  
16 witchcrafts? Behold, I'm against thee, sayeth the  
17 Lord of Hosts. That's the father. And I will  
18 discover thy skirts upon thy face and I will show the  
19 nations thy nakedness and the kingdoms thy shame. I  
20 will cast abominable filth upon thee and make thee  
21 vile. I will set thee in the gazing stocks. Well,  
22 Revelation 18 says, shall come to pass that all they  
23 that look upon thee shall flee from thee and say:  
24 Nineveh is laid waste. Who bemoan her? When shall I  
25 see comforters for thee? Art thou better than

1 populace No (phonetic)? There's a city No -- called  
2 No, an ancient city, very populated, that was situated  
3 among the rivers that had the waters round about it  
4 whose rampart was the sea and her wall was from the  
5 sea. No, it was impregnable, very strong place.  
6 Ethiopia and Egypt were their strength and it was  
7 infinite. Put and Laban were thy helpers, yet was she  
8 carried away. She went into captivity. Her young  
9 children also were dashed in pieces at the top of the  
10 streets and they cast lots for their honorable men and  
11 all their great men were bound in chains. I mean, you  
12 know, nations can be overthrown, man. Thou also shall  
13 be drunken. You know --

14 JOHN: Are you try-- are you trying to tell  
15 me something?

16 DAVID: I'm trying to say that God says to  
17 somebody that as ancient empires fell so also whoever  
18 this empire is will also be drunken. When you're a  
19 drunk you're not in your right mind.

20 JOHN: Well, we, we've seen nations  
21 overthrown for years, haven't we?

22 DAVID: Exactly. Thou shall be hid. Thou  
23 also shall seek strength because of the enemy.

24 JOHN: Um-hum.

25 DAVID: Just so happens God ends up being

1 their enemy. All thy strongholds --

2 JOHN: Listen. Will God have his way  
3 whether or not you're inside that compound or outside  
4 of that compound?

5 DAVID: God is going to have his way  
6 depending --

7 JOHN: Will he?

8 DAVID: -- upon what you do.

9 JOHN: What who does?

10 DAVID: You do.

11 JOHN: Well, we've already told you very  
12 clearly that, that the -- these people here have  
13 absolutely no intention of coming in that compound.  
14 And --

15 DAVID: Well, John --

16 JOHN: -- and --

17 DAVID: -- I wish --

18 JOHN: But the yoke is not our yoke upon  
19 you.

20 DAVID: Look. Your law --

21 JOHN: You're free to exit there any time  
22 you want to exit there and so are all those people.  
23 You've told me they're free to leave, haven't you?

24 DAVID: You know, every weapon that I have  
25 here I bought on the yellow sheet.

1 JOHN: Every one.

2 DAVID: Every one.

3 JOHN: And none have been remanufactured in  
4 any manner? Is that correct? Or you'd rather not  
5 answer that?

6 DAVID: Well, if I answer that --

7 JOHN: And I'm not, and I'm not asking it  
8 in --

9 DAVID: It don't (not discernible) --

10 JOHN: -- in that vein --

11 DAVID: If I, if I answer that, if I say yes  
12 --

13 JOHN: Yes?

14 DAVID: -- then you'll say, uh-huh. If I  
15 say no, then you won't believe me.

16 JOHN: Uh-huh.

17 DAVID: See?

18 JOHN: I think I have my answer, don't I?

19 DAVID: Yeah, because we've been hearing all  
20 over the news, all over, what we have here.

21 JOHN: Well, do you believe everything you  
22 hear on the news?

23 DAVID: Well, it comes from ATF. I'm  
24 supposed to, aren't I?

25 JOHN: Do you bel--

1                   DAVID: Or am I?

2                   JOHN: Do you believe everything you hear on  
3 the news?

4                   DAVID: Is ATF having different words put to  
5 their movements of their mouth?

6                   JOHN: Well, I don't know. I haven't been  
7 listening to the news, to tell you the --

8                   DAVID: Right.

9                   JOHN: -- truth.

10                   DAVID: Let's get back to one thing.  
11 Whoever this power is, all their strongholds shall be  
12 like fig trees with the first ripe figs. They'll be  
13 shaken and fall into the mouth of the eater. You know  
14 what God says about this thing? He says behold thy  
15 people, the (indiscernible) of women. God's calling  
16 somebody sissies. Thy gage shall be laid wide open to  
17 thine enemies. The fire shall devour thy bars. You  
18 know, God's -- is the enemy. Just like Joel 2. It  
19 says, you know, in Joel 2 the strongest lord executes  
20 his word? Ah, you know in the days of Noah, nobody  
21 believed Noah. Come on, John. They had to have the  
22 waters come and swept them all away, didn't they?  
23 Huh? It's just like here in verse 8 -- in verse 17 it  
24 says -- in -- I'm -- start with verse 16. Thou has  
25 multiplied merchants above the stars in heaven. How

1 many merchants do you have in this nation, huh? How  
2 many merchants are in the whole world?

