

Misses the target

POOR FIT

Outside scope or mission of the journal

Things-to-do

journal web site

- mission
- Search journal key words
- Scan a few issues
- read skim articles

DO SOME HOMEWORK

Strong Abstract – gateway to reviewers & readers



Reviewer comment

Poor abstract Poor paper

Clear Writing
Don't throw together last minute



Include

- Purpose
- Method
- Key findings
- Take-away

Avoid

- Acronyms & Jargon
- Convoluted sentences
- Obvious conclusion

(more research needed)






- Find Reviewers




Enough Information

Imagine how to Replicate



Make the document easy to skim

- ✓ Clear abstract
- ✓ Purpose or aim easy to find
- ✓ Methodology makes sense for purpose
- ✓ Alignment between hypotheses and operationalization of variables
- ✓ Easy to navigate subheadings helpful
- ✓ Charts and tables easy to skim (important info self contained)
- ✓ Findings aligned with purpose
- ✓ Contribution to knowledge clear and compelling

Tired ideas
Lacks Coherence
Limited generalizability
