3 Constitution being stepped on?

4 NEAL: Well, yeah.

5 JOHN: It's not easy, is it?

7 JOHN: It's real frustrating and -- but if
8 you, if you have some simple solution as to how in the
9 world this thing is going to be resolved, I'd love to
10 hear it.

11 NEAL: Well, the Bible has a simple
12 solution.

13 JOHN: The Bible has a simple solution as --

14 NEAL: Sure, the --

15 JOHN: -- to how these events are going --

16 NEAL: Sure.

17 JOHN: -- to be resolved?

18 NEAL: Uh-huh.

19 JOHN: What's the solution?

20 NEAL: Why don't you read Nahum?

21 (Unidentified voice in background not
22 discernible.)

23 JOHN: Believe me, I have read Nahum. I
24 have read Revelation.

25 NEAL: Uh-huh.

1 JOHN: I have read the Psalms.

2 NEAL: See, the thing of it --

3 JOHN: And I've listened to David read them
4 and Steven read them.

5 NEAL: Um-hum.

6 JOHN: And I don't have an argument with
7 what they're reading, because David tells me something
8 and I believe that he believes that. That doesn't
9 mean I have to believe it or I, I don't have to
believe --

10 NEAL: Well, it's not necessarily a matter
11 of whether you believe it or not. Is it written --

12 JOHN: The strict interpretation --

13 NEAL: Is it written or that?

14 JOHN: Well, sure.

15 NEAL: You know.

16 JOHN: But I asked him if he believes in the
Ten Commandments.

17 NEAL: And --

18 JOHN: Do you?

19 NEAL: Sure.

20 JOHN: Would you, would you violate any of
the commandments?

21 NEAL: Even God does.

22 JOHN: Huh?

1 NEAL: The question could be asked is God --
2 does God believe the Ten Commandments?
3 JOHN: I hope so.
4 NEAL: He did a lot of killing.
5 (Unidentified voice in background not
6 discernible.)
7 JOHN: Who did?
8 NEAL: God. Have you ever read the Old
9 Testament?
10 JOHN: Why do you say God did a lot of
11 killing?
12 NEAL: I don't think you've read the Old
13 Testament.
14 JOHN: Why --
15 NEAL: He even told the children of Israel
16 go out there and destroy the, the kingdoms.
17 JOHN: I asked David.
18 NEAL: Yeah.
19 JOHN: David said God carried swords, right?
20 NEAL: Yeah.
21 JOHN: Or Jesus carried swords.
22 NEAL: Sure.
23 JOHN: But did he use them to hur-- harm
24 anyone? No, he didn't.
25 NEAL: Yeah, but why would he carry it for?

1 Or what was the purpose of --

2 JOHN: Maybe self-defense.

3 NEAL: Yeah. Maybe in self-defense.

4 JOHN: Or maybe a veiled threat.

5 NEAL: Whatever the purpose was.

6 JOHN: But that doesn't mean that you and I
7 should kill, does it? Aren't we peaceful people?

8 NEAL: Sure we are.

9 JOHN: Do you want me to go tell the, the
10 minister down at First Baptist Church that he'd better
11 start putting LAW rockets and .50-caliber machine guns
12 in the, in the church? Do you think he needs that?
13 No.

14 NEAL: No.

15 JOHN: That's crazy. And that's all I'm
16 saying. That I hope you understand that the reason I
17 want to talk to you is --

18 NEAL: Uh-huh.

19 JOHN: -- not to try and influence you one
20 way or the other.

21 NEAL: Yeah.

22 JOHN: That if you had a message to relay to
23 someone, I, I sincerely will relay that message. But
24 to -- and, and, believe me, your child is going to be
25 well-cared for, well-cared for. And, and, hopefully,

1 you will have the privilege of caring for your child
2 some day just like your child's being --

3 NEAL: Well --

4 JOHN: -- cared for now.

5 NEAL: Okay.

6 JOHN: But if you want to leave, you can.
7 If you want to stay in there, that's your privilege.
8 I'm not going to try and sway you.

9 NEAL: We wanted to send her to her sister
10 in Hawaii.

11 JOHN: I'm sorry?

12 NEAL: I was going to send her to her sister
13 in Hawaii.

14 JOHN: Then that will be done. But you can
15 take her to her sister in Hawaii if you want to, can't
16 you?

17 NEAL: Well, I want you to do it.

18 JOHN: Is it my obligation, my
19 responsibility?

20 NEAL: I think so.

21 JOHN: Why?

22 NEAL: Huh?

23 JOHN: Huh? If she has something to say to
24 me, she can say it to me.

25 JOHN: Okay?

1 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: (Not
2 discernible).

3 JOHN: Okay? Neal?

4 NEAL: Yeah.

5 JOHN: If she's got something to say to me,
6 tell her to say it to me.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: (Not
8 discernible).

9 JOHN: All right?

10 NEAL: I can't hear what they're saying.

11 JOHN: Well, tell -- put them on the phone.

12 NEAL: Okay. Hold on a sec.

13 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: (Not
14 discernible) because the media don't have anything to
15 worry about, because she said they had to protect the
16 media.

17 LISA: Okay. Hello, John?

18 JOHN: Hi.

19 LISA: We just want to let you know, tell
20 you that --

21 JOHN: Who is this? Rita?

22 LISA: This is Lisa again.

23 JOHN: Lisa.

24 LISA: Yeah.

25 JOHN: Go ahead.

1 LISA: Well, you were asking why, you know,
2 we wanted the media out here?

3 JOHN: Why, why, why we want what?

4 LISA: Why you didn't let the media come out
5 here. It's because you were afraid that we were --

6 JOHN: Did I --

7 LISA: -- going to convert them?

8 JOHN: I didn't ask why the media's not out
9 there.

10 LISA: No. We asked.

11 JOHN: I told you why they're not out there.

12 LISA: No, no. We asked. But you --

13 JOHN: Okay.

14 LISA: -- were saying the reason why is
15 because --

16 JOHN: We have a responsibility.

17 LISA: You don't want them injured, right?

18 JOHN: Absolutely.

19 LISA: Okay. But the thing is is, you know,
20 we're not out to hurt anybody.

21 JOHN: You're not what?

22 LISA: Yeah, see -- we're not out to hurt
23 anybody. You guys came on our property. You guys
24 started -- you know, you brought these two trucks in
25 with all these people.

1 JOHN: Whoa, whoa, whoa. Listen. Listen.
2 The people --
3 LISA: You, you --
4 JOHN: -- went -- Li--
5 LISA: -- totally destroyed our house.
6 JOHN: Wait, wait. Listen. The people that
7 went on your property had not only a search warrant
8 issued by a U. S. District Judge, but they had an
9 arrest warrant issued by a U. S. District Judge, and
10 that arrest warrant and that search warrant instructs
11 them, orders them, to execute those warrants. Orders
12 them. It doesn't ask them to do it. It doesn't say
13 you can if you want to. A warrant in writing orders
14 you to do something. That's why they were there.
15 LISA: Okay. That's understandable. Okay.
16 JOHN: Now, if --
17 LISA: I understand --
18 JOHN: -- things went wrong --
19 LISA: But why did you need them -- fifteen
20 thousand million people out here for an arrest
21 warrant?
22 JOHN: Why did you need those LAW rockets
23 and those .50-caliber machine guns?
24 LISA: We don't need them.
25 JOHN: Then get rid of them.

1 LISA: We bel--

2 JOHN: Get rid of them. Throw them out the
3 windows.

4 LISA: What, what is wrong, though, with
5 each person having --

6 JOHN: Don't give me a lot --

7 LISA: -- the right to bear arms?

8 JOHN: -- of nonsense about that Lisa.
9 There is no reason in the world somebody needs those
10 kind of weapons. I don't need them. I don't have
11 them at home. I don't have --

12 LISA: The system you work for does.

13 JOHN: My church --

14 LISA: They got --

15 JOHN: -- doesn't have them.

16 LISA: -- you should see the tanks they've
17 got sitting in our front yard. They're worse than
18 anything.

19 JOHN: They do have them because they know
20 what some of those weapons can do, the destructive
21 power of some of those weapons. And those tanks
22 aren't going to harm anyone.

