They're going to go ahead and lay this wire so that we don't have anymore unwanted visitors, so to speak, coming in, like Mr. Amen and Alaniz and some of these people.

But it'll also assist in an orderly exit route for you all when you come out. You'll come out the front door, just as we talked before, turn to your left and proceed down that driveway. That exit will still be open to you. It's been open to you since day one. Okay, that'll continue to be open to you. What they're going to do is they're just going to bring some wire in and it'll basically ring the immediate vicinity of the, of the buildings.

It's not going to encroach on your buildings at all or, or your position inside. But what we'll be

able to do then is be able to control access into the facility so that it's, it's going to be very closely monitored. The rangers are going to be involved in the, in the crime scene aspect and the supervision of any of the crime scene search teams. They'll all be coming through that -- through a singular point of entry. Okay? So when that's, when that's laid, that resolves any kind of concern or issue as far as possibility of somebody coming in the back unobserved or whatever the situation might be, or the sides or whatever. The front, for that matter. In addition to that, they're also going to bring in some metal detectors so that when, when you all are coming out you'll be able to walk through metal detectors.

They'll be able to determine, you know, that nobody's got anything on them and vice versa. When the search teams in the long run are going in, nobody's going to be bringing in anything that's not inventoried, which was a concern that you and Wayne had made earlier, the possibility of, you know --

STEVE: Um-hum.

BYRON: -- something being introduced to the crime scene that wasn't there before. Well, that's not going to be a problem. We're ensuring that for your, for your safety, to begin with, but also for

the, the accurate securing of the crime scene and what's, what's there is exactly what's there. Nothing, nothing additional introduced and it won't be 3 unchanged or anything like that. And, again, it, it 4 facilitates you all coming out. They're also going to 5 put -- I think we had decided before that the actual 6 point of exchange, where you'll be taken into custody, 7 will be down that road about the place where you and I 8 had our face-to-face. Okay? So at that point, at that location, I think they said that's a little bit further than where the metal detectors will be, and 10 they'll also set up a, a Red Cross-type flag, 11 something that you all can visualize where you're 12 walking to, where there'll be an orderly transition 13 into a, into a custodial-type situation. 14 And then they'll be searched and moved on. There's really nothing different. We're just pre-15 establishing anticipating an orderly transition out of 16 there, the points that you all will be able to, to 17 visualize so that it won't be -- you won't have as 18 much of a heightened level of anxiety as to what's 19 going to go on. So, hopefully, it'll give you peace 20 of mind. But I wanted to explain that to you. STEVE: Well, the truth is, you know, it 21

doesn't matter to me the way. You know, I mean, if I

were -- if something happened to me between here and 2 there or in the jail or in the process, Byron, you've got to know it, none of that bothers me.
