2 SHERRI: -- (Indiscernible) And if we did
3 not, if we do not start protecting ourselves by, you
4 know --

5 JOHN: Hey.

6 SHERRI: -- shooting you guys, the choppers
7 would have --

8 JOHN: I can't argue about what happened in
9 the past, all right?

10 SHERRI: Okay.

11 JOHN: It happened and it was a tragedy.

12 SHERRI: I know. I know, I know.

13 JOHN: Okay?

14 SHERRI: It --

15 JOHN: I'll see you in court, Sherri.

16 SHERRI: You'll see me in court?

17 JOHN: Yeah, that's --

18 SHERRI: I'll see you --

19 JOHN: -- that's where we all get our day of
20 justice, huh?

21 SHERRI: I'll see you, hey, I will see you
22 in the highest court there is.

23 JOHN: Well, I'm sure we will some day, huh.

24 SHERRI: The highest court, do you know
25 where that is?

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JOHN: Yeah.

SHERRI: Yeah. And I would really be shaking in your boots about now.

JOHN: Why?

SHERRI: Why?

JOHN: Yeah.

SHERRI: Why?

JOHN: Yeah. Is there something I should fear?

SHERRI: Psalms, Psalms 18 is terrifying.

JOHN: But is there something I should fear?

SHERRI: (Indiscernible) I can't believe this.

JOHN: Huh?

SHERRI: Because you don't fear God, that's why.

JOHN: Well, I do.

SHERRI: You absolutely do-- okay, Revelations 6. When this earth starts doing it's terrifying thing --

JOHN: Uh-huh.

SHERRI: -- you're going to be one of those, you know, the, the people rushing underneath the rocks --

JOHN: Uh-huh.

1 Psalm 75, because this is what's gonna happen to you.

2 JOHN: What?

3 SHERRI: Psalm 75.

4 JOHN: You sound awful belligerent towards
5 me.

6 SHERRI: I am because it scares me --

7 JOHN: Why?

8 SHERRI: -- that you don't even fear God,
9 because this is what's gonna happen to you.

10 JOHN: God is loving.

11 SHERRI: God is loving? Read Psalm 75.

12 JOHN: Isn't God loving?

13 SHERRI: Not to those that don't --

14 JOHN: Huh?

15 SHERRI: -- know his seals.

16 JOHN: Why do you say that?

17 SHERRI: Because that's what the book says,
18 not me.

19 JOHN: It says that --

20 SHERRI: Read Psalm 75.

21 JOHN: -- God doesn't love everyone?

22 SHERRI: Turn to Psalm 75. Turn to Psalm
23 75.

24 JOHN: God doesn't love everyone?

25 SHERRI: Oh, loves them.

1 JOHN: Huh?

2 SHERRI: Dearly. That's why He's so
3 patiently waiting on certain people.

4 JOHN: He's forgiving too, Sherri, believe
5 me.

6 SHERRI: Yeah, He is forgiving, yes, but not
7 forgiving when you disregard some of His judgments.

8 JOHN: Wait a minute, you're talking to me.

9 SHERRI: Huh?

10 JOHN: You're talking to me.

11 SHERRI: I know I'm talking to you --

12 JOHN: Huh?

13 SHERRI: -- because you have a soul and we
14 happen to --

15 JOHN: Do you have a soul?

16 SHERRI: Yeah. We happen to really be
17 concerned about your soul.

18 JOHN: Oh, I bet.

19 SHERRI: We are.

20 JOHN: Uh-huh.

21 SHERRI: We are. So Psalm 75.

22 JOHN: What do you want?

23 SHERRI: I want you to read Psalm 75.

24 JOHN: Okay.

25 SHERRI: This is what's gonna happen to you.

1 JOHN: I will read Psalm 75, okay?
2 SHERRI: Read it. Please.
3 JOHN: What, do I have to read it to you?
4 SHERRI: Yes.
5 JOHN: Why?
6 SHERRI: 'Cause I want you to know --
7 JOHN: You won't answer any of my questions.
8 SHERRI: Okay.
9 JOHN: Why should I read it to you?
10 SHERRI: Do you know what a horn is?
11 JOHN: Uh-uh. Tell me.
12 SHERRI: Horn's a dick.
13 JOHN: Yeah.
14 SHERRI: And you're gonna be without yours.
15 JOHN: Oh, that's cute.
16 SHERRI: I know that's cute.
17 JOHN: That's a real class act.
18 SHERRI: No, that's just what Psalm 75 --
19 JOHN: I bet that makes you really feel
20 proud, doesn't it?
21 SHERRI: No, it doesn't make me feel proud.
22 JOHN: Huh?
23 SHERRI: It makes me shake in my boots.
24 JOHN: What's it mean?
25 SHERRI: What do you mean, what's it mean?

1 What's it mean? Read Psalm 75.

2 JOHN: No, I mean what, what are you trying
3 to say to me?

4 SHERRI: I'm telling you what God is telling
5 you.

6 JOHN: I think you're just being kind of
7 crude.

8 SHERRI: Read -- just -- never mind. Just
9 read Psalm 75. I got to go. If you don't believe
10 what that book says, I'm done. Tau.

11 JOHN: Have a nice day.

12 SHERRI: Okay.

13 JOHN: Aloha.

14 SHERRI: Here's, here's the next -- oh, she
15 just left. See what I told you?

16 JOHN: What?

17 SHERRI: If she didn't take it right then
18 she was going to leave.

19 JOHN: Well, she probably figured you were
20 getting kind of belligerent.

21 SHERRI: I guess you'll be watching Johnny
22 Carson tonight, huh?

23 JOHN: Who?

24 SHERRI: You.

25 JOHN: No, I'm sitting here.

1 SHERRI: Are you going to read Psalm 75?
2 JOHN: Sure.
3 SHERRI: Good. I'm glad.
4 JOHN: Unto thee, oh God. How's that?
5 SHERRI: Keep going, it's towards the end of
6 the, end of the chapter there, or end of the psalm.
7 JOHN: Uh-huh.
8 SHERRI: And I would shake in your boots.
9 JOHN: Well, you're calling me wicked.
10 SHERRI: I'm calling -- hey, we're all
11 wicked. I'm wicked, too.
12 JOHN: Why do you say that?
13 SHERRI: Why? Well, if you knew more --
14 JOHN: You're gonna lose your horn?
15 SHERRI: I don't have a horn.
16 JOHN: Well, it says the horns of the
17 wicked. You said you're wicked.
18 SHERRI: The horns of the wicked, yes.
19 JOHN: Uh-huh. Do you have a horn?
20 SHERRI: The horns of the wicked. What else
21 does it say? What does it say about the horns of the
22 wicked?
23 JOHN: Will I cut off --
24 SHERRI: Will I cut off.
25 JOHN: -- but the horns of the righteous

1 should be shall be exalted.

2 SHERRI: Should be exalted, so the men --

3 JOHN: Maybe, maybe I'm righteous.

4 SHERRI: -- the men. Are you righteous?

5 JOHN: I hope so.

6 SHERRI: Do you know where the fourth seal
7 is found?

8 JOHN: Do I have to?

9 SHERRI: Well, that's what God says.

10 JOHN: What, if I don't know where it's
11 found --

12 SHERRI: Oh --

13 JOHN: I'm not righteous.

14 SHERRI: According to the book you aren't.

15 JOHN: What, what are we having, are we
16 having a lecture on theology tonight?

17 SHERRI: Well, all I'm saying is you're
18 gonna shake in your boots and I'll -- you know, you're
19 just being warned ahead of time, that's all.