23 LISA: Anyway, that's besides the issue.
24 That's beside the point.

25 JOHN: But that's what you --

1 LISA: We understand --

2 JOHN: -- were saying.

3 LISA: No. Well, what I'm talking about is
4 why the media couldn't come out here. We're not out
5 to hurt them. (Indiscernible).

6 JOHN: Then come on out and talk to them.
7 You can go out and talk to them. Well, just walk down
8 the road and talk to them, if you want to. Nobody's
9 going to prevent you from doing that. But I, I'm not
10 -- I really sincerely do not want to get on the phone
11 and get in an argument with you.

12 LISA: Yeah. I don't want to get --

13 JOHN: I'll answer --

14 LISA: -- into an argument.

15 JOHN: -- any question you have, believe me.
16 But -- and, and I'll talk to any relative in your
17 behalf. You know, I'm --

18 LISA: But not --

19 JOHN: -- being very sincere with you about

20 --

21 LISA: Okay.

22 JOHN: -- that.

23 LISA: Okay. Listen, why don't you come out
24 here?

25 JOHN: I'd be delighted to come out there.

1 I really would.

2 LISA: No, really. I'm serious. We'd, we'd
3 love to have you down here.

4 JOHN: Do you think I just fell off the
5 turnip truck?

6 LISA TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: He doesn't
7 think -- I don't know.

8 LISA TO JOHN: No.

9 JOHN: Hey.

10 LISA: No, no.

11 JOHN: I'm, I'm being very serious with you.
12 Do you --

13 LISA: I am, too.

14 JOHN: Do you think it would be in my best
15 interest to go huckle-bucking down that road knowing
16 the weapons that are inside that place?

17 LISA: Hey --

18 JOHN: What assurances am I going to get
19 that nothing's going to happen? If David wants to
20 meet me down at the end of that road, I'll meet him
21 down at the end of the road.

22 LISA: Well, see, that's the thing, though,
23 John. I mean, if that's your reason --

24 JOHN: And I will not harm him.

25 LISA: We have our reasons. You're saying

1 that you won't harm us. How do --

2 JOHN: Well, I wo--

3 LISA: -- we know that? We got -- you got
4 tanks. You've got all kinds of people out there.

5 JOHN: Because you have to believe in the
6 system. That's all I can tell you.

7 LISA: Believe in the system?

8 JOHN: And if you don't want to believe in
9 it, that's your business and -- that's your business.
10 Do you think we're going to harm these children that
11 came out, those ladies that came out?

12 LISA: The people -- the, the children that
13 you took out of their home?

14 JOHN: I didn't take anybody out. They were
15 --

16 LISA: You most certainly did. You e-- you
17 practically --

18 JOHN: Whoa, whoa. Wait a minute.

19 LISA: -- insisted that they come out or you
20 weren't going to --

21 JOHN: Those parents allowed their children
22 to leave -- and, hey --

23 LISA: Yeah, but --

24 JOHN: -- Neal just told me --

25 LISA: -- we're afraid you might bomb us up

1 or something with all --

2 JOHN: Neal just told me --

3 LISA: -- the tanks you've got around here.

4 We're doing it for their, their best interests. We
5 don't know what you're going to do to us.

6 JOHN: You don't?

7 LISA: No.

8 JOHN: Well, come out --

9 LISA: You got seven tanks out here. Of
10 course we're going to get these children out for their
11 best interests.

12 JOHN: Well, then let the rest of them out.

13 LISA: That's up to them.

14 JOHN: What do you mean that's up to them?
15 You just said that we made them come out. We didn't
16 make anybody come out.

17 LISA: Their parents let them out for their
18 best interests.

19 JOHN: Well, then why don't the rest of the
20 parents let their children out for their best
21 interests?

22 LISA: Because that's entirely up to them.
23 I can't forc--

24 JOHN: Huh?

25 LISA: I'm not going to tell them what to

1 do.

2 JOHN: Is it common sense? Since you said
3 that they may be harmed.

4 LISA: That's true.

5 JOHN: Then I guess the, the women and
6 children and all of them should come out, huh? Whose
7 best interests are we looking out for?

8 LISA: I'm looking out for my best
9 interests.

10 JOHN: Well, do you think --

11 LISA: Everybody else is looking after their
12 own best interests.

13 JOHN: What best interests are you looking
14 out for?

15 LISA: Look, I don't trust your system.
16 That's --

17 JOHN: Okay.

18 LISA: -- basically where it stands. I
19 don't trust your system. I don't like it. I never
20 have.

21 JOHN: Well --

22 LISA: And I don't --

23 JOHN: -- well, that's all right.

24 LISA: -- like what you've done to me and I
25 don't like what you've done to my friends and my

1 family.

2 JOHN: In what respect?

3 LISA: In what respect?

4 JOHN: Yeah. And I'm not talking about
5 Sunday, all right?

6 LISA: I --

7 JOHN: Sunday happened. Sunday's over with.
8 There's not a darn thing I can do about what happened
9 Sunday. I wish I could. Okay?

10 LISA: Okay. Well, look, everybody that --

11 JOHN: Tell me something else.

12 LISA: That anybody that knows us knows that
13 we have never harmed anybody or never had intentions
14 --

15 JOHN: I'm not going to argue --

16 LISA: -- to harm anybody.

17 JOHN: I'm not going to argue that with you.

18 LISA: We've been out here for years.

19 JOHN: Answer one question.

20 LISA: Okay.

21 JOHN: Answer me a question.

22 LISA: Okay.

23 JOHN: And I am not accusing you of harming
24 anyone. I'm not accusing David of harming anyone.
25 Steven -- no one.

1 LISA: Okay.

2 JOHN: I think you're peace-loving people,
3 all right?

4 LISA: We are.

5 JOHN: Why do you have LAW rockets,
6 .50-caliber machine guns --

7 LISA: We don't have no LAW rockets.

8 JOHN: I know you do, so don't tell me that.
9 You just don't know what a LAW rocket is, that's all.
10 And why do you have .50-caliber machine guns?

11 LISA: We don't have those either that I
12 know of.

13 JOHN: You've got .50-caliber Barrett
14 (phonetic) rifles.

15 LISA: Never seen one.

16 JOHN: I didn't ask you whether you'd seen
17 one. I'm telling you what's out there and David
18 didn't deny it and Steven didn't deny it, whether
19 you've seen it or not. And there's absolutely no
20 reason to have those kind of munitions.

21 LISA: But I don't think they have them, and
22 I've been everywhere in this whole house. I've never
23 seen anything like that.

24 JOHN: Let's just say that neither David nor
25 Steven denied it, and I've been talking to them for a

1 few days. Okay?

2 LISA: Okay.

3 JOHN: So, I'm -- and, and I don't have to
4 argue that with you. If, if you tell me you haven't
5 seen them, I believe you. Because maybe you haven't.
6 I'm not going to argue that with you. What I'm
7 saying is the system we have in this country is the
8 best system in the world. Whether you like it,
9 whether I like it, it's still the best one in the
10 world.

11 LISA: Yeah.

12 JOHN: It doesn't get any better. You know,
13 we tell people if you don't like the system, you can
14 go someplace else. But we are a country of laws,
15 aren't we?

16 LISA: Um-hum.

17 JOHN: And I raise my right, right hand
18 one--

19 LISA: But I don't think that's true either.
20 Because if we wanted to move to another country, you
21 wouldn't let us do that.

22 JOHN: You could have. You could have done
23 that a year ago, a week ago, whenever you wanted to.
24 If you don't like the system in this country, you can
25 go someplace else.

