2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- said that, you know, it's
3 not -- I'm telling you that that day people were
4 preparing to go study --

5 JOHN: Uh-huh.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and all of a sudden
7 bingo-bango and there's, there's some of the proof
8 right there. I'm glad the Texas Rangers in the one
9 instance probably took her Bible to take a look at
10 that, but I hope they give it back.

11 JOHN: Well, I'm sure they will at some
12 point.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, but I can --

14 JOHN: You know?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- understand why they would
16 take that. I think that's pretty good evidence
17 myself.

18 JOHN: It may be, it may be. See, now that
19 you're thinking about it a little bit --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, no, no, I mean, come
21 on, we're, we're both aware of something like that.
22 I'm tired. I'm almost here babbling here. I'm
23 wearing out. I'm about ready to fall asleep in the
24 chair.

25 JOHN: Are you getting real tired?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I'll continue on.

2 JOHN: Want me to, want me to send a couple
3 people up there to, to help you on down the road?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I think you're
5 probably right, that's probably what I need.

6 JOHN: (Laughter)

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Just put me in the Holiday
8 Inn there and I'll talk to anybody.

9 JOHN: Hey, we'll, we'll make a room
10 available. You know that don't you?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. For what, about 10
12 minutes?

13 JOHN: No, no, no.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Anyway --

15 JOHN: We'll have a long chat. How's Judy
16 doing today?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Apparently she's doing
18 better.

19 JOHN: Is she?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Finger, well of course needs
21 attention --

22 JOHN: Yeah.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and that it's probably
24 broke. It's --

25 JOHN: -- you, you can't get the word to her

1 to get that medical help, huh?

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: She's, she's very mule-
3 headed.

4 JOHN: (Laughter) You being kind?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I am.

6 JOHN: (Laughter)

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, you know, she's got
8 something in mind and I've given up --

9 JOHN: Yeah.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- on trying to change her
11 mind over any issue to do with spiritual things
12 especially.

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, see, I was talking to
15 her today and she said, she said, look, Steve, I'm
16 still watching like everybody else is and I don't like
17 this up and down roller coaster ride that seems to be
18 what's given to us. And I says I understand. I says
19 don't you think me more than anyone being on the phone
20 morning, noon and night. I mean, dealing with all
21 these personalities like Byron and, and Dick and
22 John-3, yourself. I mean, some of these guys --

23 JOHN: Yeah.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- they all mean well, they
25 all have a different perspective or their

1 personalities (indiscernible).

2 JOHN: That's true.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, the personalities
4 are such where maybe the commanders want to use them
5 more because they're more coercive or applying more
6 pressure. Of course, you know like I told you, as
7 salespeople, one guy comes on hard, another soft.
8 You're --

9 JOHN: Uh-huh.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you're the guy that's
11 playing the softie role and whether it's part of the -

12 JOHN: I'm just easy to -- easy, huh?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- whether, whether it's
14 part, whether it's part of the ball game or not I
15 still appreciate it whether it's their planned way of
16 doing things. You know, I, I appreciate it, I can
17 handle it. But Byron as much as he has good
18 intentions, I can't handle that, I really can't. I
19 don't know how many human beings can stand there and
20 just hear somebody for so long and not being able to
21 react and, and you know, it's like going around and
22 around and around. He knows that and even though he,
23 he probably hears himself as making some very good
24 points and the rest --

25 JOHN: Let me tell you, he's as well meaning

1 as anyone out here.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know he is, I know he is.

3 JOHN: He is as, as dedicated --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- I liked Byron from the
5 time I, I met him and, and talked to him on the phone.

6 JOHN: Well, you, you talked to him out,
7 outside face-to-face.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: But -- dealing with issues
9 like this in the manner that they are and because of
10 what happened with the damage of more property and the
11 telephones lines and the music and all that as a
12 reaction to our good will that we, we thought we were
13 showing and were increasing on, I mean that's what I'm
14 trying to tell him. You can't say well, today's a new
15 day when there's a pattern that's been shown clearly
16 to us that's contrary to what the, the kindness --
17 the, the way you speak to us.

18 JOHN: Hey, we can both kick that around
19 though.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, but I'm telling you --

21 JOHN: I can, I can kick it -- my turn --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- no, no, no --

23 JOHN: Hey, my turn for a minute.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, wait, John, let me
25 just --

1 JOHN: We can kick it around that --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: But let me finish by

3 saying -- John --

4 JOHN: -- that David made a promise and --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- let me finish.

6 JOHN: -- went back on it, that Heather came

7 out --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, let me finish.

9 JOHN: -- and no one came out --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, John.

11 JOHN: -- for six days after she came out.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm telling you he's, he's
13 so offended that you might have to come in and just
14 run the building over right now.

15 JOHN: Well, what have we told you?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, then I guess that's
17 what you got to do.

18 JOHN: What have we told you?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm telling you --

20 JOHN: That we don't want to do that.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- well, I'm glad to hear
22 it because I would like to see it continue as it was
23 with you, I and Dolan, and then that's what he's so
24 mad about, he -- and he's saying what is going -- what
25 are they doing, what are they trying to say.

1 JOHN: What are we trying to say, or, or
2 what are the --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: You, you and I and him and
4 Dolan were working this thing out and it was
5 increasing and looking better.

6 JOHN: Uh-huh.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: And then the kind of
8 response that happened the night before yesterday last
9 night.

10 JOHN: Well, what about today? How come
11 nothing happened during the day today?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: He, he -- well, number one,
13 we didn't even have any communication. After I was
14 trying to communicate with Byron --

15 JOHN: Uh-huh.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and he wanted to do all
17 the talking, and then he was (indiscernible).

18 JOHN: Yeah, but that gave David plenty of
19 time to pray.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't know what David was
21 doing. He might have been. As far as I'm concerned I
22 don't know.

23 JOHN: Steven, Steven. You got a pretty
24 good idea of what David's doing.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I don't, honestly. The

1 | guy does pray. He's in his room. I really don't know
2 | (indiscernible).