3 JOHN: Well, he also said that the merchants  
4 are going to see this fire and, and unless this fire  
5 is going to --

6 DAVID: No.

7 JOHN: He did.

8 DAVID: No. What I'm saying is those who  
9 have ships.

10 JOHN: Well, you identified the merchants as  
11 being who?

12 DAVID: The great men of the earth.

13 JOHN: Sure. And, and those with --

14 DAVID: You know, that is a fact.

15 JOHN: And those with ships, right?

16 DAVID: So, see it afar off. Exactly. And  
17 wail, because no one buys their merchandise anymore.  
18 When they pull in the dock --

19 JOHN: We don't have --

20 DAVID: -- the dock's not there.

21 JOHN: -- a whole lot of vessels floating up  
22 and down the river in --

23 DAVID: Oh --

24 JOHN: -- in Waco, Texas, do we?

25 DAVID: I know, but this is a national

1 thing. Remember. You know --

2 JOHN: Well, --

3 DAVID: -- heart of Texas. Are you saying

4 that --

5 JOHN: No. Someone's --

6 DAVID: -- Waco, Texas --

7 JOHN: -- trying to make it a national

8 thing, but it is a very local thing.

9 DAVID: Okay. Okay. Well, God'll have to

10 spread it out then. He says thou's merchandi--

11 JOHN: Well, then, God can come out of that

12 compound and spread it out, can't he?

13 DAVID: Yeah.

14 JOHN: Huh?

15 DAVID: Yes. When he's ready, he can.

16 JOHN: You betcha.

17 DAVID: Anyway, verse 17. Thy crown are as

18 a locust and thy captains as the great grasshoppers.

19 There's a lot of -- there are a lot of -- you got a

20 lot of bosses there, don't you?

21 JOHN: We all do.

22 DAVID: Which camp in the hedges in the cold

23 day. Ooh, it's cold out here, isn't it? Are y'all

24 camping in the hedges? Is that what you're doing --

25 JOHN: I'm camping on a --

1                   DAVID:  -- camping in the hedges?

2                   JOHN:  I'm camping on a chair talking --

3                   DAVID:  You're camping in --

4                   JOHN:  -- to you, David.

5                   DAVID:  -- the hedges.  But when the sun

6 ariseth, buddy, you're going to flee away.  Thy

7 shepherds slumber, O king of Assyria.  Thy nobles

8 shall dwell in the dust.  You know, it just is true.

9 I guess the word of God is true.  Verse 19, there's no

10 healing of thy bruise, is there?  The wound is

11 grieving.  All that are going to hear, when

12 everything's going to be exposed about you and what

13 you're doing, they're going to clap the hands over

14 thee, for upon whom if not thy wickedness pass

15 continually.

16                   JOHN:  David.

17                   DAVID:  I'm willing to listen --

18                   JOHN:  Tell me what your --

19                   DAVID:  -- to you, John.

20                   JOHN:  -- intention is?  Do you want to work

21 with me or don't you?

22                   DAVID:  Hey.  I'm willing to work with you

23 when you begin to realize you need to start fearing

24 God.

25                   JOHN:  Well, I think we both do.  I'm, I'm a



1 God-fearing person.

2 DAVID: You don't even know these  
3 prophecies, my friend.

4 JOHN: Do I have to?

5 DAVID: You'd better believe it.

6 JOHN: To be a God-fearing person?

7 DAVID: If you -- exactly. Otherwise, the  
8 gods you fear will avail you nothing.

9 JOHN: No, I, I'm --

10 DAVID: There is a God of (indiscernible) --

11 JOHN: -- just may not have as much  
12 religious teaching and, and be as learned as far as  
13 theology as other people, but --

14 DAVID: This is not --

15 JOHN: -- that doesn't mean I'm a -- not a  
16 God-fearing person.

17 DAVID: -- theology. This is straight  
18 testimony.

19 JOHN: Don't be condescending, David.

20 DAVID: Look. You said you wanted to hear  
21 and I've let you hear something. If it means nothing  
22 to you, I can do nothing. Okay?