1 LISA: Well, can we go now? Will you let us
2 go now?

3 JOHN: If you come out right now, the only
4 thing I'm telling you that will happen to you is that
5 no harm will come to you. If you have not violated a
6 law, then you will, will not be charged with any
7 violation of the law, will you?

8 LISA: Well, you know what, John?

9 JOHN: What?

10 LISA: I've got to tell you that we really
11 love you guys. We love you.

12 JOHN: Well, good. I love you too.

13 LISA: And --

14 JOHN: I'm being very truthful. I love you.

15 LISA: I know.

16 JOHN: And I hope nothing happens to you.

17 LISA: Yeah, me too.

18 JOHN: Because it won't be because of any
19 action we've done. And, and, and I'm telling you
20 you're dealing with the FBI and you're dealing with
21 the other Federal agencies, and nothing -- no harm is
22 going to come to you because of something we're doing.
23 We are working out on a perimeter and we're out there
24 to protect people. And that's, that's it. Nobody is
25 going to assault that place. You may -- somebody

1 might tell you something, but it's not going to
2 happen. It is just not going to happen.

3 LISA: Okay.

4 JOHN: I'll sit here and I'll talk to David
5 for a month, if I have to talk to David for a month,
6 to ensure that no harm comes to anyone. And I hope
7 you believe that.

8 LISA: I, I do.

9 JOHN: Because I -- and I don't want it to
10 happen to you, kid.

11 LISA: Okay.

12 JOHN: Okay?

13 LISA: And, listen, what religion are you
14 anyway -- religion --

15 JOHN: Why does that enter into it?

16 LISA: Huh?

17 JOHN: Why does that enter into it? I'll
18 tell you if it makes you feel --

19 LISA: Yeah. I was just wondering if you
20 guys believe in present truth.

21 JOHN: I'm Catholic.

22 LISA: You're Catholic?

23 JOHN: Yeah.

24 LISA: Well, do you believe in present
25 truth?

1 JOHN: Another one of those damn Catholics,
2 huh?
3 LISA: Do you ever believe in present truth?
4 JOHN: What present truth?
5 LISA: Present truth that comes from time to
6 time to different people?
7 JOHN: You, you're going to have to explain
8 it to me.
9 LISA: I have to explain it to you.
10 JOHN: Well, I'm not being, I'm not --
11 LISA: No, no. I know.
12 JOHN: -- being silly. I'm --
13 LISA: Do you know who started the Catholic
14 church?
15 JOHN: The -- yeah, the pope from Jesus
16 Christ.
17 LISA: The pope from Jesus Christ?
18 JOHN: St. Peter was the first pope of the
19 Catholic church.
20 LISA: Okay. Well, listen, this is
21 JOHN: I'm not --
22 LISA: -- this is --
23 JOHN: -- lying to you. What research have
24 you done into the Catholic church?
25 LISA: A lot.

1 JOHN: Were you raised Catholic?

2 LISA: No.

3 JOHN: You don't believe that St. Peter was
4 the first pope of the Catholic church?

5 LISA: I don't really know.

6 JOHN: Well, you asked me a question, didn't
7 you?

8 LISA: Yeah.

9 JOHN: I gave you an answer.

10 LISA: Okay. Listen, do you -- but do you
11 still believe in, in present truth?

12 JOHN: What -- I'm asking you because I
13 don't know. What do you mean by present truth?

14 LISA: Present tru-- well, this is -- what
15 does that mean? What does it sound like? Present,
16 today, right now, present, right --

17 JOHN: But is this some religious dogma?

18 LISA: No.

19 JOHN: Do I believe in the truth. Is that
20 what you mean?

21 LISA: Yes. Second Peter, 1:12.

22 JOHN: I just asked you if we're talking
23 religious dogma and you said no.

24 LISA: No, it isn't. I'm just telling you

25 --

1 JOHN: Do I believe in the truth. Tell me
2 the truth. Go ahead.

3 LISA: No, no. I'm telling you present
4 truth. There's a lot of truths out there, but what --

5 JOHN: What is the question you want to ask?
6 I'll, I'll answer any question you've got. What do
7 you want me to answer?

8 LISA: All I want to know --

9 JOHN: Uh-huh.

10 LISA: Well, I want you to look at --

11 JOHN: Yeah.

12 LISA: Okay. Is your believing in a
13 religion that's been around for a lot of th-- a lot of
14 years.

15 JOHN: Yeah.

16 LISA: Okay?

17 JOHN: And I'm not faulting your religion.
18 I am not faulting yours. Do you under -- and I hope
19 you, you understand that I really mean that.

20 LISA: Yes.

21 JOHN: I feel that whether a person is of
22 your faith or whether they're Baptist or whether
23 they're Presbyterian or Methodist or Jewish or
24 whatever they are, that's their business.

25 LISA: Yeah.

1 JOHN: That's their prerogative. And I am
2 not going to try and sway them one bit from their
3 beliefs. And I hope you understand that.

4 LISA: That's, that's good.

5 JOHN: And I don't want you to try and sway
6 me from mine. Because I believe in something else.
7 Now, if I bel-- if -- hey, if I believed in, in, in
8 your church, that's my business, isn't it?

9 LISA: Um-hum.

10 JOHN: So --

11 LISA: That's true.

12 JOHN: So, you know, I don't, I don't
13 begrudge you or, or try and demean you for your
14 religious beliefs, and I think it's wrong for someone
15 to do that to anyone. You know? And I, and I wish
16 you well. I really do. I hope we meet again.

17 LISA: Okay. Thanks.

18 JOHN: You bet, kid.

19 LISA TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Didn't want to
20 talk about my own --

21 STEVE: Hello?

22 JOHN: Hey. Who am I talking to?

23 STEVE: Back to Steve.

24 JOHN: Hey!

25 STEVE: What's happening?

1 JOHN: Gosh, you probably went and took a
2 break, didn't you?

3 STEVE: Well, now and then and from time to
4 time I, I do get one.

5 (Laughter.)

6 JOHN: I enjoyed talking to those people.

7 STEVE: Are you sure?

8 JOHN: Do you think I'll be able to talk to
9 any of the people on --

10 STEVE: Positively.

11 JOHN: That's great. That's great. Because
12 I enjoyed talking to them.

13 STEVE: I wasn't kid -- I mean, seriously --

14 JOHN: Let me ask you something. Let me ask
15 --

16 STEVE: Oh, sure.

17 JOHN: -- you something now.

18 STEVE: Sure. Go ahead.

19 JOHN: Are you going to let me hang up the
20 phone and call you back, and will you talk to me?

21 STEVE: Sure.

22 JOHN: The reason I'm saying that is I have
23 to make a trip.

24 STEVE: Gotcha.

25 JOHN: There are certain biological things

1 --

2 STEVE: I gotcha.

3 JOHN: -- callings in life.

4 STEVE: I may not have inspiration, but I
5 have a little insight.

6 JOHN: God bless you.

7 STEVE: Okay. I --

8 JOHN: Now, if I ring you back in about 15,
9 20 minutes --

10 STEVE: I'll be here.

11 JOHN: Will you?

12 STEVE: I'll be here.

13 JOHN: Do you think you'll have one or two
14 of those people for me to talk to, just to say howdy?

15 STEVE: It's getting late. I could go try
16 to wake them up. I don't know if they've be very
17 happy.

18 JOHN: You can be persuasive. I know you
19 can, if you want to.

20 STEVE: Well, you know that anybody can go
21 wake someone up. Whether they'll be happy with you is
22 another story. Oh, these two girls that you were
23 talking to, I'll ask them if they'll go to wake
24 somebody up or something.

25 JOHN: And I don't, I don't mean to be mean

1 to them. You know? I just want to -- if they have
2 somebody --

3 STEVE: Well, they know. I mean, they've
4 got to know -- they've been around long enough to know
5 that, you know, you've got certain designs and lack of
6 interest in spiritual things. See, we're different, I
7 guess, aren't we?

