2 JOHN: -- any of the other nurses get in to
3 see him?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, in honesty they
5 haven't.

6 JOHN: Um-hum.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: They haven't yet.

8 JOHN: Yeah, if, if he can get them to do
9 that that might be a good thing --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

11 JOHN: -- to check his vital signs.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: See, what happened is I
13 guess he wanted -- Ollie came -- Oliver, they call him
14 Ollie, he came in there and so he's giving him a
15 little time and trying to encourage him and
16 everything. And he wanted to ask him a few questions
17 and he just told him to remember to, you know, hang
18 onto his Bible and so forth and -- or after he finds a
19 better foundation, you know, follow his conscience of
20 course.

21 JOHN: Right.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, I, I just stepped in
23 there a little bit and he says, you know, if -- you
24 know, just follow right on through so --

25 JOHN: Right. Well --

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

JOHN: -- that's, that's really great and I
really appreciate your efforts very much, I really do.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, I mean right
2 from the beginning, you know, I mean I've always
3 wanted the best of course, and --

4 JOHN: I know that, and it's, it's coming
5 true.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

7 JOHN: So well, I've, I've really
8 appreciated everything you've done. And how did David
9 feel about their leaving? He just said well --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, he's always
11 believed in, you know, the freedom of one's -- I mean,
12 that, that was always -- well, right from the time I
13 met him he was always that way that, you know, what
14 you're going to hear -- he said step away, wrestle
15 with it come back. And he's done this with everybody,
16 including myself. That's why I said I like had six
17 months. So, you know, like even these people, now he
18 says you always got to relook at something. It's not
19 like you're in something once and for the rest of your
20 life, you know? And so he explained that again. He
21 says look at it again and again and, and wrestle with
22 it. So --

23 JOHN: Yeah.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- so these feel that it'd
25 be best for them that they, that they step out.

26 JOHN: Well, fine.

28 JOHN: Fine, that's --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: And he says, he says he's
2 with them 100 percent. You know, if that's what you
3 need to do you've got to follow through he says.
4 Because of he says I believe that there's a God and
5 you've got to stand and answer for yourself. So he
6 says as I do, so that's basically what he told them.

7 JOHN: Yeah, yeah. Well, you know, I'm
8 getting back to his health. It does concern me, you
9 know?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

11 JOHN: Do you know if he's getting any new
12 pain like kind of where those wounds --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: I didn't, I didn't get to
14 ask him really too much because I was trying -- I
15 didn't want to break my attention from --

16 JOHN: Sure. No, no --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you know, Ollie's
18 movement and --

19 JOHN: I can appreciate that.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and, yeah, once he
21 started showing the interest I thought I'd better just
22 stay with that and --

23 JOHN: Yeah. You're right, you're right.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, so I've, I've done
25 that more.

 JOHN: Good.

 MR. SCHNEIDER: And also talked to Kathy to
 help her get going along with these -- a couple of

1 these others that I mentioned. And I've also started
2 talking with a few more as I told you but I guess
3 I'll --

4 JOHN: Great.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- have to spend more time
6 with that still.

7 JOHN: Well, just keep working on it.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

9 JOHN: It sounds like we're making really
10 good progress here --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

12 JOHN: -- good momentum.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 JOHN: Good, and thank you for everything.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, I'm still
16 trying. You know, it seems like it's still short of
17 what one would like, you know, like say from a week
18 ago, of course, you know?

19 JOHN: Sometimes the first step, you know,
20 gets things moving.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's what -- the way
22 I was looking at it too. You know, I mean, from a
23 week ago I thought we all were going to be out, it'd
24 be over. And I did wait for a while and I mean I
25 still am but I still want to work with these people
and, and try to get the best done here so --

JOHN: Well, you know, I'm really sure that
they appreciate what you're doing for them.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, maybe ultimately they
2 will. I don't know --

3 JOHN: They will.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- now, but hopefully
5 ultimately they will.

6 JOHN: They will, in the not-too-distant
7 future I'm sure.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Oh, there's -- one of
9 the guys that went and fed the chickens, he's back
10 here by me and he wanted -- what, what did you need
11 now? Oh, would it be okay if two guys went out to
12 feed the chickens and empty some dirty water I guess
13 he's asking me here.

14 JOHN: Let me check on that. I'll --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

16 JOHN: Hopefully there'll be no problem with
17 it and --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

19 JOHN: -- I'll just, just make a call on
20 it --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, and David --

22 JOHN: -- and sure we'll get it done.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- David, I told him I was
24 going to talk to you and he says, oh, he says, he
25 says, I really do, he says I like John. He says, tell
him that if he's been listening to anything on the
radio, apparently Paul Harvey made some kind of a
statement about there being a lot of UFOs and there

1 was a statement of some astronomer sighting a star
2 moving quickly toward this direction. And I guess
3 there's been a number of statements on the, on the
4 airwaves
5 and he --

6 JOHN: Oh, really?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, he said -- he says that
8 this is what I've been talking about. He said this is
9 Psalm 68, he says God has 20,000 chariots. He says
10 one of those chariots are so large they're able to
11 carry all the inhabitants of the earth in one. And he
12 says it's a reality, he says. And I like these guys.

13 He says I want them to be able to at least take a
14 little time and look at those things and weigh it,
15 weigh it out. So he just -- he mentioned that to me.

