2 MR. COX: I mean, it's tough living
3 conditions in there and it's, you know, cold weather
4 is upon us. And we can listen to the forecast and it's
5 going to be brutal tomorrow, tomorrow night, and the
6 next day.

7 MR. SOMMERS: Oh, is it? I'm originally
8 from the northeast, so five foot of snow, you know --

9 MR. COX: Well, your blood hasn't thinned
10 out?

11 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah, my blood's pretty thick.

12 MR. COX: Not yet? Good. You're lucky.

13 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah, really.

14 MR. COX: Mine isn't.

15 MR. SOMMERS: No. You're, you're no from
16 the north then, huh?

17 MR. COX: No. Well, originally, but --
18 You're from Massachusetts, originally?

19 MR. SOMMERS: Originally from Upstate New
20 York. Hold on, Steve wanted to ask you something.

21 MR. COX: Go ahead. Go ahead.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: John?

23 MR. COX: Yes, sir.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I did wake him up and I
25 went to talk to him about that, because I knew he had

1 a sore spot in mind because what happened to Pete Gent
2 and --

3 MR. COX: Okay.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: He said he wanted to talk to
5 you guys about that. He was not --

6 MR. COX: Okay.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: He was not happy what
8 happened with Pete Gent, even though certain things
9 are stated to the press on the air.

10 MR. COX: Uh-huh.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: And he, he saw the opposite
12 of that. And he did mention about Perry Jones.

13 MR. COX: Hey, you know, just giving you the
14 opportunity to do the -- to handle Perry the same way
15 and the infant the same way or whatever, if you want
16 to. Or we --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

18 MR. COX: -- can handle it some other way.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. And -- Okay, let me --
20 -I'm going to give you back to --

21 MR. COX: Answer me one thing then.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm coming right back.

23 MR. COX: Okay.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm, I'm, I'm conversing
25 with him right now.

1 MR. COX: All right, fine.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Let me give you to Greg, and
3 I'm, I'm going to pick up the phone in just a minute
4 here.

5 MR. COX: You bet.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, here he is.

7 MR. COX: That's fine.

8 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah.

9 MR. COX: Hey. Upstate New York?

10 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah, Upstate New York.

11 MR. COX: Not Massachusetts, huh?

12 MR. SOMMERS: No, no.

13 MR. COX: Oh.

14 MR. SOMMERS: They've got some pretty good
15 skiing up there, though.

16 MR. COX: Yeah. Well, you've been away from
17 Upstate New York for a while, though, huh?

18 MR. SOMMERS: Probably been, let me see
19 here, about half my life.

20 MR. COX: It's got to be culture shock going
21 to Hawaii from Upstate New York.

22 MR. SOMMERS: Well, I moved around a little
23 bit after I left New York and, finally, I was about
24 oh, 19, 20, I moved to Hawaii for 3 or 4 years.

25 MR. COX: Yeah.

1 MR. SOMMERS: And it wasn't -- The only
2 cultural shock is that there's a lot of prejudice out
3 there that I'd never experienced before.

4 MR. COX: In Hawaii?

5 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah. If you're white, you
6 are the minority and they don't want you to --

7 MR. COX: Yeah, it's got to be kind of a
8 rude awakening, huh?

9 MR. SOMMERS: It kind of was. But there's
10 so much to do, you --

11 MR. COX: Run away from it?

12 MR. SOMMERS: -- really don't have a problem
13 keeping your mind off it, you know.

14 MR. COX: Yeah. Listen, do you have anybody
15 -- I realize Kim called, but do you have anybody that
16 you would want us to contact? Mother, father, sister,
17 brother, whatever?

18 MR. SOMMERS: No. Everybody --

19 MR. COX: And let them know that you're
20 okay?

21 MR. SOMMERS: Everybody pretty much, you
22 know, knows that I'm strong into the Bible and --

23 MR. COX: Yeah.

24 MR. SOMMERS: -- they've realized that, you
25 know --

1 MR. COX: Well, if you think there's some
2 loved one out there that you want us to contact,
3 that's what we're here for. I mean, we don't -- I
4 don't have any animosity towards you or anybody else
5 in there. And we're trying to resolve this thing
6 peacefully. And if you want us to contact somebody
7 and tell them you're doing all right, you're healthy
8 and -- we'll be happy to do.

9 MR. SOMMERS: Well, if you want to, you
10 know, if you want to say in the report or something,
11 that's fine, that I'm doing great.

12 MR. COX: Good.

13 MR. SOMMERS: You know?

14 MR. COX: Good. I'm glad to hear it.

15 MR. SOMMERS: I'm going to be fine. I was
16 very -- Actually, she was my third guess after my
17 mother and my grandmother. But -- 'Cause we go a long
18 ways back and --

19 MR. COX: Well, that's good.

20 MR. SOMMERS: -- it was a very strange
21 situation.

22 MR. COX: Do you want us to contact your mom
23 or your grandmother?

24 MR. SOMMERS: No, I don't want --

25 MR. COX: Okay.

1 MR. SOMMERS: -- to worry them any more.

2 MR. COX: To tell them that we talked to you
3 and you're doing fine?

4 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah, they, they, they know
5 I'm --

6 MR. COX: All right.

7 MR. SOMMERS: -- taking well care of myself.

8 MR. COX: Okay.

9 MR. SOMMERS: I've always been very --

10 MR. COX: Independent.

11 MR. SOMMERS: Well, not just independent,
12 but very straight-headed. So what appears to, to the
13 media and to the people out there, it seems bizarre,
14 but they, they know I've always walked in the right
15 path and, and done what was right in the sight of
16 truth and stuff. So --

17 MR. COX: Well, that's good. That's good.
18 I mean, if you don't want us to contact them, that's
19 fine. You know, it's your prerogative. We just, just
20 want to let you know that we'd be happy to do it,
21 that's --

22 MR. SOMMERS: Okay. Well, I'll tell you
23 what. I'll let you know if I change my mind.

24 MR. COX: Well, do that. Do that.

25 MR. SOMMERS: You know, I mean, she might

1 call you or something. And if she does, you know --

2 MR. COX: If, if she would, we would let
3 Steve or David or whomever know that she called. And,
4 and we're not just going to call somebody and tell
5 them that, you know, we did something or not.

