MIKE: -- trying to change your, your views,
your lifestyle there, forbid you from returning to
that camp and, and resume normal --

SCOTT: Okay. Another question --

MIKE: -- normal living.

SCOTT: Okay.

MIKE: Sure.

SCOTT: Say -- you said I'm fingerprinted
and I get my picture taken, right?

MIKE: Um-hum.

SCOTT: And say I'm not charged with
anything.

MIKE: Right.

SCOTT: Will this be like on the record?

MIKE: Well --

SCOTT: Say if I applied for a job or
something would that show up or something?

MIKE: It may well show up as, as an initial
arrest but the important thing there is the

1 disposition is that all charges were dismissed, you
2 know, if, if the investigation determines --

3 SCOTT: Right.

4 MIKE: -- that the -- that no further
5 charges would be forthcoming --

6 SCOTT: Uh-huh.

7 MIKE: -- they'll all be dismissed.

8 SCOTT: Right.

9 MIKE: Sure. There are, there are other
10 ways to have that purged from your record, but that's
11 for you and your attorney to discuss.

12 SCOTT: Like community service or something?

13 MIKE: Sure, sure, whatever.

14 SCOTT: (Laughter) Yeah.

15 MIKE: Yeah, there are a lot of options
16 there. There are a lot of options.

17 SCOTT: Well see, I was just kind of curious
18 about that.

19 MIKE: Sure.

20 SCOTT: Because I'm, I'm a landscape
21 contractor, I got a landscape contractor's license in
22 California.

23 MIKE: Oh, okay.

24 SCOTT: And --

25 MIKE: You could return to that.

1 SCOTT: Yeah, I can.

2 MIKE: Be a heck of a business to be in in
3 this day and age.

4 SCOTT: Yeah. It was going, going pretty
5 good but, you know --

6 MIKE: Yeah, I'll bet.

7 SCOTT: My clients are -- is what I'm little
8 concerned about.

9 MIKE: Yeah. Yeah, well, I would be too but
10 I wouldn't worry about that.

11 SCOTT: Yeah. I mean, that's kind of like
12 in the distance.

13 MIKE: Yeah.

14 SCOTT: But --

15 MIKE: Okay. Well, what do you think? Are
16 you ready to come out and get that hand taken care of
17 and get this whole situation behind you?

18 SCOTT: I'd like to think about it some
19 more, you know. I want to come out but I still want
20 to think about it a little more and make up my mind
21 and --

22 MIKE: Okay.

23 SCOTT: If that's all right with you.

24 MIKE: Sure. No, that's fine. Will you
25 promise me when do make your decision that you'll call

1 us --

2 SCOTT: Sure, I'll do that.

3 MIKE: -- as, as soon as it's made and --
4 yeah.

5 SCOTT: I'll do that.

6 MIKE: Okay. What kind of time are we
7 talking about do you think here, Scott?

8 SCOTT: I really can't say, you know. I
9 mean I -- it's been on my mind and it's, it's a real
10 personal thing because --

11 MIKE: Oh, I know.

12 SCOTT: -- these are -- this is my family
13 over here, you know.

14 MIKE: Right.

15 SCOTT: I consider them my family and my
16 friends and --

17 MIKE: Right.

18 SCOTT: -- and I have known David for seven
19 years and --

20 MIKE: Well, they'll always be your family
21 and your friends and, you know, what you're
22 accomplishing by, you know, coming out and again
23 getting medical treatment and going through the system
24 is just a temporary separation from them.

25 SCOTT: Right, right.

1 MIKE: Yeah.

2 SCOTT: I understand that.

3 MIKE: It's not like you're deserting them
4 as family, as friends.

5 SCOTT: Right. You know what I'm saying,
6 right?

7 MIKE: Yes.

8 SCOTT: I mean, it's not like something that
9 I, I take lightly --

10 MIKE: Yeah.

11 SCOTT: -- leaving them, you know?

12 MIKE: Yeah.

13 SCOTT: So --

14 MIKE: Okay. Well, you know, would, would
15 it also be more reassuring to you, would you like
16 someone else to, to accompany you out of the camp?
17 Would that make it easier or someone to, to meet you
18 out here?

19 SCOTT: I'm -- let's see, you know, my, my
20 two daughters? I was really wondering about them, how
21 they're doing. Because the videos --

22 MIKE: Okay.

23 SCOTT: -- that we have received my two
24 daughters are not really seen very much --

25 MIKE: Yeah, yeah.

1 SCOTT: -- if at all.

2 MIKE: Okay.

3 SCOTT: Do you know which ones they are?

4 MIKE: Yes, yeah.

5 SCOTT: Angelique and Crystal.

6 MIKE: What's the first one?

7 SCOTT: Angelique is the older one and
8 Crystal is the other --

9 MIKE: And Crystal.

10 SCOTT: Yeah.

11 MIKE: Yeah.

12 SCOTT: And the pictures that we got the
13 second time, you know --

14 MIKE: Did you not get pictures and notes or
15 whatever from one or both?

16 SCOTT: No.

17 MIKE: Oh, okay.

18 SCOTT: There were just, there were just
19 three kids that wrote notes.

20 MIKE: Oh, okay. It was my impression when
21 I, I saw them just briefly I thought just about
22 everybody wrote or had somebody write for them.

23 SCOTT: No. Just three kids wrote notes and
24 one wrote -- two of them wrote two notes --

25 MIKE: Yeah.

1 SCOTT: -- one of them wrote one note.

2 MIKE: Okay.

3 SCOTT: And the photographs we got the
4 second time were just of a few of them.

5 MIKE: Sure. Okay. Yeah.

6 SCOTT: You know, so I'm kind of like well,
7 where are the rest of them, you know?

8 MIKE: Yeah. No, they're all, they're all,
9 you know, together and they're being cared for.
10 Obviously I --

11 SCOTT: I think they were just taken to the
12 parks -- not all of them were taken at that park --

13 MIKE: Okay. Okay. Well, would you like to
14 be reunited with both of them as, as Kathy was with
15 Brian?

16 SCOTT: Sure, yeah.

17 MIKE: Yeah, okay. We can -- we'll work on
18 arranging that.

19 SCOTT: Okay.

20 MIKE: That's not that difficult a thing
21 once, once you're out.

22 SCOTT: You know, because that was one thing
23 that was really worrying in my mind that, you know --

24 MIKE: Yeah.

25 SCOTT: -- like they were telling me yeah,

1 you know, you get to see them and stuff -- I'm going
2 yeah, right, you know, like, like I'd be lucky if I
3 got to talk to them on the phone, you know?