8 JOHN: What do you mean --

9 STEVE: We --

10 JOHN: -- I have a lack of interest in
11 spiritual things? You --

12 STEVE: Well, it's, it's --

13 JOHN: Don't tell me that now.

14 STEVE: Well, she apparently wasn't through
15 with talking to you. She was kind of --

16 JOHN: Hey.

17 STEVE: -- disappointed when the phone was
18 being handed to me --

19 JOHN: Hey.

20 STEVE: -- from what I could tell. Yes?

21 JOHN: When I come back you tell her to get
22 back on the phone. I'll talk to her. Okay?

23 STEVE: All right.

24 JOHN: I'm serious.

25 STEVE: Okay.

1 JOHN: You, you're going to answer it now,
2 huh?
3 STEVE: I'll be answering it.
4 JOHN: I'm going to let you get some sleep
5 tonight, too.
6 STEVE: Oh, sounds good.
7 JOHN: But you got too much last night.
8 STEVE: Well, let's, let's stay to it a tone
9 now.
10 JOHN: Okay.
11 STEVE: Don't get anymore than me.
12 JOHN: Hey, I'll call you back in 15
13 minutes.
14 STEVE: Okay. David said he still loves
15 you, John.
16 JOHN: I love him too.
17 STEVE: All right. And I'll --
18 JOHN: I hope --
19 STEVE: -- pass it on.
20 JOHN: -- to see him --
21 STEVE: Okay.
22 JOHN: --soon. Okay.
23 STEVE: You'll talk to who?
24 JOHN: Okay?
25 STEVE: He'd like to see how Jim's doing

1 | also sometime again.

2 | JOHN: Who?

3 | STEVE: Jim. That ATF agent that started

4 | with us.

5 | JOHN: I don't --

6 | STEVE: He's probably not around anymore or

7 | is --

8 | JOHN: I think --

9 | STEVE: -- he or --

10 | JOHN: I think -- I'm trying to think -- he

11 | had to go someplace.

12 | STEVE: Is he going to --

13 | JOHN: I'll find out.

14 | STEVE: Thank you.

15 | JOHN: I'll find out. And, and when I call

16 | you back, I'll let you know.

17 | STEVE: All right.

18 | JOHN: But he normally is, is around here

19 | from like 6 in the morning to 6 in the evening.

20 | STEVE: He is? Okay.

21 | JOHN: But I, I got the impression this

22 | afternoon that he had to go someplace. Whether it was

23 | a trial or something, that he had to --

24 | STEVE: Um-hum.

25 | JOHN: -- to go someplace. I'll find out.

1 I'll get --

2 STEVE: Okay.

3 JOHN: -- back with you.

4 STEVE: Talk to you in 15.

5 JOHN: Thanks.

6 STEVE: Okay, bye.

7 JOHN: Bye.

8 *****

9 CATHY: Hello?

10 JOHN: Hi. Who's this?

11 CATHY: Cathy.

12 JOHN: Cathy?

13 CATHY: Uh-huh.

14 JOHN: This is John. Is Steve there?

15 CATHY: No, he isn't.

16 JOHN: He isn't?

17 CATHY: No.

18 JOHN: I'd told him I was going to call him
19 back in 15 minutes. And he's not there. Is David
20 there?

21 CATHY: Who?

22 JOHN: David.

23 CATHY: No.

24 JOHN: Well, where are they? David's
25 supposed to be right next to the telephone.

1 CATHY: Well, I'm -- they -- I don't know
2 who David is.

3 JOHN: You don't know who David is, huh?

4 CATHY: No.

5 JOHN: Okay. I'm sorry to bother you.

6 CATHY: Um-hum.

7 JOHN: Uh-huh.

8 LISA: Hello?

9 JOHN: Hello.

10 LISA: Hi. Do you want to talk to Steve?

11 JOHN: Well, who's this?

12 LISA: This is Lisa again.

13 JOHN: No. I want to talk to you. He said
14 that I was too abrupt in --

(Clicking sound.)

15 JOHN: Hello?

16 (Dial tone.)

17 LISA: Hello?

18 JOHN: Lisa?

19 LISA: Yeah.

20 JOHN: What did you do to me?

21 LISA: No. I just got disconnected somehow.
22 Somebody must have stepped on the line.

23

1 JOHN: You threw the phone against the wall,
2 huh?

3 LISA: Yeah, I did.

4 JOHN: I didn't mean to be abrupt with you.
5 Go ahead, if you had someth-- Steve said there was
6 something else that you wanted to say.

7 LISA: Oh, no. That's okay. I realize, you
8 know, you have your beliefs and I have mine and --

9 JOHN: Hey --

10 LISA: -- what's just like -- that's --

11 JOHN: -- it'll all work out. Your beliefs
12 and my beliefs, they'll all work out, huh?

13 LISA: Yeah, because there's a God in
14 heaven, you know.

15 JOHN: You got it. And he loves us all,
16 doesn't he?

17 LISA: Um-hum.

18 JOHN: That's what counts. That's the
19 bottom line. If, if Steve's there, go ahead and put
20 him on with me.

21 LISA: Okay.

22 JOHN: Thank you.

23 LISA: Sure.

24 STEVE: John.

25 JOHN: Feel much better.

1 STEVE: You do? Good. Good.

2 JOHN: I do. I do.

3 STEVE: Oh. Good. So, it's after the
4 pumpkin hour here.

5 JOHN: It is?

6 STEVE: Yeah.

7 JOHN: Are we going to turn into something?

8 STEVE: Well, I, I'm hoping so.

9 JOHN: Yeah? Well, I do --

10 STEVE: Aren't you worn out after this long
11 day?

12 JOHN: No. No. I enjoyed it. I enjoyed
13 it. I mean, I, I enjoyed talking to David and -- and
14 I enjoyed talking to you.

15 STEVE: Where did you say home was for you?

16 JOHN: Home?

17 STEVE: Yeah.

18 JOHN: Lafayette, Louisiana.

19 STEVE: That's right. Louisiana.

20 JOHN: Down in the bay-- not Indiana now.

21 STEVE: No, no, no. I got it straight. I
22 got it straight.

23 JOHN: Down in the bayou.

24 STEVE: Yeah. David wanted to know if you
25 eat crawdads.

1 JOHN: You tell David that they are
2 crawfish.

3 STEVE TO DAVID: He says I'm to tell you
4 they're crawfish.

5 DAVID: (Not discernible).

6 JOHN: And I know --

7 STEVE: He says he knows.

8 JOHN: I -- he probably uses them for bait.
9 Where I'm from they --

10 STEVE TO DAVID: He says you use them for
11 bait. Because he wants to know -- he says you
12 probably do it where he's from --

13 STEVE TO JOHN: They what?

14 JOHN: Eat them.

15 STEVE TO DAVID: They eat them.

16 JOHN: That's right.

17 STEVE: Okay.

18 DAVID: (Not discernible).

19 JOHN: So, are we going to get to talk to
20 anybody?

21 STEVE: Well --

22 JOHN: I'll talk to David again if he, if he
23 wants to. I'll talk to him again. You know what I
24 mentioned to you.

25 STEVE: John, you know what we're supposed

1 to do? He asked to --

2 JOHN: You're supposed to sleep probably.

3 Yeah.

4 STEVE: Well, yeah. He wanted us to read
5 Isaiah 65 and 6 to you because of mentioning how you
6 eat those crawfish.

7 JOHN: Never mind. Never mind. I know what
8 it's going to say.

9 STEVE: What is it going to say?

10 JOHN: They're going to poison me.

11 STEVE: Well, it's close. And no cigars.

12 JOHN: Hey. I don't smoke those either.
13 Well, you got --

14 STEVE: You can smoke a cigar, but don't eat
15 those things.

16 JOHN: Now, see? The cigar won't kill me,
17 huh?

18 STEVE: No, it won't.

19 JOHN: No. I'd have a hard time convincing
20 --

21 STEVE: Hey --

22 JOHN: -- somebody of that.

23 STEVE: Hey, get this.

24 JOHN: Go ahead.

25 STEVE: It says here for behold the Lord

1 will come with fire and with his chariots like a
2 whirlwind --

3 JOHN: Uh-huh.

4 STEVE: -- to render his anger with fury and
5 his rebuke with flames of fire.

6 JOHN: Uh-huh.

7 STEVE: For by fire and by his sword will
8 the Lord plead with all flesh. And the slaying of the
9 Lord shall be many. They that sanctify themselves and
10 purify themselves in the gardens behind one tree in
11 the midst --

