Photovoice


- A collaborative approach
 place based; public
 driven
- Journaling and photography completed by community members
- Journals and images available online (in CDM and linked via website)



Oral Histories

- Digital equipment
- Full audio and transcripts available online (CDM & Soundcloud)
- Topics from the everyday to the extraordinary



Archival Digitization

- Camera, flatbed scanner, and 3D scanner if needed
- Collection linked via website to Community Collection in CDM
- Digital copies of all items provided when returning originals rehoused in archival folders & boxes





Historic Resources Surveys

- Digital photographs
- Survey forms can be completed on computer in several file formats and submitted to SHPO
- Option for GPS mapping
- Digitizes all materials and makes them available through crhr-hrs.org via website







Roadblocks to Success

- Oral History: equipment failures, time and cost to transcribe
- Photovoice: low participant return rates, time and cost to transcribe and digitize journals
- Archival Collections: often large amounts of unorganized materials, slow digitization and metadata entry
- Historic Resource Surveys: extensive photographic and form results to be combined and hosted online