6 MR. SOMMERS: Right. They might not even
7 know I'm here now. I don't know.

8 MR. COX: You don't think, you don't think
9 they would?

10 MR. SOMMERS: They probably --

11 MR. COX: Well, do you think Kim may call
12 them?

13 MR. SOMMERS: Call you back or --

14 MR. COX: No, no, no. Call your mother or
15 call your grandmother?

16 MR. SOMMERS: Oh, yeah, I'm sure she already
17 has.

18 MR. COX: Okay. Well, then she'll know
19 after we talk to her --

20 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah.

21 MR. COX: -- you know, that you're doing
22 fine.

23 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah. My mom, my mom is
24 probably not as worried as most mothers are because
25 she -- although she raised me very properly and was --

1 MR. COX: Well, I think the big worry, Greg,
2 is that people were hurt in there and people were
3 killed in there, and the identities of those that have
4 been killed and those that have been wounded have not
5 been made public, other than maybe one or two people.

6 And that would be the concern of a mother, I would
7 say. Has something happened to my son? Has something
8 happened to my daughter? And that's why I suggested
9 letting her know. And if you'd rather Kim lets her
10 know, that's fine, you know, but that, that to me
11 would be the concern. Hey, I haven't heard from him,
12 I don't know. There's this big question mark up
13 there.

14 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah, I'm doing fine.

15 MR. COX: Well, we will see that somebody --

16 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah, if you want to, you
17 know, just say on the air or in, in your reports,
18 well, that would be fine.

19 MR. COX: Okay.

20 MR. SOMMERS: And just say, you know, that
21 Greg Sommers --

22 MR. COX: That we spoke to you and you're,
23 you're healthy and well.

24 MR. SOMMERS: I'm very healthy and I'm here
25 on my own free will and --

1 MR. COX: Well, I think you can probably
2 count on it happening then.

3 MR. SOMMERS: Great.

4 MR. COX: As long as you don't have any
5 objection. We're not trying to say anything that --

6 MR. SOMMERS: No.

7 MR. COX: -- that's going to embarrass
8 anybody or, you know, cause any undue concern one way
9 or the other.

10 MR. SOMMERS: Right.

11 MR. COX: And maybe that'll make them feel a
12 little better.

13 MR. SOMMERS: Uh-huh. Where are you guys
14 located at?

15 MR. COX: A long way from where you are.

16 MR. SOMMERS: You guys over at the FTC?

17 MR. COX: At what?

18 MR. SOMMERS: TFTC?

19 MR. COX: I don't know what that is.

20 MR. SOMMERS: That's over at the airport.

21 MR. COX: We're in that area.

22 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah?

23 MR. COX: Yeah. Sure are.

24 MR. SOMMERS: I notice --

25 MR. COX: It's got to be a long ways from

1 | where you are, huh?

2 | MR. SOMMERS: It's about four or five miles.
3 | Which, really, the distance all the way out here, if
4 | you travel it so many times, it seems like, you know,
5 | just a block away.

6 | MR. COX: Really?

7 | MR. SOMMERS: Oh, yeah.

8 | MR. COX: I have no idea where it is. I'm
9 | sure I'll find out before this is all over.

10 | MR. SOMMERS: Yeah.

11 | MR. COX: Where it is.

12 | MR. SOMMERS: Well, you know, I'll tell you,
13 | John, I was -- I'll be honest. I was very
14 | disappointed that they killed my dogs. That was a
15 | shocker, that
16 | was --

17 | MR. COX: Oh, those were your dogs?

18 | MR. SOMMERS: This is very painful. There
19 | were actually days that I was the one that helped
20 | bring, you know --

21 | MR. COX: Raise them?

22 | MR. SOMMERS: -- raise them. And the pups,
23 | they were weeks old.

24 | MR. COX: Breed them? Yeah.

25 | MR. SOMMERS: And they --

1 MR. COX: I didn't see them but I saw
2 pictures of them.

3 MR. SOMMERS: They were six months old when,
4 when they were all killed. And I had to put Fawn, the
5 mother, out of her misery because she had blood
6 streaming all the way from her neck, all the way down
7 the front of her body, and she was just screaming
8 bloody murder. So I just --

8 MR. COX: Yeah.

9 MR. SOMMERS: -- shoot. That was very
10 discouraging. And she had also just had another
11 litter and they were just a week old. What happened
12 to those pups, by the way, John?

13 MR. COX: I have no idea. I, I really have
14 no idea what happened to the pups. Whether the SPC --
15 I think the SPCA is holding them.

16 MR. SOMMERS: 'Cause they were supposed to
17 be the children's.

18 MR. COX: Well, I'm sure they will be,
19 because they're just holding them to make sure they're
20 cared for right, you know, because the children are
21 being kept together.

22 MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum.

23 MR. COX: And, you know, where they're being
24 kept together there may not be a -- in a position to
25

1 take care of all those young pups.

2 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah.

3 MR. COX: 'Cause they are young.

4 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah, they are.

5 MR. COX: You know, but the pups were
6 initially taken to a veterinarian.

7 MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum.

8 MR. COX: And they're not, you know, it's
9 not something where these things are going to be abuse
10 or they're -- people are turning their back on them.
11 They're being cared for. But they are young, huh?

12 MR. SOMMERS: Oh, yeah, they're about --
13 Well, one was three weeks old now.

14 MR. COX: That's young. That's young.

15 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah.

16 MR. COX: Well, hey, what happened, I
17 wasn't, I wasn't here when it happened back on the
18 28th, and what's happened, happened. And there's,
19 there's not too much we can do about the past and we,
20 we've got to look at the future right now and just try
21 and work --

22 MR. SOMMERS: You know, John, you know the
23 reasoning for shooting the dogs?

24 MR. COX: No. I mean, I'm not with ATF and,
25 and I don't -- I wasn't on the scene. I don't know

1 what transpired, whether somebody thought there was a
2 threat. I can't tell you. I have no idea. I need a
3 ouija board to give you the answer.

4 MR. SOMMERS: Oh, don't mess with that
5 stuff.

6 MR. COX: Well, you know, I, I wouldn't want
7 to give you an answer that's not the truth --

8 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah.