3 | JOHN: Yeah, but you can't be a mile away
4 | from his room.

5 | MR. SCHNEIDER: A what?

6 | JOHN: You can't be a mile away from his
7 | room. You --

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: A mile away from his room?

9 | JOHN: You know, you're in close proximity I
10 | should presume.

11 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, no, there are times
12 | you just -- you leave him alone, and there are times
13 | I'll knock and call his name, if he doesn't answer I
14 | respect it. I mean, whatever -- if he's sleeping or
15 | whatever else -- like last night in behalf of Byron I
16 | stayed awake much longer as you know. I was going to
17 | go lay down, I started to, and then all of a sudden
18 | David wanted to talk with you when he knew you were --

19 | JOHN: (Laughter)

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- around and so I brought
21 | the phone in.

22 | JOHN: And you had to get involved, huh?

23 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- well, I sat down --

24 | JOHN: (Laughter)

25 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- for a minute because as

1 you know I hadn't seen the guy basically the entire
2 day so there --

3 JOHN: Well, did you have enough cord to get
4 it where he was?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, well, we -- well, don't
6 you remember the 150' that (indiscernible).

7 JOHN: Well, I know they were supposed to
8 leave a bunch of cord out there.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, no, yeah, weeks ago
10 that 150 was left, that 150' cord so and because all
11 the other phones don't work because they were so nice
12 to run it all over, we went and took that cord, hooked
13 it up and you were able to communicate with us.

14 JOHN: So you, you didn't have to get him to
15 do a lot of moving to get down to the phone then or
16 anything, huh?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, no, I mean he wouldn't
18 have done it, it, it would have been too hard to --

19 JOHN: Well, do you think any people got to
20 spend any time with him today and to prepare?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- no, they didn't in
22 fact. No one did. In fact, I went in there --

23 JOHN: Hey --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- in the morning, he was --

25 JOHN: -- let me, let me tell you something

1 and I'll be as candid as I can with you --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

3 JOHN: -- and, and I think I have been
4 throughout this thing.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: More than anybody.

6 JOHN: To me -- and, and you just listen to
7 me for a minute, okay?

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

9 JOHN: To me, no matter how you feel about
10 this or how you accept this or what your attitude is
11 about this, you are the key to resolving this
12 situation. Now, whether you, whether you accept that,
13 whether you don't accept that, to me that's
14 immaterial. You have been the person that's been
15 working hard, you have been the person that's been
16 going out talking to people, because other people have
17 told us yes, he came around and he spoke to us and he,
18 and he spent time with us and, and you know, 23 hours
19 a day --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's -- okay --

21 JOHN: Let me finish now.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Go ahead.

23 JOHN: That you have a lot of influence
24 whether you believe it, whether you accept it, whether
25 you want to accept it. And I'm not saying influence

1 that you can direct people. I'm, I'm saying it more
2 along the lines of influence to make people think, to
3 make -- into people's hearts.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't, I don't disagree
5 with that.

6 JOHN: And just keep using that power.
7 Because your power --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I have --

9 JOHN: -- because your power is a positive
10 power when you want it to be a positive power.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, John, look. It has
12 never changed with what I attempted to do
13 (indiscernible).

14 JOHN: Well, we all have our ups and downs,
15 right?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's why I've gotten
17 frustrated with Byron. Because I said -- like I told
18 you, I mean look, when we're -- when those seven
19 people went out I thought this is awesome, good. I
20 expected now we're back on track, we've got a good
21 relationship with these people, they're going to give
22 us just even minutes or hours to start developing this
23 thing now. That's -- I thought for sure because the
24 way -- every time we get off the phone --

25 JOHN: Well, then you, you tell me --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- every time we get off --

2 JOHN: -- what it takes to get this train --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, what it, what it --

4 JOHN: -- back on the tracks.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- what it was a couple days
6 ago. I don't understand why that had to be -- the

7 reaction that came about (indiscernible).

8 JOHN: What, what do you want? What do you
9 want to get the --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: What could I do to --

11 JOHN: -- train on the tracks?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I really don't know now
13 because three times it's been damaged like that and
14 every time, every time that happens it's ten times
15 worse.

16 JOHN: Well, what do you, what do you think
17 it does to John --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Can I say something?

19 JOHN: -- to John and myself and the other
20 people that are talking to you and how --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't know, I don't know.

22 JOHN: -- much more difficult do you think
23 it makes it for us?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't know.

25 JOHN: Huh?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I just know that it, it
2 becomes ten times harder for me, that's all I know.

3 JOHN: Well, the, the, the thing is --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm, I'm telling you --

5 JOHN: -- you are working hard in there.
6 You're doing a lot of positive things in there and,
7 and we appreciate it. We really appreciate it. And
8 I'm not telling you that to stroke you or to build up
9 your ego or anything else --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know.

11 JOHN: -- because I don't have to do that, I
12 don't have to do that at all. And if you weren't in
13 there I think our task would be a hundred times harder
14 because I know if I have to try and get ahold of David
15 and you're not in there -- I mean, I can give you an,
16 an example last night. When you went to bed and I'd
17 ring in there to talk to somebody, guy would answer
18 the phone and he'd say no, I can't do something, it's
19 up to God, you know, it's God's will. And I'm saying
20 what is this? Who am I talking to? And it was -- you
21 know, he just wouldn't communicate. That's not the
22 same when it's dealing with you.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, the reason being that
24 some of these people --

25 JOHN: Now --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- are like that is
2 because --

3 JOHN: -- whether they're not too bright or
4 something, I don't know --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no.

6 JOHN: -- or they're just scared to death, I
7 don't know.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, it's because
9 they've seen what has happened, they hear the
10 communications, they're aware of it and then they
11 watch what happens on the outside and, you know, what
12 they've seen they've not liked (indiscernible).