4 MIKE: Yeah. That's not the case. You
5 know, we, we will work on that. That may take a
6 little
7 time --

8 SCOTT: Right.

9 MIKE: -- so, you know, as, as, as soon as,
10 you know, you're -- you give us an indicator that
11 you're ready to come out we will start working on
12 that. You know, we can be working on that kind of
13 reunion between you and your daughters while you're
14 going through a medical examination --

15 SCOTT: Right.

16 MIKE: -- and through the other process.

17 SCOTT: Yeah.

18 MIKE: Yeah.

19 SCOTT: But I'd appreciate that if --

20 MIKE: I'm sure that they would, they would
21 like to give their, their dad a big hug, you know?

22 SCOTT: Yeah.

23 MIKE: Yeah.

24 SCOTT: Yeah.

25 MIKE: No, I'm --

1 SCOTT: Because I, I was real close to them,
2 so --

3 MIKE: Well, I'm sure you are, yeah, I'm
4 sure you are, and they're close to you.

5 SCOTT: Yeah. They're real good kids.

6 MIKE: Yeah, oh, yeah. All the kids were
7 good what I saw of them, yeah.

8 SCOTT: Yeah.

9 MIKE: Yeah, and you've, you've got to
10 realize that, you know, they have a need for you, you
11 know, you are their --

12 SCOTT: The one thing that really --

13 MIKE: -- you're their father.

14 SCOTT: Yeah. The one thing that really
15 upset me --

16 MIKE: What's that?

17 SCOTT: -- was the kid -- you know, the
18 psychologist -- you know, the so-called "experts"?
19 Because the kids were kind of like well behaved --

20 MIKE: Uh-huh.

21 SCOTT: -- and like controlled themselves
22 to, to a certain degree that, you know, that they
23 thought they were abused or something?

24 MIKE: Well, I wouldn't worry about all
25 that. You know, they were, they were under a strange

1 setting there and, and --

2 SCOTT: Kind of funny, you know?

3 MIKE: -- they'd been away, yeah. No, I
4 wouldn't -- we're trying to, you know, keep them all
5 together until they can be reunited with, with
6 everybody that they should be when, when, when --

7 SCOTT: Yeah.

8 MIKE: -- you all come out.

9 SCOTT: Another thing I was wondering is,
10 okay, they were saying that they would do a background
11 check on any relatives that wanted to take custody of
12 the kids. And how would that work with an out-of-
13 state parent? Like my family is from Hawaii.

14 MIKE: Well, it wouldn't make, make any
15 difference at all. They'll, they'll go -- you know,
16 they don't have to be from here or from Texas or, or
17 the continental United States.

18 SCOTT: Right.

19 MIKE: The, the Social Service people that,
20 that handle it --

21 SCOTT: There's a, there's a way they could
22 do that that --

23 MIKE: Pardon me?

24 SCOTT: There's a way they could do it
25 without actually going --

1 MIKE: Sure, sure.

2 SCOTT: -- over there?

3 MIKE: Oh, sure, I mean they're only a
4 telephone call away.

5 SCOTT: Right.

6 MIKE: They're only a telephone call, you
7 know? There are people from Australia and Britain,
8 you know, and, and everything else, Scott.

9 SCOTT: Right. Okay.

10 MIKE: That's no problem to get on the --

11 SCOTT: I see.

12 MIKE: -- the telephone, yeah.

13 SCOTT: Uh-huh. Want to talk to Steve some
14 more?

15 MIKE: Yeah.

16 SCOTT: I'm getting, I'm getting kind of
17 cold.

18 MIKE: Sure, sure. Okay. Okay. But you
19 give that -- this whole situation some thought.

20 SCOTT: Yeah, and your name was what? Mike?

21 MIKE: Mike, Mike, right. And, you know,
22 this phone system is literally available 24 hours a
23 day there's someone here to answer it.

24 SCOTT: Okay. So we can call you then?

25 MIKE: You know, I'm here -- pardon me?

1 SCOTT: We can call out?

2 MIKE: Sure, you can.

3 SCOTT: Okay.

4 MIKE: Sure you can. And as, and as soon as
5 you let us know, you know, the, the quicker we'll be
6 able to set this thing up for you.

7 SCOTT: Right.

8 MIKE: Literally, anybody in there can call
9 out and, and we're here to, to help everybody and we
10 just want to see this -- see it resolved.

11 SCOTT: Right.

12 MIKE: And, you know, you, you coming out
13 and, and getting the treatment you need is a first
14 step for everybody else too, so --

15 SCOTT: Right.

16 MIKE: -- you're helping yourself and, and
17 others.

18 SCOTT: I got a big favor to ask you.

19 MIKE: What's that? I'll help you if I can,
20 and I, I think I can.

21 SCOTT: Well, yeah, I mean, you know, do
22 what you can, but --

23 MIKE: Sure.

24 SCOTT: -- do you think you can do something
25 about the electricity?

1 MIKE: About the power? Well, we --

2 SCOTT: I know, I know it's a big deal, you
3 know?

4 MIKE: Yeah, yeah.

5 SCOTT: But it -- you know, it would show
6 some, it, it would show some good faith on your part.

7 MIKE: It would, and we realize that and it
8 would reestablish some credibility. It's basically
9 like the credibility -- probably the best thing we
10 could do right now to, to get that power back on is to
11 have you come out.

12 SCOTT: Right.

13 MIKE: That would be --

14 SCOTT: It's like a two-way street, right?

15 MIKE: It's a two-way street -- good faith
16 from your side, reestablish the credibility. And, you
17 know, even if you couldn't benefit from that power
18 back on, everybody else in there --

19 SCOTT: Yeah.

20 MIKE: -- you know, could.

21 SCOTT: Right.

22 MIKE: So you'd be helping, helping others,
23 your friends and the family in there.

24 SCOTT: Okay.

25 MIKE: Okay?

1 SCOTT: All right. I'll let you get talking
2 to Steve then.
3 MIKE: Good, Scott. Good talking to you.
4 SCOTT: Okay --
5 MIKE: I'll hear from you soon.
6 SCOTT: Okay. See you later.
7 MIKE: Bye.
8 SCOTT: I'll get -- I'll to get him right
9 now. Hello?
10 MIKE: Hello?
11 SCOTT: You want me to just have him call
12 you back?
13 MIKE: Sure, if he wants to, to --
14 SCOTT: I got to go find him.
15 MIKE: Sure, that's okay. If he wants
16 something else -- I don't have anything specific for
17 him that we haven't talked about --
18 SCOTT: Oh, okay.
19 MIKE: -- so if he wants --
20 SCOTT: If he has anything else --
21 MIKE: -- wants to talk --
22 SCOTT: -- I'll have him call you.
23 MIKE: Sure.
24 SCOTT: Okay.
25 MIKE: Okay, Scott.