20 JOHN: Hey, hey.

21 SHERRI: I'm sorry. I'm sorry. I mean, I'm
22 totally sorry.

23 JOHN: Don't let it get to you, 'cause it
24 won't --

25 SHERRI: Anyway --

1 JOHN: -- 'cause it won't get to me.

2 SHERRI: Anyway, I'm tau. Here we go. Here
3 we go.

4 JOHN: I'll -- you be good, huh?

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: (Indiscernible)
6 wants to learn any more scripture.

7 SHERRI: Do you want to learn any more
8 scripture?

9 JOHN: Who's this?

10 SHERRI: Me. This is Sherri.

11 JOHN: Oh, I thought you were running off on
12 me.

13 SHERRI: You know, it's just that I'm real
14 concerned that you don't seem to fear, that's all,
15 and, you know, you're talking --

16 JOHN: Do I fear death? Is that --

17 SHERRI: Do you fear God?

18 JOHN: -- what you're asking?

19 SHERRI: I'm asking if you fear God.

20 JOHN: Sure, I love God.

21 SHERRI: The beginning of wisdom is fearing
22 God.

23 JOHN: Hey.

24 SHERRI: You know, fearing God?

25 JOHN: You know, some people fear God, other

1 people love God.

2 SHERRI: Well, you don't fear God.

3 JOHN: And, and it's like being a pessimist
4 and being an --

5 SHERRI: Do you want to know any more
6 scripture about this?

7 JOHN: It's like being a pessimist and an
8 optimist.

9 SHERRI: John, do you want to know some more
10 scripture about this?

11 JOHN: Is it half full or half empty, kid.
12 Huh?

13 SHERRI: Do you want to know any more
14 scripture about this?

15 JOHN: Where are we going with this?

16 SHERRI: Huh?

17 JOHN: Where are we going with this?

18 SHERRI: What do you mean, where are we
19 going? For your understanding.

20 JOHN: Well, you just wanted to be
21 belligerent --

22 SHERRI: For your salvation, that's my --

23 JOHN: -- and, and raising your voice and
24 getting crude and all of this kind of stuff.

25 SHERRI: I'm not getting crude, I said

1 excuse me ahead of time. And it was not as crude as
2 your men were, not your men but, you know, the other
3 guys.

4 JOHN: I'm not talking about what happened
5 last Sunday.

6 SHERRI: You're all the same, you're all the
7 same company, government. I mean, I don't talk like
8 those guys.

9 JOHN: Well, I'm sorry you feel that way.

10 SHERRI: You know, they talk a lot cruder
11 and they didn't say, you know, excuse me ahead of
12 time.

13 JOHN: Well --

14 SHERRI: Anyway, did you want to know some
15 more scripture on this?

16 JOHN: Like what?

17 SHERRI: About, about anything from David?

18 JOHN: What do you want to tell me?

19 SHERRI: No, I want to know, do you want to
20 study?

21 JOHN: Do I want to study scripture tonight?

22 SHERRI: Um-hum.

23 JOHN: No. What I asked David is to speak
24 to some people tonight. And he said that he would
25 make them all available for me to speak to them.

1 SHERRI: Yeah, well, most of them went to
2 bed.

3 JOHN: I wonder why?

4 SHERRI: Because. I was in bed. I didn't
5 want to get up. I said I'd talk to him tomorrow. And
6 then he says, well, why don't you talk to him.

7 JOHN: Oh, you, you couldn't give up the
8 opportunity though, could you, huh?

9 SHERRI: Hey, I'm sorry, but a lot of these
10 people really don't want to speak to you, because it's
11 all the same sh-- stuff.

12 JOHN: What? What same stuff?

13 SHERRI: You know, the questioning, the --

14 JOHN: You think I'm being antagonistic in
15 my dialogue with you or something?

16 SHERRI: No, it's just that --

17 JOHN: I'm really not.

18 SHERRI: -- you know, it's like senseless.
19 Our whole point is the book, the Bible. You don't
20 really --

21 JOHN: People call in here and they care
22 about people, and so I tell them, I tell David and I
23 tell Steve look, all I want to do is talk to the
24 person and to ensure that they're all right, to ensure
25 they're in there.

1 SHERRI: We are all fine here.

2 JOHN: And ensure that they're in there at
3 their own free will.

4 SHERRI: We are here in our own free will,
5 and that garbage that --

6 JOHN: Well, you can speak for yourself.

7 SHERRI: That garbage that you had on the
8 TV, I was about ready to throw something at it.

9 JOHN: What, what's that?

10 SHERRI: Because when you, when the guy said
11 that we, we were not here on our own free will, that's
12 not, that is like so far from the truth.

13 JOHN: Well, who said that?

14 SHERRI: That, that guy that was on the TV.
15 I don't know what his name was, name was. I mean, I
16 took notes on the whole thing.

17 JOHN: Uh-huh.

18 SHERRI: It was bad. It was, it put us in a
19 real bad light.

20 JOHN: Well, there's no question in my mind
21 that you're there on your own free will, and I'm not
22 going to argue that. But people call in and they want
23 to know if their loved ones are, are safe, if they've
24 been injured.

25 SHERRI: I have lived with these people for

1 a long time, and I don't know --

2 JOHN: Do what?

3 SHERRI: I have lived with these people for
4 a long time.

5 JOHN: Uh-huh.

6 SHERRI: This is a family here.

7 JOHN: Uh-huh.

8 SHERRI: And I don't see anybody who wants
9 to leave. Nobody. And you know --

10 JOHN: But you're not, you're not there to
11 speak for other people though, are you?

12 SHERRI: No, I'm not.

13 JOHN: You know, no more than I am either.

14 SHERRI: Hey, you know what? They would --

15 JOHN: Hey, David's son told me he wanted to
16 leave.

17 SHERRI: David's son told you he wanted to
18 leave. You know why? Probably 'cause cartoons or
19 something.

20 JOHN: I didn't bring up why.

21 SHERRI: Well, I didn't --

22 JOHN: And you, it's pure speculation --

23 SHERRI: I didn't know either.

24 JOHN: -- on your part why, isn't it?

25 SHERRI: Speculation.

1 JOHN: Isn't it?

2 SHERRI: Because, you know, this is real
3 senseless. And here's this person that would like to
4 speak to you.

5 JOHN: God bless you, kid.

6 SHERRI: God bless me?

7 JOHN: Yeah, stay in there.

8 SHERRI: I think you better start hoping he
9 blesses something else there, too, 'cause I'd be
10 shaking in your boots.

11 JOHN: Hey. Just take care of yourself,
12 everything will work out fine. And I'll see you when
13 you come out.

14 SHERRI: (Laughs.)

15 JOHN: Because David said you are coming
16 out.

17 SHERRI: Oh, we definitely are coming out.

18 JOHN: He says it's just a matter of time.
19 So I'll see you when you come out.

20 SHERRI: You definitely will see us when we
21 come out.

22 JOHN: Okay.

23 SHERRI: Okay. (Unidentified voices in
24 background not discernible.) Jean left again.

25 JOHN: Pardon me?

1 SHERRI: Where's Jean? She was wanting to
2 -- (Unidentified male voice in background not
3 discernible.) Do you want to speak or not?
4 (Indiscernible) or not, yes or no?
5 MS. BORST: Hi, this Mary Jean Borst again.
6 I just wanted to --
7 JOHN: Hey, Mary Jean, how are you?
8 MS. BORST: Fine. I just wanted to say one
9 thing.
10 JOHN: Yes, ma'am.
11 MS. BORST: I used to work for the FBI --
12 JOHN: Did you really?
13 MS. BORST: -- years ago, yes.
14 JOHN: Where?
15 MS. BORST: Many years ago in Washington,
16 D.C.
17 JOHN: No, kidding, whereabouts?
18 MS. BORST: Well, I was, for a little while
19 I was in the Ident, Identification Building.
20 JOHN: Don't tell me that, what year?
21 MS. BORST: Well, I started in '62.
22 JOHN: So was I.
23 MS. BORST: Really?
24 JOHN: Second and D Street, S.W.
25 MS. BORST: And then I went to the -- oh, I

1 can't remember the name of that building right now, it
2 starts with an R?