16 He said they're, they're coming toward the earth and,
17 and I guess it's been on a number of broadcasts
18 apparently on -- news.

19 JOHN: Oh, is that right?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

21 JOHN: Well, this could be a sign.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, this is what he was
23 saying, that's exactly what it is. He says there are
24 -- well, of course the Bible talks about a lot of that
25 type of thing happening in the final days.

26 JOHN: Yeah.

27 MR. SCHNEIDER: But he, he asked me mention
28 that to you or pass it on to you and I said I would do

1 that.

2 JOHN: I appreciate you doing that.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

4 JOHN: I, I think that might be something
5 really significant.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

7 JOHN: And Kathy had mentioned you were, you
8 were a real source of help to her and --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

10 JOHN: -- everybody else for that matter,
11 so --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, good. How long are
13 you going to be there yet, John?

14 JOHN: I'll be here until 6 o'clock.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

16 JOHN: But if you need -- if you want me to
17 stay around a little bit I will.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, what I'm going to do
19 is I haven't been able to -- actually, about four or
20 five hours have gone by. I haven't been able to use
21 the facilities here. You know, once you get talking
22 with somebody I just figured that was more important.

23 JOHN: Yeah, I think so too.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm kind of walking around
25 here right now, so --

26 JOHN: I think so too.

27 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. I --

28 JOHN: Well, why don't you go ahead and get

1 a chance to do that?

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, and I'll be getting
3 back with you. I'm going to try to talk to a few more
4 and I'll get back to you.

5 JOHN: I'll talk to you later. Thank you
6 very, very much.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, no problem.

8 JOHN: Right.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Talk to you later, John.

10 JOHN: Talk to you later, Steve.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Bye-bye.

12 JOHN: Bye.

13 (Phones hung up.)

14 JOHN: Yeah, Steve?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I was just going to
16 call back. Do you know, I -- these guys are pestering
17 me here. They -- I forgot to get an answer about them
18 feeding the chickens and throwing the water out I
19 guess. John?

20 JOHN: Yes, I'm sorry. Yes --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, okay --

22 JOHN: -- absolutely go ahead.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. They'll just probably
24 be out there for a few minutes and they'll be right
25 back in again.

26 JOHN: That's fine. Go ahead.

27 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, thanks.

28 JOHN: Thank you.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Bye-bye.

2 JOHN: Bye-bye.

3 (Phones hung up.)

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1 John Tremont?

5 JOHN: Yes, one moment, please. Hi.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Hello, Mr.
7 Tremont?

8 JOHN: Mr. Tremont?

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Yes.

10 JOHN: No, no, I'm sorry. Mr. -- there's no
11 Mr. Tremont at this number. This is a newly-issued
12 number.

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Okay. Sorry
14 to disturb you.

15 JOHN: That's no problem. Thank you.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Okay, bye-
17 bye. (Phones hung up.)

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: Hello?

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #3: Is Robin
20 there?

21 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: Pardon me?

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #3: Robin?

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: I think you
24 have the wrong number.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #3: All right,
thanks.

(Phones hung up.) (Phone ringing)

MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

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JOHN: Steve?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

JOHN: John.

MR. SCHNEIDER: John Cox?

JOHN: Hey, how you doing?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Not too bad, not too bad.

JOHN: Had a pretty good day, huh?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, real good day.

Real good day. I was -- about an hour or so ago I was in there talking to David too and he was saying well, if he -- if you talk to any others encourage whoever and so I'm still talking to a few people around here.

JOHN: How does he feel?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Pardon?

JOHN: How does David feel?

MR. SCHNEIDER: He -- he went back to sleep again -- I, I sat in there for a little while talking with him --

JOHN: Yeah.

MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and someone said they heard on the, the radio that the message was that he -- he talked -- no, I forgot what they told me, but it was not so; you know, they had to ask permission to go or something, that's not true at all. You know, I mean the, the names were mentioned some of the names I mentioned so it would have only had to --

JOHN: Yeah.

MR. SCHNEIDER: -- come through there of

1 course. But --

2 JOHN: Yeah.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- no, they didn't ask his
4 permission at all.

5 JOHN: Okay.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: But Oliver did want to talk
7 to him. He went in there and asked --

8 JOHN: Sure.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- about some religious
10 things and that's what he was talking to him about,
11 but he had already told me he wanted to go and I
12 worked with him for a while on that.

13 JOHN: Well --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: But I am still talking with
15 a few other people here and I guess they're all
16 looking to -- sometime in the morning then.

17 JOHN: Okay.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I was hoping to do a
19 little more communicating with David though, but, you
20 know, because of this crazy illness, the wound --

21 JOHN: I think, you know, what you heard on
22 the media was probably just some press speculation.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, they maybe chose their
24 own words or something --

25 JOHN: I really do, because --

MR. SCHNEIDER: -- so I don't know.

JOHN: Hey, they've been doing plenty of
that, huh?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, oh, yeah.

2 JOHN: The -- John was telling me that David
3 said he heard on Paul Harvey that he mentioned a star
4 heading this way and --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I guess it was on a
6 couple of -- well, David didn't hear it and neither
7 did I, but a couple of others listening to radios came
8 --

8 JOHN: Oh, okay.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and all told us the same
10 story. A star --

11 JOHN: You, you ready for this?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Go ahead.

13 JOHN: The Houston Chronicle, today's
14 paper --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

16 JOHN: -- captioned, "This Is One Hot
17 Guitar: Neutron Star Is Moving Darn Fast Through Our
18 Galaxy." They've got a whole article on it.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, could I ask you a
20 favor?