9 MR. COX: -- so I just don't know. Are you
10 and the others really prepared to come out of here
11 now? And I'm -- I don't mean prepared to come out of
12 here now, now, but have people told you what to expect
13 when you come out? I mean, 'cause we've gone over it
14 with David and we've gone over it with Steve. And, of
15 course, Wayne's a lawyer, he knows what in the heck to
16 expect when he comes out of here.

17 MR. SOMMERS: Well, I should already,
18 though, know what to expect, because I was involved in
19 that
20 19 --

21 MR. COX: Eighty-eight?

22 MR. SOMMERS: -- 88 up in --

23 MR. COX: Incident?

24 MR. SOMMERS: Incident. And so I've already
25 got a taste of what the justice system is all about.

1 MR. COX: Well, you may have got a taste of
2 a, of a state justice system, but you've -- Unless
3 you've been involved in the federal system, it's like
4 night and day. It's a totally different environment,
5 it's --The courts leave nothing to anybody's question
6 as far as their rights, their constitutional rights,
7 not only to counsel and -- And I told Steve and I'll
8 tell you that there have been at least eight attorneys
9 who are a member of I guess a firm here in, in the
10 Waco area, or affiliated with one, and they're not
11 ACLU attorneys, but it's a similar group of attorneys
12 who have already offered their services to assist you
13 people in there.

14 So I'm sure that you'll get good
15 representation. And I know David's mother's -- on the
16 news anyhow -- indicated that she had already hired
17 either an attorney or two attorneys from the Houston
18 area to, to assist David when he comes out. So --

19 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah.

20 MR. COX: -- you know, the legal profession
21 has, has been watching the news and they're out there
22 and they're, they're going to see that no one's rights
23 or privileges are abused. And, believe me, the
24 federal system is a lot different than a state or
25 local system. It's not the good old boy network.

1 MR. SOMMERS: Well, I'll be honest, this is
2 my point of view, that that's really hard for me to
3 swallow at this point because I'm already seeing that
4 rights are being refused, even at this point, and we
5 haven't been out yet.

6 MR. COX: What's that? What, what's that?

7 MR. SOMMERS: Such as the communication with
8 the --

9 MR. COX: The media?

10 MR. SOMMERS: -- the media.

11 MR. COX: Well, there's no right there.

12 MR. SOMMERS: Why do you say that?

13 MR. COX: There may be a wish there, there
14 may be a desire there, but there's certainly no right,
15 no legal right that the media has to communicate with
16 you or that, that you have to communicate with the
17 media. It's basically our decision to make, who
18 communicates with who to successfully, peacefully
19 resolve this situation. And we don't want people
20 making up stories and --

21 MR. SOMMERS: Well, that's obviously --

22 MR. COX: -- a lot of bizarre communications
23 and speculation. We feel --

24 MR. SOMMERS: Yet, I can sit there and I can
25 listen to the 10:30 --

1 MR. COX: News?

2 MR. SOMMERS: -- news, FBI, the ATF
3 consultation with the media and it's, it's not all
4 together. And it's not all correct.

5 MR. COX: You mean it's not candid?

6 MR. SOMMERS: It's not all correct.

7 MR. COX: Well, you know, if it's not
8 correct, the only way that it will be corrected is
9 when you and the other people come out of there. And,
10 and as we told -- as I told you, as I told David and
11 Steve, and I guess all told we've talked to, I don't
12 know, 68 people in there or something like that, on
13 and off or one way or another, on video, whatever,
14 that you know the road. You walked down the road many
15 times, I guess, carrying those videotapes down there
16 and other things, and, and that's all anybody has to
17 do is walk down the road.

18 MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum.

19 MR. COX: And we're not preventing anybody
20 from walking down the road. And you told me that
21 you're in there on your own volition, and David has
22 told me -- I've had a lot of lengthy discussions with
23 David.

24 MR. SOMMERS: Oh, yeah, he's --

25 MR. COX: And he has told me that when he

1 gets the word he -- He said I'm ready to come out, I
2 am ready to come out of here, I'm ready to leave, and
3 all I have to do is get the word.

4 MR. SOMMERS: That's it.

5 MR. COX: And I said David, I'll give you
6 the word. And that's not the word he's looking for.

6 MR. SOMMERS: No.

7 MR. COX: You know? But that's how anxious
8 I am to see --

9 MR. SOMMERS: Oh, yeah.

10 MR. COX: -- see it resolved.

11 MR. SOMMERS: We're all, we're all anxious
12 to see it --

12 MR. COX: I know you are.

13 MR. SOMMERS: We're just waiting for the
14 word, like you said.

15 MR. COX: I know. And, and I've explained
16 the system to David and to Steve, and I don't lie
17 about it, I don't try to kid anybody about it. And it
18 may not be, it may not be the system that you desire,
19 but it's the best one in the world.

20 MR. SOMMERS: I would add something but I
21 don't think you guys would probably put that in the
22 press meeting tomorrow. I would wish that you would,
23 but --

1 MR. COX: Take your best shot, Greg.

2 MR. SOMMERS: -- I would very doubt it.

3 I'll throw it at you.

4 MR. COX: Go ahead. I'm not thin-skinned.

5 MR. SOMMERS: What's that?

6 MR. COX: I'm not thin-skinned. Go ahead.

7 MR. SOMMERS: Okay. My only request for the
8 world is that they judge not by the sight or by the
9 hearing of their ears, but by the truth, which is not
10 being -- Well, you don't have to say which is not
11 being revealed. That time will tell.

12 MR. COX: And it will, huh, in time?

13 MR. SOMMERS: It will.

14 MR. COX: You know, it's -- We all get our
15 fair day in court, and don't just think that big
16 brother or the government or whatever name you want to
17 tag onto it, because somebody goes to court that means
18 they're guilty. Remember, in this society, a person
19 is presumed innocent until proven guilty. And, and
20 that's the nice thing about this system of ours, isn't
21 it?

22 MR. SOMMERS: But you know that always
23 doesn't work. I mean --

24 MR. COX: Hey, as I was telling Steven
25 tonight, I just --

1 MR. SOMMERS: But, like I'm telling you,
2 John, I'm not real -- That's not what I -- I'd have to
3 say that I'd have to focus -- The judgment that I fear
4 would be God's judgment. And --

5 MR. COX: Hey, we all have to face that
6 someday, don't we?

7 MR. SOMMERS: Exactly.

8 MR. COX: There's, there's no getting around
9 that.

10 MR. SOMMERS: Right.

11 MR. COX: We, we all have to answer to him.
12 And, believe me, if you've done nothing wrong in
13 there, you don't have a problem. If you've done
14 something wrong, you're going to have to answer for
15 it. And, and just like anybody will.