13 JOHN: No. It just seems like you're a more
14 rational person, I'll tell you that.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: John. I mean, you and I
16 both know, I mean it all comes down to actions, they
17 speak louder than words ever will, and that's what the
18 problem is. That's why --

19 JOHN: Well --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- David became so adamant.
21 Today I went up to see him and he was concerned about
22 what's happened with Fagan. Now he, he says is Yvette
23 getting ready to go out and so forth, and I said well,
24 I don't know, I went down to talk with Byron and I ran
25 into a real snowstorm there. I mean, he didn't want -

1 - JOHN: Well, David --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- he didn't want to talk --

3 JOHN: -- David prepared Fagan so David --

4 when David says Fagan, you know, I love you, God loves

5 you and it's, and it's time for you to go and Fagan

6 goes, David should have no other concern at that

7 moment --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: He doesn't.

9 JOHN: -- for Fagan, for Fagan --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: He doesn't.

11 JOHN: -- because --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: And hasn't.

13 JOHN: Well, then he shouldn't get all

14 concerned about that --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well --

16 JOHN: -- because we knows when he comes

17 out --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- he was not so concerned -

19 - JOHN: -- he can communicate with Fagan.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: His concern was not Fagan,

21 his concern was with his relationship with you and

22 then what happened immediately after that. I'm

23 talking about the damage, the telephone, the, the

24 music. That's the -- you -- I mean, you really made -

25 - I mean not you, but whoever, made him mad --

1 JOHN: No, it's, it's --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- that's why he said to you
3 -- that's why he started talking in the spirit and
4 manner he did again because it's a frustration.

5 JOHN: Well, this is we, "we" operation.
6 It's we out here --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

8 JOHN: -- and you/we inside there, and we
9 have to all put it together. And one of the
10 major --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, my God.

12 JOHN: -- stumbling blocks --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: How many times do I hear
14 that and then the --

15 JOHN: Hey, one of the major stumbling
16 blocks, and you can believe it, you don't have to
17 believe it, is people out here look at progress and
18 the progress they look at is not necessarily the same
19 progress you look at.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: You're right. Now instead
21 of having --

22 JOHN: Do you, do you understand what I'm --
23 where I'm coming from?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, but now instead of
25 having at least seven go out yesterday and today which

1 | would have been a total of 21 -- no, 23 because it was
2 | nine since Friday, now all of a sudden there was
3 | nothing -- well, yeah, yes, there was, but nothing
4 | today at all and that has, has nothing --

5 | JOHN: Well, you had --

6 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- that's not my fault in
7 | the least. I mean (indiscernible).

8 | JOHN: Well, I'm not saying it's your fault.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I know you're not, but
10 | I'm just saying --

11 | JOHN: I'm saying the things that you've
12 | been doing in there --

13 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm, I'm saying not only is
14 | it --

15 | JOHN: -- have been very positive.

16 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- not only is it not my
17 | fault -- again, it's been -- whatever I could have
18 | done has been taken from me again.

19 | JOHN: But tell me, from the day that
20 | Heather came out nothing happened for six days.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: This is true.

22 | JOHN: Nothing happened for six days. There
23 | was no, there was no power turned off, there was no
24 | nothing done. Nothing happened for six days. And
25 | that's very difficult for us to explain to the people

1 that we're dealing with that --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: And then all of a
3 sudden --

4 JOHN: I mean, do you understand that?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yes, but then all of a -

6 - JOHN: I mean, do you really?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, then all of a sudden we
8 started working with John Dolan and it started
(indiscernible).

9 JOHN: Yeah, but he'd bene talking to you
10 before that.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. He'd only been with me
12 for like two, three days and then it started coming
13 back again (indiscernible).

14 JOHN: Yeah, but tell me why, tell me why
15 nothing happened for six days, I mean --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Because of the lack of trust
17 because of statements made from Jim Kavanaugh all the
18 way down through that milk ended up becoming a
19 soured -- no pun intended -- a sour issue. Six --
20 five, five days later it's finally dropped off and
21 then the electricity is cut off the very night it's
22 dropped off. I mean, that -- those kind of --

23 JOHN: Well, do you think the electricity
24 should have been shut off the day after nothing
25

1 | happened when Heather came out?

2 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Probably should have. It
3 | would have made more sense.

4 | JOHN: Well, hindsight is great isn't it?

5 | MR. SCHNEIDER: The thing is though, I
6 | mean --

7 | JOHN: What, what can I say? The, the -- I
8 | think I made it as clear as I can, and, and whether
9 | we're -- and we're, we're trying to get on track. You
10 | know we're trying to get on track, you are and I am,
11 | aren't we?

12 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, we are but Byron here
13 | and --

14 | JOHN: And we -- everybody is.

15 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- the commanders --

16 | JOHN: Byron is --

17 | MR. SCHNEIDER: The way this --

18 | JOHN: -- John-3 is --

19 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- the way --

20 | JOHN: -- John Dolan is.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: What happened to Dolan?

22 | JOHN: Everybody that's talked to you --

23 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Where is Dolan?

24 | JOHN: -- is trying to get on track.

25 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Where's Dolan been?

1 JOHN: Well, he was there this morning.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I haven't talked to him
3 literally for days.

4 JOHN: Well, he was working this morning so
5 I don't know where he was.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Why do they keep him away?
7 Is he choosing to stay away? Are they keeping him
8 away? What's going on --

9 JOHN: I think they're getting --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- because he knows that --

11 JOHN: I think they're getting ready to
12 rotate him out.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you know that, you know
14 that he knows that the people here -- there are a lot
15 of people always ask about him. They like the guy.
16 You don't think that would go a long way to maybe
17 alleviating some of their distrust?

18 JOHN: I, I -- if you want --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Come on.

20 JOHN: -- if you want my --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: You don't mind --

22 JOHN: -- you want -- my, my candid answer
23 is --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: They all came to talk to you
25 last, when you gave a list of names and you asked they

1 have no problem coming and talking to you, John, I'm
2 going to tell you the truth. They don't mind.