12 JOHN: Uh-huh.

13 STEVE: -- eating swine's flesh and the
14 abomination and the mouse shall be consumed together,
15 sayeth the Lord.

16 JOHN: It didn't say crawfish.

17 STEVE: If you read Deuteronomy, Chapter 14,
18 or Leviticus 11 --

19 JOHN: Uh-huh.

20 STEVE: -- you will see it there. Well --

21 JOHN: Well, will it say crawfish?

22 STEVE: Oh, yeah. Anything that doesn't
23 have fins or scales is bad for the body. See, if you
24 eat a pig, a pig is a, a --

25 JOHN: Oh, I know. I know.

1 STEVE: -- cesspool. It eats dead, decaying
2 fecal matter.

3 JOHN: Oh, yeah.

4 STEVE: It eats anything. So, God created
5 some animals to actually keep the world clean.
6 They're sort of clean. Other animals have been
7 allowed -- have been added to the diet for man's
8 benefit.

8 JOHN: Well, you don't think crawfish were?

9 STEVE: Oh, definitely not. Definitely not.
10 They eat dead --

11 JOHN: Oysters?

12 STEVE: They eat -- oh, another thing that
13 eats dead, decaying matter down in the ocean is --

13 JOHN: Oysters?

14 STEVE: Oh, yeah. (Not discernible).

15 JOHN: Are you going to tell me --

16 STEVE: Rules that -- in fact --

17 JOHN: What about well, catfish?

18 STEVE: And as far as -- for --

18 JOHN: -- catfish have fins.

19 STEVE: Do they have scales though?

20 JOHN: Su-- catfish?

21 STEVE: Yeah.

22 JOHN: Yeah, they have scales.

1 STEVE: Are you posit--
2 STEVE TO DAVID: Do catfish have fins and
3 scales?
4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No.
5 STEVE: No scales.
6 JOHN: No scales?
7 STEVE: No scales.
8 JOHN: You mean, no catfish?
9 STEVE: They eat bad -- they eat a lot of
10 dead crap on the bottom of the rivers and --
11 JOHN: Steven?
12 STEVE: -- places. Yeah?
13 JOHN: I guess oysters and beer are
14 definitely out, huh?
15 STEVE: Beer is okay. Beer is all right.
16 JOHN: In moderation?
17 STEVE: You got -- now, he said it the same
18 time you did.
19 JOHN: Huh?
20 STEVE: You and Dave said it at the same
21 time.
22 JOHN: We're on the same wavelength then,
23 aren't we.
24 STEVE: I, I'm hoping so.
25 JOHN: Well, that's the -- me, too.

1 STEVE: I'm hoping so.

2 JOHN: This is going to be depressing, going
3 back --

4 STEVE: He says that -- he says a little
5 wine is good with the Eucharist.

6 JOHN: Well, I, I, I'll go along with that.

7 STEVE TO DAVID: He says he'll go along with
8 that.

9 JOHN: I'll go along with that. Listen.

10 STEVE: Yeah.

11 JOHN: What do you, what do you think about
12 what I mentioned to you before? And I didn't mean it
13 to, to s--

14 STEVE: Well, do you want to talk to a few
15 people here?

16 JOHN: Yeah, or that -- or David.

17 STEVE TO DAVID: He'd like to talk to a few
18 people here or you, if it's possible.

19 DAVID: (Indiscernible).

20 JOHN: Hey, I don't want him to think he's
21 playing second fiddle.

22 STEVE: Yes. He said you -- he said we were
23 studying Habakkuk.

24 JOHN: I don't, I don't want him to think
25 that he's playing second fiddle now.

1 STEVE TO DAVID: He, he says he don't want
2 you to think he's playing second fiddle now.

3 DAVID: Well, well, tell him to -- if he
4 wants to listen, I'll read it. He can listen along.

5 STEVE: He says now, if you will, he'll read
6 it, if you want to listen along here.

7 JOHN: Read what?

8 STEVE: Habakkuk. It's very short. It's
9 very short.

10 JOHN: Some, somebody, you know, picked up
11 the other phone and was playing some -- they said
12 something about Saturday Night Live or something else
13 on there?

14 STEVE: Is that right?

15 JOHN: Yeah. I don't know who inside there
16 was --

17 STEVE: John, you're all right. Here he is.
18 Okay?

19 JOHN: Okay.

20 STEVE TO DAVID: Here he is.

21 (Clicking sound.)

22 JOHN: Don't disconnect --

23 DAVID: Hello?

24 JOHN: Hi.

25 DAVID: Hey, John. Steve says he just don't

1 know about you.

2 JOHN: He doesn't?

3 DAVID: Yeah. He says he likes you, but he
4 just don't know about you.

5 JOHN: Hey. He'll be able to find out
6 someday, though, huh?

7 DAVID: Yeah. Okey-doke. Aah.

8 JOHN: Are you feeling a little better?

9 DAVID: Are ya'll, are ya'll ready?

10 JOHN: You're feeling better tonight, aren't
11 you?

12 DAVID: Well, I, I feel kind of a lot
13 better, you know. I've, I've, you know, been able to
14 get up a little bit and try to -- it's just this top
15 part of the leg that's been --

16 JOHN: Did, did --

17 DAVID: You know where you --

18 JOHN: Does --

19 DAVID: You know where your -- let me tell
20 you exactly where I got hit, all right?

21 JOHN: Where?

22 DAVID: Okay. You see where your, see where
23 your left leg is? Okay?

24 JOHN: Yeah.

25 DAVID: Do you know where the hip bone is?

1 JOHN: Yes, sir.

2 DAVID: Okay. Now, when you're going
3 towards your belly button?

4 JOHN: Yes, sir.

5 DAVID: Come over about four inches.

6 JOHN: Okay.

7 DAVID: I got hit right there in the belly
8 --

9 JOHN: Just the left side where you'd have
10 an acka-- appendectomy scar on the right side. Just
11 about the opposite, huh?

12 DAVID: Right. Okay. So, you four -- about
13 four inches from the belly to the left.

14 JOHN: Okay.

15 DAVID: All right.

16 JOHN: And it went which way?

17 DAVID: And it went in. It went in and hit
18 the hip bone.

19 JOHN: Uh-huh?

20 DAVID: The top of it. Because that thing
21 -- you know, I'll tell you.

22 JOHN: Uh-huh.

23 DAVID: And then it came out my back --

24 DAVID TO LISA: How many inches is it from
25 the middle of my hip to the back again, Lisa? About

1 what?

2 LISA: (Not discernible).

3 DAVID: Well, like if, if I'm laying on my
4 back, I'm laying on it. It's just a -- it's, it's a,
5 it's a so-- it's a big caliber. I guess it's about --
6 was a .45-er. I don't know.

7 DAVID TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: What would
8 you say, about a .45?

9 JOHN: It should have been something a
10 little smaller.

11 DAVID: You think 9-mm?

12 JOHN: Yeah.

13 DAVID: Probably a hypersonic then.

14 JOHN: Something -- I -- well, I don't know,
15 but that's what the round should have been, probably.

16 DAVID: Yeah. And -- so, anyway, it went in
17 there --

18 JOHN: There's no infection though, huh?

19 DAVID: No. No.

20 JOHN: Good.

21 DAVID: I let it -- you know, like I said, I
22 bled over three qu-- three pints or so.

23 JOHN: Yeah.

24 DAVID: And I learned that from a long time
25 ago, that any time you start covering them up and all

1 that they don't bleed clean.