3 JOHN: Where?

4 MS. BORST: At that time it was the, the
5 name of the building that I went -- first I was in the
6 Identification Building.

7 JOHN: Uh-huh.

8 MS. BORST: Then I went to the -- I can't
9 remember the name of the building right now. But I,
10 anyway I went --

11 JOHN: Was it the Washington field office?

12 MS. BORST: Oh, I don't think so.

13 JOHN: Or the main building, the main
14 Justice building?

15 MS. BORST: No, I went, it was a smaller
16 building. I went into a steno pool anyway.

17 JOHN: Yeah.

18 MS. BORST: First I was in the Ident
19 Building as a, you know, fingerprint, and then I went
20 to --

21 JOHN: You were in the fingerprint section?

22 MS. BORST: Yes, just for a short time, and
23 then I went --

24 JOHN: You got to be kidding me.

25 MS. BORST: No.

1 JOHN: In 1962?

2 MS. BORST: Right.

3 JOHN: That means two of us were there,
4 doesn't it?

5 MS. BORST: Really?

6 JOHN: Yeah.

7 MS. BORST: Well anyway, I just wanted to
8 say, I mean, I remember a lot of the people that I
9 worked with back then and I'm sure some are still
10 working there.

11 JOHN: Who was your supervisor back then?

12 MS. BORST: In the Identification Building?

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 MS. BORST: I don't really remember, see,
15 'cause I was only in the Identification Building for
16 three months. I went there because --

17 JOHN: Uh-huh.

18 MS. BORST: -- there was no opening at the
19 time in the steno pool, and then I --

20 JOHN: I bet you were happy to get out, huh?

21 MS. BORST: And -- well, I enjoyed it but I
22 loved it in the steno pool.

23 JOHN: Yeah.

24 MS. BORST: And then, but, and I just wanted
25 to mention there was this, I had a good friend back

1 | then --

2 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

3 | MS. BORST: -- who later became an agent.

4 | JOHN: Oh, no kidding, who?

5 | MS. BORST: I was just -- Gary Stone. And
6 | I was just wondering if there's any way I could --

7 | JOHN: Jerry or Gary?

8 | MS. BORST: Gary, Gary, with a G. And I was
9 | just wondering if there's any way I could ever talk to
10 | him or at least just tell him hi for me? I heard --

11 | JOHN: Gary Stone. Do you know where he may
12 | have gone?

13 | MS. BORST: Well, I heard several years
14 | back, it's quite a few years ago, that he was
15 | stationed in Texas, but then that was, you know, quite
16 | a few years ago --

17 | JOHN: Like how many years ago?

18 | MS. BORST: Oh, that's probably, it's
19 | probably been ten years or so ago now, that I heard
20 | that. So --

21 | JOHN: Now, was he an agent when you were
22 | with him up there or was he clerk?

23 | MS. BORST: No, no, no. He came in as a
24 | messenger, right?

25 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

1 MS. BORST: He was a clerk in that same
2 building I was in the steno pool. And then he --

3 JOHN: And it wasn't Washington field
4 office, huh? The Old Post Office Building?

5 MS. BORST: No. It was, it's, the building,
6 the name of the building started with an R.

7 JOHN: Like the Ryder Building or something?

8 MS. BORST: Something like that. Well, I
9 don't think it was Ryder but I'm sure it started with
10 an R.

11 JOHN: Whereabouts was it, do you recall?

12 MS. BORST: I don't know, but it was a ways
13 away from the Identification Building. It wasn't
14 right there, you know.

15 JOHN: It wasn't up near the Library of
16 Congress, huh?

17 MS. BORST: I think it was just like
18 Raleigh, the -- no, not Raleigh.

19 JOHN: What, it wasn't --

20 MS. BORST: Rydell, the Rydell Building.

21 JOHN: Rydell Building?

22 MS. BORST: That was it, Rydell Building.

23 JOHN: That was the old, what, Domestic
24 Intelligence Division, Rydell Building?

25 MS. BORST: It was in the Rydell Building,

1 | so it was like--

2 | JOHN: And he was a messenger there?

3 | MS. BORST: He was a messenger there. And
4 | then he, you know, later he, he studied, he, you know,
5 | went on to become an agent and --

6 | JOHN: Um-hum.

7 | MS. BORST: So it was several years later,
8 | probably before he became an agent.

9 | JOHN: Um-hum.

10 | MS. BORST: But, but he became an agent.
11 | Last I heard, I believe he was stationed in Texas and
12 | that's --

13 | JOHN: Well, let me tell you, we'll try to
14 | round him up.

15 | MS. BORST: Oh, I would love that. And his
16 | wife. He got married back then when he was still a, a
17 | messenger and --

18 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

19 | MS. BORST: -- she was a very good friend of
20 | mine who worked in the steno pool with me, and I would
21 | love it if you could get a message to them, 'cause
22 | they were great people. And you know, so many people
23 | back then -- my, my supervisor in the steno pool was
24 | Sylvia Wahler, and I'm --

25 | JOHN: I bet you she's retired by now.

1 MS. BORST: She's what?

2 JOHN: I bet she's retired by now, huh?

3 MS. BORST: Well, I don't know. She was,
4 back then she was like her late 20's. So --

5 JOHN: And she was a supervisor?

6 MS. BORST: She was a supervisor in the
7 steno pool and --

8 JOHN: That's young.

9 MS. BORST: And she's someone I'm sure that
10 would stay with the FBI until she retired, so she's
11 probably still there.

12 JOHN: Let, let me --

13 MS. BORST: And I really liked her and I
14 would love it if you could tell her hi for me.

15 JOHN: Give me, give me her name again.

16 MS. BORST: Sylvia Wahler. W -- I think
17 it's W-A-H-L-E-R, I'm not sure. But her husband's
18 name is Richard Wahler, Dick. His name is Dick.

19 JOHN: I knew a fellow that --

20 MS. BORST: But he didn't work for the FBI,
21 he was --

22 JOHN: -- that was an agent with that name.
23 But he did not, huh?

24 MS. BORST: No, he, he worked for someone
25 else, but.

1 JOHN: Yeah. How long did you work for the
2 Bureau?

3 MS. BORST: I only worked there for 2½
4 years.

5 JOHN: Yeah.

6 MS. BORST: Then I went back to Minnesota.

7 JOHN: Well, you know something about the
8 Bureau then, huh?

9 MS. BORST: Yes, somewhat, you know. I mean
10 that was years ago.

11 JOHN: And you, and you know we're pretty
12 decent people, don't you.

13 MS. BORST: I know that there are a lot of
14 people that I really loved, you know. Good people all
15 over.

16 JOHN: Some, some good folks, huh.

17 MS. BORST: Right. That's very true.

18 JOHN: Well, well, you can do me a big
19 favor, because we are good people and we are family,
20 and we don't want to mistreat anyone or hurt anyone,
21 and, and if you can plant that seed in there, that,
22 that I'm being as truthful as I can be when I tell you
23 that, that I, I have patience and everybody else out
24 here has an awful lot of patience that this thing will
25 be resolved peacefully and that's, that's our fondest

1 wish. And you know the way the Bureau is, that we
2 like to do things the right way, huh?