21 JOHN: You bet.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: They did a series of course,
23 The Tribune, The Waco Tribune --

24 JOHN: Uh-huh.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and we -- the last thing
we got to see about that was from Gonzalez, Robert
Gonzalez. He brought the Sunday paper over and of

1 course it went then from I guess it was Monday on
2 through to Friday and we never got -- we were to get
3 papers delivered here but we've never seen them. I
4 just wanted -- it's mainly Mark Bro (phonetic) story
5 of course and I'm just curious as to what he had to
6 write about us. I can basically guess.

6 JOHN: Uh-huh.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: But is, is there any way we,
8 we could get copies of that given to us and maybe that
9 Houston -- what is it, the Houston Chronicle?

10 JOHN: The, the article that I have here?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. It's --

12 JOHN: Yeah, it's kind of remarkable where
13 it talks about this guitar-shaped heated material and
14 it's been named the Guitar Nebula. I mean --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: No kidding? David will --

16 JOHN: Some timing, huh?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I tell you one thing,
18 he's got a lot to say about it. I know you guys --
19 John, and I know it's too weird, to wild, I know you
20 don't believe it. But if you ever heard the man get
21 into physics and astronomy, that was one of the
22 biggest things that blew -- all my life I've loved
23 astronomy, took classes, listened, watched. And I run
24 into him and he went so beyond any astronomer and I --
25 that made me say to him, "Where did you get the
information?"

26 JOHN: Uh-huh.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I said, "What school did you
2 go to?" I didn't know that he was not a graduate from
3 some university, and he said that he dropped out of
4 school in high school. So, I mean, that's what
5 started already getting my attention. But yeah, it's,
6 it's definitely interesting about what --

7 JOHN: It's kind of bizarre isn't it?

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, to him it isn't
9 because he --

10 JOHN: Oh, I know.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- he said he will -- he
12 wants to actually to get on the phone and tell you
13 guys more things that are going to happen ahead of
14 time so when they happen you can see them develop.
15 You know, he mentioned Psalm 68 and he mentioned --
16 he'll get into the Book of Job which is a very deep
17 book and the Chapter 38, 39 and so right in there, 37,
18 38. Deep mysteries to do with the universe, matter,
19 antimatter, astronomy, so forth.

20 JOHN: Hey, I'd rather have David come out
21 and talk to me about it though. Huh?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, I, I mean I --

23 JOHN: Wouldn't we all.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- well, I believe that.

25 JOHN: Sure.

 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean I, I know you would
want that.

 JOHN: Sure.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: But I mean, there's a,
2 there's a part of these things that he wants you to be
3 able to see and judge and if it's not so well you lost
4 a little time.

5 JOHN: Well, I -- the, the biggest thing
6 that concerns me right now is you and I both know that
7 David hasn't been doing too well for a while and -- or
8 he would have been out -- up and about. Because he --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, you're right, he
10 hasn't --

11 JOHN: -- he was in, he was in pretty good
12 shape.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: He hasn't been up and about
14 in the last two days, that's true.

15 JOHN: He was down for a while then he, then
16 he really pepped up and started feeling much better.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

18 JOHN: And, you know, all the, the vibes
19 that we're getting is that with this seepage and
20 everything --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

22 JOHN: -- it, it's not good and it could
23 turn into septicemia in nothing flat and become
24 gangrenous.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well -- I, I seriously have
been doing the best I can since the time I -- I tell -
-it's, it's so draining and wearing when you're
sitting down talking to people and trying to give them

1 other perspectives.

2 JOHN: Oh, I'm sure.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know what I mean? I
4 mean it has --

5 JOHN: Oh, sure.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- been a long day. Last
7 night even I went down and talked to those people. I
8 tried to pick up right away this morning. I went off
9 and found them, went and talked to Oliver again, went
10 and talked to a few more and -- by talking to Kathy
11 and spending time with her. She decided to make her
12 decision. And, and we -- and in fact David, I even
13 said to him, you know, we don't want to even use it as
14 a bargaining anything. You know, that's never been
15 the thing in the first place, John. I mean, you
16 realize that.

17 JOHN: Sure.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, we want to get these
19 people out. They, they made their choice and, you
20 know, I'm -- whoever wants to do whatever, you know,
21 I'm for that. That's the main thing.

22 JOHN: Well, did you get a chance to talk to
23 Floyd and --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- he --

25 JOHN: -- Cleve Doyle or Clive Doyle or --

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I went -- last night
when I went, went to see them Floyd was already
sleeping and --

1 JOHN: Yeah.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I called his name, he
3 answered, and I says that's okay, I said I'll talk to
4 you in the morning.

5 JOHN: Yeah.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: But what I could do if you
7 want, I could -- you know, I can go -- they're up and
8 around --

9 JOHN: You know, before it gets too late.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, yeah.

11 JOHN: Because there was -- I know there
12 were four others and you were able to get Greg on the
13 phone, but there were four others.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right, right.

15 JOHN: And would you like -- you'd like to
16 get this article in there, the --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I'd love to, you know,
18 just for myself. I'm kind of -- I'm definitely
19 curious to see that about the stars. Is, is -- it's
20 probably not very long. It's probably a little
21 caption or --

22 JOHN: It's -- no, it gets -- it's three
23 full columns. I can read you part of it --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: No kidding?