16 MR. SOMMERS: Right.

17 MR. COX: Whether it's me, whether it's you,
18 whether it's anyone. If, if, if someone on our side
19 of the track does something wrong, we have to answer
20 for it.

21 MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum.

22 MR. COX: And if someone in there did
23 something wrong, they will have to answer for it.
24 And, and it all comes out in the end, but I want you
25 to know that, that legal counsel is waiting for you

1 out there. Our judicial system is fair, particularly
2 the federal judicial system, and it's an honorable
3 system. And, and, believe me, I've gone to court
4 before and lost cases, and it isn't because I didn't
5 think I had a good case. I wouldn't have been there.

6 MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum.

7 MR. COX: You know, if I didn't think it was
8 a good case. And, and I wasn't happy when I lost the
9 case, but I watched the defendant walk free. So, I
10 mean, you know, people think it doesn't happen. But
11 the, the 12 jurors decide in, in their mind that a
12 person has done anything wrong, they're on their way,
13 you know?

14 MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum.

15 MR. COX: That's why we've got the best
16 system in the world. And we've got to live with it.
17 Steven come back yet?

18 MR. SOMMERS: No. Actually, I'm still
19 waiting for him. What'd he do, fall asleep? Hold on
20 just a second.

21 MR. COX: Did he abandon you?

22 MR. SOMMERS: Steve? I don't know what he's
23 up to.

24 MR. COX: Well, I know he was going to go
25 check, check on something. And I don't want you to

1 hang up the phone 'cause I don't want to ring it --

2 MR. SOMMERS: I bet you've got a lot of
3 tired guys over there, huh?

4 MR. COX: Yeah, you're right. You're right.
5 There's a lot of people would like to go home.

6 MR. SOMMERS: I feel sorry for all those
7 guys.

8 MR. COX: Believe me, not a whole lot of us
9 from Waco.

10 MR. SOMMERS: Thank God, huh? Thank God.

11 MR. COX: Hey, I'll tell you, the people
12 have been awful nice around here.

13 MR. SOMMERS: Well, that's good.

14 MR. COX: And, and I don't have any problem
15 with the people. And I, I don't know if you've,
16 you've ever had any other dealings with law
17 enforcement other than that incident.

18 MR. SOMMERS: I'm a pretty good natured guy.

19 MR. COX: But I've met the sheriff here and
20 he seems to be just a nice fellow, pretty easy going
21 fellow. Kind of a grandfatherly type that you, you
22 picture somebody sitting on his knee.

23 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah. Hey, here's Steve.

24 MR. COX: Good.

25 MR. SOMMERS: He just walked in.

1 MR. COX: It's been a pleasure talking to
2 you.

3 MR. SOMMERS: You too, John, and you take
4 care of yourself.

5 MR. COX: Well, I'll see you in a day or
6 two.

7 MR. SOMMERS: All righty, John.

8 MR. COX: Okay.

9 MR. SOMMERS: Bye-bye.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, I'll tell you, I am so
11 tired, I'm trying to -- I, I finally got to sit down
12 with him for the last few minutes there.

13 MR. COX: Good. I mean, it's good that you
14 did.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I've been talking to a
16 lot of people all day long and I didn't really want to
17 say much to you until I really knew more.

18 MR. COX: Okay.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: But after talking with him,
20 I think there may be even some people coming out
21 tomorrow.

22 MR. COX: Okay. Okay.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: And we just wanted -- He
24 wants to make sure that, you know, that --

25 MR. COX: Okay.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: So he says let them know.
2 He says we'll be talking to them tomorrow and as far -
3 - He says if you want to go even in the slightest, go
4 ahead. You don't need to wait. So he told them clear
5 and I told them, also, and --

6 MR. COX: Okay. You got any idea who might
7 be coming out tomorrow?

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Actually, apparently, a
9 couple people must have came and talked to him today
10 when I was --

11 MR. COX: Okay.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- at the other end of the
13 building, because he was just telling me he needs to
14 talk to them again. And apparently, he's actually
15 encouraged them to go.

16 MR. COX: You got any idea who?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I have any idea, but --

18 MR. COX: What I'm looking for is something
19 positive to tell somebody.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Well, it sounds like
21 there's anyway three of them and they're all --
22 they're guys.

23 MR. COX: Three guys?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, three guys.

25 MR. COX: Do, do you have idea who they are?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think one --

2 MR. COX: I'd like to give some names to --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I think, I think one
4 of them is Oliver Guyarfus. I think that was one of
5 them he mentioned.

6 MR. COX: Okay.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I don't -- It seems
8 like -- He didn't really say who the other one was,
9 but --

10 MR. COX: Didn't he have a relative in
11 there, too?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, he's got a sister here.

13 MR. COX: Do you think she may be coming
14 with him?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: So far, you know, nothing --
16 I mean, I've asked a lot of people, as you can
17 imagine, in the last, you know, four or five, six,
18 seven days. I daily ask people --

19 MR. COX: Who do you think the other two
20 guys might be?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: He didn't say and so, I
22 mean, I had a feeling that it could be Oliver. I had
23 a feeling, so I kind of knew right along that he might
24 want to. And I've encouraged him. I says, you know,
25 if you really want to, don't let anything keep you. I

1 mean, you know, if you think that's the best thing,
2 well, you know, go ahead and do that and we'll help
3 you work it out. And I told him I've been talking
4 with you guys and if he'd like he can talk with you,
and he says well --

5 MR. COX: Do you think he'd like to?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think so.

7 MR. COX: Okay.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think so. And so I'm
9 going to be encouraging him right along tomorrow then
10 when I get up and --

11 MR. COX: Do you think I can talk to him
12 tonight?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: They told me he went and he
14 laid down I guess a couple hours ago, so --

15 MR. COX: You're not, you're not stroking me
16 now, are you, Steve?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, not, not in the --
18 Hey, John, that is a serious thing.

19 MR. COX: Okay. I just want to be sure now.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not in the least. When
21 you're asking me a name, that's the person who did
22 bring it up. And, apparently -- I didn't know it, I
23 didn't realize, though, he had talked with David about
24 it, but I guess he did.
25

1 MR. COX: Okay.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: He just called me in there
3 and said Steve, let John know. And that was apart
4 from you asking or saying anything.