1 SCOTT: Okay. Take it easy.

2 MIKE: Anybody that wants -- you know, needs
3 anything or has a question have them call.

4 SCOTT: Okay.

5 MIKE: Okay, Scott.

6 SCOTT: All right. Thanks.

7 MIKE: Bye.

8 SCOTT: Bye.

10 (Phone dialing) (Phone ringing)

11 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Hello?

12 JOHN-3: Hello, is Steven there, please?

13 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Wait one
14 moment.

15 (Pause)

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

17 JOHN-3: Steven?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes.

19 JOHN-3: This is John-3.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: John-3?

21 JOHN-3: I talked to you shortly yesterday
22 about the note from your sister, Susan.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yes.

24 JOHN-3: The reason for my call, Oliver and
25 Kathy had requested to talk to you.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

2 JOHN-3: And I don't -- do you still want to
3 talk to them?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure.

5 JOHN-3: Okay. We're going to arrange that
6 here in just a second.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

8 (Pause) (Dial tone persisting throughout
9 following exchange)

10 JOHN-3: Can, can you hear?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: I can hear it sounds like a
12 dial tone --

13 JOHN-3: Okay (dial tone ceases) hold on one
14 second here.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

16 JOHN-3: We're trying to arrange this here.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

18 JOHN-3: Go ahead.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

20 OLIVER: Hello?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Is this Oliver?

22 OLIVER: Yes.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oliver, how are you doing?

24 OLIVER: Oh, Steve, I'm great, doing just
25 fine.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, good. Good to hear
2 it.

3 OLIVER: Yeah, they're -- you know, they're
4 treating me real nice, you know? No one's been unfair
5 to me or anything, you know, everything's going real
6 well. I'm in good spirits. I just -- you know, I
7 just got out of bed not so long ago.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, really? Well, that
9 sounds good.

10 OLIVER: Yeah.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Anything you want to tell
12 me, or your sister --

13 OLIVER: Yeah, they've, they've provided an
14 attorney for me.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: They have? Okay.

16 OLIVER: They're going to appoint me a new
17 one on Monday.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

19 OLIVER: Yeah, of course the Australian
20 consulate came to see me.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good.

22 OLIVER: You know, he wanted me to -- you
23 know, he asked me if I wanted my parents to know
24 anything, he wanted to send some message on --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I see.

1 OLIVER: -- and stuff like that. I, I
2 believe -- they've, they've told me that I've got
3 press access which I didn't know up until today, but I
4 do have access to the press. I can ring anyone I
5 like. And I --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, if, if you can we'd
7 like to be listening by radio to who you might connect
8 with or the possibilities of hearing you or what you
9 might want to say.

10 OLIVER: Okay. I'm just jotting these down.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Oliver?

12 OLIVER: Yeah?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Would you like to talk with
14 your sister?

15 OLIVER: There's one more thing I'd like to,
16 I'd like to say before I --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

18 OLIVER: -- before I talk to Aeysha.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

20 OLIVER: I just -- you know, I do have faith
21 in the system and I hope everything does work out.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

23 OLIVER: And I believe this will be worked
24 out just fine, you know what I mean?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

1 OLIVER: Okay. Yes, I would like to speak
2 to her.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Just a minute. Here,
4 here she is.

5 AISHA: Hello?

6 OLIVER: Hi.

7 AISHA: Hi. How you doing?

8 OLIVER: I'm all right.

9 AISHA: Yeah?

10 OLIVER: Yeah. What are you doing?

11 AISHA: The usual.

12 OLIVER: Uh-huh. How's Startle?

13 AISHA: Good.

14 OLIVER: Is she, is she sleeping or what?

15 AISHA: No, she's just in bed. So, what,
16 what happened to you?

17 OLIVER: Oh, I they're, they're holding me
18 down in the county jail right now.

19 AISHA: You're in jail?

20 OLIVER: Yeah.

21 AISHA: Really?

22 OLIVER: Yeah.

23 AISHA: What for?

24 OLIVER: They're, they're holding me as a
25 material witness --

1 AISHA: Oh.

2 OLIVER: -- which is my -- I, I may know
3 something and they may want to keep me to -- just in
4 case -- they want to find out, you know -- in the
5 long-term situation -- do you have dad's phone number,
6 because I, I left my wallet on the bed?

7 AISHA: Oh, you didn't take it?

8 OLIVER: No, I left it. You know, I wanted
9 to take it. It had my ID and everything.

10 AISHA: Oh, Ollie, how come you left that
11 there?

12 OLIVER: Oh, I don't know. I wasn't
13 thinking I guess.

14 AISHA: Yeah, I have, I have to go get it,
15 okay?

16 OLIVER: Yeah, go get it. Aisha's going to
17 go --

18 AISHA: Okay. Just wait.

19 OLIVER: Okay.

20 AISHA: Hold on. Ollie?

21 OLIVER: Hmm?

22 AISHA: While I go get it do you want to
23 talk to David?

24 OLIVER: Sure.

25 AISHA: Sure.

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(Pause)

MR. KORESH: Ollie?

OLIVER: Hi.

MR. KORESH: Did you get that steak dinner
yet?

OLIVER: Not quite.

MR. KORESH: (Laughter) What are they
feeding you?

OLIVER: Just prison food, I guess. It's --

MR. KORESH: Prison food?

OLIVER: Yeah.

MR. KORESH: That may not be that bad.

OLIVER: It's all right. No, I've got no
complaints.

MR. KORESH: They've been treating you good?

OLIVER: Yeah.

MR. KORESH: That's good.

OLIVER: Yeah.

MR. KORESH: So anyway, so they're not half
as bad are they?

OLIVER: No, they're, they're all right.

MR. KORESH: Huh?

OLIVER: They're pretty good to me, yeah.

MR. KORESH: Heard anything about the
weather?

1 OLIVER: No, everything is fine.

2 MR. KORESH: That's good. Yeah, you kind of
3 discouraged a lot of people here when they didn't let
4 you call back like they said.

5 OLIVER: Yeah, well --

6 MR. KORESH: Well, they just broke -- after,
7 after you left they just broke negotiations with us.
8 They shut our electricity off, you know, didn't give
9 us the "Newsweeks."