3 JOHN: Well, is it having any positive
4 results?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, it starts to when you
6 starting -- start to generate as the day before like
7 with the seven individuals that came -- that's what
8 I'm saying.

9 JOHN: Yeah, but I talked --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Don't come back
(indiscernible).

11 JOHN: -- I talked to you and then I talked
12 to David until, you know, 4:45 this morning and my
13 talking to David I'm sure had absolutely nothing to do
14 with somebody coming out this morning. I don't think
15 it had anything to do with that. Do you?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: To tell you the truth, I
17 don't even know anymore.

18 JOHN: Sure.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I tell you what, I mean
20 I'm -- after what happened yesterday and --

21 JOHN: I think John --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- then last night --

23 JOHN: -- I think John D's lost his --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I can't --

25

1 JOHN: -- credibility with the, with the
2 people in here and, and --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: That who has?

4 JOHN: -- they're concerned about just --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Who's lost their
6 credibility?

7 JOHN: John.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: John Dolan?

9 JOHN: Yeah. It's a possibility that --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: If you think so -- if you --
11 say, listen, if you think so put on Bryon again and
12 put on some of these guys that are -- that push so
13 hard and that don't (indiscernible).

14 JOHN: I mean, if you, if you asked me for
15 my, my honest opinion, it's --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: See, see, the reaction of
17 (indiscernible).

18 JOHN: Steven, listen to me for a minute.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Go ahead.

20 JOHN: Listen, listen, and, and I don't want
21 to raise my voice.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, I don't, I don't
23 have any problem there.

24 JOHN: If you ask me for my opinion I'll
25 tell you my opinion, and I, and I can't give you

1 someone else's opinion because I can't put myself in
2 their shoes can I? My own personal opinion is that
3 basically the, the people that are making the
4 decisions feel that both Johns, 1 and 2, maybe we can,
5 we can talk to you people, maybe we can communicate
6 with you people, but we're just not getting any place
7 as far, as far as --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's where
9 (indiscernible).

10 JOHN: -- moving, as far as moving people
11 out of there day by day by day.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: (Indiscernible) Friday night
13 it started even late at night because you wanted them,
14 so David wanted to come right along because you wanted
15 them, so two came out and then, and then all of a
16 sudden -- and the next within 24 hours seven, and he
17 was going to start moving up from there and all of a
18 sudden --

19 JOHN: Well, let me tell you something.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: (Indiscernible)

21 JOHN: I'm going to be sitting here until 6,
22 7 o'clock in the morning and before you sack out for
23 the night go tap David on the shoulder --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I will.

25 JOHN: -- tell him I'll be here, tell him to

1 get into a prayer session with some folks and I'm here
2 if he wants to talk.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't even know if he's
4 (indiscernible).

5 JOHN: But I'm not here if he wants to
6 just -- do you know what he did to me this morning?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's that?

8 JOHN: I was insulted. I was totally
9 insulted. I'm trying to talk to that man and what's
10 he doing? Laughing and playing the guitar and
11 everything was a big joke when I was trying to be
12 serious.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, he was, he was --
14 no, he -- actually, he was very -- he was mad. He was
15 --

16 JOHN: I thought he was high on something to
17 tell you the truth.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, oh, not at all, not
19 at all. He was mad (indiscernible).

20 JOHN: Well, can you see where I'm coming
21 from?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: He likes you as a -- if
23 nothing else, if he can -- well, sure I can, but --

24 JOHN: I mean, I was really trying to be
25 serious, and I am every time I talk to him. We have

1 our laughs and we, we, we can smile --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, John --

3 JOHN: -- and we could have some humor.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you -- but John, you
5 realize --

6 JOHN: He was sticking it right in my ear.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, John, you realize his
8 reaction was from the destruction, from the broken
9 telephone lines, from the music.

10 JOHN: Well, he can take that on -- out on
11 somebody else, not out on me.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, he wasn't --

13 JOHN: I've been pretty fair with him and
14 I've been --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: No --

16 JOHN: -- pretty decent with him.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I know, and his
18 greatest --

19 JOHN: And he was just laughing in my face.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, his greatest delight
21 was he wanted to talk to you. I stayed up. I went in
22 there, took the phone in there, he likes to talk with
23 you. Even if you are not, as your word --

24 JOHN: If I'm a slow learner?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, like Bob Ricks

1 | said, you know, not going to take any of this
2 | conversion business, you know, being converted. No
3 | one's trying to --

4 | JOHN: Well, that's not what we're doing
5 | anyhow, is it?

6 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly, of course it's not.

7 | JOHN: No.

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: There's, there's not a -- I
9 | couldn't -- there wouldn't be a snowball chance in you
10 | know where for -- I could never imagine someone like
11 | you to associate yourself to such --

12 | JOHN: Hey, I've got, I've got different
13 | beliefs and that doesn't mean I'm going to knock
14 | yours.

15 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Of course not. But is there
16 | not -- is there (indiscernible).

17 | JOHN: But he was, he was really trying to
18 | stick it in my ear this morning just playing around
19 | and, and --

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Not so. He was trying to --

21 | JOHN: Hey, he, he was really just making
22 | fun --

23 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Why don't -- in fact, I'll
24 | put you on --

25 | JOHN: -- of a lot of issues.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll put you on the phone
2 with him and you, and you tell him that. I --

3 JOHN: I want you to tell him something
4 first.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's that?

6 JOHN: I want you to tell him that I want to
7 have serious dialogue and that I want him to get into
8 some serious, serious prayer time with some of these
9 people because as, as much as I want to be here and as
10 much as I want to try dealing with you, people think
11 that I'm just being stroked and that I'm being used
12 and I'm being manipulated and, and I don't like it
13 and, and I, and I want to -- I'm here to help, I'm
14 really here to help and they're looking for some
15 results. And I can't tell them that those tangible
16 things are happening, I wish they were, and, and I
17 pray that they were.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Too bad they worked behind
19 your back isn't it?