5 MR. COX: That's great.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I remember he said, he
7 says let me talk to the other two in the morning, he
8 says but I think there's about three of them, there
9 could even be more.

10 MR. COX: Well, let me tell you, I
11 appreciate what you're doing, I really do. You've
12 been up late, you've had a long day on the phone,
13 you've talked to a lot of people, but you've --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: My voice is hoarse because I
15 have talked to a lot of these people. And, you know,
16 I don't -- I've told them don't hang back if there's
17 at all a chance you want to leave. I mean, take it
18 serious and I'll help, help you as much as I can and -

19 MR. COX: Let me ask you one other thing,
20 and we'll call it a night, huh?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure.

22 MR. COX: What about the, the identity of
23 the little girl and the other people?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I asked him about that and
25 he says -- Apparently, he wants to talk to you about

1 that.

2 MR. COX: All right.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: He says that's kind of his
4 business, he acted like, instead of mine and --

5 MR. COX: That's fine. I don't have a
6 problem with that.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. And I guess it has to
8 do with Perry Jones and I don't know what he all has
9 in mind.

10 MR. COX: Well, he may want, want to get in
11 a little dialogue about it.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Probably. I figure probably
13 that's what it'll be. So --

14 MR. COX: Hey, you get a good night's sleep.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

16 MR. COX: Okay? And thank you very much for
17 --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, and I'll be talking --

19 MR. COX: -- everything you've done this
20 evening.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: No problem. In fact, you
22 know, I'll keep on working the best I can.

23 MR. COX: Good talking to you. It's been a
24 few days, huh?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Probably be talking

1 to you tomorrow night, huh?

2 MR. COX: Well, you never know.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Never know. Okay.

4 MR. COX: Okay.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, take care.

6 MR. COX: Okay.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, bye.

8 MR. COX: Bye-bye.

9 * * * * *

10 MR. COX: Hello?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello. Is this John?

12 MR. COX: Yeah, Steve. Go ahead.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. The reason I'm
14 calling is I have --

15 MR. COX: I thought you'd be sound asleep.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: I was hoping to be. I had a
17 couple of guys come and wake me up just now.

18 MR. COX: Okay.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: They said there is someone
20 that's right beside the building, the gymnasium.
21 There's someone down -- There's a silver travel-all
22 type trailer, one of those Air Streams, of which
23 there's a guy that is wandering around there or
24 snooping or something around that trailer.

25 MR. COX: Okay. The Air, the Air Stream?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

2 MR. COX: Want me to check on it and call
3 you back?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Please do.

5 MR. COX: Okay, I'll call you right back.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, thank you.

7 MR. COX: You bet.

8 * * * * *

9 (Telephone dialed and rings one time.)

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

11 MR. COX: Hey, Steve.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah?

13 MR. COX: Talked to the guy that's in charge
14 up at that end and he said absolutely not. The only
15 people that we have up there that I guess any of your
16 people would see would be in one of the Bradleys.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's what I would
18 expect, anyway.

19 MR. COX: And he said there is no way
20 because of the, the good rapport that we had going
21 tonight and, and the potential of things in the
22 morning -- We're not going to try and queer something.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, I'm going to trust
24 that. I'm going to, I'm going to just believe that
25 these guys did not see what they think they saw then.

1 MR. COX: That's all I can tell you.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Maybe they, maybe they saw a
3 dog or something.

4 MR. COX: I don't know.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm going to leave it at
6 that.

7 MR. COX: Okay, you get a good night's
8 sleep.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Thanks. Talk to you later.

10 MR. COX: Thanks for calling.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure.

12 MR. COX: Appreciate your concern.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Bye.

14 MR. COX: Uh-huh.

15 * * * * *

16 (Telephone dialed and rings three times.)

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Steve?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Good morning.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: What time is it?

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Let me check.

23 Seven twenty-five.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, boy.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Did you get some

1 sleep last night?

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, not much at all, because
3 after talking with John Cox, I just laid down and --

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Went right out?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I did, but then they
6 came and reported someone nearby the trailer. We took
7 care of that, I finally turned in, it was three or
8 later, and -- Anyway.

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: So you're a
10 little hurting?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I'm tired.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Oh, boy. Well,
13 obviously, you haven't had a chance to see the
14 condition of the David at this point, so --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. No, no.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: How you feeling,
17 other than beat?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, beat, yeah.

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: A little beat.
20 Probably big --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, yeah.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: -- big time.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: How about talking to me just
24 after nine?

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Okay. Sounds

1 good. Sounds good.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, thanks a lot, John.

3 JOHN: Okay.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Bye-bye.

* * * * *

5 (Telephone dialed and rings two times.)

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

7 JOHN: Good morning, Steve.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good morning.

9 JOHN: How are you this morning?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not, not well.

11 JOHN: Not well?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I mean, from the first
13 phone call, of course, everything -- nothing's slowed
14 down since then.

15 JOHN: Oh, what's been going on.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: People running around, you
17 know, children with breakfast and all the rest and one
18 thing after another. I don't know.

19 JOHN: Got everybody fed?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, to tell you the truth,
21 I'm so tired I don't know what I'm doing.

22 JOHN: Not an easy night, huh?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, it's, it's
24 phone calls through the night and then I had some
25

1 questions. Somebody's always up and around, it seems.

2 JOHN: Can't get a good night's sleep?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not, not last night.

4 JOHN: Yeah, yeah. Sounds like you're still
5 really groggy.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I am.

7 JOHN: I know, I know. So what's the
8 communications inside? Anything with David or has
9 he --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. In fact, they've been
11 knocking at his door for the past hour and without
12 success, so

13 JOHN: Is that the nurses or --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: They were knocking at his
15 door about having worship or something, and I guess
16 he's not answered, so --

17 JOHN: Maybe he's too, maybe he's too ill.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. I checked on him
19 earlier, he was okay. It's -- I guess he -- I think
20 he's sleeping. He probably wants to sleep.