25 JOHN: -- if you'd like to hear it.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure, sure. I'd love to.

JOHN: It's -- it starts off, "Some very hot
licks from the fastest star ever found has created a

1 heavenly guitar-shaped glow says astronomers."

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Holy, do me a favor.

3 JOHN: Yeah.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I would love to have if you
5 can tomorrow can we work it out where you can get me a
6 copy of it, seriously?

7 JOHN: We'll get it in to you tonight.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Even if you run a copy off
9 a -- great, but it's pouring out there.

10 JOHN: Sure. No problem. That's no
11 problem.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I guess we'll have to
13 dress somebody up in some kind of a plastic suit here
14 or something.

15 JOHN: You got a slicker in there I'm sure,
16 huh?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, there must be
18 something in here.

19 JOHN: Yeah.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

21 JOHN: And it's talking how this thing is
22 traveling at 1,800 kilometers a second and, you know,
23 it's, it's, it's a very interesting article.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Wowie! I, I would
25 appreciate --

26 JOHN: They've already named it the Guitar
27 Nebula.

28 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think that would really

1 lift David up, I would. I mean, I'd, I'd wake him up
2 for that for sure.

3 JOHN: Hey --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Because he's into the hot
5 licks --

6 JOHN: -- he probably needs something to --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- he's, he's an awesome,
8 he's an awesome guitarist. This whole message was to
9 go by stringed instruments is all the prophecies talk
10 about, John, all of them do. It's called shiggaion.
11 But anyway, I mean, it's very -- the language you were
12 reading there is what he's always been into.

13 JOHN: Well, he could probably use something
14 to lift him up a little, huh?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, oh, yeah,
16 definitely.

17 JOHN: He's I'm sure at a, at a low ebb
18 physically.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah, yeah.

20 JOHN: Maybe not, maybe not emotionally.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not mentally or spiritually.
22 He, he -- see, all the prophecies talk about one day
23 how God gets up off his throne and comes on down. You
24 can look in any book of the Bible, Ecclesiastes 12,
25 you can look in all the Psalms, Daniel 12:1 it talks
about God getting up off the throne, the Throne of
Judgment and coming down and this is what he's talking
about. He, he said that God showed him -- God hasn't

1 told him anything but wait -- but he was showing a
2 picture of seeing God getting off the throne, there
3 being a lot of activity in the heavens. And he says
4 you tell these guys to watch the heavens, you're --
5 they're going to see a lot more taking place. They're
6 not going to believe it, they're going to count it as,
7 as, as --

8 JOHN: Hey, could be something he's, he's
9 been looking for, huh?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- as a coincidence.

11 JOHN: Could be something he's looking for.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I know you don't
13 believe that, but of course, you know, I have hopes.

14 JOHN: Hey, I believe he does.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, well, that's about it.
16 You got that right.

17 JOHN: You know, and, and his -- you know, I
18 can't, can't deny that. I believe he does.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, right.

20 JOHN: Let me, let me --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: John --

22 JOHN: -- just give you one --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

24 JOHN: -- the second paragraph on this
25 thing.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, yeah, do so.

JOHN: It says, "The tiny object is a

1 neutron star only 10 miles in diameter, it's moving
2 through our galaxy, the Milky Way, at a tremendous
3 rate, perhaps 1,800 kilometers per second, or fast
4 enough to travel from New York to California in a bit
5 over two seconds," you know, and it goes on and on.
6 And it's --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. Well, mention the
8 part about the hot licks again and the guitar so I can
9 get that in my mind real --

10 JOHN: "Some very hot licks from the fastest
11 star ever found has created -- " --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

13 JOHN: -- " -- has created a heavenly
14 guitar-shaped glow says astronomers."

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Let me call you back, okay,
16 John?

17 JOHN: Yeah.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Call you right back.

19 JOHN: Bye.

20 (Phones hung up.)

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello, John?

22 JOHN: Hey.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I'm, I'm talking here
24 to David. He'd like to hear that article from the
25 paper.

26 JOHN: Yeah.

27 MR. SCHNEIDER: Could you read the entire
28 thing to him?

1 JOHN: Sure.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Do you have it there?

3 JOHN: You bet.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Here he is. Just a
5 moment.

6 JOHN: Okay.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

8 JOHN: You ready?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Just a minute.

10 JOHN: Okay.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's -- we're trying to move
12 something so we can get the phone in here. Hello?

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Here he is.

15 MR. KORESH: Hello, John.

16 JOHN: Hey, bud, how you doing?

17 MR. KORESH: I'm all right.

18 JOHN: Not too hot, huh?

19 MR. KORESH: Huh?

20 JOHN: Not feeling too well, huh?

21 MR. KORESH: I'm trying to recuperate.

22 JOHN: Well, maybe this will help you a
23 little bit. You ready?

24 MR. KORESH: I'm ready.

25 JOHN: Okay. The caption of the article is,
"This is One Hot Guitar: Neutron Star Is Moving Darn
Fast Through Our Galaxy," and it's a Houston Chronicle
science writer in Today's Houston Chronicle. It

1 starts off, "Some very hot licks from the fastest star
2 ever found has created a heavenly guitar-shaped glow
3 says astronomers. The tiny object is a neutron star
4 only 10 miles in diameter. It's moving through our
5 galaxy, the Milky Way, at a tremendous rate, perhaps
6 1,800 kilometers per second, or fast enough to travel
7 from New York to California in a bit over two
8 seconds."