2 JOHN: Yeah.

3 DAVID: So, like I said, it -- now, I bled a
4 couple of blankets and -- because I laid in three
5 different places on the floor.

6 JOHN: But it, it hit, hit you in the wrist
7 also?

8 DAVID: Yeah. Well, then, the shell -- a, a
9 round -- second --

10 JOHN: Or, or another round?

11 DAVID: Well, that was a completely
12 different bullet.

13 JOHN: Oh. Oh.

14 DAVID: See, first, at first, I thought I'd
15 been shot twice.

16 JOHN: Uh-huh.

17 DAVID: But, actually, what we figured out
18 what it did was I got shot and -- several rounds were
19 fired at me, because it went, it went in the front,
20 and then went straight out the back. That's what
21 happened.

22 JOHN: Uh-huh. Did you --

23 DAVID: And --

24 JOHN: -- get the use of that suture kit at
25 all?

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DAVID: Huh?

JOHN: Did you --

DAVID: No. What, what they're saying is is that it's already swollen up and it, it's already started to heal.

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: It's about a -- oh, good over a half-an-inch in gash. If somebody was to take above your wrist there and just make a clean cut like a little ditch --

JOHN: Going up your forearm?

DAVID: Going sideways, on the side of it, the side of my thumb.

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Up, up above the thumb. But my whole thumb is totally numb.

JOHN: Really?

DAVID: So, it's just numb now.

JOHN: (Not discernible).

DAVID: Yeah. See, what happened was, what happened was I went to, I went to see what was going on. You know, I was just -- I was walking around seeing what was going on. And when I, when I went up one place, then that's when some -- you know, I looked out the window. Some rounds came up and that's, and

1 that's when they hit me there.

2 JOHN: You think you got your hip broken?

3 DAVID: I think it's either chipped or
4 cracked --

5 JOHN: Yeah.

6 DAVID: -- at the very top of it.

7 JOHN: Yeah.

8 DAVID: And, of course, the back hole was a
9 lot bigger than the front hole. It was like I went
10 outside (not discernible) --

11 JOHN: You don't have any of those girls in
12 there that, you know, have some medical background
13 that could really tell you whether you, you broke a
14 bone there, huh?

15 DAVID: Oh, we've got two --

16 JOHN: You think you just chipped --

17 DAVID: -- we've got two RNs. We've got two
18 Registered Nurses here.

19 JOHN: You think it just may have just
20 chipped it a little bit?

21 DAVID: I don't know. It's just hard to
22 tell.

23 JOHN: Well, when you tried walking?

24 DAVID: Well, see, the way I have to walk --

25 JOHN: Could you put any weight on it?

1 DAVID: Not -- only when it's straight up
2 and down.

3 JOHN: Uh-huh.

4 DAVID: It's all, all from the -- it's from
5 the hip belt --

6 DAVID TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: I'll be right
7 with you on a second.

8 DAVID TO JOHN: From the belt up is just big
9 swollen.

10 JOHN: Uh-huh.

11 DAVID: You know, it's just, it's just real
12 big swollen.

13 JOHN: Uh-huh.

14 DAVID: So, anyway -- so --

15 JOHN: Well, you sure sounded a lot better
16 tonight than you did, did last night.

17 DAVID: It's, it's hyperkinetics.
18 Hyperkinetics.

19 JOHN: It is?

20 DAVID: Mind power. Mind power.

21 JOHN: The mind over the body, huh?

22 DAVID: Well, yeah. Plus the mind over the
23 -- so, it's when you treat your body descent, you
24 know, you heal faster, too. Or maybe God's just
25 healing me. I know people are scoffing and laughing,

1 but --

2 JOHN: What?

3 DAVID: -- let them get shot like this and
4 see.

5 JOHN: Well, I don't think anybody's
6 laughing about it at all?

7 DAVID: I mean, what -- it's all on the
8 radio. They're going, ah, he wasn't shot or --

9 JOHN: Well --

10 DAVID: -- or emergency (Indiscernible), oh,
11 yeah.

12 JOHN: I'll tell you what --

13 DAVID: We was thinking about, we was
14 thinking about sending y'all some pictures.

15 JOHN: The media is -- you know, you take
16 the media with a grain of salt. But if you want to
17 send some pictures out -- I'll tell you. Do it.

18 DAVID: I think I might.

19 JOHN: Do it. I mean --

20 DAVID: They were, they were thinking about
21 these holes.

22 JOHN: Hey. Send them out.

23 DAVID: He appears to be on my side.

24 JOHN: I did -- hey. That's, that's
25 carrying it a little far, isn't it?

1 DAVID: Yeah. And it's a bullet hole this
2 time instead of a spear.

3 JOHN: I'm not going --

4 DAVID: Okey-doke.

5 JOHN: I'm not going to give you any, any
6 sponge with --

7 DAVID: Vinegar.

8 JOHN: -- bitter, bitter wine either, am I?

9 DAVID: No. Gall.

10 JOHN: You got it.

11 DAVID: Vinegar.

12 JOHN: The -- no. If, if -- seriously, if
13 you want to, if you want to send out some pictures,
14 I'd be happy to send them -- show them to some medical
15 people, too. You know what I, what I mentioned a
16 little earlier?

17 DAVID: What was we talking about?

18 JOHN: God, I guess we mentioned a bunch of
19 things. But what I talked about, if you wanted to
20 send out a message.

21 DAVID: Oh, yeah. Well, like I said, it's,
22 it's kind of a --

23 JOHN: Get up -- go ahead.

24 DAVID: It was kind of a -- you know, I
25 don't want to, I don't want to -- you know, what I

1 gave in the first message --

2 JOHN: Yeah.

3 DAVID: -- was serious enough. I mean,
4 nobody can deny that Psalms 45 was the first seal.
5 You know, nobody in their right mind. Hey. Psalms
6 45. David, a great king, was inspired of God to write
7 in behalf of God, and surely God could write himself.
8 God wrote the law with his own finger. And then God
9 told Moses to write the laws afterwards. But, you
10 know, it's kind of like this. We heard ministers the
11 other day, lots of them, get on the phone and --

12 JOHN: Yeah.

13 DAVID: -- well, ah, this and this and ah
14 some theologians in the apocrypha believe that, ah,
15 this, that, and that and this, and we believe, and we
16 feel, beh, beh, beh. And I just come straight across
17 the table, going, now, what's this little key of David
18 right here? Let's start with Psalms 45, putting
19 little key in, open the door. Look here at Psalms 45.
20 Say it was Revelations.

21 JOHN: Hey --

22 DAVID: See?

23 JOHN: Let me, let me tell you --

24 DAVID: And people go like wow --

25 JOHN: You --

1 DAVID: -- it's right.
2 JOHN: -- you can respond to that.
3 DAVID: I win. You lose.
4 JOHN: You know, you can respond to that if
5 you --
6 DAVID: The first point's mine, right, John?
7 JOHN: Hey.
8 DAVID: Right?
9 JOHN: Whatever.
10 DAVID: Did I win the first point?
11 JOHN: Well --
12 DAVID: Hey, seven strikes you're out. You
13 know that, don't you?
14 JOHN: Seven strikes you're out?
15 DAVID: Seven strikes, you're out forever.
16 JOHN: Nah.
17 DAVID: Yep. God's going to whup your
18 behind, going to burn --
19 JOHN: Yeah, but he --
20 DAVID: -- you.
21 JOHN: -- he won't be getting a fresh one,
22 I'll tell you that, to whip on.
23 DAVID: I tell you.
24 JOHN: But if you want to, to respond to
25 what you saw on the news or anything else, I, I --

1 DAVID: Why would you want to do that for me
2 anyway?

3 JOHN: Well, did you understand --

4 DAVID: Because you don't believe --

5 JOHN: Did you understand --

6 DAVID: -- my (not discernible) --

7 JOHN: -- everything I said that --

8 DAVID: You said send some girls out and
9 send some kids out, and we're, we're going to come
10 out.

11 JOHN: I know you are.

12 DAVID: You see, we're just waiting on God
13 because God, when we come out --

14 JOHN: I know you are.

15 DAVID: -- God's going to give you a chance
16 to judge us, and then God is going to show you what
17 he's talking about.