21 JOHN: Just needs some more rest, huh?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

23 JOHN: Has his headache gone or whatever?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think so.

25 JOHN: Yeah?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think he's -- that's
2 disappeared now.

3 JOHN: Yeah. How you feeling physically, I
4 mean other than tired?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: I feel pretty good other
6 than --

7 JOHN: Good.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- just being a little worn
9 out.

10 JOHN: Yeah. You sound worn out, you know?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

12 JOHN: I can hear it in your voice. I can
13 hear it in your voice, and there's a baby in the
14 background there.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Huh?

16 JOHN: There's a little baby in the
17 background.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, there's a little,
19 little Mayanah bird right here.

20 JOHN: Oh, a little Mayanah bird.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

22 JOHN: I know who that is.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

24 JOHN: I can tell you who that is. How's
25 she, how's she holding up?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Real good.

2 JOHN: Yeah?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: She's a two-year-old and she
4 can talk like you wouldn't believe.

5 JOHN: Nonstop, right?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Nonstop.

7 JOHN: Fast forward. That's great. So,
8 well, the press conference will be at the usual --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

10 JOHN: -- 10:30, as we know.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

12 JOHN: Everything standard procedure.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 JOHN: Now, what you talked about last
15 night, three men coming out this morning --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. That's the way it
17 was left with, with John.

18 JOHN: Let's get them out. And we're all,
19 we're all ready to go on that.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's what we're
21 going to be working on. In fact, in the last couple
22 days -- You know, I didn't want to say anything in
23 advance because half the time someone might bring it
24 up and then they don't want to. You know what I mean?

25 JOHN: Ummm.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: So I was saying well, look,
2 if you want to, it's no problem, I've been talking to
3 these guys and they've given me some -- a little
4 procedure and you can follow that and don't have to be
5 worried, and so on. You know, last night when I was
6 talking to him, he -- I said well, what do you want?
7 He says well, try to get them -- If they want to go,
8 if they even bring it up, you know, encourage them to
9 go.

9 JOHN: Great. Great.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: So I'm going to be talking
11 to him here in a little bit.

12 JOHN: Great.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Apparently, some of them
14 were up late last night, so they're sleeping I guess
15 kind of late this morning.

16 JOHN: Well, let's look forward to doing
17 that this morning.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, we'll be working on
19 that.

20 JOHN: All right. Have you spoken to any
21 of -- You haven't spoken, obviously, just getting up,
22 so you haven't spoken to the people?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

24 JOHN: All right. It'll be the same, just
25

1 like we discussed yesterday. Come down the road and
2 real simple.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. Okay.

4 JOHN: As I understand, one's name -- one
5 gentleman's name is Oliver?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

7 JOHN: And who are the other two gentlemen?

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: He didn't -- I, I knew him.
9 See, I'd talked to him myself. And when David
10 mentioned the other two, I wasn't too sure who he
11 meant. And it was so late last -- I think when I last
12 talked to John it was 2, 3 in the morning.

13 JOHN: Um-hum. Um-hum.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I told him some time
15 this morning I'd know who they all were or who wanted
16 -- or who else might want to go even.

17 JOHN: Oh, great. Well --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: So --

19 JOHN: Yeah, you and I will work on that.
20 And if you could check --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

22 JOHN: -- check on who the others are,
23 that'd be helpful. And we'll --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 JOHN: -- get everybody going.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

2 JOHN: Great.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: I've got to -- I've still
4 got to ask this guy, because, you know, he's been kind
5 of like wishy-washy before. So I --

6 JOHN: Oliver?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. First he wants to go,
8 first he says -- I says well -- You know, like what I
9 do every day is does anybody want to go? You know, I
10 go around and I say now -- Like even on the, the
11 video, you know, I asked them a number of times. So
12 like with him, he says well, you know, I've given it
13 some thought. And I says well, look, if you want to -
14 - That's what I was telling him yesterday. Look, if
15 you want to go, it's not, you know, don't be
16 concerned. You know, do what you think best.

17 JOHN: What did he say to that?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's when he started
19 saying well, okay, let me, let me think about it. To
20 me, you know, it's like he probably wants to go then.
21 I don't know.

22 JOHN: Yeah. Well --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: So I mentioned it to David
24 and David says well, yeah, tell him to go ahead and go
25 then. And that's what, what I was telling John last

1 night.

2 JOHN: Well, that's good. It sounds like,
3 you know, you're really helping those people. I mean,
4 you personally are really doing a lot for them.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, I keep --
6 You know, they're always telling me well, they were
7 just waiting and all that, and I says well, look, you
8 know, I said -- Well, like I told you, you know, they
9 have to answer for themselves and if they have an
10 urge, if they have a feeling to go, you know, it's
11 okay. It's between them and their choices. So --

12 JOHN: Fine, fine. Well, if you can contact
13 the other, the other two or any others --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what I'm going to be
15 trying to do.

16 JOHN: Okay. How, how should we leave it
17 then? That --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, what I'm going to do,
19 like right now David, he's not awake. So I wanted to
20 ask David who he was talking to, 'cause I'm not sure.

21 JOHN: Um-hum.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: The only one that I had
23 found out was Oliver, and then he told me the same.
24 When I mentioned Oliver to him, he says well, you
25 know, tell him. And so I did, I told him well, go

1 ahead, you know, if want to. So he did mention, he
2 says there's probably a couple more. And at that
3 time, he went back to sleep again.

4 JOHN: After that, after that conversation,
5 huh?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I mean, yesterday he
7 was like sleeping most of the day. He'd come out for
8 just, you know, wake up for minutes and then go back
9 to sleep again.

10 JOHN: I remember that. I remember that.
11 He was like kind of going in and out, so to speak.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

13 JOHN: Of, of consciousness. Yeah.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

15 JOHN: Yeah. Well, if you can, can get up
16 and contact Oliver and the other gentlemen that can go
17 with him, you know, that'll be great.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I'll get back with you
19 as soon as I've got something going here.

20 JOHN: All right. You want to give me a
21 buzz back or I'll give you --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

23 JOHN: As usual, we'll --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 JOHN: -- get back and forth in contact.

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MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

JOHN: Thanks a lot, Steve.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure. Okay, bye.

JOHN: Bye-bye.

* * * * *

(Telephone dialed and rings three times.)

MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

JOHN: Good morning.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Good morning.