8 MR. KORESH: Moving pretty slow.

9 JOHN: It's fast by my standards.

10 MR. KORESH: I know.

11 JOHN: "The star and its glow are described
12 in an article published today in 'Nature` magazine by
13 astronomer James M. Cordis of Cornell University in
14 Ithica, New York, Cornell graduate student Scott C.
15 Lundgren and Roger W. Romani, a Stanford University
16 Astrophysicist. Romani said the star is trailing a
17 stream of gas and particles as it speeds through space
18 like a jetliner leaving a contrail across the sky.
19 The glow of this heated material is in the shape of a
20 guitar but it can only be seen with the most powerful
21 telescopes. Appropriately, the object has been named
22 the Guitar Nebula. Romani said the unusual shape is
23 probably caused by the shockwave from the star
24 crashing through the glass -- the gas clouds of
25 differing densities. The phenomenon called a 'bow
shock` is analogous to the wave breaking from the bow
of a speeding boat. Cordis described the Guitar

1 Nebula as the most spectacular version of these bow
2 shocks we've ever seen. It's a fairly average pulsar
3 but it's forward motion is exceptional. The star the
4 formed the nebula is known to astronomers as
5 PSR2224+65. The number also gives the location of the
6 star in the constellation Cepheus. Cepheus is low on
7 the northern horizon now but will be high in the
8 northern sky in late-summer. 'The star is moving darn
9 fast,' Romani said, pointing out that it has moved
10 into another constellation. In a million years it has
11 moved from Serpens to Cepheus."

11 MR. KORESH: That's incorrect.

12 JOHN: Well, all I'm doing is quoting the
13 article.

14 MR. KORESH: Yeah. So it's --

15 JOHN: "Despite that kind of speed Romani
16 said snapping a picture of the nebula required a two-
17 hour exposure using special equipment installed in the
18 great 200" Palomar telescope in California. He said
19 the pulsar formed about a million years ago when a
20 star ran out of nuclear fuel and collapsed to a very
21 high density. Pulsars normally move about ten-times
22 faster than ordinary stars but this one is far faster
23 than most pulsars. 'Otherwise' Romani said, 'it seems
24 rather ordinary.' Curt Michael of Rice University's
25 Department of Space Physics and Astronomy said,
'Astronomers cannot explain such high velocities with
certainty.' He said he suspects the star was boosted

1 by an off-center supernova explosion which blew some
2 material one way and kicked the remaining neutron star
3 the other. 'Other astronomers more skeptical in that
4 theory,' Michael said -- another possibility is that
5 the star once was one of a pair of white dwarf stars
6 closely linked by gravity. If one exploded the pair
7 would have been flung apart. 'It's possible for the
8 mechanism to work, but how common it is not known,'
9 Michael said. Romani said the crucial task in
10 calculating the speed of the star was to determine its
11 distance which they found to be about 6,000 light
12 years away, well within the Milky Way. A light year
13 in distance light travels in a year about 5.9 trillion
14 miles. But Romani said the star's speed is so great
15 that millions of years from now it will escape into
16 intergalactic space." That's the article.

15 MR. KORESH: Well, at least they see
16 something.

17 JOHN: You want it sent in to you so you can
18 read it?

19 MR. KORESH: No, I, I was, I was just --

20 JOHN: The reason I ask is we have another
21 video of the children and we could certainly put a
22 copy of this article with the video of the children
23 and send it on in to you.

24 MR. KORESH: That's all right. We do a lot
25 of discussion here about stars and the constellations
and their origin and about God and matter and

1 antimatter and why the universe is the way it is and
2 it's one of the schedules that we teach our students.

3 JOHN: Um-hum.

4 MR. KORESH: A lot of guys who have been
5 into astrology and astronomy have come here and in
6 very simple terminology they've been blow away when
7 they've learned things about the structure of humanity
8 and the images of humanity and its relationship to the
9 universe. It's -- we always used to say that today's
10 inspiration which is the knowledge within is
11 tomorrow's common knowledge and man becomes quite
12 familiar with common knowledge to where it becomes
13 indifferent. You know, many people in the world don't
14 know what makes a toaster toast?

15 JOHN: Um-hum.

16 MR. KORESH: You know? They use them but
17 they never could fix them could they?

18 JOHN: Yeah.

19 MR. KORESH: So --

20 JOHN: Well, do you think this is what you
21 meant when Steve said that this may be a sign?

22 MR. KORESH: Oh, no, no, no, no, no,
23 it's --

24 JOHN: Yeah.

25 MR. KORESH: -- the -- you're going to,
you're going to see a lot of strange events happening
in our atmosphere. There's a, there's a lot of,
there's lot of aid already assisting here now, you

1 know, the 20,000 chariots have already arrived anyway
2 long ago anyway. It's, it's just a matter of, you
3 know, the finishing of the probation of this
4 generation. And you have to admit, John, that even
5 though the detailed truth has not been permitted to be
6 given, you have to admit that just the announcement of
7 seven seals is the last subject matter of the Bible.
8 You know, it's the last book. And whether a man is
9 allowed to have their third chance to teach these
10 things or not, just the announcement of them is
11 something that's going to cause men to search their
12 hearts and their own reasoning because that's where it
13 all begins anyway. If a person looks at these
14 subjects and says within their soul the light within
15 them that well, I don't know these things and they
16 start searching, well, that's a good probationary sign
17 the cross still covers them. But like Psalms 1 says,
18 "Those who scoff and those who transgress and those
19 who make a play with their own carnal knowledge and
20 defy the mystery are defying the very subject of God."
21 It says they will not stand in the judgment.