3 MS. BORST: Well, I believe you. I mean,
4 and I just have one thing I would like to ask of you.

5 JOHN: You bet.

6 MS. BORST: Please, besides, you know, if
7 you could contact those people I used to know, I would
8 love that, but --

9 JOHN: Uh-huh.

10 MS. BORST: -- just please keep letting
11 David show you the seals, have an open mind and, and
12 study, because this is the truth.

13 JOHN: Okay.

14 MS. BORST: It would never be here if it
15 wasn't the truth. Okay? And, and all we want is for
16 everyone to know the truth and that was all.

17 JOHN: Well, do you think the seals' gonna
18 let you come out of there shortly?

19 MS. BORST: Well, like I said, all I'm
20 waiting is for God to say come out --

21 JOHN: Okay.

22 MS. BORST: -- and I'm out.

23 JOHN: Okay.

24 MS. BORST: Okay?

25 JOHN: I'll see you when you come out, huh?

1 MS. BORST: Okay.

2 JOHN: All right.

3 MS. BORST: I sure appreciate it.

4 JOHN: You be good, huh?

5 MS. BORST: You too. Did you want to talk
6 to David or --

7 JOHN: Sure, I'll talk to anybody that's there.

8 MS. BORST: He says anybody that's here.

9 JOHN: I'll even talk to Sherri if she wants
10 to talk.

11 MS. BORST: Okay, let me check, okay? Okay,
12 bye-bye.

13 JOHN: Okay.

14 [gap]

15 (Unidentified male voice in background not
16 discernible.)

17 JOHN: Hello. Hello. Hello.

18 OLIVER: Hello.

19 JOHN: Hello.

20 OLIVER: This is an Aussie from down under,
21 mate. Good day.

22 JOHN: Hey, how are you?

23 OLIVER: I'm all right.

24 JOHN: What's your name?

25 OLIVER: My name's Oliver Gyarfas.

1 JOHN: Oliver --

2 OLIVER: G-Y-A-R-F-A-S.

3 JOHN: G-Y -- G-Y, give it, give it to me
4 again. G-Y --

5 OLIVER: G-Y-A-R-F-A-S.

6 JOHN: Okay.

7 OLIVER: I just wanted to tell you about my
8 experience.

9 JOHN: Go ahead.

10 OLIVER: Okay.

11 JOHN: Your wife's -- Elizabeth's your wife,
12 huh?

13 OLIVER: No, my -- Elizabeth's my mother.

14 JOHN: Oh, I'm sorry.

15 OLIVER: Yeah. They, they -- I don't where
16 they are at the moment, they're probably pretty
17 worried about me. Anyway, I'd like to tell you about
18 my experience, is that all right?

19 JOHN: Go ahead.

20 OLIVER: Okay. I heard, I heard gunfire,
21 all right, so we -- you know, as you know, we've got a
22 bunker.

23 JOHN: You've got a what?

24 OLIVER: We've got a bunker. You know what
25 that is?

1 JOHN: Well, I know what a bunker should be,
2 yeah.

3 OLIVER: Well, anyway, it's a tornado
4 shelter, something like that.

5 JOHN: Uh-huh.

6 OLIVER: So I went down in there and I
7 walked over to the tunnel entrance, and I see one of
8 your guys in a, in the, in a puddle. I could see his
9 reflection above.

10 JOHN: Uh-huh.

11 OLIVER: He must have seen us, because, you
12 know, he, he screamed out, he said, "Come out you
13 mother-f'ers" --

14 JOHN: Uh-huh.

15 OLIVER: -- you know? I'm, I'm sure you
16 probably know about this. But I couldn't shoot the
17 guy because he was behind the cement, you know? So he
18 was lucky.

19 JOHN: Why would you want to shoot him?

20 OLIVER: Well, he was shooting at us, you
21 know, so self-defense, you know.

22 JOHN: Uh-huh.

23 OLIVER: That's the only reason I'd shoot
24 anyone. Self-defense.

25 JOHN: Let me, let me --

1 OLIVER: I wouldn't go out to kill anyone
2 purposely --
3 JOHN: Let me ask you something, Oliver.
4 OLIVER: Go ahead.
5 JOHN: You're there -- do you have any other
6 relatives in there with you?
7 OLIVER: Yeah.
8 JOHN: Who do you, who else do you have in
9 there with you that are your relatives?
10 OLIVER: I've got a sister, her name's Aisha
11 Gyarfas.
12 JOHN: Okay, I talked to her earlier, I
13 guess, Aisha.
14 OLIVER: Yeah.
15 JOHN: And we, and we were having some
16 confusion as to the spelling of her first name.
17 'Cause she said there were several spellings for her
18 first name.
19 OLIVER: Um-hum.
20 JOHN: What is the correct spelling of her
21 first name?
22 OLIVER: The correct spelling is A-I-S-H-A.
23 JOHN: Okay.
24 OLIVER: That's the correct spelling.
25 JOHN: And, and that's it, just you and your

1 | sister are in there?

2 | OLIVER: Yeah.

3 | JOHN: As far as relatives are concerned.

4 | OLIVER: Yeah.

5 | JOHN: Do you understand, David and Steve
6 | and I have both discussed several nights now, that
7 | everyone in there is free to leave if they care to
8 | leave, all the men, all the women, all the, all the
9 | youngsters. And that's your understanding? That
10 | should you care to leave, you're certainly free to
11 | leave?

12 | OLIVER: Oh, yeah.

13 | JOHN: And no, and nobody's trying to exert
14 | any pressure upon you to leave, so that, that you are
15 | in fact staying in there on your own free will, is
16 | that correct?

17 | OLIVER: That is correct, yes.

18 | JOHN: And that David has told me that he
19 | has every intention of leaving and he wants to leave
20 | and he's just waiting to hear the word and that
21 | everybody then will come out, and he will bring his
22 | flock out with him, and --

23 | OLIVER: Yeah, he --

24 | JOHN: -- is that your impression?

25 | OLIVER: Yeah, he's waiting on Big Daddy to

1 give him the word.

2 JOHN: On who?

3 OLIVER: Big Daddy. God.

4 JOHN: Well, I guess that's one way to
5 address him. I haven't really addressed him that way
6 before.

7 OLIVER: Well, that's just my little
8 nickname for him, that's all.

9 JOHN: Yeah. But you, you are, you are
10 aware that, you know, you're free to leave, all you
11 got to do is walk down the road and --

12 OLIVER: That is true.

13 JOHN: -- that's the way it'll be. How long
14 have you been down there?

15 OLIVER: I think it's been about 11, 12
16 months from now.

17 JOHN: Has it really.

18 OLIVER: Yeah. (Indiscernible)

19 JOHN: Having a tough week, huh? Difficult
20 week --

21 OLIVER: Right.

22 JOHN: -- for all involved. Let me, let me
23 ask you something else.

24 OLIVER: Go ahead.

25 JOHN: How come you have all those weapons

1 in there? And, and I'm just asking for your own
2 opinion, you know.