JOHN: You sound better.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I've been running around here, trying to talk to a few people here, and I went and talked to Oliver and he got a little annoyed with me. He says don't push me. He says I want to talk to David first. And I says well, okay, just relax and --

JOHN: Sure, that's fine. That's fine.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

JOHN: Did he talk to David or --

MR. SCHNEIDER: Not yet.

JOHN: Not yet.

MR. SCHNEIDER: He's sleeping. And so I went and knocked at the door and I said let me see, and he hasn't answer. A couple other people knocked at the door, so I guess I'll leave him be for a few

1 minutes yet and keep on trying.

2 JOHN: Sure, sure. Who are the other
3 gentlemen, Steve?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I asked him and -- 'cause I
5 never really knew. It was David that mentioned it to
6 me for the first time last night when I was talking to
7 John Cox.

8 JOHN: Right.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: And then he fell asleep on
10 me. When I went in there, I says well, can you tell
11 me who they are, and then he turned over, went back to
12 sleep.

13 JOHN: Hmmm.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: So I thought this morning
15 right away I'd be talking with him. I didn't think --
16 I thought he'd be awake. About three or four days ago
17 he'd be awake at this time. So --

18 JOHN: Oh, yeah.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yesterday and the day
20 before, I don't know, it's the first time he's been
21 acting kind of like sick and not talking so much.

22 JOHN: Hmm. Have you taken his blood
23 pressure?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: In truth, I really don't
25 know. I don't -- I'm not certain, 'cause I saw the

1 nurses go in there, I think it was yesterday morning I
2 think it was, but since then I don't know. I don't
3 think so.

4 JOHN: Well, maybe we can get his blood
5 pressure taken. Do you know, do you know if they were
6 doing it before or what the nurses -- or if they
7 stopped doing it?

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, they -- Apparently, they
9 went in, like I said, yesterday morning, and I know
10 they were doing it up until then, but I'm not certain
11 about, you know, like through the day or toward the
12 evening. I don't think so.

13 JOHN: Oh, okay. 'Cause somebody said if we
14 sent in a blood pressure thing that they would, you
15 know, make sure he got a good reading on it.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Yeah, you did.

17 JOHN: Yeah. Good. Okay, well, then they
18 can use that and see if he's okay.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

20 JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I was -- All this time
22 I'm in there, spent a little time there talking with
23 Oliver and, boy, I don't know, it's almost like he's -
24 -he becomes like wishy-washy or something. And -- But
25 he didn't say no, he didn't. He says, he says well,

1 just, just wait. He goes like that to me. He says I
2 want to talk to David first. And I says well, yeah,
3 that's all right.

4 JOHN: Yeah, yeah. Is Oliver a black man or
5 a white man?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, he's white.

7 JOHN: He's a white man? Okay.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

9 JOHN: Oh, good, good. Well, we'll have the
10 press conference at, you know, the standard time.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. What time do you have
12 there?

13 JOHN: Okay, let me just check my watch.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

15 JOHN: I've got 10:04.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Ten oh four?

17 JOHN: Ten oh four, yeah.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh.

19 JOHN: Coming up to 10:05. So well, we'll
20 just keep working together.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

22 JOHN: Things are going good.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. I stopped to talk
24 to, to Wayne, also, for a minute there.

25 JOHN: Oh.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I asked him again to
2 take a look in, into the procedure for helping some of
3 these people understand, so --

4 JOHN: Oh, excellent, excellent. 'Cause,
5 you know, Wayne, Wayne should understand federal
6 procedure and -- And, of course, if he hasn't, hasn't
7 done that much work in federal court --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't think he has, to be
9 honest.

10 JOHN: -- I'll be happy to run down the
11 procedure with you, you know.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

13 JOHN: It's, it's, it's not terribly complex
14 at all.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

16 JOHN: You know, it's actually relatively
17 simple. It's -- You come out, like I explained to a
18 lot of people. When you come out, you're interviewed,
19 they take your picture and they take your
20 fingerprints, all of which is extremely painless,
21 nothing to it.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

23 JOHN: You go down and then the next thing
24 would be an appearance before what's called the United
25 States Magistrate, and that's very simply a judge.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

2 JOHN: And he advises of the charges and
3 sets the bond. And then, under the federal system,
4 depending on what the bond is, there's a couple of
5 types, let's say they can present 10 percent to the
6 clerk of the court. The clerk of the court stamps the
7 papers that the bond's been posted and it's out on
8 bond, so --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

9 JOHN: You know, it's not a very complex
10 procedure.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

12 JOHN: From 10 days from that they set
13 what's called a hearing and that's it. And then -- So
14 it's not a very involved process, but I'll be happy to
15 go over it with you --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

16 JOHN: -- in more detail if you'd like.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

18 JOHN: So you're going to watch the press
19 conference?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, yes.

20 JOHN: Okay. And then, as I understand it
21 now, Oliver is going to talk to David. Is that -- Was
22 that going to be --

23

24

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes. He wants to talk to
2 David. He said to me -- I started talking to him a
3 little bit and I said well, you know, if you'd like,
4 you know, I've been talking with John on the phone and
5 if you'd like to have any questions answered he'd be
6 happy to answer them for you.

7 JOHN: Be more than pleased to answer --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

9 JOHN: -- any questions that he has or, you
10 know, and sometimes it, it's difficult in one's mind -
11 -Like you and I went over things yesterday, and if you
12 can clarify things, it's a lot easier. So I'll be
13 more than happy to talk to him.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

15 JOHN: Yeah.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: I told him that already and
17 I thought I was getting somewhere with him, and then I
18 just said a few more things about some of the
19 discussions about, you know, I mean, some of the
20 things that you alleviated, you know, about what the
21 procedure'd be and -- Then he -- All of a sudden, he
22 just says well, no, no, just don't push me, he said.
23 And I says well, I'm not, I said I'm not, I just
24 wanted to help you understand.

25 JOHN: Sure.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: He says -- Then he said to
2 me well, I want to, I want to talk to David and I says
3 well --

4 JOHN: Sure.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I think he's sleeping
6 yet. And he says well, I want to talk to him.

7 JOHN: Sure.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: So I said well, just --
9 Okay, well, go ahead and do that then. And I says
10 well, you know where you can find me, and I, I told
11 him I would be communicating throughout the day with
12 you guys.