10 OLIVER: Really?

11 MR. KORESH: Yeah, they haven't, they
12 haven't been calling us or nothing.

13 OLIVER: Hmm. I'll have to talk to them
14 about that.

15 MR. KORESH: Well, it's just, you know, I
16 guess they got their reasons.

17 OLIVER: We'll work something out.

18 MR. KORESH: You know, Kevin and them were
19 going to come out, you know, we was working it out and
20 then all of a sudden they just -- John Cox was the
21 last guy I was talking to, it was going real good then
22 all of a sudden they just turned our electricity off
23 and we called them and we said what's going on. And,
24 you know, they just -- ever since then they just been
25 real stifled, haven't been calling us in the morning

1 or nothing.

2 OLIVER: Hmm.

3 MR. KORESH: So we didn't know what -- we
4 didn't know if they beat you up or whatever they did
5 to you, you know? So anyway -- so --

6 OLIVER: No, they've, they've been very,
7 very polite, the -- especially the, the Sheriff's
8 Department down there and --

9 MR. KORESH: Oh, yeah.

10 OLIVER: -- they've been real good to me.
11 You know, they've -- you know, you know, given me
12 everything I needed and, you know --

13 MR. KORESH: Well, tell, tell, tell those
14 guys, Weinberger and all those guys I still love them
15 down there.

16 OLIVER: To who?

17 MR. KORESH: Sheriff Weinberger.

18 OLIVER: What's his name, Sheriff Lamberger?

19 MR. KORESH: Weinberger.

20 OLIVER: Weinberger?

21 MR. KORESH: Yeah.

22 OLIVER: Weinberger.

23 MR. KORESH: And Harwell --

24 OLIVER: Oh, Weinberger, right.

25 MR. KORESH: -- and all those guys down

1 | there. And tell them, you know, it's strange thing
2 | when these big boys come in down here in our little
3 | town.

4 | OLIVER: Yeah.

5 | MR. KORESH: But anyway, well, good to hear
6 | from you. Here, here's, here's Fish.

6 | OLIVER: Okay.

7 | MR. KORESH: Okay.

8 | OLIVER: Catch you later.

9 | MR. KORESH: Talk to you later.

10 | OLIVER: Yeah --

11 | MR. KORESH: Tell them to send those
12 | magazines.

12 | OLIVER: All right. I'll tell them that.

13 | MR. KORESH: Thanks.

14 | (Pause)

15 | OLIVER: Hello?

16 | AISHA: All right. I got the phone number.

17 | OLIVER: Okay.

18 | AISHA: Wait a minute. (Pause) Okay. As
19 | far as I know, it's 011-613 --

19 | OLIVER: Yeah, I know that part.

20 | AISHA: Okay, 758 --

21 | OLIVER: 758.

22 | AISHA: 8975.

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OLIVER: 8975.

AISHA: Do you have the address?

OLIVER: Yeah, I've got the address, 7
Rudman Street (indiscernible).

AISHA: Yeah. 3156. That's the Post Code.

OLIVER: 3156.

AISHA: Okay?

OLIVER: Okay. Yeah, it's -- everyone is
treating me real nicely, you know?

AISHA: Of course, Ollie.

OLIVER: It's great.

AISHA: Just like the prophecies say so.

OLIVER: Yeah, well, I guess. You know I
love you and I hope for the best and I hope, hope this
can be resolved in a good way and that everything will
come out nicely.

AISHA: I heard that Gary Coker got
Catherine and Margaret -- were they for the reason for
-- that you're being held?

OLIVER: Let me ask them. Is -- do you know
Catherine and Margaret, the two elderly ladies that
came out? Are they being held the same way I am or
have they been released? All -- have they been -- has
their bond been paid? Are they released? Are
they --

1 AISHA: Well, we know they have been
2 released.

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: They're out,
4 they're out.

5 OLIVER: Yeah, they're out. They've -- you
6 know, they've, they've been set a bond and --

7 AISHA: Are they going to do that for you?

8 OLIVER: I don't know yet. There's -- we
9 will have to see. I guess they might. I don't
10 know -- see -- I don't know. She's asking me, my
11 sister, if they're going to put a bond for me but --

12 AISHA: Um-hum.

13 OLIVER: We'll, we'll have to discuss that
14 later, me and my lawyer and, you know, find out what's
15 going on with that.

16 AISHA: With your lawyer, okay.

17 OLIVER: Yeah. I've, I've got a temporary
18 lawyer right now but I'll, I'll be getting a new one
19 on Monday and so send my love to, you know, everyone
20 and tell them I'm all right and I love them and, you
21 know -- you still there?

22 AISHA: Yeah, yeah, I'm listening.

23 OLIVER: Okay. Tell, tell Kevin and --

24 AISHA: So you're --

25 OLIVER: Huh?

1 AISHA: -- you're staying in a cell in a --
2 that's where you are, in a cell?

3 OLIVER: Yeah, I'm in a cell. I've got a
4 television, you know, I've got a shower, you know,
5 I've got a toilet, you know, bed. Don't know what
6 else to say. I guess there's not much really to say.

7 AISHA: Okay. Well --

8 OLIVER: Just listen out on the radio and
9 see what happens.

10 AISHA: All right.

11 OLIVER: So you didn't get the magazines,
12 huh?

13 AISHA: No, we didn't get the magazines.

14 OLIVER: All right. I'll tell them about
15 that. That's unusual. And you were, and you were cut
16 off --

17 AISHA: They cut off all negotiations with
18 us, Ollie.

19 OLIVER: They've cut off all negotiations?

20 AISHA: Yeah, and the electricity.

21 OLIVER: And the electricity. All right.
22 Well, I'll ask them about that and see what we can do.

23 AISHA: That's why the rest, that's why the
24 rest of the guys here aren't coming out.

25

1 OLIVER: She's, she's right here -- she's
2 going to --
3 AISHA: Huh?
4 OLIVER: Okay. Well, I got to go now and
5 Kathy wants to speak to you guys now --
6 AISHA: Kathy wants to talk --
7 OLIVER: -- later on -- Kathy wants to speak
8 to you --
9 AISHA: Oh, later on?
10 OLIVER: -- later on, yeah.
11 AISHA: When? Right now or later on?
12 OLIVER: Later on. Well --
13 AISHA: Later on?
14 OLIVER: -- the same line or you going to
15 redial?
16 AISHA: Huh? She's going to what?
17 OLIVER: So you're going to take over for me
18 now? Okay. Well -- what was your name again?
19 DICK: Dick.
20 OLIVER: Dick's going to take over now and -
21 - DICK: Hello?
22 OLIVER: -- good-bye.
23 DICK: Hello?
24 AISHA: Good-bye, Ollie.
25 OLIVER: Hello?