3 OLIVER: Well, we, you know, we, we know the
4 prophecies and we know, we know what God --

5 JOHN: Uh-huh.

6 OLIVER: -- God, we know what the dragon's
7 gonna do. We know.

8 JOHN: Um-hum.

9 OLIVER: So we, we, we were prepared for
10 that, you know.

11 JOHN: And the, the only reason I ask is
12 that I've never been in a, in a church or a religious
13 community before that, that had the volume of weapons
14 that you obviously have in there.

15 OLIVER: Um-hum.

16 JOHN: And I understand the Constitution,
17 and I, and I don't want you to, to think that I don't
18 understand about the right to bear arms and that, that
19 it's a right that we, we hold very dearly in this
20 country.

21 OLIVER: Um-hum.

22 JOHN: But I've just never been in a
23 religious setting that --

24 OLIVER: You probably think we've abused
25 that right, don't you?

1 JOHN: Huh?

2 OLIVER: You probably think we've abused
3 that right.

4 JOHN: Well, I'm not here to judge, you
5 know.

6 OLIVER: Okay. Well, that's good, I'm --

7 JOHN: You, you've got different, you've got
8 different branches of the government. You got the
9 executive branch and the, the judicial branch and the
10 legislative branch, and it's up to the judicial branch
11 in our system to judge, not, not the executive branch
12 from which I'm a member, you know.

13 OLIVER: Um-hum.

14 JOHN: All I, my only hope is that it's all
15 resolved peacefully. And I presume that's your hope.

16 OLIVER: Oh, for sure.

17 JOHN: You know, 'cause things have
18 happened, they've happened, right? And we, we can't
19 turn that clock around, can we? But we, but we can
20 communicate, we can talk, and hopefully everything
21 will be resolved successfully. And I believe it and I
22 hope you believe it.

23 OLIVER: Yeah.

24 JOHN: Well, that's great.

25 OLIVER: Something like that.

1 JOHN: Do you have some message that you
2 want me to --

3 OLIVER: To pass on to my parents?

4 JOHN: -- to pass on to your folks?

5 OLIVER: Tell them I love them.

6 JOHN: Okay.

7 OLIVER: That's about it, I guess.

8 JOHN: And you're all right?

9 OLIVER: I'm all right, I'm fine, I'm
10 healthy, I'm strong, you know.

11 JOHN: Okay, and your sister's doing okay
12 too?

13 OLIVER: I'm ready, I'm ready for any action
14 you guys give out. That, that's all I want --

15 JOHN: Well, I think you're kind of
16 preempting something, because I told Sherri and I told
17 Graeme and I told Jean and, and everybody that I've
18 talked to in there, that we're very patient people,
19 and that --

20 OLIVER: Oh, we are too. We won't, you know
21 --

22 JOHN: -- and that we have no intention and
23 absolutely no intention to come into that facility.
24 We, we are gonna stay out here and we're gonna wait
25 till God gives David the word and when God gives --

1 OLIVER: Well, but --

2 JOHN: When God gives David the word that
3 he's coming out, which I know he will, it's not if he
4 will, I know he will, it's when he will --

5 OLIVER: That's it.

6 JOHN: -- and you all come out of there,
7 everybody will be safe and sound. And if there are
8 people that have been injured they'll be cared for.

9 OLIVER: Oh, yeah.

10 JOHN: And mothers will be able to get back
11 with their children, and families will be reunited.
12 And that's what it's all about, isn't it.

13 OLIVER: That's it.

14 JOHN: We're talking peace. We're not
15 talking --

16 OLIVER: Well, God talks about war a lot,
17 you know. And it's all throughout the Bible.

18 JOHN: Yeah.

19 OLIVER: We all hope for the best, I'm sure
20 --

21 JOHN: But, you know, you can be a
22 pessimist, you can be an optimist, can't you?

23 OLIVER: That is correct.

24 JOHN: Sure. The glass is half full, it's
25 half empty, but I'm hoping that it'll all be resolved

1 well. And I think David does and I think you do,
2 don't you?

3 OLIVER: Oh, yeah.

4 JOHN: We don't want to see people hurt,
5 people, people injured. Anything else you want me to
6 discuss with somebody for you?

7 OLIVER: No, I've said about everything I
8 want to say.

9 JOHN: Well, listen, you take care of
10 yourself, huh?

11 OLIVER: Same to you, buddy.

12 JOHN: Okay.

13 OLIVER: Okay.

14 JOHN: I'll see you when you come out.

15 OLIVER: All right.

16 JOHN: All right.

17 OLIVER: I'll see you too.

18 JOHN: Okay.

19 OLIVER: Okay. Bye.

20 JOHN: Bye-bye.

21 OLIVER: I think he got kind of tired of
22 talking.

23 * * * * *

24 OLIVER: Hello? Hello?

25 JOHN: Hello.

1 OLIVER: Yes.

2 JOHN: Who's this?

3 OLIVER: This is Oliver.

4 JOHN: Hey, you hung up on me, pal. Is, is
5 David still there, or is Steve there?

6 OLIVER: Sure, you want to speak to him?

7 JOHN: Either one.

8 OLIVER: Yeah. I'm sorry about that, I
9 didn't think you wanted to speak to anyone.

10 JOHN: Well, I'm not --

11 OLIVER: He's right here.

12 JOHN: I'm not ready to go to bed yet.

13 * * * * *

14 JOHN: Hey.

15 DAVID: I'm sorry. John?

16 JOHN: Yeah.

17 DAVID: Yeah, it was the phone again, they
18 moved it and stuff and --

19 JOHN: If you look at it it goes bonkers,
20 huh?

21 DAVID: It's, it's weird. It's the lines
22 for some reason, I don't know what it is.

23 JOHN: Yeah. How are you feeling?

24 DAVID: Anyway --

25 JOHN: How are you feeling?

1 DAVID: What have you, what have you found
2 out so far, talking with certain people?

3 JOHN: You got some good folks in there,
4 huh?

5 DAVID: Well, I, I like to think that I've
6 chosen the best around the world.

7 JOHN: Well, I, I got a good lecture from
8 Sherri. I, I know she was proud of herself.

9 DAVID: Well, I don't, know, Sherri --

10 JOHN: She's a, she's a good person.

11 DAVID: Sherri's the kind of girl who'd do
12 anything for a person.

13 JOHN: She got kind of pumped up.

14 DAVID: Well, now.

15 JOHN: Huh?

16 DAVID: Well, now.

17 JOHN: Hey.

18 DAVID: It's an eventful event these days,
19 you know.

20 JOHN: Yeah, I know, I know.

21 DAVID: Little Ali --

22 JOHN: A lot of people, a lot of people are
23 under a lot of stress, huh?

24 DAVID: Little Ali, I have to --

25 JOHN: He's just a little guy?

1 DAVID: No, he's a pretty big guy, he's into
2 martial arts and all that.

3 JOHN: Yeah, uh-huh.

4 DAVID: He, he was wanting to jump out there
5 and whomp one of your ATF agents.

6 JOHN: Uh-huh.

7 DAVID: But he's, we have to keep him kind
8 of under control a bit, 'cause he's, he's got, holds a
9 lot of grudges, and we have to kind of watch him.

10 JOHN: Well, he sounded fine on the phone.

11 DAVID: He's --

12 JOHN: You know, and --

13 DAVID: He's the kind of character I have to
14 tell him, you know, exhibitioning that makes yourself
15 no better than the others. You know.

16 JOHN: How are you feeling?

17 DAVID: Oh, I feel pretty good.

18 JOHN: You getting around a little more?

19 DAVID: Well, you know, it's very, it's
20 minimal, you know. If I, if I walk say --

21 JOHN: Uh-huh.

22 DAVID: You know, if I walk say 30, 40 yards
23 and walk back, it's like I ran a 100-yard dash. I
24 mean, it's -- the old body, you know, it's, it's gone
25 through a dramatic experience.