18 JOHN: Well, I hope so.

19 DAVID: For right now the truth, the seed is
20 spreading. And, you know, people have an opportunity
21 right now to look at the situation, to see how you're
22 working, and they don't know nothing about us.

23 JOHN: No, they don't.

24 DAVID: When, when we come out --

25 JOHN: Other than what you told them on that

1 tape.

2 DAVID: Right. And when we --

3 JOHN: That's the only thing. And, and if

4 --

5 DAVID: Well, that's what -- you know, God's
6 word sounds pretty far (indiscernible) first -- you
7 know, hey, don't -- don't be stupid.

8 JOHN: But you've got a lot of people that
9 are just sitting out there saying, aw, what's this guy
10 talking about. And, and they, and they take it in
11 kind of a frivolous vein when they shouldn't --

12 DAVID: Ooh --

13 JOHN: -- take it in a frivolous vein.

14 DAVID: You know, Psalms -- you know what
15 Psalms 1 says? Blessed is the man that walketh not in
16 the counsel of the ungodly nor sits in the seat of the
17 scorners. Right? Or stands in the way of sinners,
18 but whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and in
19 his law on what he meditates day and night. You know,
20 why the law? It says he shall be as a tree planted by
21 the waters and his leaf shall not fade. Everything he
22 does shall prosper. The ungodly are not so, but like
23 a chaff which the wind blows away. Therefore, the
24 ungodly will not stand in the judgment nor sinners in
25 the congregation of the saints. The way of the

1 ungodly shall perish. Now, it's very ungodly not to
2 pay attention to scripture. It's very ungodly to mock
3 or to lightly esteem the fact that Psalms 45 is the
4 first seal. I cannot help it --

5 JOHN: You've seen and heard it, though,
6 haven't you?

7 DAVID: -- I cannot help it that people
8 disregard -- why -- why do you think the second seal
9 says what it says? Huh? Why do you think that you're
10 fulfilling the very thing God says you're going to
11 fulfill before he beats your butt? You don't even
12 know the second seal, do you?

13 JOHN: No.

14 DAVID: Okay. Well, I'd like to show you.

15 JOHN: Go ahead.

16 DAVID: Okay. We're going to, we're going
17 to alter our route here for a second. We're going to
18 show John the second seal. Let's turn to Revelation
19 6, verses 3. I appreciate this, John, for my sake --

20 JOHN: Well, I do too.

21 DAVID: It's for my sake too, because I
22 really would like you to -- the light to turn on. I'd
23 like to see you in the kingdom, you know? So, you
24 know, it's -- we're all made of flesh and blood and we
25 all get this one life to learn about good and evil

1 and, and then, you know, then we've got to stand for a
2 judgment. If we haven't accepted Christ's
3 righteousness, the truth of God, then we're going to
4 lose. Okay. Verse 3. Revelation 6, verse 3.

5 JOHN: I'm there.

6 DAVID: And when he had opened the second
7 seal, I heard the second beast say: Come and see.
8 And there went out another horse that was red. And
9 power was given to him and set thereon to take peace
10 from the earth, and that they should kill one another.
11 And there was given unto him a great sword. Again,
12 it may appear to be a subject of violence, just like
13 the first seal may appear. For, remember, if God
14 makes any violent threats against us, it's so that we
15 might fear him so that we might receive his mercy.
16 Correct?

17 JOHN: Um-hum.

18 DAVID: Okay. That's what you're doing out
19 there. You're showing me a show of arms so we might
20 fear you so we might come out to receive your mercy.
21 I, I appreciate that. Thank you very much. Now,
22 let's turn to the --

23 JOHN: Well, I don't think I'm talking mercy
24 though, huh? Not me or, or we. We're not talking --

25 DAVID: Well --

1 JOHN: -- mercy.

2 DAVID: -- at least, at least the mercy of
3 the judicial system.

4 JOHN: And, and I hope you understand and --
5 that what I tell you is --

6 DAVID: Oh, I realize that. I, I've been
7 hurt before. Don't --

8 JOHN: -- is true.

9 DAVID: -- don't (not discernible).

10 JOHN: You know, that --

11 DAVID: I'm not asking for no, no bequittal
12 or anything like that or amnesty. What I've done, I'm
13 willing -- ready, ready and willing to pay for.

14 JOHN: Well, whatever that may be, huh?

15 DAVID: A lot less than one shall think --

16 JOHN: Well, okay.

17 DAVID: -- that I've done.

18 JOHN: You know, I, I hope it is. And, and

19 --

20 DAVID: That's why I want to talk to Robert.

21 You know --

22 JOHN: You're going to get the opportunity
23 to --

24 DAVID: I did everything in my power to keep
25 you guys from making that mistake.

1 JOHN: I know. You said that you had a lot
2 of dialogue with Robert about it. And, and I, and I
3 know he's taking --

4 DAVID: He was the one --

5 JOHN: -- this thing very diffic-- it's very
6 difficult for him.

7 DAVID: Well, you tell him I still love him.

8 JOHN: Well, I'm sure he -- that he believes
9 you do. You know, I can't tell him. He's --

10 DAVID: He's going to, he's going to --

11 JOHN: -- he's not around Waco anymore, I'm
12 afraid, but --

13 DAVID: Well, you need to get him back --

14 (clicking sound.)

15 DAVID: Hello? Hello, Robert? Okay. Are
16 you there?

17 JOHN: Hello?

18 DAVID: All right.

19 JOHN: Yeah.

20 DAVID: Now, are we in the book of
21 Zechariah?

22 JOHN: No. We're in the book of Revelation.

23 DAVID: Well, now, let's turn to Zechariah
24 and let's bust this seal.

25 JOHN: Okay. Be patient with me.

1 DAVID: I will.

2 JOHN: Hang on. Almost there.

3 DAVID: John, I don't mind if you're a --

4 JOHN: We're there.

5 DAVID: -- Catholic. I don't mind if you're
6 a Catholic, John. I just hope you're a --

7 JOHN: Well, I hope not.

8 DAVID: -- a good Catholic.

9 JOHN: I hope not. And I hope I am.

10 DAVID: Now, a good Catholic believes in the
Bible, don't they?

11 JOHN: You bet. And the Ten Commandments.

12 DAVID: And the Ten Commandments. Although
13 the sa-- sabbath -- you changed the sabbath a little
14 bit, but, nevertheless, still you've got a sabbath in
there somewhere, right?

15 JOHN: I'll, I'll do you a favor. I'll go
16 to church on Saturday. How's that?

17 DAVID: (Laughter.)

18 JOHN: Huh?

19 DAVID: Well, you ought to go to church
every day too, just like we do.

20 JOHN: We have an --

21 DAVID: We keep it daily.

22 JOHN: -- evening mass on Saturday. How's

23

1 that?

2 DAVID: Okay.

3 JOHN: Maybe we're swaying a little bit,
4 huh?

5 DAVID: Well, like I say, there's a narrow
6 path and a broad path. So, let's see if we can't
7 resolve it.

8 JOHN: Chapter 1.

9 DAVID: Chapter 1. Now, it was in the
10 eighth month of the second year of Darius, which was
11 one of the kings of Middle Persia, came the word of
12 the Lord to Zechariah, the son of Berekiah, the son of
13 Iddo, the Prophet, saying: The Lord has been sore
14 displeased with your fathers. Okay. So, God was
15 angry with the Jews, right?

16 JOHN: Um-hum.

17 DAVID: Therefore, say though unto them:
18 Thus sayeth the Lord of Hosts. Turn ye into me, said
19 the Lord of Hosts, and I will turn into you, sayeth
20 the Lord of Hosts. Kind of a barter there, huh?