1 DICK: Hello. Keep, keep the line open if
2 you would, please, so that Kathy can --
3 OLIVER: Yeah. I'm just going to hand it
4 over to Dick.
5 DICK: I guess we have to call back but
6 we'll, we'll keep the, the line open here.
7 OLIVER: All right. Okay. Bye.
8 AISHA: Bye, Ollie.
9 OLIVER: Yeah. I love you.
10 AISHA: Okay. I love you, too.
11 OLIVER: Here's Dick.
12 AISHA: Oh, okay.
13 DICK: Hello? Steve?
14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?
15 DICK: This is Dick.
16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, Dick (indiscernible) or
17 Dick?
18 JOHN-3: Yeah, hello, John here -- John-3
19 here.
20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, John. Okay. John,
21 Steve here.
22 JOHN-3: Okay. Steve, listen, we'll get
23 Kathy set up and we'll, we'll be back with you.
24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, so you want to call me
25 back then?

1 JOHN-3: Yeah.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. John, so, yeah, I was
3 talking with I think it was see, who was it last night
4 last? Oh, it was Mike and he told me no -- I said I
5 had talked to a John-3 and he says no, you were
6 talking to John Cox. I says, no, I believe it was --
7 he told it was John-3.

8 JOHN-3: Steve, he was confused.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

10 JOHN-3: I talked to you yesterday.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: I thought so. Okay. You
12 know, it was what, 6:00 in the morning or somewhere
13 around there?

14 JOHN-3: Yeah.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Talk to you when you
16 call then.

17 JOHN-3: All right.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Bye.

19 * * * * *

20 (Pause) (Indiscernible voices in
21 background.)

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

23 JOHN-3: Steven?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes.

25 JOHN-3: This is John-3 again.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: John-3, how you doing?
2 JOHN-3: Good.
3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good.
4 JOHN-3: I believe we've got that call from
5 Kathy --
6 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.
7 JOHN-3: -- set to go here in a minute if
8 you'll just hold on.
9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, I will.
10 JOHN-3: Okay. I think she's there. Go
11 ahead.
12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Hello?
13 KATHY: Hello?
14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Kathy?
15 KATHY: Hi, Steve.
16 MR. SCHNEIDER: How is it going?
17 KATHY: Okay. How's it going there?
18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, we had -- apparently
19 Sabbath was kind of a breakdown with them.
20 KATHY: Yeah.
21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Started out with the
22 electricity being turned off. We thought everything
23 was going great. Three, three people at least were
24 going to go out yesterday and, and --
25 KATHY: But not --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- they, they got cold feet
2 when they didn't hear from Ollie, the electricity went
3 off, no "Newsweek" magazines.

4 KATHY: Kind of scared them, huh?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, it did. I, I
6 tried --

7 KATHY: No "Newsweek"?

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I tried to talk to them a
9 little bit further and they just didn't want to make a
10 move, they didn't hear from Ollie, they were --

11 KATHY: I thought you had "Newsweek" and
12 "Time."

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: No.

14 KATHY: Oh, no.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Never received it. We were
16 listening to the radio and we were -- David and I and
17 the rest were quite unhappy with you because they
18 stated you said you are our spokesperson.

19 KATHY: I never said that.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: And also you called us
21 Koreshians which isn't so and -- Branch Davidian
22 Seventh Day Adventists which is not so. So I mean, I
23 don't know, Kathy, just be -- you know, those things
24 we've never -- David has never called us that or said
25 we were that. Pardon? Yeah, he said -- David even

1 passed on you didn't need to salt your foot.

2 KATHY: Okay.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, other -- but otherwise,
4 they're treating you okay and things are fine?

5 KATHY: Yeah.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: You've got an attorney?

7 KATHY: Yes. The court appointed me an
8 attorney real quick, but --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Are you still, are
10 you still with Brian?

11 KATHY: No, Brian -- I saw Brian -- when I
12 did I come out? Friday. I saw Brian Friday.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, and not since, huh?

14 KATHY: No.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, what's the thing on
16 that?

17 KATHY: Well, I have -- they -- I have to
18 wait until they go through the system.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: And have they given you any
20 idea about time or --

21 KATHY: No. It just depends on, you know,
22 how the court proceedings go.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. So, no idea what
24 time, huh?

25 KATHY: No.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, right now you're a
2 material witness. What kind of -- I mean, where are
3 you located? Are you in a, in a jail or --

4 KATHY: I, I was -- I went through the FBI
5 command post, whatever, which is where I was when I
6 saw Brian and --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: That was the first thing you
8 did?

9 KATHY: Right.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

11 KATHY: And I was not put through any
12 interrogation or anything, you know, everybody was
13 real nice.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Great.

15 KATHY: Then I was moved here and --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, where is here?

17 KATHY: County, County Sheriff's Office.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, you're at the County
19 Jail?

20 KATHY: Yeah.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Do you have a cell or
22 something?

23 KATHY: Yes. I have access to whoever. I
24 have a phone and I have an attorney.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: You have a telephone? You

1 can call anybody?

2 KATHY: Yeah.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: And you have access to the
4 press?

5 KATHY: If I want.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: If you want, huh?

7 KATHY: I, I have a, I have a phone in my
8 room.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

10 KATHY: I have a detention hearing scheduled
11 Tuesday and I'm -- if all goes well I could be
12 released then.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: I see.

14 KATHY: But I don't want to push anything,
15 you know?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

17 KATHY: So I'm just going by their rules
18 and, you know, doing the best I can to facilitate the
19 best resolution of the whole situation. You know,
20 that's why, you know, I want to talk to you, let you
21 know that okay, yeah, I am going through a system.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

23 KATHY: But I, I've been treated fairly.
24 You know, the system has -- is doing what they can for
25 me and I'm doing what I can to help the people that

1 are still in there to solve the situation. I mean,
2 there's no way that everybody is going to be able to
3 speak until they come out. So that's why I'm on the
4 phone with you, to help you help the others to see
5 that that's, that's the only possibility. They're not
going --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, they, they've
7 stated that --

8 KATHY: -- they're not going to let you have
9 any access to the press. You know that.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- they've stated that to me
numerous times and --

11 KATHY: Okay.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- it's been obvious by what
13 has taken place thus far --

14 KATHY: Right. That's, that's the simple
15 facts. There's no --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- about us not having
17 access to the press until we come out.