13 JOHN: Absolutely. Well, it's a big step
14 forward and I think we're making some fantastic
15 progress --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

17 JOHN: -- is really what it is. And David
18 is still kind of in a resting --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I just had somebody,
20 in fact, go check again. Every now and then they
21 might -- they'll open -- they'll tap at the door, they
22 open it and just look -- kind of crack the door, and I
23 guess he's still sleeping.

24 JOHN: Um-hum. Um-hum.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Apparently, after I turned

1 in, he was awake I guess, they told me, for an hour or
2 two.

3 JOHN: Oh, is that right?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

5 JOHN: Huh. Geez, it sounds like some kind
6 of medical problem. You know, it just may be it's
7 taken a lot of that energy out of him.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's why as soon as he
9 wakes I want to -- I definitely want to sit down and
10 talk with him to see what, what's been happening with
11 him physically and, and I want to -- I'll report that
12 to you.

13 JOHN: Yeah, good.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: See if we can't get a nurse
15 in there and --

16 JOHN: Yeah, you might want to double check
17 those BP or blood pressure readings --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

19 JOHN: -- and make they're accurate. And
20 let's make sure nothing's happening to him.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

22 JOHN: And if it is, we can make sure
23 together that nothing does happen, so --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 JOHN: -- maybe we can get Julie in or one

1 of those ladies in there and let that --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. I'll, I'll try to
3 see if I can't even get one of them on the phone maybe
4 after we've --

5 JOHN: Okay.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- spent some time with him.

7 JOHN: Great. Yeah, that'd be fine. And,
8 and then we can coordinate seeing that he's okay.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

10 JOHN: Great. Thanks a lot, Steve.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure. And I'll -- Right
12 after that, I'll talk to you.

13 JOHN: I'll talk to you.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, bye.

15 JOHN: Bye-bye.

21 complete the dial.

23 can't be in two places at one time, but if you'll
24 leave your name and number and the --

25 (Telephone dialed and rings six times.)

1 RACHEL: Hello?

2 JOHN: Good morning.

3 RACHEL: Good morning.

4 JOHN: This is John.

5 RACHEL: Hello.

6 JOHN: Who's this?

7 RACHEL: Rachel.

8 JOHN: Hi, Rachel.

9 RACHEL: Hi.

10 JOHN: Is Steve around?

11 RACHEL: Just a minute. I'll have to find
him, I guess.

12 JOHN: How's, how's David feeling?

13 RACHEL: I'm not exactly sure.

14 JOHN: I heard he's trying to get a lot of
sleep, rest?

15 RACHEL: Yeah, I think he's resting, so I
haven't --

16 JOHN: Good, good. Well, that'll, that'll,
17 you know, that'll make him feel better sooner than if
18 he loses energy.

19 RACHEL: Um-hum.

20 JOHN: So yeah, if you could find Steve,
21 that'd be fine.

22 RACHEL: Okay.

2 RACHEL: Hold on.

4 JOHN: Rachel?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

7 JOHN: Good morning again.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good morning.

9 JOHN: You sound a lot, lot brighter.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, believe me, I am.

11 JOHN: What's been going on.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I, I went to try to
13 find out a little bit more from Oliver, and he didn't
14 really want to talk to me yet, he said. And I says
15 well, okay. And so then I went and tried to find out
16 who the others might be, and I, I think I know, but
17 they didn't really want to talk to me, either. So
18 then what I've been doing, just as of the last, oh, 15
19 minutes or so, is I was talking to the Israeli guy
20 that's here and I was --

21 JOHN: Pablo Cohen?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, exactly. And I was
23 asking him if I couldn't at least interview him and
24 film him and so forth. So he said he might even give
25 me up to an hour, so I was just going to get ready, in

1 the process of start filming him and, and get as much
2 information as I can.

3 JOHN: Sure. Well, do you know who the
4 other gentlemen are?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I think -- I'm not
6 certain.

7 JOHN: Sure, I know.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, there's one I'm, I'm

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I do, but wait, let's wait -

20 you know, he'd be -- definitely would be -- I might
21 make it worse, you know, if it wasn't. It'd make it
worse for me trying to help or --

14 be interested, from what I understand, but no one else

16 those two, apparently, and him.

17 JOHN: Oh, okay.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: And then the first I knew of
19 it was last night when I was talking to John Cox. I
20 went in to see how he was and that's when he told me,
21 tell John that there may be three coming out tomorrow.

22 And I know then -- I knew then that David was
23 definitely trying to encourage them to do that even.

24 JOHN: Oh, David was, huh?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, yes.

1 JOHN: Oh.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Because, apparently -- I
3 don't know if it's because they had let him think at a
4 time or two that they were thinking about it. See, if
5 anybody even thinks about it or, or indicates some way
6 that they want to, he'll actually encourage them to do
7 so.

8 JOHN: Encourage them to go?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, exactly. See, for him
10 it's a thing between him and his God. But, you know,
11 they of course -- No one talks to these others. And
12 then if they show -- It shows that they, they don't
13 totally maybe trust or something. He says in that
14 case, you know, well, why stay then, you know? Why
15 not resolve this -- In fact, he himself, he was
16 telling
17 me -- Like I was saying to John Cox last night that he
18 wanted and planned on walking out that Tuesday. And
19 the procedure, nothing's changed except for himself.
20 He's got to wait, he says, 'cause, oh, for the past at
21 least -- it's been 12 years, he's had communication as
22 he has from, you know, from the same source.

23 JOHN: Um-hum.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: So that's -- You know, this
25 gets back to that one thing.

1 JOHN: Sure.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: So even in talking to these
3 people, that's, that's one of the first things that
4 come up when I talk to them. It's one of the first
5 things. So that's what makes it more difficult, of
6 course.

6 JOHN: I understand that, of course.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

8 JOHN: Do, do, do you have any idea what
9 Oliver's possible objections are at this point?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: I would like to know myself,
11 'cause I'm very curious. But he hasn't -- He, he's
12 got a different kind of an attitude, where -- He's a
13 young guy. He's about, oh, 19, 20. I guess he's 19.
14 And he can get a little snappy, you know, if I, if I
15 pursue it too much.

15 JOHN: Yeah.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I'm waiting to talk to
17 him a little more, but, apparently, he, he keeps on
18 implying he wants to talk to David first, so --

18 JOHN: He wants to speak to David first?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. See, I mean, that's
20 the whole thing. That's the way it is with a lot of
21 these people. It's -- See, a lot of times some --