20 JOHN: What can I tell you? What can I tell
21 you?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's it, that's what
23 I'm saying. That's why David said to you last night
24 again about going directly to these so-called bosses
25 or whatever they are. I mean seriously, if you guys -

1 - I mean, he likes -- I -- you -- I'm not going to
2 (indiscernible).

3 JOHN: It doesn't make any difference
4 whether he talks to me or --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, it does make a
6 difference.

7 JOHN: -- he talks to Mike or he talks to --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, but if they allow --

9 JOHN: -- anybody else out here.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, if they allow
11 you to work, John, and he started bringing out seven
12 that day, you know there would have been more than
13 that even the following day unquestionably. I knew
14 it, I told you that was (indiscernible).

15 JOHN: Well, Steven, he doesn't have to work
16 with me tonight until 7 o'clock tomorrow morning and
17 say John, I love you, I want to talk to you and I want
18 to tell you --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: But look what
20 (indiscernible) done --

21 JOHN: -- that ten people are coming out of
22 here --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't even know if he will
24 want to, I don't even know if he will want to talk to
25 you anymore. He's in a bad frame of mind right now.

1 JOHN: Well, that's all right.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm not going to tell you
3 what he told me to say to Byron and I didn't end up
4 doing it because I --

5 JOHN: Hey --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I didn't end up getting
7 back on the phone with Byron.

8 JOHN: Believe me, if he doesn't want to
9 talk to me tell him to pray to God and to have some
10 people in there while he's praying.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: (Indiscernible) not said,
12 has not said that. I said I don't know because he's
13 mad with what these guys did.

14 JOHN: Well, I'm more concerned that he gets
15 with Mrs. Fagan, you know, with Ophelia's daughter if
16 that, that need be to come out and spend time with
17 Ophelia, with Yvette, with --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what he was working
19 on even --

20 JOHN: -- with Livingston's mother.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Do you know that David has -

22 JOHN: We'll let him spend the night talking
23 to these people.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what he was doing
25 until Byron came across the way he did and, and then -

1 - JOHN: Well, then don't let me interrupt and
2 don't let me interfere, just let him do it, okay? Let
3 him do it. I'm serious. I don't want -- if something
4 positive can happen without me interfering, without me
5 interrupting, let 'er rip, let it happen.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't think it will.

7 JOHN: Hey, he said don't push me. I don't
8 want to push you. He said don't press me, he needs
9 time.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, talking about
11 this whole attitude that Byron chose.

12 JOHN: Oh, I know that, I know that. He's
13 not talking as an individual, he's talking as a
14 system. I don't want to push, I don't want to press.
15 I want to give him the opportunity to do what he
16 wants to do with these people, prepare them, to pray
17 with them.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's not what he wants to
19 do, it's these people requesting (indiscernible).

20 JOHN: Well, it's the proper thing, right?
21 Isn't it the proper thing?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what he's -- we've
23 been saying from the beginning.

24 JOHN: Well then tell him to do it. Tell
25 him to do it.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: These guys don't want that,
2 it's not quick enough, they're not happy. You're
3 going to, you're going to get the --

4 JOHN: Steven --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- other extreme --

6 JOHN: Steven --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- on the phone, they'll --

8 JOHN: Steven, it's, it's 8 o'clock at
9 night. He's got 10, 12 hours to prepare some people.
10 Tell him to prepare.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I don't even know if
12 he's up and around yet. I'll go check it out. I --

13 JOHN: You know where I'm coming from, don't
14 you?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know what's been, you
16 know what's been happening lately?

17 JOHN: Hey --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's, he's been --

19 JOHN: Listen, listen.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, what?

21 JOHN: You know where I'm coming from though
22 don't you? I've told you how much good you've done
23 for us. Keep it up, keep it up. I don't want to see
24 anything happen to you, I don't want to see anything
25 happen to anybody else in there.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's so nice of you.

2 JOHN: But you have been the saving grace
3 for us in there by calming some of those people down.
4 Get in there, talk to David.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, here's the thing.

6 JOHN: I don't need any guitar playing, I
7 need him praying with people.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, he was strumming before
9 you even called before the phone was --

10 JOHN: Well, I thought you said he was
11 asleep?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I can't even remember, but
13 to tell you the truth --

14 JOHN: Hey --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I'm just sort of --

16 JOHN: You go get some rest and on your
17 way --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: (Indiscernible)

19 JOHN: -- to get some rest you give him a
20 tap and tell him to start praying with people because
21 that's more important to me than him talking to me on
22 the phone.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: When I put you in touch with
24 him last night was he -- he wasn't strumming on the --

25 JOHN: He was on a buzz. I thought he was

1 spring-loaded.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

3 JOHN: And then he had a song about the FBI
4 and AFT and I wish I could remember the --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah, I
6 recall, I recall.

7 JOHN: Well, you probably recall it as a
8 blur.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, no, no, I mean I
10 remember (indiscernible).

11 JOHN: But listen, I, I really truly believe
12 if he can spend time with people and prepare these
13 people and pray with these people it's more important
14 than him playing a guitar with me. Don't you think
15 so?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what he was saying to
17 you the -- before.

18 JOHN: Well, go give him a nudge and tell
19 him to get on with it and --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, here's been --

21 JOHN: -- I'll be here.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- here's been his pattern
23 lately. He's been bright-eyed, bushy-tailed at about
24 the time that he talked to you last night, you could
25 tell. But that's about the time I'm so worn out I

1 can't even see straight.

2 JOHN: Well, then why don't you get some
3 sack time right now?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, but no, no, because I
5 wanted to hear what, what -- where he's at and who is
6 coming into the room to talk with him so I can
7 (indiscernible).

8 JOHN: Well, I personally thought he was
9 insulting me this morning.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, he wasn't. I was there
11 and --

12 JOHN: That's the way I felt because I was
13 trying to talk serious to him and he was laughing
14 and --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I wish I could have heard
16 what you were saying. I don't know what you were
17 saying but I could tell by --

18 JOHN: That's because you were in a blur by
19 then.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, I could tell by what
21 he was saying there was no insult intended. For sure
22 not, none.