18 KATHY: That's -- there's no way around it.
19 But I do have access --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I, I know, I know, I
know they have total control.

21 KATHY: Yes, they have total control of you.
22 I have access to the press though.

23

24

25

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know they have -- that
2 they made that statement even on the press this
3 morning how they are -- that they have total, complete
4 control of everything.

5 KATHY: Yeah.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: They're, they're more
7 powerful than the press, they're more powerful than
8 any other aspect of society.

9 KATHY: They are. But now I'm out of that
10 situation and I do have access to the press. Whether
11 I use that is, is, is dependent on your lives in
12 there.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. Well, hang on a
14 minute. (Pause) Yeah, anything else, Kathy or --

15 KATHY: You know that Margaret and Catherine
16 were released on bond? You know that?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: They -- okay, if they're
18 material witnesses did they explain to you why they
19 would have to be on bond or bail in the first place?
20 I don't quite understand.

21 KATHY: Because as a material witness don't
22 they have to come back when there is a court trial and
23 testify? That's why the bond is placed on them, so
24 that they can secure their testimony.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I see, so that's the only

1 reason.

2 KATHY: Yeah.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: And so far it appears that's
4 the way it's going to be for yourself?

5 KATHY: That's what I'm hoping.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: And then you don't know much
7 about Ollie then do you?

8 KATHY: I don't, I don't know anything about
9 Ollie.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. Okay. So --

11 KATHY: I mean, I've seen him a couple
12 times, but --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, you have seen him a few
14 times?

15 KATHY: Yeah, but I, I don't know about his
16 case.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I see. Are you both in the
18 County Jail?

19 KATHY: Yeah.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I see. Okay.

21 KATHY: The other statement I wanted to make
22 was that when I get the opportunity and, you know, if
23 I, if I win the detention hearing or whatever, I'm
24 going to file a wrongful death lawsuit against the ATF
25 for killing Mike.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

2 KATHY: And I'm going to need you all's
3 help.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

5 KATHY: So in order for -- you know, this is
6 my, my help to the -- to the FBI, in order for you to
7 help me --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I would have to be out.

9 KATHY: Right.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I'm working on it.

11 KATHY: Okay. That's the bottom line there.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: The truth is, you can pass
13 on that I want to be on that side with the rest too.

14 KATHY: Okay. The last thing I wanted to
15 mention was that, you know, we've been in this for
16 what, 14 days now?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: This is actually -- yeah, 14
18 days today.

19 KATHY: Day 14? I don't think time is
20 really on our side. You have a lot of supplies --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: You, you don't, you don't,
22 you don't think time is on our side? What do you
23 mean?

24 KATHY: You have a lot of supplies in there,
25 but the resources that are being used out here are

1 monumental and the FBI has made it clear that for that
2 reason and --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: So --

4 KATHY: -- and for the lives and for the
5 injuries and for the need for medical, medical
6 attention of those inside that they are extremely
7 anxious for this situation to come to an end.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: They're extremely anxious
9 for -- well, we've been anxious for this thing to have
10 never started and also to come to an end. You stated
11 that we have a lot -- even though we have a lot of
12 supplies here they've got great -- what, what was
13 meant by they have great resources out there?

14 KATHY: They're using, they're using a lot
15 of resources out here to --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: What do you mean they're
17 using a lot of resources? Like -- can you make
18 yourself more plain?

19 KATHY: Well, you can, you can see, you can
20 see what's on our property, right?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, you talking about the
22 tanks and Bradleys?

23 KATHY: I'm talking about everything that,
24 that's being used. I mean, even, even to keep me here
25 costs, you know, time, space, everything.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Is this what they explained
2 to you then or --

3 KATHY: Well, that's common sense, too, but,
4 but what they did explain to me was that --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Why, why would you be
6 telling me that when since day one it's obvious to me
7 by just looking out the window I can see things
8 happening? I mean, is there a reason? Have they
9 encouraged you to say that? Have you -- do, do you
10 have an, an opinion about it or what?

11 KATHY: Well, that statement I know you
12 know, but the -- what they have encouraged is that
13 they are anxious to bring this situation to an end
14 based on those facts.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, so they, so they let you
16 know that they are anxious --

17 KATHY: Right.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- to bring this to a quick
19 close?

20 KATHY: Right.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: And that they do have
22 resources to do so?

23 KATHY: Sure they do.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 KATHY: And, and, you know, based on the

1 lives that are in there we want it to come to a
2 peaceful end, that's, that's, that's their, their --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know the --

4 KATHY: -- biggest desire.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Kathy, we -- I really
6 thought in all truth and honesty, I really thought
7 that what we had going with this John-2, John Dolan,
8 about three days or Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, it
9 was looking so well and three more were coming out. I
10 was actually starting to talk to a number of guys that
11 were speaking about going out and it all came to an
12 abrupt stop Friday night.

13 KATHY: Because of the electricity going
14 off?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, that was the first
16 thing that -- it was the most freaky thing to this
17 point of time that's happened. It was like pulling
18 the carpet out from under us. All of a sudden these
19 guys that wanted to go out didn't want to even talk to
20 me. What now?

21 MR. KORESH: (Indiscernible) (In
22 background)

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, John Cox was -- yeah,
24 John Cox was talking to David, everything was going
25 fine. In fact, he was going to call us right back.

1 KATHY: I, I read that in the paper that --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

3 KATHY: -- David talked to him.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, did -- have they been
5 bringing out how they all of a sudden right in the
6 process of, of super -- David had already let them
7 know that he was aware that these three guys were
8 coming out, they were going to be out in the morning
9 like say 9, 10, 11 o'clock. And all of a sudden --

9 KATHY: I think --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- all of a sudden the
11 electricity came off. Did they, did they show in the
12 press that it went off at 11:15 and that's when
13 negotiations broke down, no "Newsweek," no Ollie's
14 return call? I mean now all of a sudden the people
15 they became scared again. You know, now I've got to
16 go back and start trying -- but I don't have any tools
17 to work with. The electricity never came back on,
18 they never warned --

18 KATHY: I told, I told them that that was
19 going to put everybody in a state of shock but I don't
20 know --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: It did --

21 KATHY: -- I don't --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- more -- worse than I -- I

23

24

25

1 mean, after almost these 14 days now it's made it near
2 impossible to even to even -- for me to communicate
3 with them.