1 JOHN: Yeah. I listened to kind of an
2 interesting tape this evening. It was, I guess your
3 call to 911 last Sunday.

4 DAVID: Well, what does it say? Was it my
5 call or was it, it was Steve's and Wayne, I guess.

6 JOHN: I think it was, I think -- no, it was
7 yours, because there was an early call from Wayne, and
8 I listened to that one, and then, then there was your
9 call on there.

10 DAVID: Is that that guy named Lynch?

11 JOHN: It could have been, yeah.

12 DAVID: Yeah, Larry, Harry Lynch, something
13 like that?

14 JOHN: There were --

15 DAVID: Yeah.

16 JOHN: There were a couple of people. There
17 was, Lynch answered the phone and then someone else
18 was on the phone also.

19 DAVID: Yeah.

20 JOHN: And it sounded like just a terrible,
21 terrible situation, huh?

22 DAVID: Oh, it was.

23 JOHN: Yeah.

24 DAVID: What can you do?

25 JOHN: But you sounded, you sounded pretty

1 healthy at that point.

2 DAVID: I wasn't shot yet.

3 JOHN: Oh, really?

4 DAVID: Really.

5 JOHN: God, I was wondering how in the world
6 somebody that had gone through what you had gone
7 through could sound that way.

8 DAVID: No, that was, they --

9 JOHN: That was early on?

10 DAVID: When that conversation was taking
11 place --

12 JOHN: Early on?

13 DAVID: Yeah. When Steve --

14 JOHN: Yeah.

15 DAVID: When Lynch was called -- when was it
16 I talked to him? (Unidentified male voice in
17 background not discernible.) Yeah, I remember talking
18 to, or you ran and gave the phone to me and I talked
19 to somebody real quick? (Unidentified male voice in
20 background not discernible.) Okay, and then that's
21 when I left. Then afterwards I got shot.

22 JOHN: Yeah, I heard that, and I said man,
23 how could, how could he have been shot. And in a lot
24 of excruciating pain, so it obviously happened first,
25 huh?

1 DAVID: Yeah. I would -- like I said, I'd
2 show you some pictures, but you, you boneheads, you
3 always, okay, sure we'll have some pictures. Now send
4 out some kids.

5 JOHN: Well, I'm waiting to see the
6 pictures. You know that. I, I told you last night
7 when you said you were gonna send them out that I'd
8 welcome them. Send them on out. Listen, Steve said
9 that -- excuse me. It's not the company. Steve said
10 that you're going to have a, a service tomorrow
between 10 and 11, huh?

11 DAVID: No. The, the worship, the daily is
12 between 8 and 9.

13 JOHN: Pardon me?

14 DAVID: Between 8 and 9 and 2 and 3. That's
the daily.

15 JOHN: Oh, no, I don't mean prayer. I mean
16 a service outside.

17 DAVID: Oh, right, the burial.

18 JOHN: Yeah, yeah, between 10 and 11.

19 DAVID: Yeah.

20 JOHN: Yeah, okay. I just wanted to make
21 sure everything was squared away, that there aren't
22 any time changes. And, and you could do me a big
favor if, if one of you would call in the morning and,

23

1 and talk to somebody in here about, before you go out.

2 DAVID: You know, it really, it really blows
3 me away that you guys have such a rotten attitude on
4 this.

5 JOHN: I don't think we do.

6 DAVID: You know, if -- I wish I'd had some
7 hindsight and seen exactly how really --

8 JOHN: Some what?

9 DAVID: -- really cynical you guys really
10 are.

11 JOHN: Some what?

12 DAVID: It might have been my, in my, in my
13 -- I wish I had some hindsight, you know, to where I
14 could have actually seen, you know, how really cynical
15 you guys really are. You know, while you're, while
16 your wounded and dead are laying around here, you're
17 so interested and all that. And then, you know, while
18 we find, when we find our people, you know, then all
19 of a sudden you just don't give a damn.

20 JOHN: Well, we are, we do care and we told
21 you that --

22 DAVID: Oh, yeah, your conditions are very
23 stupid, too.

24 JOHN: -- how, how it could be worked out.
25 And hey, you've chosen it --

1 DAVID: It's gonna, it's gonna, it's gonna
2 be worked out.

3 JOHN: You, you've chosen to do something
4 else and that's fine.

5 DAVID: Like I say, you're gonna be, you're
6 gonna be punished. You know, you're gonna be
7 punished. Your reasoning, your controlled oratation
(sic), you know, your discernment (Phonetic)
8 unconcernment (sic) for the situation. You're a cold
9 heart. You know, you're just a freezer, you know what
10 I'm saying? Like I said, you know, you remind me of,
11 like my dad, my stepdad. All talk, you know, like,
12 it's like someone puts their quarter in a slot --

13 JOHN: Hey, you didn't say he was such a --

14 DAVID: -- you know, and you operate.

15 JOHN: You didn't say he was such a bad guy,
16 though.

17 DAVID: Oh, I told you. I said we never
18 really knew him.

19 JOHN: Yeah.

20 DAVID: Well?

21 JOHN: Well, that doesn't mean he was bad,
22 huh?

23 DAVID: Oh, yeah he was bad. He was a
24 gangster.
25

1 JOHN: He finally, he finally came around,
2 didn't he?

3 DAVID: But, but one of your, but one of
4 your, one of your assistants, one of your assistants
5 let him go because you all liked each other.

6 JOHN: Let, let me ask you something. I
7 want to --

8 DAVID: That's what I was gonna teach you.

9 JOHN: I want to, I want to get some, some
10 details as to what you all intend to do, you know,
11 between 9 and 10 tomorrow with Peter, so, and, and
12 exactly where so I can let our, our folks know.

13 DAVID: Hey, they'll --

14 JOHN: You'll be right out across from the
15 flag pole there?

16 DAVID: Yeah, they'll know. They'll see us.

17 JOHN: Well, just, just don't, just don't go
18 indiscriminately wondering out some place, huh? Do
19 you understand what I'm saying?

20 DAVID: Yeah, I hear what you're saying.

21 JOHN: And, and somebody, we've got to have
22 communications and we got to maintain communications.

23 DAVID: I communicated with that. I told
24 you what I was gonna do.

25 JOHN: But I don't want any surprises

1 tomorrow, somebody come bouncing out of there. I want
2 somebody to communicate before it happens and if
3 people are going to carrying shovels, I want to know
4 if people are carrying shovels.

5 DAVID: So what are you gonna, what, are you
6 gonna try to shoot somebody, is that what you're gonna
7 do?

8 JOHN: Of course not. Of course not. But
9 we want to be reasonable and we want to be sensible
10 about this, huh? Other, otherwise --

11 DAVID: Hey, listen.

12 JOHN: -- I wouldn't be talking to you,
13 would I.

14 DAVID: Listen. Listen. I wouldn't be
15 talking to you if I wasn't trying to give you guys a
16 half a chance. Bringing that many law enforcement
17 agencies, three helicopters, two trucks with the
18 gooseneck trailers loaded down with ATF agents is not
19 very sensible in my book. And if it's in your book, I
20 think you better throw your book away.

21 JOHN: What, what's done is done, huh?

22 DAVID: Yeah. And I think someone's gonna
23 pay.

24 JOHN: I can't turn that around. You can't
25 turn it around.

1 DAVID: Somebody's gonna -- oh, yeah, well,
2 we'll see. Someone's gonna pay.

3 JOHN: I can't turn it around and you can't
4 turn it around. You know, and all we can try to do is
5 communicate and try to use some common sense, huh?