23 JOHN: Well, that's the way it came across.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, see --

25 JOHN: And I'm, and I'm, and I'm not trying

1 to be that way.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I know. Well, anyway,
3 what the whole problem is is he's, he's waking up in
4 the middle of the night and it's like that's his
5 daytime now and I'm -- myself I'm going through the
6 entire day.

7 JOHN: What's the matter with his circadian
8 rhythm here? It's all kicked out of whack or
9 something?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think (indiscernible)
11 shot, I don't know, or something. I --

12 JOHN: Did he get shot at the wrong time of
13 the day?

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Probably so.

15 JOHN: Look, do me a favor, will you?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, what's that?

17 JOHN: Get some rest. Get some rest. Talk
18 to me later after you've got some rest, but --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I know I'm not going to
20 be getting any.

21 JOHN: I'm not going to keep you up.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know you're not because --

23 JOHN: I want you to go talk to him, tell him I
24 don't need to spend two or three hours with him on the
25 phone, I'm here anytime he wants.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: (Indiscernible)

2 JOHN: You know I'm here. I'm at the end of
3 the phone.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, do you know the
5 greatest thing that you --

6 JOHN: Tell him to start praying with these
7 people --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: John --

9 JOHN: -- prepare these people.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Do you know the greatest
11 thing that you could actually do, either talking to
12 the commanders, whoever it is going to be you need to
13 talk to --

14 JOHN: You tell me, tell me.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- we've got to get
16 something going again with Livingston. I need to
17 communicate with him by telephone. I need to do that.

18 JOHN: What do you, what do you need to tell
19 him?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I need to ask
21 (indiscernible).

22 JOHN: I mean I don't want to interfere with
23 your personal dialogue with him, but --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, I don't care if you
25

1 | guys are on the phone. That's, that's --

2 | JOHN: Well, we probably will be.

3 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's fine. I mean,
4 | that doesn't matter. I want to ask him what's going
5 | on that he's showing such an -- I want to hear it for
6 | myself (indiscernible).

7 | JOHN: Well, I'll what I can do. And I
8 | won't --

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I will tell him --

10 | JOHN: -- I won't kid you, I won't lie to
11 | you. I'll, I'll ask some people --

12 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm telling him it's going
13 | to -- well, listen. I want to tell him he's making it
14 | more difficult for the choice of his own mother and
15 | wife even coming out of here because they become
16 | suspicious and all of a sudden they locked themselves
17 | in here now.

18 | JOHN: Hey, let me see what I can do.

19 | MR. SCHNEIDER: And that's just what's
20 | happened. And then the rest of the people knowing
21 | that he went out and if they're not coming out why
22 | should they? Do you see what I'm dealing with?

23 | JOHN: Let me see what I can do. The
24 | quicker, quicker I can do it --

25 | MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

1 JOHN: -- the quicker we can get back
2 together, huh?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. Okay. So let me
4 know and --

5 JOHN: Hey, do me a favor.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's that?

7 JOHN: I will call you when I have a
8 response.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Take as much --

10 JOHN: If David needs to call me all he has
11 to do is pick up the phone.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. Take as much
13 time as you want because --

14 JOHN: You get some rest. Please do me a
15 favor.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's that?

17 JOHN: Please tell him to start praying with
18 these people and he's --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I'm going to go check
20 on that.

21 JOHN: -- got all night long to do it.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm going to check on him.
23 But, you know, I'll call his name.

24 JOHN: Give him a nudge.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm not going to do that.

1 JOHN: Why, why does it appear that people
2 are reluctant to open the door, go in and say David?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: (Indiscernible) since he's
4 been wounded.

5 JOHN: Does he have a Do Not Disturb sign on
6 there?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: He -- basically he does. He
8 really does. He's gotten a little agitated with
9 people. This is not Grand Central Station, he's told
10 that.

11 JOHN: Steven, you're the key to this.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, John, I've tried to do
13 everything I (indiscernible).

14 JOHN: You're the key to this.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Did I not sit up late last
16 night to make sure that --

17 JOHN: Be strong, be strong.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: The lights -- the lights
19 came on. I knocked at the door numerous times, he
20 didn't answer. Finally I laid down -- or sitting low
21 on the floor and when the lights finally came on about
22 the time I got ahold of you, I mean I got ahold of you
23 immediately.

24 JOHN: Listen --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Didn't I? Did I call you or

1 did you call -- I think I, I called you didn't I?

2 JOHN: I've been calling in there for I
3 don't know how long and people are saying it's going
4 to be the will of God when David wakes up and --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh (indiscernible).

6 JOHN: I didn't need to hear that.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- well, I'm sure I
wouldn't either.

8 JOHN: I didn't need to hear that.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: I must admit I wouldn't
10 either.

11 JOHN: But try, will you?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: You -- well, you know --

13 JOHN: Try.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- as usual I will be
because, I mean --

15 JOHN: You do it and I'll see what I can
16 find out about Livingston.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. Give me a little
time though because I'm, I'm tired.

18 JOHN: Well, kick on the door on your way
19 by.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll try to do it.

21 JOHN: Well, just -- you got to reach out
22 the foot.

23

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

2 JOHN: Doesn't take too much to do that.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, man (indiscernible).

4 JOHN: Do me a favor, huh?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm about ready to just stay
6 here for (indiscernible).

7 JOHN: Do me a favor.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's that?

9 JOHN: I don't ask much of you. Give him a
10 little nudge. Tell him to start praying with those
11 folks.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm going to try it.