4 KATHY: I don't know why that came about. I
5 did, I did read that some -- that they are unsure as
6 to why myself and Oliver came out. I did not state
7 that I was a key player, I did not state that at all,
8 I don't know where that came from.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I know -- we heard
10 that too and I was wondering --

11 KATHY: I stated --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- what that was all about.

13 KATHY: I stated that the people inside are
14 going to look and see what happens to me --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

16 KATHY: -- to help their decision as for
17 them to come out.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: And that did make a --

19 KATHY: That was my statement.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: And it was a big difference.

21 KATHY: That was my statement.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Ollie was feeling much
23 better about it, he went out, and these others were
24 just going to follow right after him. In fact, they
25 were thinking about it that night and they said, well,

1 let's just wait until the morning hours when the
2 sunlight comes up and, and we're going to be going out
3 then ourselves. And then bingo, all of a sudden the
4 electricity went off and John Cox said he'd call us
5 back, he never did. So that was -- and they all
6 started --

6 KATHY: (Indiscernible)

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- acting real strange.
8 Then all, all of a sudden I talked to a John-3 and a
9 new person Dick and got absolutely nowhere, nothing
10 about turning the electricity back on, nothing about
11 the "Newsweek," nothing about Ollie talking to us. I
12 mean, the whole thing just totally fell apart and now
13 they show no interest in even calling here. And then
14 we listened to the press conference, the whole truth
15 was not told. I mean, all these --

15 KATHY: The only way that you can be
16 told --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- on this side, on this
18 side you wonder just what's going on with them now.

18 KATHY: I -- it's, it's not going to happen,
19 Steve. The only way the truth can be told is for us
20 to tell it; you know they're not going to tell it. We
21 have got to tell it.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Now, that's for sure.

23

24

25

1 KATHY: We're going to tell it in the courts
2 and we're going to tell it to the media, but we can't
3 tell it from in there. Because I don't, I don't know
4 any way around that. We cannot tell it from in there.

5 The FBI refuses to let that happen and --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I know that. You -- and
7 I, I -- you, you and -- they've told me that, you've
8 told me a number of times. I'm aware of their
9 statements.

10 KATHY: And, and Steve, I have to apologize,
11 but the, the, the (indiscernible).

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Steve? Excuse
13 me. Kathy? Kathy?

14 KATHY: Yes?

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Steve?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah?

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: I just wanted to
18 let you know that we were on the line here just so we
19 aren't concealing anything, okay?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, all right. I, I wasn't
21 aware of that.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Okay, and can I
23 clear up something that might involve the spokesperson
24 issue?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: That may have
2 been our words. I don't believe Kathy said that she
3 was a spokesperson -- exactly what she just said --
4 that she said that people would be looking on the
5 inside at how she was treated and --

6 KATHY: I called myself a guinea pig, that's
7 the words I used.

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: That's the exact
9 same words, right.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Okay? So I'll
12 let you go on.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

14 KATHY: What was I saying?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: You were talking about the
16 press or something or -- or --

17 KATHY: Right, right. I have immediate
18 access to the press right now. Whether or not I want
19 to say anything that might harm the lives in there --
20 I may, I may not say anything to the press until
21 anybody's out based --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: That sounds good.

23 KATHY: -- based on the fact that I don't
24 want to do anything that's going to hurt anybody
25 inside.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

2 KATHY: So, everything -- look, everybody is
3 going to have to go through the system, Steve, it's
4 that simple, okay? But --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Do you know that I'm at a
6 place where I'm, I'm actually anxious for that? It's
7 just that there's --

8 KATHY: I, I am too. I'm --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- it's just that there are
10 people here that aren't like I am, you know, that
11 don't see it so clear, they're apprehensive, they're
12 scared especially because of Friday night all the
13 more. I mean, that's what bothers me more than
14 anything else. I thought we were making like super
15 headway. I even got to talk to David a few times that
16 night and he had a smile on his face, he had a happy,
17 good conversation with John Cox and then all of a
18 sudden bingo. Yesterday was a total -- so totally
19 different, so totally different. I was hoping to talk
20 to this John Dolan again which they call John-2 again,
21 but, you know, obviously I have not had that
22 opportunity.

23 KATHY: I, I, I don't know why the
24 negotiations you feel have broke down. I really feel
25 that -- you know, you --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, just because they were
2 so decent, so friendly. People were coming out, it
3 was snowballing, I told them clearly it was and then
4 bingo, they cut off -- without even warning cut off
5 the electricity, Ollie never called back.

6 KATHY: I don't know why Ollie didn't call
7 back. I mean I stayed there --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- well, anyway, I gave
9 them credit --

10 KATHY: -- I stayed there all day.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I gave them credit where
12 he could maybe call back the next day but -- which was
13 yesterday, never happened.

14 KATHY: I stayed there all day
15 (indiscernible) call -- back.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: They had a colder attitude.
17 Maybe it was Dick, maybe -- I don't know, but it was
18 just colder. It seemed like the negotiators had
19 little or no control whatsoever, that there were those
20 above them that didn't have the same insight as
21 themselves.

22 KATHY: Well, that's, that's true. I mean,
23 there is higher-ups in every, in every situation. I
24 mean also, Steve, you got to also remember when we
25 come out and we make our statements to the media,

1 right now the situation has been going on so long the
2 media is leaving and I know you know that.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Of course.

4 KATHY: I mean, I'm sure that the thing will
5 pick back up --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, for myself, Kathy --

7 KATHY: -- if everybody were to come out.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- understand for David and
9 myself and a lot of people here I really don't care
10 about the media. I had a life to live two weeks ago
11 and I wasn't in this because I wanted some kind of
12 adverse media coverage --

13 KATHY: No, but don't we want the truth
14 told?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- or some kind of infamy or
16 notoriety because that's what it is.

17 KATHY: But we want the truth to be told.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, if that's what God
19 would have, but one does not need to lean on the arm
20 of the world or to do crazy or weird things to be able
21 to speak to -- through the airwaves. So I don't, I
22 don't see that as anything extremely advantageous.
23 The day that anybody comes out -- or, or let me speak
24 for myself: the day that I come out, I mean I would
25 like to be able to have someone there to monitor --

1 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: (Spoken in
2 background) Steve, there's a tank right on our
3 property by the little lake sitting at the lake.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Like right now there
5 is a tank right on our property right -- it's so close
6 to the building, it's right next to the little lake
7 setting up lights on us. So, you know, that goes real
8 far for these negotiations and people coming out too.
9 So what, what can I say?

10 KATHY: I just, I just hope, Steve, that you
11 realize that coming out peacefully is the only answer
12 to --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Coming out peacefully is the
14 only answer, Kathy?