6 DAVID: Common --

7 JOHN: And try to --

8 DAVID: Common sense?

9 JOHN: -- try to work this thing out
peacefully.

10 DAVID: Common sense? No.

11 JOHN: Yeah.

12 DAVID: Boy, I think you need to get a
13 dictionary and before you talk, you need to go and
14 reference all the words you're fixing to use. Common
sense.

15 JOHN: Remember what apparently the --

16 DAVID: Hey, where's the milk?

17 JOHN: Huh?

18 DAVID: Where's the milk?

19 JOHN: What, what did we say?

20 DAVID: What did we say before?

21 JOHN: What did we say before when?

22 DAVID: So, you're, you're gonna keep lying
to us and like I say, it's gonna come down to the

23

1 draw.

2 JOHN: No, it isn't. It's all gonna work
3 out fine. But remember, you agreed that no one was
4 gonna exit the building with a weapon. And that there
5 would be communications before anybody exited any
6 buildings, right? Just live up to that, huh?

7 DAVID: Yeah, we told you --

8 JOHN: I don't want anything to happen, you
9 don't want anything to happen either.

10 DAVID: Well, the news wants something to
11 happen. The news wants to see some firecrackers.

12 JOHN: Well, why do people go to the
13 Indianapolis 500?

14 DAVID: Why do they go see movies all the
15 time?

16 JOHN: Sure.

17 DAVID: Terminator and Destroyer and all
18 that kind of stuff. They like it. They dig it.

19 JOHN: Huh.

20 DAVID: This is the way, this is the way
21 your country is.

22 JOHN: What, what were you watching on the
23 tube tonight? Huh?

24 DAVID: What did you watch?

25 JOHN: No, I said what were you watching

1 tonight.

2 DAVID: Nothing, only --

3 JOHN: You --

4 DAVID: I only have, I don't have an
5 antenna, I only got one channel.

6 JOHN: You don't have an antenna?

7 DAVID: No.

8 JOHN: I thought you had a big dish over
9 there.

10 DAVID: It doesn't work. You all shot it
11 up.

12 JOHN: No.

13 DAVID: You did.

14 JOHN: Not really. Huh?

15 DAVID: You did.

16 JOHN: You're kidding me.

17 DAVID: I told you that --

18 JOHN: You only have one channel?

19 DAVID: We got one TV.

20 JOHN: Well, you must have some videotapes
21 you can watch, huh?

22 DAVID: The VCR was shot up too. Now, we
23 got a VCR, but it's not hooked up to this TV.

24 JOHN: Uh-huh.

25 DAVID: They hooked it up to the other TV,

1 | which doesn't have an antenna which was connected to
2 | the satellite, and the T -- and the videotape you
3 | brought, it was, it was blank.

4 | JOHN: Well, hey, before, before anybody
5 | does any moving around tomorrow, please give somebody
6 | a call here, huh?

6 | DAVID: Want a Bible study?

7 | JOHN: I don't know if I'm ready for one
8 | tonight. I may let you have a good night's sleep --

9 | DAVID: Well, you --

10 | JOHN: -- we get into a lot of -- I had a
11 | Bible study talking to Sylvia.

12 | DAVID: Sylvia?

13 | JOHN: I don't mean Sylvia, Sherri.

14 | DAVID: Sherri?

15 | JOHN: Sherri. Boy, she was pumped up, huh?

16 | DAVID: Oh, boy, she was a, she was a hard
17 | person in the beginning, though.

18 | JOHN: You're kidding.

19 | DAVID: Oh, a lot of these people were.

20 | JOHN: That's hard to believe.

21 | DAVID: That's why I keep talking with you.

22 | JOHN: She -- (Laughs.)

23 | DAVID: Maybe, maybe you might see the
24 | light.

1 JOHN: She didn't say, she didn't seem to
2 think it was too difficult to grasp.

3 DAVID: Oh, in the beginning they were, you
4 know, they already had their beliefs and things like
5 that, and you know, yeah, they didn't mind hearing
6 about Jesus, but, you know, what, "What are you trying
7 to say?" they kept saying. "What's your point?
8 What's your point? What are you trying to say?" So
9 you know, I had to work real slow with them.

10 JOHN: Yeah.

11 DAVID: Most people don't realize there's a
12 New Testament that revolves around Christ, the
13 sanctuary and truth that's supposed to come in the
14 latter days.

15 JOHN: What, what do you think the
16 intentions are tomorrow? You just gonna go across and
17 have a little, a little service there?

18 DAVID: Got to go dig --

19 JOHN: Are you going to be able to make it?
20 Are you going to be able to get across there?

21 DAVID: No, I'm not going to be able to get
22 across.

23 JOHN: You're not? You don't feel that
24 well, huh?

25 DAVID: Well, I mean, that's a big, pretty

1 big step there, you know, stepping off on the front
2 there.

3 JOHN: I don't know, I, you know, I haven't
4 been there. I haven't seen it. I just don't know
5 what's over there. All I've seen is a picture and,
6 and I know that there's a building there and there's a
7 flag pole and what, a walkway or something. Or no
8 walkway?

9 DAVID: No, there's a walkway in the front,
10 yeah.

11 JOHN: Yeah. And I, I didn't know how
12 difficult it would be. And, but I understand that
13 Steve says they were just going to go across the road
14 there and, from the flag pole and, and have their ser-
15 - burial service there. And I'm sure you'll have a
16 service inside before, I guess, huh? That you can
17 participate in.

18 DAVID: Man, you guys are really funny.

19 JOHN: Why? We're funny, yeah, I know. The
20 five kids?

21 DAVID: Yeah, I'm looking right at you right
22 now.

23 JOHN: I know. You think. How long do you
24 think this is take tomorrow?

25 DAVID: I don't know.

1 JOHN: About an hour?

2 DAVID: Oh, it may take an hour to dig the
3 hole.

4 JOHN: I mean, do you intend to send a
5 couple of people out early to do that and then have
6 the service afterwards?

6 DAVID: Yeah, probably.

7 JOHN: Okay.

8 DAVID: Be sure and tell his mom and dad,
9 though.

10 JOHN: You bet. You bet. Does he have any
11 relatives in there at all?

12 DAVID: Yeah.

13 JOHN: I mean, that are still inside there?

14 DAVID: Oh, yeah.

15 JOHN: Okay.

16 DAVID: Yeah, he's got, he's got about,
17 let's see, one, two, three, four, four relatives.

18 JOHN: Have anybody else that you have to
19 handle the same way?

20 DAVID: Nope.

21 JOHN: That's good. I'm glad to hear that,
22 because there was some concern that there was, you
23 know, and I'm glad to hear that you don't.

24 DAVID: Well, when you all said, when they
25

1 were saying we had 14 or 15 wounded, you all was
2 asking the kids, the kids were probably repeating what
3 was said about the ATF agents over the TV.

4 JOHN: It could be.

5 DAVID: Over the radio.

6 JOHN: It could be.

7 DAVID: So it blew me away, I thought man,
8 for kids that are so unstable that don't know
9 anything, boy, you all -- (Laughs.) Oh, boy.

10 JOHN: Hey, they're good kids. They've been
11 through a lot, though.

12 DAVID: Oh, we know they're good kids.

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 DAVID: They're the best in the world.
15 They've had the best training.

16 JOHN: And they've been through a traumatic
17 experience, you know, and, and it was tough on all of
18 them, I'm sure, you know, as it was on, on the adults.
19 They don't expect to go through something like that
20 either, do they?