13 JOHN: And I'll talk --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll try it.

15 JOHN: -- I'll talk to you as soon as I hear
16 something about Livingston.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

18 JOHN: All right. Get a little rest.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Okay. Bye.

20 JOHN: Bye.

21 (Phones hung up)

22 * * * * *

23 (Phone dialing) (Phone ringing)

24 JUDY: Hello?

25 TONY: Hello.

1 JUDY: Hi.

2 TONY: Hi, is David there?

3 JUDY: Is David here?

4 TONY: Yes.

5 JUDY: Yeah, he's here. Who's this?

6 TONY: This is Tony.

7 JUDY: Tony?

8 TONY: Yeah.

9 JUDY: I haven't heard your name before.

10 TONY: No, I'm just somebody new that works
with John.

11 JUDY: Okay. Let me see if he's available.

12 TONY: Okay.

13 JUDY: Hold on.

14 (Pause)

15 JUDY: Hello, Tony?

16 TONY: Yeah?

17 JUDY: Is there anything in particular I can
18 tell him that you want to know?

19 TONY: Well, I just wanted to talk to him.
You know, I'm calling because -- well, is Steve there?

20 Did Steve talk to David?

21 JUDY: Yeah.

22 TONY: Yeah, and I just wanted to know if he

23

1 | took -- told him, you know, how upset he was about
2 | last night.

3 | JUDY: How upset who was?

4 | TONY: Well, John got a little upset, you
5 | know, with David. He was somewhat offended because of
6 | what happened last night so I just wanted to talk to
7 | David a little bit here, you know, really try to tell
8 | him how John's trying to work with him on this thing
9 | here and let him know, you know, where he's heading.
10 | You know, John's pretty upset right now.

11 | JUDY: He is?

12 | TONY: Yeah. Well, well, you know,
13 | apparently the --

14 | JUDY: He needs medical attention?

15 | TONY: Pardon me?

16 | JUDY: He needs medical attention?

17 | TONY: Oh, no, no, he's just pretty upset
18 | because of what happened here. He went -- you know,
19 | about what happened last night and the bosses heard
20 | about it and everything and basically they weren't too
21 | happy with John and let him know about it. But I
22 | wanted to talk to David a little bit about it and see
23 | if -- you know, to let him know anyway that, you know,
24 | that he's really working with him here. His
25 | credibility is, you know, going downhill somewhat here

1 because of what happened.

2 JUDY: John's credibility?

3 TONY: Yeah, a little bit.

4 JUDY: (Indiscernible) okay, hold on.

5 TONY: Okay.

6 (Long pause)

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

8 TONY: Hello, David?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: This is Steve.

10 TONY: Hey, Steve, how you doing?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not too bad.

12 TONY: Good. This is Tony here.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello, Tony.

14 TONY: How you doing? Was that, was that
15 Rachel that came on?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Pardon?

17 TONY: Was that Rachel that answered?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, that was actually Judy.

19 TONY: Oh, Judy. Okay. I didn't the voices
20 there.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I just didn't
22 realize -- I must have just passed out here. I just
23 laid down about 20 minutes ago and I must have fallen
24 asleep. It took me a few moments.

25 TONY: Yeah, I knew you were going to sleep

1 but I didn't know if --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I'd been up for a
3 while, but --

4 TONY: Yeah.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, David he's quite
6 bothered because -- in fact, I just stopped by his
7 door and I noticed the light was on. I was hoping to
8 talk with him. He said just tell them that apparently
9 they have no, no respect for the Judeo/Christian ethic
10 and we have a lot of associates and people that we
11 know from Israel. We know that from their
12 understanding and belief too that they're not going to
13 be pleased because the Rosh Kadesh (phonetic sp.)
14 which is 12 new moons out of a, out of a year, one of
15 those is in the process of happening, it's a Sabbath -
16 -

17 TONY: Um-hum.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and that happens 12
19 times. And of course, you know, with all this being
20 played and the response, the attitude even now during
21 our daily which is another aspect of that, all these
22 different things are taking place. I mean, even
23 before this incident happened, the unfortunate
24 incident --

25 TONY: Which one?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, that Sunday,
2 February 28th.

3 TONY: Okay, um-hum.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: With that happening, I mean,
5 we -- you know, this, this is part of our lifestyle.

6 TONY: Um-hum.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: And this is something that
8 is required in that book called the Bible, not Easter,
9 Christmas, Halloween and all these pagan holidays of
10 which, you know, I grew up with all that myself. But
11 I mean God's not going to be trifled with. He's got a
12 program of which Satan has come along with
13 counterfeits galore and in the final days everybody's
14 caught up into feelings and theories --

15 TONY: Well --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- but at the same time
17 there's an ancient history that's been left to
18 everybody to look at.

19 TONY: Yeah.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, but anyway, he just
21 wanted me to say -- I'm saying in response for him
22 that, you know, he's got a great concern about the
23 desecration and the lack of respect for, for the
24 Christian/Judeo ethic so --

25 TONY: Well, we -- you know, we appreciate

1 that, Steve, I really do. The reason I'm calling
2 here, you know, John left here a short time ago --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

4 TONY: -- and he, he was really upset. I, I
5 don't know if he -- I think he mentioned that to you.
6 He was -- and I don't know if you really got the
7 message, you know. He, he left here and of course he
8 went and talked to the commanders and they called him
9 in and talked to him. Now, apparently that incident
10 that happened last night where he was speaking with
11 Dave, you know, and David was playing the, the guitar
12 and singing and kind of making light of it is the way
13 it was perceived, anyway. And he, he really was
14 pretty much insulted and the reason I was calling here
15 is to let you know that, you know, he's, he's really
16 been trying hard here and I think you guys know that
17 to try to get this thing resolved. And he -- of
18 course, he got called in on that and they were pretty
19 upset with him and needless to say he's, he's not very
20 happy right now. He's upset and he's pretty hurt by
21 the whole thing and, you know, I wanted to let you
22 know
23 because -- you know, I've been working here with him
24 and I really know he's really, really trying and I
25 just wanted you guys to know that, that -- how, how

1 hard John is trying to do this thing and basically his
2 credibility is suffering right now because of --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, you and I --
4 let me be honest with you. You know, truthfully, I
5 don't buy that, I really don't. I mean I'd, I'd be
6 foolish to be saying I acknowledged such a thing. I,
7 I will tell you this though for a fact, Tony, that
8 David loves the man.