19 JOHN: Um-hum.

20 MR. KORESH: Their attitude -- "and every
21 man by his words you shall be justified and by your
22 words you shall be condemned in the judgment." And
23 besides, everybody has already subject to judgment now
24 because everyone's already read Matthew, Mark, Luke
25 and John haven't they?

1 JOHN: Um-hum.

2 MR. KORESH: The Gospel has already been
3 given and everybody knows the righteousness of Christ.
4 All they lack to know is the mystery, something
5 additional, it's extra oil, you know? No, Deuteronomy
6 talks about the star, all the prophets talk about the
7 stars. But, you know, the way that travel takes place
8 and throughout the universe is totally different than
9 the way it takes place in this world. You know,
10 everything is measured in wavelengths and forms be it
11 through the audio spectrum or the visual spectrum.
12 Everything is measured in lines. When you read in the
13 Psalms and in the prophets about how God stretched
14 forth his line from the beginning of creation, you
15 know, everything is finite or infinite in measure; you
16 know, what the stars are, how they were really created
17 and what matter is and how that when -- well,
18 something man can even understand in the building
19 blocks of creation is the atom. You know, here is a
20 little systematic working tool of the universe and if
21 any force is greater than the force contained in the
22 perimeters of the atom, should such a force compress
23 an atom it can only compress it to the equity of its
24 own pressure and then it explodes either through
25 fusion or fission. But of course that law does not
always hold true and probabilities such as Einstein
was given to know if there was a force far beyond and
greater than the atom then the atom can be compressed

1 to where it becomes antimatter. And if it is
2 antimatter hypothesis states that it still retains not
3 its own equal force or energy, but it increases on the
4 opposite spectrum. So this is where you get into the
5 realms of spirituality by like the Apostle Paul saying
6 that the things are not seen are greater than the
7 things that are seen, and the things that aren't seen
8 have more power than the things that are seen because
9 the things that aren't seen are more real than the
10 things that are. Visual things are more primitive
11 than invisible things. Of course, you know, the
12 angels are invisible aren't they?

13 JOHN: Yeah, I haven't seen any.

14 MR. KORESH: Exactly. Unless they
15 (indiscernible) unless they take on the atomic form.
16 Of course, it's also a proven fact that man is
17 constructed of the elements of the earth. We're dust.
18 We're dirt, you know? And what holds us together?
19 Well, if we break it down in the scientific realm,
20 there's no explanation what causes molecule and atom
21 to combine and to form the way it does. We call it a
22 hidden law, called genetic, call it information. But
23 where did the information come from, who established
24 the law? From the conception of the sea, you know,
25 what determines the image of a fish, the image of a
man, the image of a horse? Now, you got to go all the
way back to the beginning to start a foundation before
these questions even have their perfect visual

1 foundation to even begin to start answering, but
2 there's answers to these things. For the simple at
3 heart there's answers and wisdom. Now, when Isaiah
4 talks about God commands Israel to look into the
5 heavens and behold all the stars. God says behold who
6 hath created these things? Bringest out their host by
7 number. Well, there are many galaxies, many universes
8 of galaxies and many stars that are unseen, many
9 universes beyond universes of universes, you know? If
10 it's true that my father sits on a throne, but if it
11 is true that he gave me a book, then I'm not really a
12 cult leader. As a matter of fact, there's far more
13 stars than there are people, and there's far more
14 planets than there are stars, and there's far more
15 inhabitants of those planets than there are planets
16 and they all believe in the seven seals.

15 JOHN: Well, that -- what you're talking
16 about is faith though isn't it?

17 MR. KORESH: No, it's reality.

18 JOHN: Well --

19 MR. KORESH: You see, it's reality for me --

20 JOHN: What, what --

21 MR. KORESH: -- but it's faith for those who
22 have to pick up a book. And it's a simple little --
23 see, because you cannot bring upon the minds of men
24 realities far above and beyond their reality. Just as
25 today if me and you was to jump in our new car and
drive back 200 years ago we would be worshiped as gods

1 | wouldn't we? Wouldn't we?

2 | JOHN: Um-hum.

3 | MR. KORESH: The mind and perception of that
4 | era of time -- it's just like even in your own
5 | documentaries of this world, your scientists of this
6 | world who've been blessed with small, teeny-tiny rays
7 | of light, they've compiled documentations from all
8 | over the world to where ancient empires have, have had
9 | landing strips and places to honor those who have
10 | visited this world from ancient times, you know? The
11 | Chariots of the Gods is a documentary, it's a
12 | scientific documentary. And they've through
13 | hieroglyphic forms of art have shown that the
14 | possibility of man flying into the atmosphere was a
15 | reality of their mind, you know? And it shows them in
16 | space vehicles and it shows them in, you know,
17 | different vehicles. That's why, you know, like when
18 | Nahum tries to explain about the last controversy with
19 | Messiah he says there'll be a messiah or a war with
20 | messiah and it'll involve chariots with flaming
21 | torches, you know? It's tanks, John. And right there
22 | in Nahum the prophet if, if he saw something for true
23 | maybe, maybe he was assisted, maybe he was assisted by
24 | beings from other worlds. I mean, I know about beings
25 | from other worlds but you couldn't believe me because
I told you so.