23 JOHN: I just wanted an explanation, didn't  
24 I? Isn't that what I asked for?

25 DAVID: Did you get it? God (indiscernible)

1 --

2           JOHN: We went a roundabout way. Now, I  
3 have to go tell all of the priests and all of the  
4 ministers and all of the rabbis that they'd better  
5 start arming their fortresses, huh?

6           DAVID: Stop playing child.

7           JOHN: You, you know exactly -- that's your  
8 interpretation --

9           DAVID: Stop --

10          JOHN: -- of this.

11          DAVID: -- being foolish.

12          JOHN: You're the one interpreting it that  
13 way.

14          DAVID: You'd better come up hither, my  
15 friend. You better fear God like Paul, of whom you  
16 say you believe was an apostle. Paul says fear him  
17 that speaketh from heaven. The apostles talk about a  
18 truth. In the latter days it's going to come and wipe  
19 out all nations.

20          JOHN: Um-hum.

21          DAVID: Now, go ahead and laugh at Psalms  
22 45. Go ahead and get on the side of your bed tonight  
23 and look at Psalms 45, and go ahead and laugh at that  
24 prophecy. And go ahead and laugh because I showed it  
25 to you. But the door is now shut. If you have any

1 other questions, I'm sorry.

2 JOHN: What do you mean the door is shut?

3 Huh?

4 DAVID: I already tried --

5 JOHN: You're not going to talk to me  
6 anymore?

7 DAVID: I already tried to tell you the key  
8 of David opens, but you don't believe Psalms 45. You  
9 don't believe the warnings of the ancients. You don't  
10 know about the lips of the ancients they cause to  
11 speak. Spiritually discerned. I -- you know, what  
12 can I say, John?

13 JOHN: David, the -- the truth may be here,  
14 David. But if you remain inside there, who's going to  
15 open the door?

16 DAVID: The door is already opened.

17 JOHN: But you just said that the door is  
18 shut.

19 DAVID: I'm talking about there are things  
20 that you do not know. I've opened up Psalms 45 to  
21 you. Who only can open the first seal, John?

22 JOHN: Well, we've, we've covered that  
23 ground, haven't we?

24 DAVID: Who?

25 JOHN: The Lord's going to open the seals,

1 right?

2           DAVID: Who just did? It's a small, minute,  
3 little red light at first. Just a quickening of the  
4 mind, a quickening of the intellect. Hey, Psalms 45,  
5 the first seal. You should have heard all those  
6 preachers and teachings on the radio the other day.  
7 They sure sounded funny.

8           JOHN: Let me ask you something, David,  
9 changing the subject. Okay? Since -- because I guess  
10 we're pretty satisfied that my answer to why you have  
11 all those weapons has been now put upon me, huh?

12           DAVID: In the Book of Nahum, as was in  
13 other prophecies.

14           JOHN: I mean, you're satisfied --

15           DAVID: My work --

16           JOHN: You're satisfied that you have  
17 answered my question, ha-- aren't you?

18           DAVID: Well, not really. I'd like to  
19 answer it in greater detail. But my means of  
20 answering you is the means that you don't want to  
21 hear.

22           JOHN: Well, I mean, you can tell me that  
23 you're doing it because of the books. Right?

24           DAVID: But that does not avail you with an  
25 understanding. See, you don't understand, John. Too

1 many years --

2 JOHN: Well, I'm trying.

3 DAVID: Well, let's, let's back up a second  
4 now. Psalms 45 is a prophecy about God talking about  
5 his Son, right? God's heart (indiscernible) a good  
6 matter. He wants to talk about things he's made. Is  
7 he a creator? Is he a maker? Touching the king?

8 JOHN: Um-hum.

9 DAVID: Has God elected a king?

10 JOHN: Um-hum.

11 DAVID: Is God's tongue the pen of a ready  
12 writer? Has he got -- is God going to write it down?  
13 Did he think his Son is fairer than children of men?  
14 Do you think God loves you more or his Son more?

15 JOHN: And I'm listening to you, David.

16 DAVID: God says that grace is poured into  
17 the Son's mouth.

18 JOHN: Where are you?

19 DAVID: I'm, I'm just, I'm just -- I'm not,  
20 I'm not looking in the Bible no more. I'm just simply  
21 going over Psalms 45.

22 JOHN: Go ahead.

23 DAVID: Well, I'm --