15 KATHY: -- to ending this situation with,
16 without God doing something.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Kathy, you don't think I
18 realize that?

19 KATHY: (Laughter) I know, I just need to -
20 -that's why I'm here on the phone.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. I mean, these are
22 things that are considered constantly, these are
23 things that I'm thinking even for myself all the time
24 that I want, but I, I feel I've got a responsibility
25 with others here that, you know, not to leave them sit

1 but encourage and, and communicate with the, try to
2 help them, help them see it clearly and that's what
3 I've been doing.--

4 KATHY: Well, you understand --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's why I was so
6 disappointed because of what happened Friday night
7 because I mean --

8 KATHY: You understand --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- after all the talking, my
10 voice was hoarse and sore, thought I'd really gotten
11 somewhere and then all of a sudden it's, it's like I
12 just -- it was like I had no tools, nothing to work
13 with, I've lost my credibility to some degree with
14 these people.

15 KATHY: Steve, for -- on a personal note
16 from myself if I can remember what I was fixing to
17 say, you understand that as long as I am out here I
18 have no contact with my -- you know, I'm on my own,
19 right?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

21 KATHY: Okay. I have no contact with
22 day-to-day events with my belief, right?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

24 KATHY: I don't know what God's going to do,
25 I don't know what's going to happen.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, just hang on to what
2 you remember or what you believe or what you choose to
3 believe, it's up to you. I mean, you've got freedom
4 of choice, of course, and we all know what the issues
5 are. There's a book called Naham, a book called
6 Habakkuk, a book called Revelation.

7 KATHY: And I've been reading them all.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good.

9 KATHY: Especially the Psalms and I've even
10 been --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Naham, Naham is a reality
12 right now. It's no longer a prophecy, it's history in
13 the making.

14 KATHY: I know.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: So I mean, you know, these
16 people they still believe in the Bible, the only
17 reason why they ever came here is because they already
18 believe there was some credibility to that source of
19 information and that's why they have chosen to stay
20 even though the adversity here and -- but of course
21 they've given a lot of thought as to how this should
22 be resolved each as an individual. And a lot of them
23 were starting to look at, you know, what was happening
24 with yourself and Ollie until that incident. And
25 they're --now a lot of them are, are stepping back a

1 little bit and still watching and looking. So I'm
2 just hoping that something can be resolved or --

3 KATHY: Well, all right, maybe --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I want -- I'd like to
5 actually pick up where I was with John. If you would
6 get off the phone you could tell them I'd like to pick
7 up back with John Dolan again and see what could be
8 worked out from where him and I were at the time that
9 we broke off speaking to one another.

10 KATHY: Okay. Let me just tell you, too,
11 that you are watching what happens to me and Ollie and
12 I'm hoping that a positive note will be sent to you by
13 what happens to me Tuesday. And I'm hoping that maybe
14 then I can call you back and if we can get --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I hope so. Please --

16 KATHY: -- if we can get the --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I hope they will allow
18 that because that will -- that would be another plus -

19 KATHY: Yeah. I --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- that would be another
21 help for sure.

22 KATHY: We've already, we've already
23 discussed the possibility of doing that.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 KATHY: You know, if I can convey any

1 positive message to you at all about what's happening
2 to me that's what I want to do.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

4 KATHY: Because like I said, I'm being
5 treated fairly, yes, there's no way around going to
6 through the system. Okay, I have to go through the
7 system.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

9 KATHY: I mean (indiscernible)

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's fine because I -- so
11 far it seems like they are fair and decent and for
12 myself that's not a problem.

13 KATHY: They have been fair and decent but,
14 you know, things happen that we cannot go around. So
15 I'm hoping maybe I can call you back Tuesday and let
16 you know, you know, if I'm out or whatever -- but like
17 I said, I probably will not be talking to the media
18 because of the lives that are at stake.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sounds good.

20 KATHY: I just want to let you know --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, even for me to
22 be --

23 KATHY: -- where you didn't hear anything
24 from me (indiscernible) and it's, and it's --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- a spokesman for David's -

1 - KATHY: -- it's my own decision.
2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. Okay.
3 KATHY: Okay?
4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sounds good.
5 KATHY: Tell David --
6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Anything else or --
7 KATHY: -- I'm sorry about the D.B.D.S.D.A.,
8 and when they asked me what my religion was they
9 couldn't even write it on the computer.
10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Couldn't you put down a
11 Bible student?
12 KATHY: I did. I said, Bible --
13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.
14 KATHY: -- and they couldn't put it on the
15 computer.
16 MR. SCHNEIDER: I see.
17 KATHY: So we left it blank.
18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, this whole business of
19 being called Branch Davidians -- we have not called
20 ourselves that. That's something --
21 KATHY: That --
22 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- Marc Breault labeled us
23 with.
24 KATHY: -- that's, that's why I made the
25 statement to begin with because Perry told me were --

1 we were D.B.D.S.D.A.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Perry thought that from
3 about six, seven years ago and, and --

4 KATHY: Oh, well, that was wrong?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- we -- you've never heard
6 David ever say -- never, he's never said that.

7 KATHY: I know I've never heard David say
8 that either.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Or Koreshites or
10 Koreshians --

11 KATHY: And the, and the Koreshians, David
12 never said that either. That was just us --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: We --

14 KATHY: -- trying to figure out what to call
15 ourselves.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: We, we heard on the press
17 conference that they laughed when you said that we
18 were Koreshians.

19 KATHY: Okay. I will, I will try to make a
20 statement --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Because we've never called
22 ourselves that. One or two people here just smiling
23 once or twice said that as -- in humor.

24 KATHY: Yeah, I agree --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: But --

1 KATHY: -- you're right, and I will try to
2 make a statement to correct that.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Please. That, that helps.

4 KATHY: Tell, tell David I, I am terribly
5 sorry and I love you all.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. We love you too,
7 Kathy, you know that.

8 KATHY: And I'll try to contact you Tuesday.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Kathy --

10 KATHY: And I --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- take care. Don't
12 forget --

13 KATHY: -- I'm hoping that --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- don't forget Naham and
15 the Psalms and --

16 KATHY: I got, I got my -- not my Bible but
17 I have a Bible right next to me.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Okay.

19 KATHY: And, and I, I want you to talk to
20 John again and maybe you can come up with something
21 positive to tell the people to let them know that
22 coming out, you know --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

24 KATHY: -- is, is going to get our story
25 told.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Is he nearby, Kathy?

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: I'm, I'm right
3 here.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, okay.