 JOHN: Doesn't mean I don't believe you do
though.

1 MR. KORESH: Right, I do, and no one can
2 take that from me.

3 JOHN: No. I don't think anyone's --

4 MR. KORESH: It's just like --

5 JOHN: -- anyone's trying to either, do you?

6 MR. KORESH: No, no. It's just the elemency
7 of unbelief like Paul states in Hebrews to when Hosea
8 delivered Israel from Egypt then he had to destroy
9 them in wilderness because of unbelief. So that's why
10 he warns the New Testament era, he says, "Therefore
11 let us fear lest a promise being left unto us that we
12 should enter into God's rest any of us should seem to
13 come sure of it." He goes on to explain that when God
14 begins to unfold his mysteries it'll always be
15 something beyond man's normal reality but yet the
16 reason why this is done is so man can prepare his
17 heart and mind to see these realities become present
18 reality. It's just, you know, like Ezekiel's chariot
19 when you read in Ezekiel's prophecy about that
20 lightening, that flaming, that awesome vehicle. Have
21 you ever read Ezekiel 1 and 2?

22 JOHN: No, I don't believe I have.

23 MR. KORESH: Well, you know, the reason why
24 that God's never passed judgment on the world is
25 because God cannot pass judgment on the world until
Daniel's prophecy is fulfilled. In other words, man
has to first be given sufficient evidence that these
prophets were true and no one could understand their

1 subjects of flaming chariots who travel with the sound
2 of thunder and, and travel at the speed of lightening
3 and all that until man can begin to see the
4 possibilities. I mean, you have your little jets, you
5 know, you have your little airplanes, you have your
6 spaceships, you know, you're -- they're, they're quite
7 primitive. But, you know, man's gone to the moon
8 hasn't he and they've sent their satellites throughout
9 the planets of the -- of our solar system haven't
10 they?

10 JOHN: Well, we're looking at man's
11 standards there though aren't we, you know?

12 MR. KORESH: And the ancient prophets have
13 spoken of this long before.

14 JOHN: Um-hum.

15 MR. KORESH: You know, God's not only the
16 god of the Jews, you know, God has also conversed with
17 many ancient empires, you know? The Koran and all,
18 all, all forms of people --

19 JOHN: Um-hum.

20 MR. KORESH: -- and all people are God's
21 people. The people of the four divisions of the Tower
22 of Babel, the red, yellow, black and white. The
23 Orientals have, have been far more religious and
24 spiritual towards their god than Israel has. And on
25 the contrary, the most rebellious people of all in
the, in the records has been Israel. And, you know,
the Caucasian race of all races have been predominant

1 and more arrogantly set forth as any other type of
2 people which God has brought forth from the four faces
3 of the earth. But it's just like I was explaining to
4 one of the gentlemen about the twelve laminations, the
5 precious gems that are below the City of God, you
6 know, in the Book of Revelation. The world knowing
7 about laser and how that light is refracted and how
8 that light can be solidified through opposing energies
9 and polarities of energies. You know, these are --
10 there's a natural force that generates through our
11 universe. There's a natural power that if the key of
12 harnessing was obtained there's no limits to what
13 man's possibilities could be. Of course, man's made
14 in the image of God too, both form and feature and
15 also in his mind, you know? But --

14 JOHN: Let me, let me ask you something.

15 MR. KORESH: Sure.

16 JOHN: You know, we haven't talked to you in
17 about Lord, it's almost been three days, huh? And,
18 and --

18 MR. KORESH: Seems like one night.

19 JOHN: Pardon?

20 MR. KORESH: I've done a lot of sleeping.

21 JOHN: Well, I guess you've done a lot of
22 praying too, huh?

23 MR. KORESH: Well, my mind's in continual
24 connection with that --

24 JOHN: Yeah.

25

1 MR. KORESH: -- source of information.

2 JOHN: And it really -- you know, you had
3 your bad days to begin with and then boy, you really
4 sounded great. And you --

5 MR. KORESH: I've been shot.

6 JOHN: -- and you were -- you really seemed
7 to be picking up and, and then I guess you, you --

8 MR. KORESH: The human body, you know how it
9 goes through --

10 JOHN: We went through some difficult times,
11 but did, did Steve talk to you about septicemia?

12 MR. KORESH: I'm sorry. What did you say
13 again?

14 JOHN: Did Steve talk to you about the
15 concerns that we were getting from our medical people
16 about septicemia, the infection of the blood?

17 MR. KORESH: No.

18 JOHN: And that it was important that you
19 make sure that you --

20 MR. KORESH: Consider those things.

21 JOHN: -- constantly monitor your blood
22 pressure and your pulse rate because it's a serious
23 thing. You remember Jim Hensen and the Muppets and,
24 and that's exactly what, what happened to him and it
25 was a very, very sudden thing and your temperature is
important.

MR. KORESH: Did he, did he die?

JOHN: You bet he did --

1 MR. KORESH: Hmm.

2 JOHN: -- in about 24 hours once, once it
3 formed. And if formed from, from a very minor, minor
4 thing where an infection got into the blood system and
5 very, very similar to a gangrenous situation.