21 JOHN: Um-hum.

22 DAVID: How do we turn to God, though? How
23 will they turn? Well, be not as your fathers and to
24 whom the former prophets have cried, saying: Thus
25 sayeth the Lord of Hosts, turn ye now from evil ways

1 and from your doings. But they did not hear nor
2 hearken unto me, sayeth the Lord. So, they wouldn't
3 listen to prophets, would they?

4 JOHN: Um-hum.

5 DAVID: No. Your fathers, where are they?
6 Dead. And the prophets, do they live forever? No.

7 JOHN: No.

8 DAVID: But my words and my statutes which I
9 commanded to my servants the prophets, did they not
10 take hold of your father? Isaiah the prophets
11 foretold a battle that overthrow the Jews if they
12 didn't listen. And they were. And after 70 years,
13 all of a sudden they came out of captivity, and now
14 Zechariah is prophesying. And they returned and said,
15 like has the Lord of Hosts ought to do unto us
16 according to our ways and according to our doing, so
17 hath he dealt with us. See, prophecy is important,
18 isn't it?

19 JOHN: Um-hum.

20 DAVID: Upon the four-and-twentieth day of
21 the eleventh month, which is in the month Shebat, in
22 the second year of Darius came the word of the Lord
23 unto Zechariah, the son of Berekiah, the son of Iddo,
24 the prophet, saying: I saw by night and, behold, a
25 man riding upon a red horse. Isn't that complicated?

1 Huh?

2 JOHN: Yeah.

3 DAVID: It's a kid's game, isn't it?

4 JOHN: Sure.

5 DAVID: Who do you think this guy is on the
6 red horse?

7 JOHN: Speckled in white.

8 DAVID: And he stood among the myrtle trees
9 that were under the bottom. See, in Jerusalem there's
10 a valley called the Kidron.

11 JOHN: Um-hum.

12 DAVID: Okay. It runs right into -- between
13 the Mount of Olives and, and, and the Mount Mariah
14 (phonetic). And behind --

15 JOHN: I only wish I could go over there and
16 see it.

17 DAVID: Oh, any time, you know. Helal's
18 (phonetic) a good airline.

19 JOHN: Well, you --

20 DAVID: And behind him there were red
21 horses. Now, the Hebrew word speckled, the
22 translators in the English, it's pale. Okay? That
23 there's a word translation. Get your dictionaries out
24 and look. In other words, red horses, pale and white.
25 Then said I: O my Lord, what are these? What does

1 this mean? You know, what are these? What are these
2 horses? What do they -- what does it mean? The angel
3 that talked unto me said unto me: I will show thee
4 what these be. And the man that stood among the
5 myrtle trees answered and said: These are they who
6 the Lord has sent to walk to and fro through the
7 earth. Uh-huh. A little spiritualism here. You ever
8 see horses walking to and fro through the earth?

8 JOHN: Um-hum.

9 DAVID: You ever go around and see all these
10 horses? And they answered the angel of the Lord --
11 now, horses don't talk, do they?

11 JOHN: Not likely.

12 DAVID: These horses do though, don't they?
13 They answered to the angel of the Lord that stood
14 among the myrtle trees and said: we have walked to
15 and fro through the earth and, behold, all the earth
16 sits still and is at rest. Well, remember the Book of
17 Nahum?

17 JOHN: Hmm.

18 DAVID: There's a group that says though
19 that it be likewise quiet and likewise many? See,
20 they're hiding. You know, they're being real quiet.
21 It says they camp out in the hedges, you know, and the
22 bushes and everything, that God's fixing to come and

23

1 burn them up. Remember?

2 JOHN: Um-hum.

3 DAVID: Because they're fighting against the
4 Lord. They don't know that yet, but they're fighting
5 against the man that brought good tidings. Now, these
6 horses, the way they travel, because everywhere the
7 Bible goes they go. Everywhere there's a scripture,
8 there's a revelation of Jesus Christ, which is a
9 mystery of God God declared aforetime to who? His
servants the prophets. Right?

10 JOHN: Um-hum.

11 DAVID: Then the angel of the Lord answered
12 and said: O Lord of Hosts, how long will thy not have
13 mercy on Jerusalem and on the citizens of Judah,
14 against which thou has had indignation these three
15 score and ten years? For 70 years God allowed Judea
16 to be led into captivity into Babylon. Well, they
17 still have to go through Middle Persia, Greece, Rome,
18 Europe, and sometime during the times that Europe
19 still stands as a broken nation.

20 JOHN: Okay.

21 DAVID: Then God the Rock will set up a
22 kingdom. And the Lord answered the angel that talked
23 with me with good words and comfortable words, and so
24 the angel communed with me and says: Cry thou:
25

1 | Saying thus the Lord of Hosts, I am jealous for
2 | Jerusalem and for Zion with a great jealousy. And I
3 | am very sore displeased with the heathen that are at
4 | what?

5 | JOHN: That are at ease.

6 | DAVID: Because they don't care about these
7 | horses, do they?

8 | JOHN: No. Kind of taking a lackadaisical
9 | attitude.

10 | DAVID: Right. For I was but a little
11 | displeased and they helped ford the what? Of -- so,
12 | God's being afflicted, isn't he?

13 | JOHN: Um-hum.

14 | DAVID: Therefore, thus sayeth the Lord, I
15 | am returned to Jerusalem's mercies and my house shall
16 | be built in it sayeth the Lord of Hosts, and a line
17 | shall be stretched forth upon Jerusalem. Cry yet,
18 | saying -- cry yet, saying: Thus sayeth the Lord of
19 | Hosts -- are you there?

20 | JOHN: Yeah.

21 | DAVID: My cities through prosperity, she
22 | have be spread abroad. And the Lord shall yet comfort
23 | Zion and shall yet choose Jerusalem. It doesn't say
24 | when, though, right?

25 | JOHN: No.

1 DAVID: Then lifted up mine eyes and saw
2 and, behold, four horns. Uh-uh.

3 JOHN: Which means?

4 DAVID: Well, let's find out. And I said
5 unto the angel that talked with me: What be these?
6 And he answered me, these are the horns which have
7 scattered Judah, Israel, and Jerusalem. Well, what
8 were the four empires that scattered Judah, Jerusalem,
9 and Israel? Babylon, Middle Persia, Greece, and Rome.
10 Huh. And the Lord showed me four carpenters. You
11 know, carpenters build, right?

12 JOHN: Um-hum.

13 DAVID: Then said I: What come these to do?
14 And he spake, saying, these are the horns which have
15 scattered Judah, stood nobly, then lift up his head.
16 But these are come to fray them. To scare them. To
17 cast out the horns of the Gentiles, which lifted up
18 their horn over the land of Judah to scatter it. Now,
19 wait a minute. How can it be that Babylon, Middle
20 Persia, Greece, and Rome can come back to Jerusalem
21 one day to try to scare the Jews, and at the same time
22 scatter the Gentiles? Well, it's, it's a situation
23 you'll find in other prophecies that deals with Amon
24 Moab, right? The Arab nations want Jerusalem. Okay?
25 And unless the empires of Babylon, Middle Persia,

1 Greece, and Rome combine together and defend
2 Jerusalem, the Arab nations would overthrow it. Now,
3 this is something very serious. Now, here's the next
4 part of it. I lift up mine eyes again and looked to
5 behold a man with a measuring line in his hand. And
6 said I: Whither goest thou? And he said unto me: To
7 measure Jerusalem, to see what the breadth thereof and
8 what is the height -- length thereof. To see how big
9 it is. Because no doubt he wants to populate it,
right?

10 JOHN: Um-hum.

11 DAVID: And behold the angel that talked
12 with me went forth. Another angel went up to meet him
13 and said to them: Run, speak to this young man,
14 saying Jerusalem shall be inhabited as towns without
15 walls for the multitude of men and cattle therein.
16 Now, we can't be deceived. Jerusalem now is -- the
one --