8 TONY: I, I know that.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Wait, let me say something
10 about that.

11 TONY: Go ahead, go ahead.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: See, I can't say something
13 like that because me being a person -- like yourself,
14 I haven't met you people but I do love -- I like
15 humanity and even though I've not been on this earth
16 really that long in comparison to many others, I mean
17 I, I can take a look logically back at the history of
18 mankind and see we're all subject to death. I'm not
19 going to get on some tirade here, but --

18 TONY: Yeah, exactly, because, you know, I
19 don't want to get into that.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, I understand, but --

21 TONY: I'm calling in to really pass a
22 message --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- but, you know --

2 TONY: -- more or less.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: But myself, I'm one of the
4 few people in life that I've always looked and
5 wondered what is truth and where is it. So I've
6 compared for years and years and --

7 TONY: Well --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: But anyway, in the process,
9 you know, you, you know why we're here.

10 TONY: Sure.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: We've repeated it, it's been
12 -- it's been -- it's been recorded on many tapes and
13 so forth. But, I mean, I'm concerned about your well-
14 being, my own included, and this is why like for
15 instance maybe these commanders aren't happy. I mean,
16 a lot of these people, you know, religion's a joke to
17 them but that's, that's -- you know, that's between
18 them and whatever might be for their -- in their mind.

19 TONY: Right, but what --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: But, but for us, you know,
21 the main thing is no, David was not make -- I was
22 there last night even though I should have been in bed
23 --

24 TONY: You mean when David was talking to
25 John?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: When he was talking to John
2 Cox --

3 TONY: Yeah.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- he was strumming and so
5 forth. And he kept on saying, you know, getting to
6 John, do you want a study because, you know, he
7 believes highly in that he has one mission and that is
8 that he's to declare the seven seals which unlocks all
9 the mysteries.

9 TONY: Oh, we, we understand that and, you
10 know, I --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

12 TONY: -- yeah, I, I fully appreciate that
13 and I know that.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: So -- you know, no, but he
15 had no -- he meant nothing in, in --

16 TONY: Well --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- in the way of insult to
18 John.

19 TONY: Well, I think, I think John took it
20 as a -- you know, John is trying -- really, really
21 trying here, as you well know.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know David --

23 TONY: We've been working with you -- both,
24 both you and John have been working on this real hard
25

1 and I've been here with John the entire time --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

3 TONY: -- and, you know, I kind of see where
4 he's coming from and I've known John.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, David did say though
6 clearly, Tony, last night that the reason he did what
7 he did was in response to people like John Cox for
8 their hard work, for their patience even listening to
9 David --

9 TONY: But --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: He said that kind of thing,
11 you know, that, that kind of humanity, how can you but
12 want to respond to someone that is --

12 TONY: Well --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- so sincere as --

14 TONY: Dave, Dave looks -- John looks at it
15 in a completely different light because John wanted to
16 discuss significant issues here. He wanted to get
17 something going here and the way he interpreted that
18 is well, this is somewhat of a game and it's --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, but it isn't a game.

19 TONY: -- you really don't mean anything.
20 Well, understand and I think John --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: David was highly --

22 TONY: -- understands that.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- insulted by the
2 commanders or whosever decision it was on one hand
3 after sending out seven people he was going to
4 increase and try to get communication going with the
5 people here to get them moving on out of the building
6 --

7 TONY: Well --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- when all of a sudden you
9 get the telephone lines cut, you've got all the damage
10 that was perpetrated and, and done --

11 TONY: Well --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- yesterday along with
13 that's when the --

14 TONY: We fully understand and that's why --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: But see, that's --

16 TONY: -- we got the lines put back together
17 here, so that we could get back and discuss these --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, yeah, but still the
19 music -- the weird music and all that, that was his
20 reward for trying to work with John Cox and Dolan, two
21 men that really have a very good personality.

22 TONY: Absolutely, and they really try and -

23 - MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, but at the same time
24 it, it ultimately shows they're not in control
25 whatsoever anyway so what is the sense in even talking

1 with these men? Is it an exercise for the lungs, the
2 throat?

3 TONY: All they're, all they're trying to
4 do, all they're trying to do, both John and -- is to
5 get something going here, and like he doesn't want, he
6 doesn't want to bother David tonight. He says I'm not
7 going to bother David tonight. He wants David to get
8 with the people and prepare them so that maybe we can
9 have some progress tomorrow. And he said I'm not
10 going to discuss this any, anymore with them, I'm not
11 going to talk to them because I'm, I'm -- and he was -
12 - and I'm not saying this, I'm not just saying this,
13 I'm not going to lie to you, I won't give you a story
14 that's not true here.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: David is --

16 TONY: He was -- John was -- let, let me
17 finish, okay?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

19 TONY: John was -- he felt bad in the sense
20 that he -- of all the days he's put and the time he's
21 put in on this and felt that maybe we're going to get
22 some progress going here. And we understand there's
23 been some back-sets and so forth. But John felt, he
24 honestly felt that maybe if I keep working with these
25 guys that they'll work with me and then when the --

1 when it got to where he was listening to music there,
2 the paying guitar, John felt well, maybe, maybe it's
3 just a game, maybe they're just playing this. And,
4 and he felt that maybe everything he's trying to do
5 here has just gone down the tube. He doesn't want
6 that.

6 He --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no. I tell you, Tony,
8 there's such a sobriety here, there's people that are
9 looking deep into the things in the Bible
10 (indiscernible) book is a bunch of nonsense and these
11 people have had a lesson in futility, or there's a God
12 that is very wise that has brought about a plan
13 through every generation like it says in Peter, be
14 established in the present truth. Well, what is the
15 truth for the present? That's the question people ask
16 here. And if it can't be logically shown from the
17 Scripture --

17 TONY: Um-hum.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- in context, not a text
19 here and text there, that Christianity pogo sticks all
20 around --