6 MR. KORESH: Machine, machine broke down I
7 guess.

8 JOHN: You bet, you bet. We don't want to
9 see that happen either.

10 MR. KORESH: No.

11 JOHN: You know, you don't want to see it
12 happen, we don't want to see it happen.

13 MR. KORESH: No, there's too much of this
14 judgment that has to finished.

15 JOHN: Yeah, and you've got to be healthy
16 and lead your flock out of there, huh? And a healthy
17 -- not only emotionally mentally healthy David, but a
18 physically healthy David.

19 MR. KORESH: I'm stronger than what people
20 realize.

21 JOHN: Well, you sure had us concerned
22 because we hadn't, we hadn't heard anything from you,
23 you've been doing a lot of sleeping and that's one of
24 the things that our medical people tell us occurs,
25 excessive sleeping. And, you know, if you've got a
good RN there you'd better keep her busy and let her
watch you and let her tend to you because it's going
to be important. And I'm, I'm sincere when I tell you

1 I don't want anything to happen to you.

2 MR. KORESH: I don't want nothing to happen
3 to you all too.

4 JOHN: Well, we're in a little different
5 environment out here than you're in in there and --

6 MR. KORESH: You want to hear about a
7 mystery?

8 JOHN: A mystery?

9 MR. KORESH: About some pets that I have in
10 store for you all?

11 JOHN: Some what?

12 MR. KORESH: Some pets.

13 JOHN: Pets? P-E-T-S?

14 MR. KORESH: Yeah, pets.

15 JOHN: What's that?

16 MR. KORESH: Well, you know what a submarine
17 is don't you?

18 JOHN: Sure.

19 MR. KORESH: You know what sonar and depth
20 and, and all the sophisticated sciences of
21 telecommunication is under the ocean, right? You
22 know, sound travels more thoroughly through water than
23 it does through atmosphere, right?

24 JOHN: Um-hum.

25 MR. KORESH: You know, I want to show you --
I want to read something here to you. It's found,
it's found in, in Job 38. It's a lot of mysteries
that scholars have never understood. But I want to

1 tell you about these pets. There are some in Africa
2 and there's some in South America and there's a whole
3 bunch of them out there in your great big little water
4 trough called the oceans and you all are fixing to see
5 these pets.

6 JOHN: Well, you want to explain it to me?

7 MR. KORESH: Sure. You ever heard of the
8 leviathan? You ever heard of behemoth?

9 JOHN: Uh-uh.

10 MR. KORESH: Okay. Have you heard -- you
11 all, you all, you all for a long time have heard of
12 the Loch Ness Monster, right?

13 JOHN: Why, sure. Everybody's heard of
14 that, huh?

15 MR. KORESH: Okay, and for ever since
16 mariners since the beginning of time even through
17 ancient China and all that they've always talked about
18 the great sea dragons, right?

19 JOHN: Um-hum.

20 MR. KORESH: Well, once upon a time in this
21 world --

22 JOHN: Of course, some of us think that
23 those may have been giant squid and they have been
24 other things also, right?

25 MR. KORESH: That's what some think.

JOHN: Yeah.

MR. KORESH: But there's also records found
in the manuscripts of God.

1 JOHN: Um-hum.

2 MR. KORESH: I mean, surely a Christian is
3 going to believe the Bible, right? Uh-huh.

4 JOHN: Certainly hope so.

5 MR. KORESH: Okay. Now, in the beginning
6 Genesis tells us that the spirit of God, the
7 (indiscernible) of Elohim, moved on the face of the
8 waters. And of course when you look up into the
9 Nebula of Orion you see a lot of gaseous material
10 don't you? And that in a form that's, that's spirit.
11 And God said, "Let there be light," and the
12 origination of light is something that as we say
13 before has its equity with darkness, you know, one is
14 the same than the other, it's just they're on two
15 sides of dimension just like you're on one side of the
16 sun or the other side of the sun, there's always one
17 dark side of the moon isn't there where light shines
18 and where light doesn't shine? But anyway, without
19 getting into the philosophies, let's just take a look
20 here, and this is found in Job 38. "Then the Lord
21 answered Job out of the whirlwind." Now, remember the
22 whirlwind is just -- it's something that causes the
23 atmosphere to spin around and around, right?

24 JOHN: Um-hum.

25 MR. KORESH: And says to Job, "Who is this
that darkeneth counsel by words without knowledge?" A
lot of, a lot of the things that men say they just say
out of their feelings, they really don't know what

1 they're talking about. I'm sure you, you know about
2 that. So God says to Job, "Gird up now thy loins like
3 a man; for I will demand of thee, and answer thou me."

4 In Verse 4 God says to Job, "Where wast you when I
5 laid the foundations of the earth? Declare, if those
6 has understanding." I mean, you know, yeah, where was
7 Job? In the mind of God? You know, I mean where did
8 we come from? How did we originate? How do we have
9 personality? How come we have individuality? Is
10 there anything like us? Is there another equal to us?
11 "Who hath laid the measures thereof, if thou knowest,
12 and who hath stretched the line upon it? Whereupon
13 are the foundations thereof fastened?" You know, the
14 world just hangs in space doesn't it? "Or who laid
15 the corner stone thereof? When the morning stars sang
16 together, and all the sons of God shouted -- " you
17 know, sons, that's plural isn't it?

18 JOHN: Um-hum.

19 MR. KORESH: "Shouted for God -- for joy?"