21 DAVID: Well, like Ali was telling you about
22 war all through the scriptures. Like, well, like I
23 say, you don't believe, why should I waste our time.

24 JOHN: I enjoy listening though, sometimes.
25 Just not into -- I don't like to get into a debate

1 like with Sherri. And then Sherri wanted to, she
2 wanted to get kind of offensive there. It's not my
3 style.

4 DAVID: Where did you learn your, where did
5 -- did you go to Jesuit's College also?

6 JOHN: (Laughs.) Why? No, I didn't.

7 DAVID: You didn't.

8 JOHN: No. Where did you get your --

9 JOHN: I was Augustinian-trained.

10 JOHN: What's that?

11 DAVID: That's an order of priests.

12 JOHN: I see. How many other guys out there
13 of those, of those five kids, how many of them were
14 also Augustinian-trained?

15 JOHN: Well, I don't, I don't know what
16 their religious backgrounds are. I, I have no idea.

17 DAVID: Oh, so, so most of them so far is
18 Catholic, the one I've talked to.

19 JOHN: Is that, is that a good trait or a
20 bad trait, huh?

21 DAVID: Well, it depends. Depends on how
22 much you know about it. If you don't know that much
23 about it, yeah, we can have grace. If you know a lot
24 about it, we're dead-set enemies, aren't we.

25 JOHN: Well, I don't think we are, are we.

1 world. When you hear it, you investigate it. If you
2 don't, then you're being judged. And then all of a
3 sudden the penalties God pronounces the ungodly who
4 reject His truth will be executed.

5 JOHN: Yeah.

6 DAVID: And the rewards that God has
7 pronounced for the righteous who have listened will be
8 executed. Anyway, I guess I'll let you get some
9 sleep.

10 JOHN: Let me ask you a couple, couple
11 things that we, that we kicked around earlier today,
12 huh?

13 DAVID: Sure, go ahead.

14 JOHN: The, I -- first of all, I appreciate
15 your putting those people on the line with me, I
16 really do.

17 DAVID: Well, that's their right. That's
18 their God-given and American right.

19 JOHN: Well, I know some were probably
20 reluctant to do it and maybe you give them a little
21 prodding.

22 DAVID: Well, there's freedom -- well, I
23 keep telling them, I say, you know, there's nothing
24 that's gonna harm them.

25 JOHN: No.

1 DAVID: It's their freedom of speech.

2 JOHN: You sound tired.

3 DAVID: Oh, a little.

4 JOHN: You got a good night's sleep last
5 night.

6 DAVID: No, I didn't.

7 JOHN: How come?

8 DAVID: Remember I'm praying for you.

9 JOHN: (Laughs.) God, I guess you were up
10 all night, huh?

11 DAVID: All the time.

12 JOHN: But I, I want to thank you for, for
13 having those people talk to us, and --

14 DAVID: Got to also remember, I lost over
15 three pints of blood, too.

16 JOHN: Yeah, but you sure sounded --

17 DAVID: I'm a strong person --

18 JOHN: You sounded chipper two nights ago.

19 JOHN: Well, it comes and goes, it comes and
20 goes. Depends on what time you catch me.

21 JOHN: You really sounded good.

22 DAVID: Well, I appreciate that.

23 JOHN: You know, you were, you were on a
24 roll and, and I really hope, you know, that you get
25 some rest and get some soup and other things in you.

1 DAVID: Got to build some blood back up.

2 JOHN: You bet. Build up your strength,
3 'cause I want to be there waiting for you when you
4 come walking out.

5 DAVID: Okey-doke.

6 JOHN: There's, there's a couple of people
7 that I didn't get to talk to, and --

8 DAVID: Which people is that?

9 JOHN: It was Wayne Martin's wife, I guess,
10 Sheila.

11 DAVID: Uh-huh.

12 JOHN: The Fatta's, Paul Fatta, Kalani
13 Fatta.

14 DAVID: Uh-huh.

15 JOHN: And Perry Jones, who was Rachel's --
16 I think she said her dad.

17 DAVID: Oh, boy, she's teed at you.

18 JOHN: Why?

19 DAVID: Why?

20 JOHN: I thought Rachel and I had a, had a
21 nice talk and that --

22 DAVID: You are --

23 JOHN: -- and we had a nice chat with the
24 kids.

25 DAVID: He's an older man.

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JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Anyway, we'll work that out tomorrow.

JOHN: Let me ask you two things. Then we'll call it a night, huh? Okay?

DAVID: Okay, two more things, go ahead.

JOHN: 'Cause you sure sound tired.

DAVID: Well, go ahead.

JOHN: How are we gonna resolve this thing? That's one. What are you gonna tell me now? That's one.

DAVID: I've already told you.

JOHN: When you get the word?

DAVID: When you get the word I'll come out.

JOHN: No, when you get the word, right?

DAVID: When I get the word --

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: -- I'll be out.

JOHN: You got any ideas how close we're getting? Whether things are getting better or that things aren't getting better.

DAVID: Well, I mean, sh-- the things are not gonna get any better or any worse.

JOHN: Huh? Well, yeah, some things will get better.

1 DAVID: (Laughs.)

2 JOHN: I hope.

3 DAVID: Oh, boy.

4 JOHN: I hope you get better, huh?

5 DAVID: Yeah, I want to get better.

6 JOHN: Just don't laugh too much, now, don't
sneeze, don't cough.

7 DAVID: Yeah, well, it's not, it's not --

8 JOHN: Don't look at, don't look at those
9 five kids.

10 DAVID: Oh, boy, that really -- I enjoyed
every, every pain when I laughed on that one.

11 JOHN: (Laughs.) I bet you did, huh? And,
12 and I, I was asked to ask you that at the press
13 conference tomorrow, you know, they have these daily
14 press conferences. Usually I'm sleeping, so I don't
15 get to see the press conferences. But I was asked as
16 to whether or not you wanted to be addressed as the
17 Lamb, as David, as Christ, or as the Lord.

18 DAVID: My name is David Koresh.

19 JOHN: Uh-huh.

20 DAVID: And that's what you need to call me
by.

21 JOHN: Okay.

22 DAVID: Because you don't know if I'm the
23
24
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1 Lamb or Christ.

2 JOHN: Well, I know what you told me.

3 DAVID: Or the Lord. Well, it's like this.

4 JOHN: You told me, what, at least five
5 times.

6 DAVID: I showed you something and you were
7 looking at it.

8 JOHN: Uh-huh.

9 DAVID: But you refused to see. so I'm
10 going to show you something --

11 JOHN: Well, I'm trying.

12 DAVID: I'm going to show you something in
13 the future where you will not be able to deny.

14 JOHN: Okay.

15 DAVID: Okay?

16 JOHN: You would like to be continued to be
17 addressed as David.

18 DAVID: That's what people should know me
19 as, David Koresh.

20 JOHN: Okay.

21 DAVID: My name. It's my legal name.

22 JOHN: Listen, you have a good night's rest,
23 huh?

24 DAVID: Okey-doke.

25 JOHN: And take care of yourself. And maybe

1 in the morning, I can talk to Perry if he's not upset,
2 to Sheila, to Paul, and Kalani.

3 DAVID: Okey-doke.

4 JOHN: Okay.

5 DAVID: Lylatov.

6 JOHN: Shalom.

7 DAVID: Bye.

8 (A brief conversation ensued between
9 negotiator and another federal employee who called in
10 and was directed to use another telephone line.)
